Burpee Annual Flower Seeds

Annual flowers are those which grow, bloom, seed and die in one season. They are attractive in the garden—some for bedding, some for borders, some for rock gardens, some for climbing or trailing and others for their foliage effect only. Many are invaluable for cutting. There are annual flowers for every purpose; all are lovely and, with proper selection, blooms can be had from early summer until frost. We offer a wide and varied assortment on pages 2 to 46. Easy to follow, how-to-grow directions are given on every bag of Burpee seeds.



On the left is a plant of Queen of the Market Early asters in comparison with the new Burpeeana Early asters on the right. Seeds were sown at the same time. Queen of the Market is in the bud stage, while Burpeeana Early is in full bloom. Note, too, the more desirable, erect habit of growth of Burpeeana Early, and the greater number of flowers per plant.

Burpeeana Early Asters

1663 All Colors Mixed This new Burpee strain of asters is particularly noteworthy because of its desirable, uniformly upright, compact habit of growth; also because it comes into bloom extremely early.

Flowers are globular, double, 3 to 4 in. across, with attractively incurved petals, ranging from snowy white through shell-pink, rose, crimson, blue, violet to purple—practically all colors known in asters.

Plants are of erect, base branching growth, average 20 in. in height, with many stems per plant, each stem being unusually strong and topped with a flower somewhat resembling the American Beauty in shape. These terminal flowers come into bloom at about the same time, thus making a grand showing in the garden. The erect growing plants also permit close planting so that more can be grown in a given area to supply a greater number of blooms than could be had from other types. Doubly appreciated where space is limited.

Burpeeana Early Asters, in many localities come into full bloom before aster wilt or aster yellows may make their appearance. In our plantings, these new asters reached the peak of their bloom two weeks or more earlier than Queen of the Market, with larger and better shaped flowers and longer, stronger stems.

Burpee's Extra Early Asters

These very early flowering varieties begin to bloom soon after Burpeeana—flowers are of different shapes and the plants rather open in growth. Extreme earliness and good stems make them a most welcome type of aster for early cutting. All were created by Burpee on Floradale Farms.

1607 Heavenly Blue Large, feathery, beautifully formed flowers, 4 in. and more across, of an exquisite azure or light lavender-blue color. Petals are long, narrow, prettily inter-laced, the smaller ones gracefully curling over the center. Plants are of spreading growth, well branched, 2 ft. tall, bloom early; stems up to 16 in. long. Wonderful for cutting.

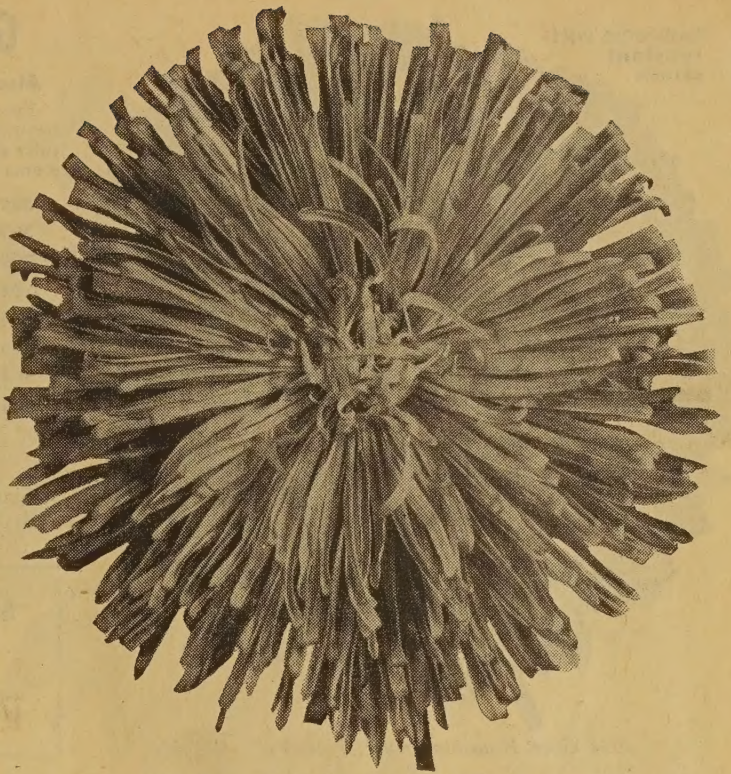

1605 Early Bird First flowers appear very early and the plants will continue to produce their colorful carmine-rose flowers for several weeks. Blooms are double, 3 1/2 in. across, with the petals evenly placed to form a most symmetrical flower. Plants grow 15 in. and more high and branch freely. As flowers age, outer petals become tipped lighter rose.

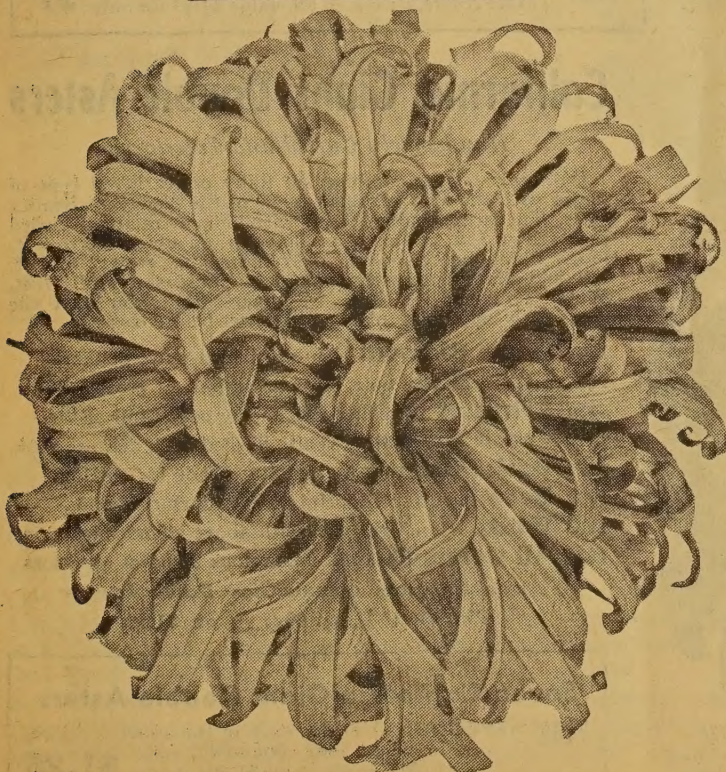

ASTERS

Asters are easy to grow. They prefer rich, well-drained soil and a warm, sunny location. For earliest blooms, sow seed indoors in boxes or seed-pans four to six weeks before your usual outdoor planting time. Set plants in the garden when weather gets warm. A continuous display of flowers from early summer until frost can be had by planting the new Burpeeana and other extra early, early and midseason blooming varieties. Asters are wonderful for cutting.

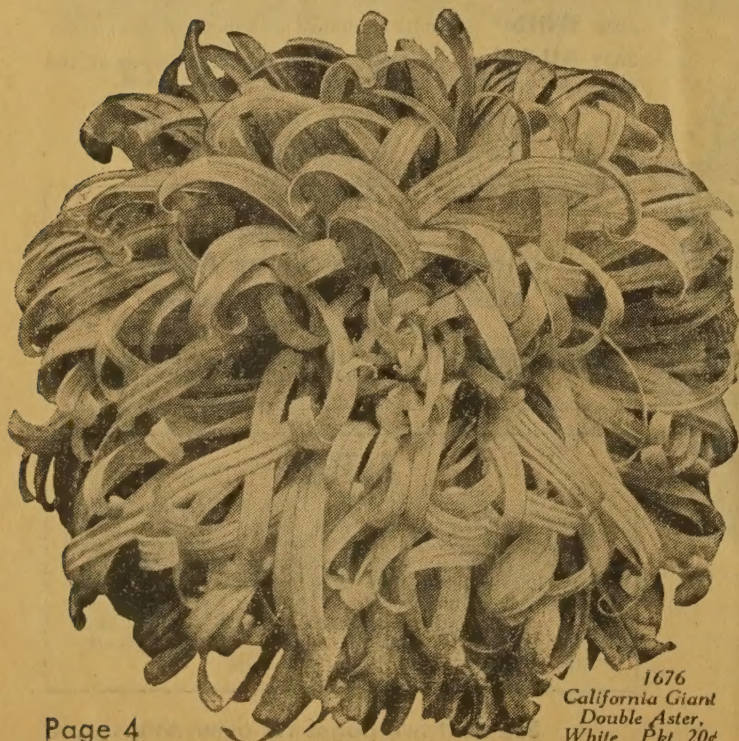
Handsomely Curled and Interlaced

California Giants combine the fluffy or feathered type of flower with the long, straight stems of the American Beauty class. The large, double flowers with long, attractively curled petals grow 5 in. and more in diameter, on stems 1½ to 2 ft. long. Plants are vigorous, freely branching, grow 2 to 3 ft. tall and bloom profusely from late midseason until frost. Where summers are short, we suggest that you start the seeds early indoors so plants will flower before frost.

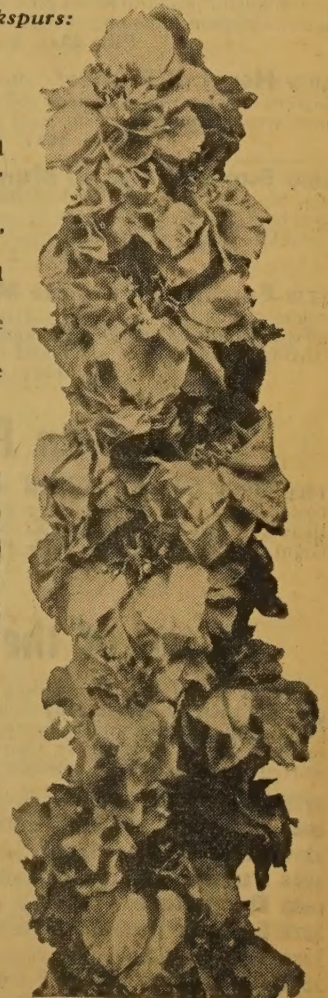

Pansies succeed best in fairly rich, well-drained soil in a sunny position, and produce their finest flowers in the cool, early days of spring. Keep flowers picked during the summer, plants pinched back, and you will get a nice lot of flowers again in the fall. Seeds may be sown outdoors when soil has become warm; for earlier blooms, start seed indoors or in a warm hotbed six to eight weeks before your usual outdoor planting time.

Maturity Dates

The average number of days required from the time the seed is sown until vegetables are ready for use is given with each variety. Where plants must first be grown, such as Celery, Cabbage, Peppers, Tomatoes, etc., the number of days to maturity is from the time plants are set in the garden. How to Grow Tomatoes

Sow seed in a hotbed, or in a shallow box in the house, allowing 6 to 8 weeks to produce plants large enough for setting outdoors when weather becomes warm. Light, friable soil of medium fertility is best for starting the seed. Cover seed with 1/4 in. of fine soil or sand. Keep soil moist but not too wet and avoid excessive drying. If seed is sown in container, keep it in a warm place (65 to 70°). When seedlings are about 2 in. tall, transplant to stand 4 in. apart each way, or pot singly in 3 in. pots. Plant outdoors when all danger of frost is past in rows 3 to 4 ft. apart each way, if to be grown untrained and unpruned; if supported on stakes, plants may be set 18 to 24 in. apart in the row, except hybrids, which should be spaced 2 to 2 1/2 ft. apart in the row. Disturb roots as little as possible when transplanting.

Where summers are long, seed of standard varieties may be sown directly outdoors when soil and weather get warm. When plants are large enough to transplant, set them where they are to remain; such plants will come into bearing later than those started earlier indoors or in a hotbed. Sizes and weights mentioned in descriptions are for the general field-run of fruits; with special care they often do better than we state. A pkt. of standard tomato seeds will produce about 200 plants; 1 oz. 5000 to 6000.

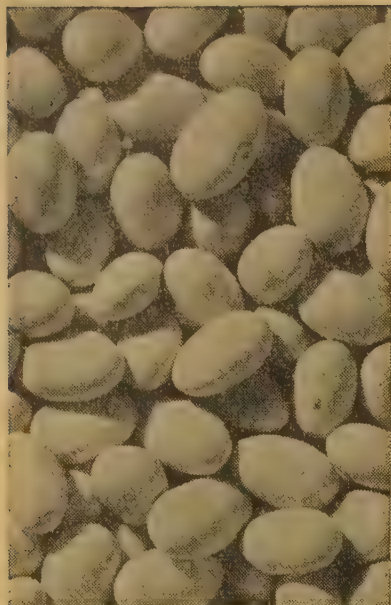

How to Grow Pole Beans

Pole Beans should not be planted until all danger of frost is past and the soil is warm and moderately dry. They do best if the vines are given support, the most frequently used being rough poles, spaced 3 to 4 ft. apart each way. Place 5 or 6 beans around each pole, cover with 2 in. of soil, and firm to assist germination. When plants are well started, thin so that 3 or 4 of the strongest remain to a pole. A packet of seed is enough for 15 poles; 1 lb. of seed for 100 poles, except Scarlet Runner, a pkt. of which is enough for 8 poles; 1 lb. for 60 poles. Pole Beans may also be planted 3 to 5 in. apart along a trellis or fence, sowing 300 ft. of row with 1 lb. of seed.

Bush LIMA BEANS

Easier grown than pole limas as plants do not need support. There are varied sizes and shapes of beans to meet your preference, whether it be the large thick (Burpee's Fordhook) or small thick "potato" type (Baby Fordhook), the large flat (Burpee's Improved) or the small flat baby butter lima (Henderson Bush or the newer Triumph). How to Grow Bush Lima Beans

Bush Lima Beans succeed well in almost any good garden soil but do best in a rich, well-drained, sandy loam. As seed is sensitive to cold and wet ground, it must not be planted until the soil has become quite warm and fairly dry. Plant the seeds edgewise, eye

down, 4 in. apart in rows 2 1/2 to 3 ft. apart, and cover with 2 in. of fine soil. 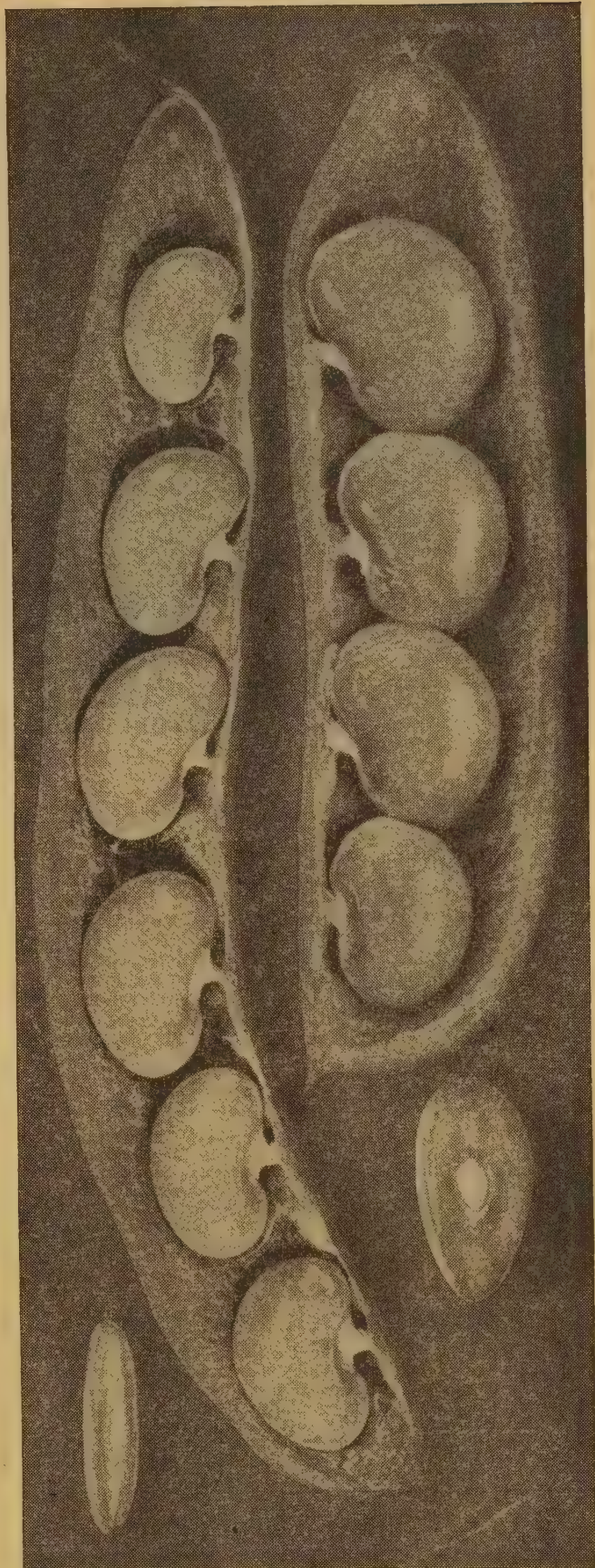

How to Grow Pole Lima Beans

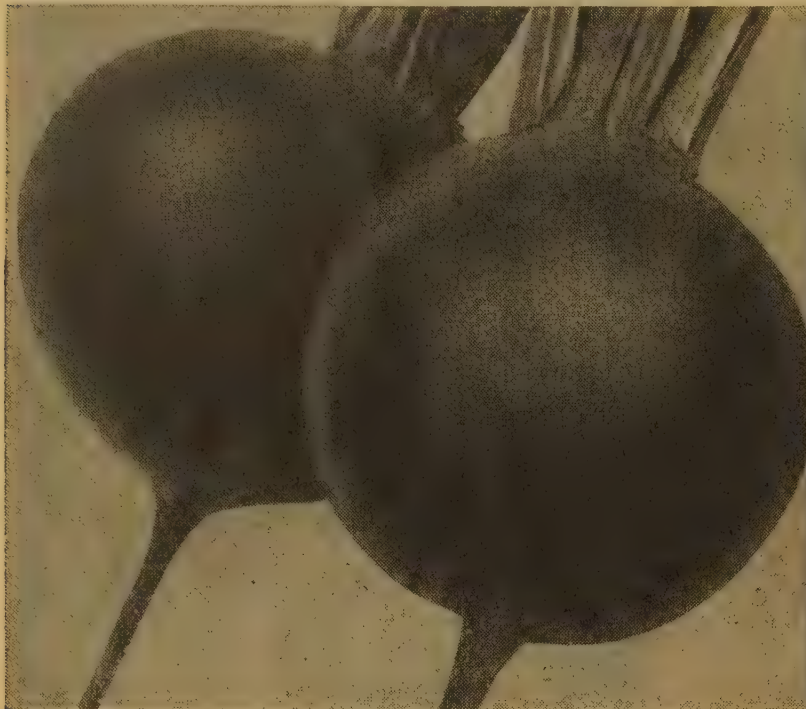
Pole Lima Beans are easily grown in any rich, well-drained garden soil. Should be given support, the most frequently used being rough poles, spaced 3 to 4 ft. apart each way. Sow seeds when soil has become warm; put 6 to 8 seeds (preferably with the eyes down) around each pole, cover with 2 in. of fine soil, and firm to assist germination. When plants are well started, thin so that 3 or 4 of the strongest

remain to a pole. A pkt. will plant 10 poles; 1 lb. for 50 poles. Small plantings may be made along a fence or trellis, putting several beans 1 ft. apart, later thinning to one strong plant; such plantings would require 1 lb. of seed to about 50 ft. of row; a pkt. will plant about 10 ft. Pole Beans may also be planted the same way.

Sow seeds as early in the spring as the ground can be worked. For a continuous supply make additional sowings when the preceding planting is up and growing; allow plenty of time for the last sowing to mature before frost. Space rows 1½ to 2 ft. apart and cover seed with ½ in. of fine soil. A rich, sandy loam, mellow and deep, produces the best shaped and smoothest roots. 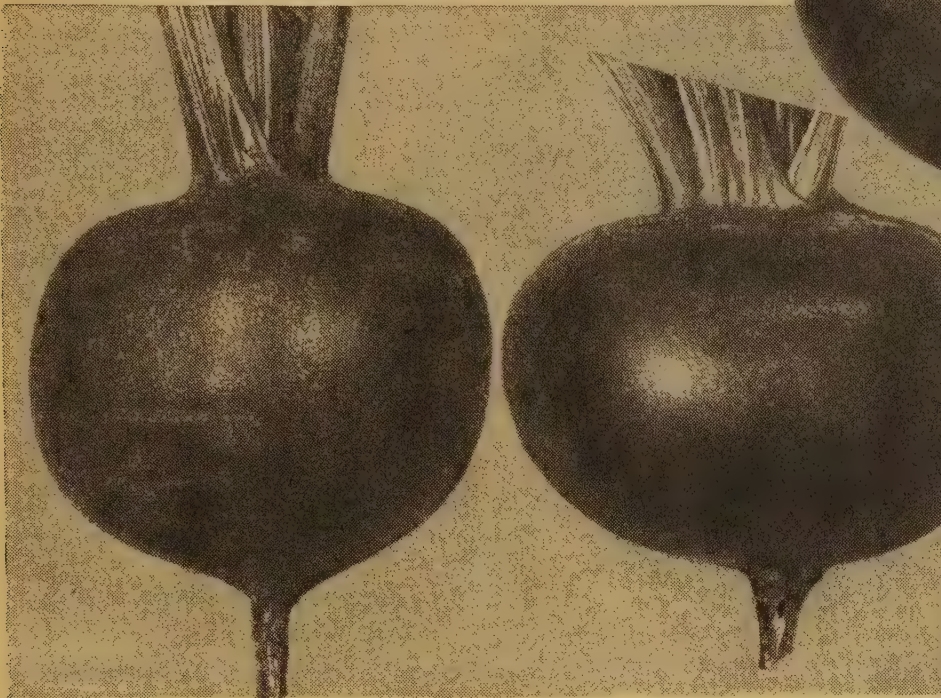

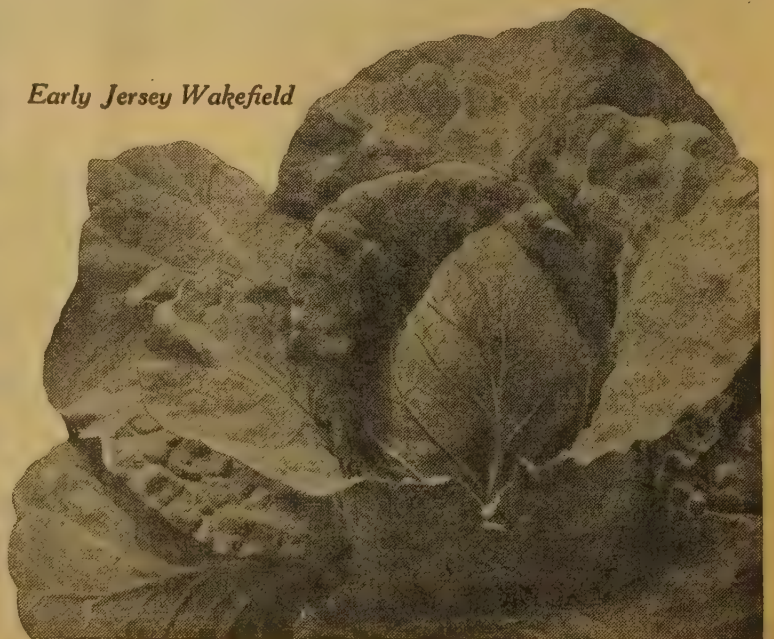

For earliest crop, start early and midseason cabbage seed in hotbed or house; for medium early cabbage, seed may be sown in a coldframe or open-ground seed-bed in early spring. Sow late cabbage for winter use in a seed-bed outdoors when soil has become warm. A pkt., except O-S Cross, will produce about 250 plants; an oz. about 2000 plants. 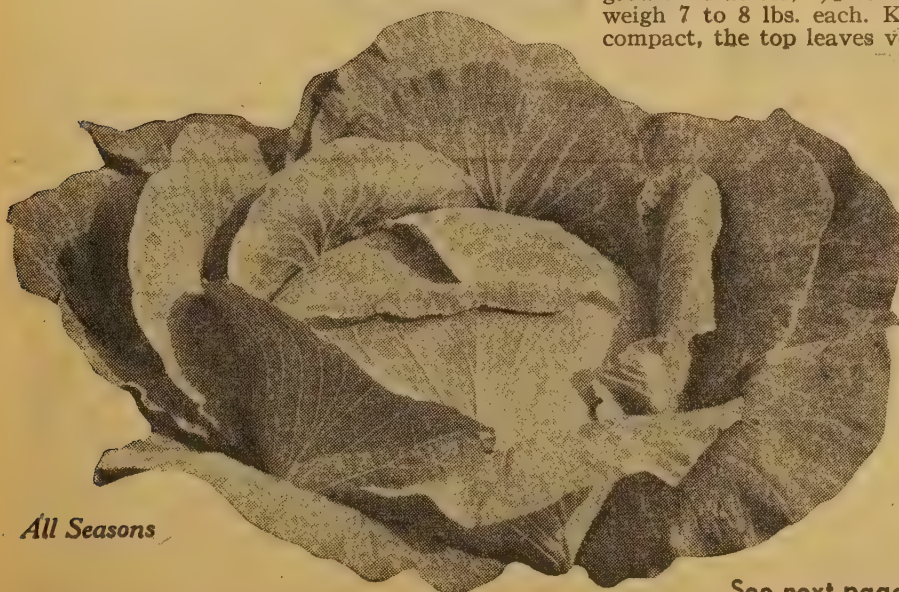

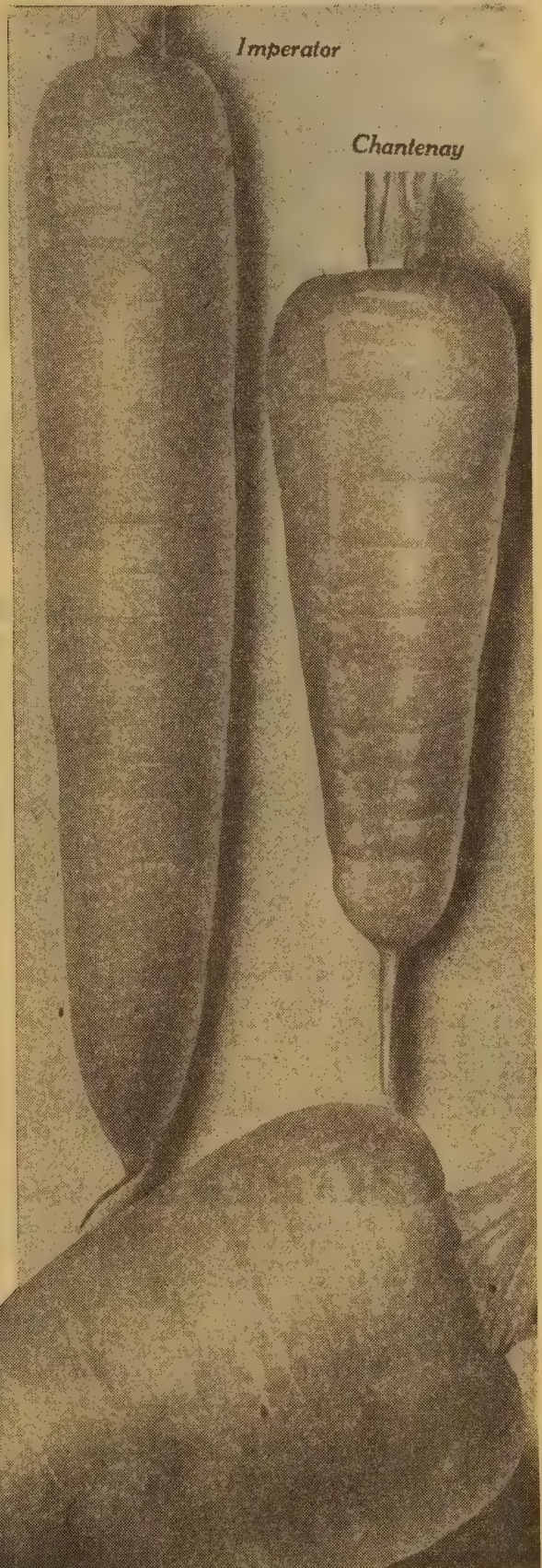

Sow seed thinly in early spring in rows not less than 12 in. apart and make additional sowings when the preceding planting is up and growing; allow plenty of time for the last sowing to mature before frost. 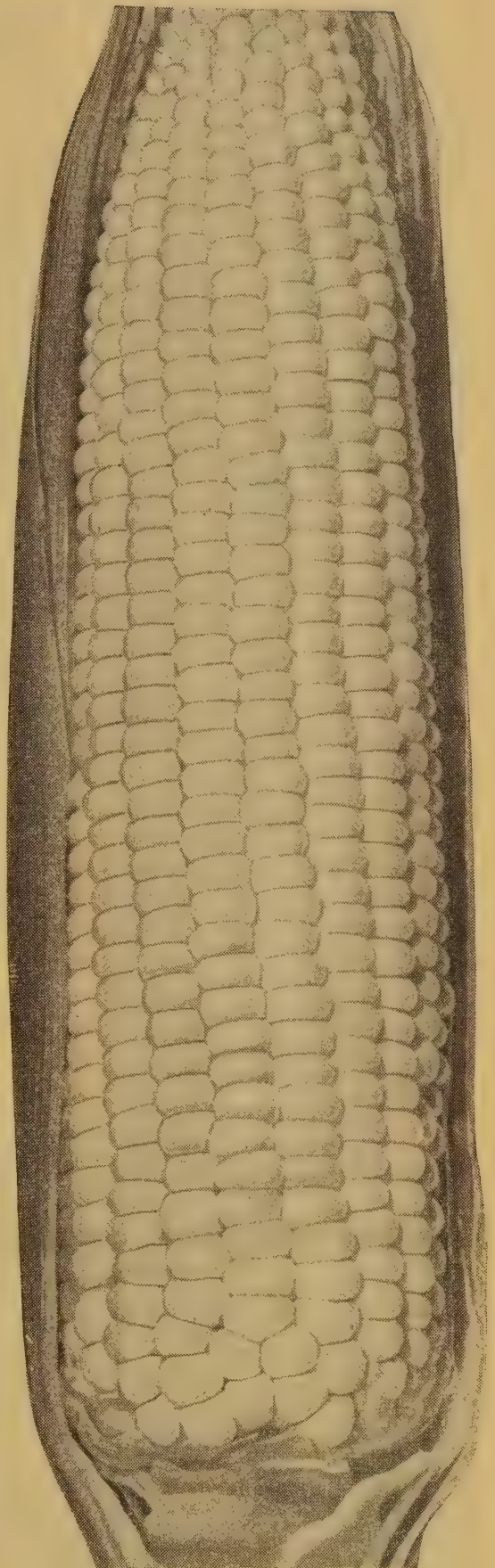

How to Grow Sweet Corn

Plant seed after all danger of frost has passed and the soil has become thoroughly warm, in rows 2½ to 3 ft. apart, spacing the seeds 4 to 6 in. apart in the row; cover with 1 in. of soil and later thin to stand 8 to 12 in. apart. Some prefer to sow 4 seeds in groups, allowing 2 to 3 in. between the seeds and spacing the groups 2 to 3 ft. apart in the row; allow 2 or 3 plants to remain in a group. Corn should be planted in blocks of at least 4 rows side by side rather than in a single long row, to insure pollination and the development of a full set of kernels. A pkt. will plant 4 rows, each about 25 ft. in length; 1 lb. will plant 300 groups or "hills."

Explanation of White Spine and Black Spine

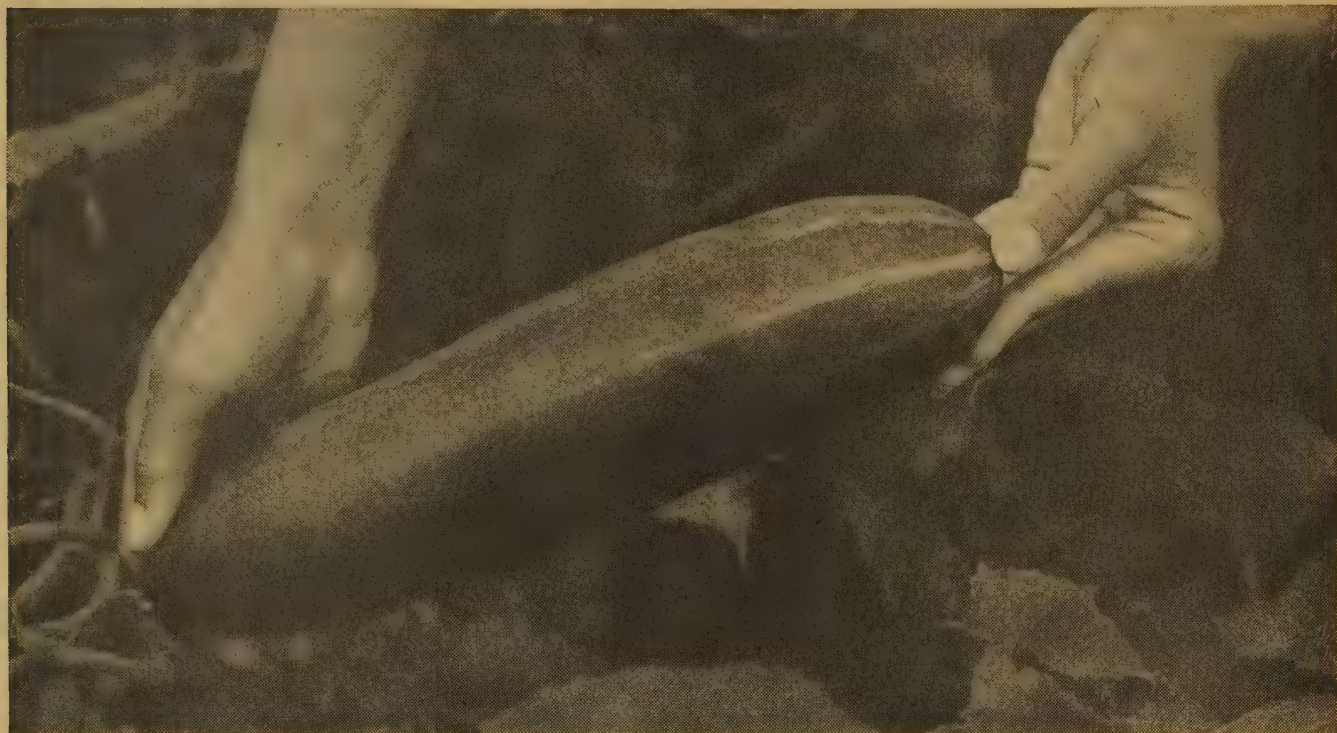
Cucumbers are divided into two families, "White Spine" and "Black Spine." The spines are the miniature stickers that protrude from the warts when fruits are young. White spine cucumbers turn to a creamy white when old; black spine varieties turn to a yellowish orange when matured. Burpee Hybrid and all cucumbers listed on the two following pages, with the exception of Improved Long Green, are white-spined; pickling cucumbers, offered on page 83, are black-spined.

How to Grow Cucumbers

Make your first sowing of cucumbers after all danger of frost has passed to supply fruits for summer use, and a second sowing 4 or 5 weeks later to furnish cucumbers for fall use and pickling. They succeed best in a fertile, light, well-drained soil. Well-rotted manure or organic matter dug into the soil where seeds are to be planted and side-dressings of commercial fertilizer after the plants have begun to grow are beneficial.

Plant in groups 4 to 5 ft. apart, placing 8 to 10 seeds in each group, and cover with ½ in. of soil. When plants are 6 to 8 in. high, thin to 3 or 4 plants to a group. A pkt. of seed will plant 15 groups; 1 oz. 50 groups or so-called "hills." Seeds may also be sown in rows 4 to 5 ft. apart, 4 to 6 in. apart in the row; later thin the plants to stand 12 in. apart in the row. To save garden space and make for easier gathering, cucumbers may be grown on a fence or trellis.

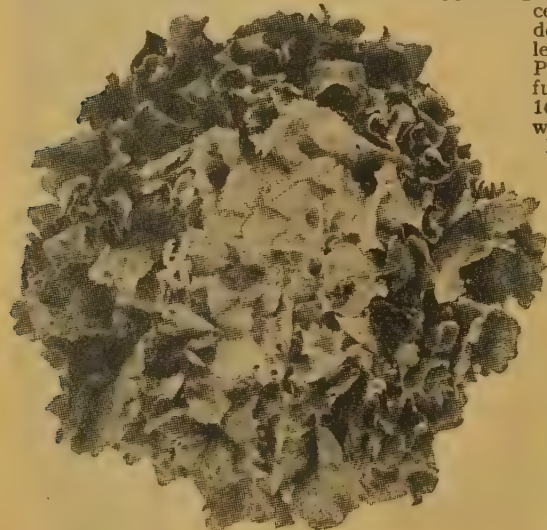

How to Grow Lettuce

How to Grow Peas

Peas make their best growth during cool weather so that the first planting of seed should be made as early in the spring as the soil can be worked. Sow an early variety two or three times at 10-day intervals or choose from the smooth-seeded early, wrinkled-seeded early and main-crop varieties. Sow again in late summer for a fall crop. Planting space available more or less governs the number of sowings and the choice between tall and dwarf varieties. Peas are usually planted in double rows 3 in. apart, the seeds dropped 2 in. apart and covered with 1 to 2 in. of soil. Double rows should be spaced about 2½ ft. apart. For best results, provide supports (wire, brush or string) for the tall-growing varieties to climb upon. A pkt. will sow 20 ft. of single row; 1 lb., 100 ft.

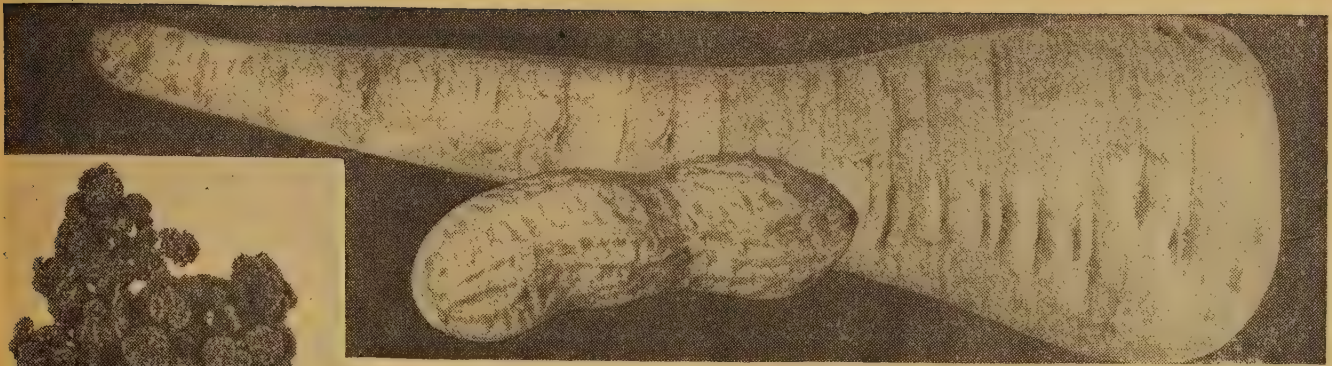

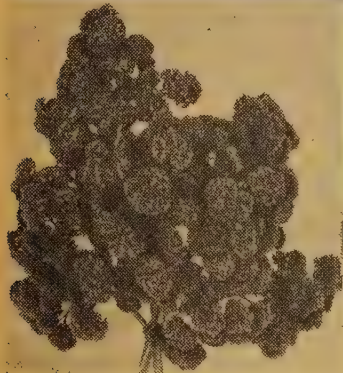

Roasted peanuts, salted peanuts, peanut butter and peanut candies are well known to all of us. Have you ever tried them baked as you would beans? Leave skins on or take them off; they are, however, more palatable if skins are removed.

Plant in rows 2½ to 3 ft. apart, spacing the shelled nuts 8 to 10 in. apart in the row, or place them 16 to 18 in. apart in the row if planted in the hulls. Cover with 2 in. of soil. Cultivate and hoe freely. In the fall, before frost, dig and hang vines under a shed or in an airy room to cure. 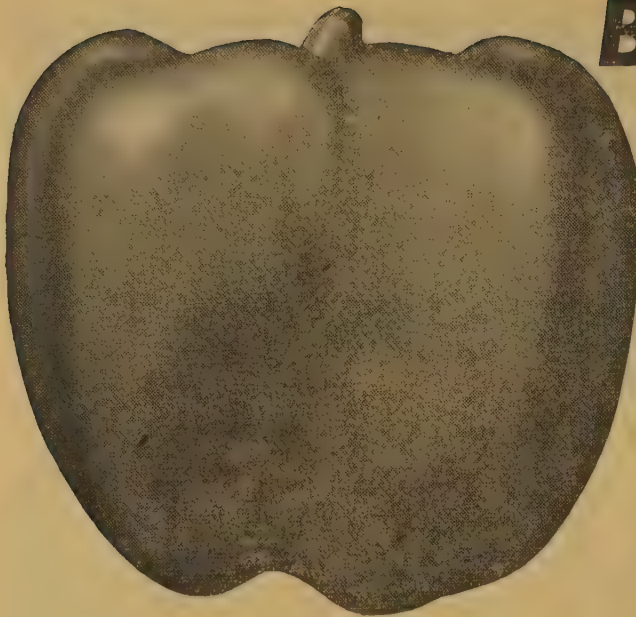

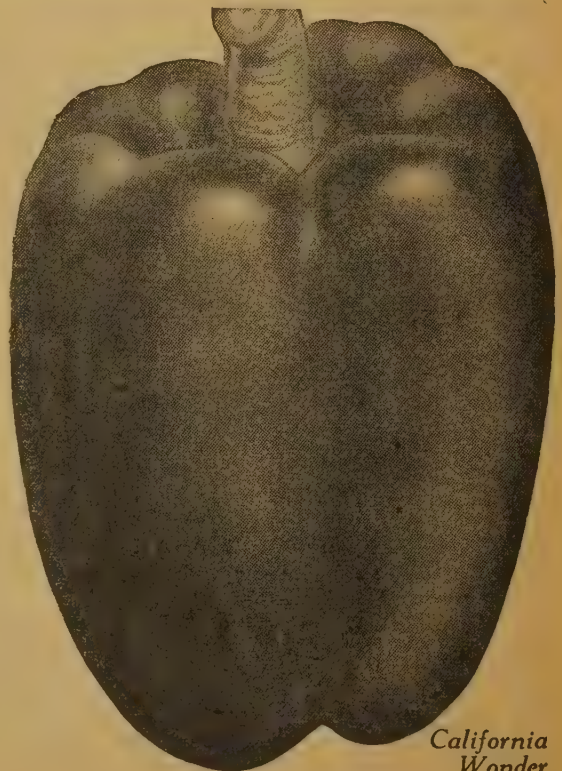

Sow seed in a hotbed or indoors in shallow boxes, pots or seed-pans of rich soil, allowing 8 to 10 weeks to produce plants large enough to set outdoors when all danger of frost is past. When the soil has become warm, set the young plants in the garden, 18 to 24 in. apart in rows 2 to 3 ft. apart. A pkt. will produce about 100 plants; 1 oz. 1500. Days mentioned in descriptions represent the average time required from the setting of the plants in the garden until the first fruits are ready for table use.

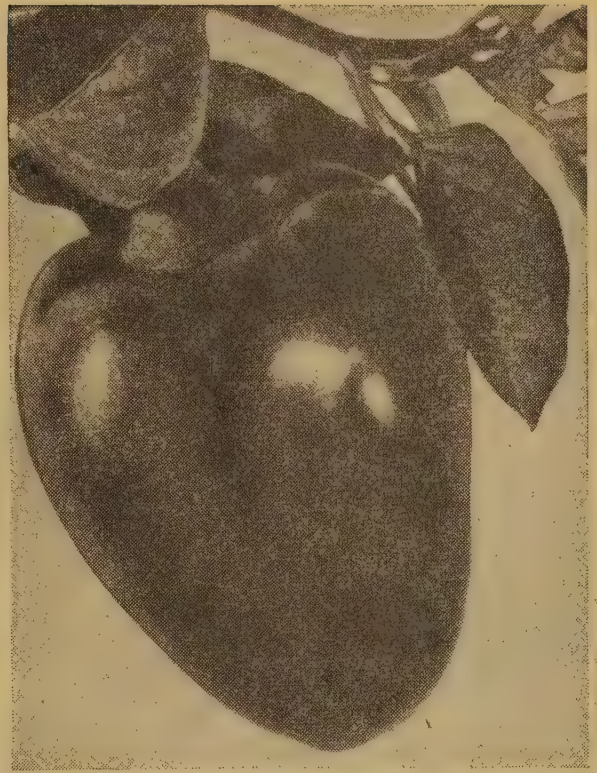

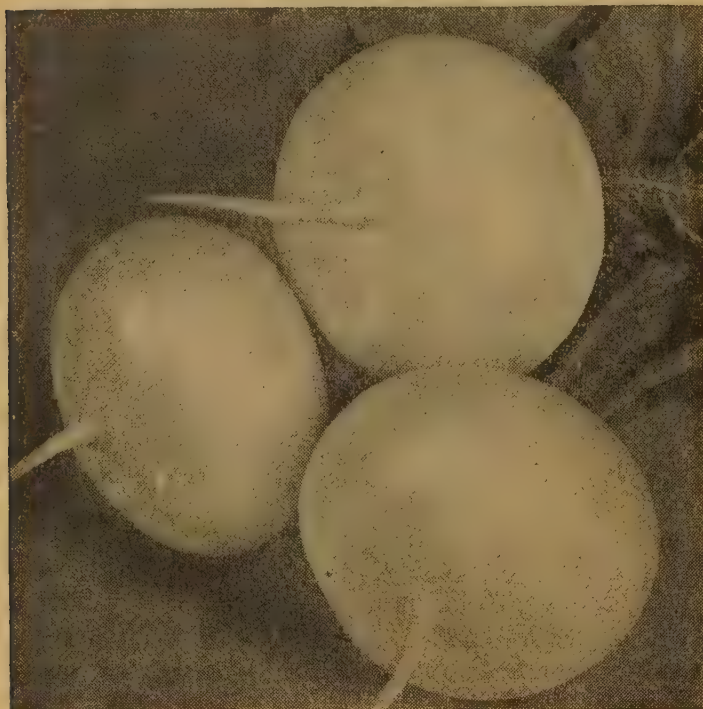

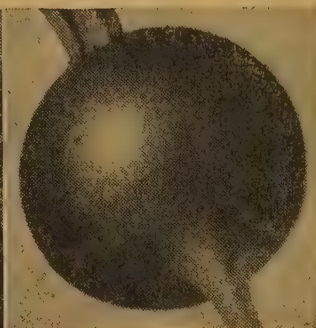
How to Grow Pumpkins

Put 5 seeds in groups, allowing 2 to 3 in. between the seeds and spacing the groups of bush varieties 4 ft. apart each way and those of the running kinds either 8 by 8 ft. or 10 by 12 ft. apart. Thin bush varieties so that 3 or 4 of the strongest plants remain in a group; running varieties allow 2 or 3 plants to a group. They may, like pumpkins, be planted among the corn. Pkt. will plant 8 to 10 groups; an oz. 30 to 40 groups.

Winter Squash. Sow seed in the same way as given above for the running varieties of summer squash; 4 seeds in a group is sufficient. A pkt. will plant 6 to 8 groups; 1 oz. 20 to 30 groups. All varieties of squash grow best in a fertile, deep soil.

Fall and Winter SQUASH

All, except the Banana squashes, produce hard-shelled fruits which may be stored for use during the winter.
