




THE FARMER BUYS: PRICES HE PAYS ARE LIKELY TO RISE.



THE FARMER SELLS: PLANTING WITHIN ACREAGE ALLOTMENTS WILL HELP KEEP FARM PRICES IN LINE.




LAND RUINED: BECAUSE OF UNWISE EXPANSION IN THE LAST WAR.
