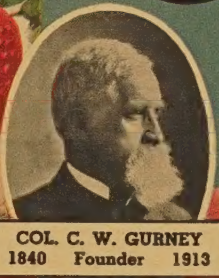

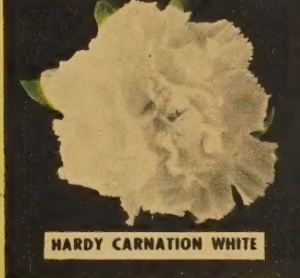

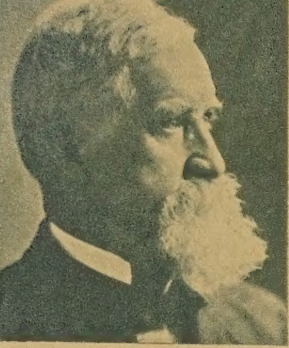

True to Name

Another thing you can be sure of when you buy from Gurney's is that what you buy will be true to name, whether it is garden seed or nursery stock or baby chicks or field seed. We have been in this business for 85 years, and we hope to be in it at least 85 more years, so we are not going to start now on any short-sighted, dishonest policy.

Gurney's Nursery Stock Is State Inspected

When you get your nursery stock from Gurney's, notice that it carries a state inspection label certifying that your nursery stock is clean and free of diseases and passes all state laws as to quality.

It Pays to Order Early

Mail your order in January or February if possible. This way we get your order booked and ready to ship to you the minute the winter breaks in your locality. You can plant earlier—and early planted stock does better.

How to Make Remittance

We are glad to take your check here at Gurney's. To make it easy for you, we put a blank check on the bottom of the order blank. A bank or money order is all right too, but if you send cash, please register your letter for your own protection.

No C.O.D.'s Please

One of the reasons that we can sell better goods at lower prices is that we don't maintain an expensive department to handle C.O.D.'s. When you buy something C.O.D. you have to pay the post office's C.O.D. charge. Why not save that?

How We Ship

Most items such as garden seed and merchandise are shipped at once. Nur-

sery stock is shipped at the proper planting time in your locality. We watch the weather reports from your locality, and ship your stock at your proper planting time. That's why we might fill your order in several separate shipments. Most nursery stock is quoted postpaid. Exceptions are so noted in the catalog—they usually are balled and burlapped evergreens and trees too big to ship parcel post. Items quoted "Express Not Prepaid" will be sent transportation collect. Be sure to give your nearest Express Station on your order.



We hope you can come and visit us sometime, and see our fields of nursery stock growing. By growing our own stock, under our own supervision, right here around Yankton, we can assure you of hardy, northern-grown stock.

Extra Payment in Nursery

Select only sound, well matured ears, but not tough ones. The sooner you use corn after picking, the better because sugar content and flavor start to change as soon as the ear is picked. Drop ears into a kettle of boiling water to which a little salt has been added. Cook 3 minutes, no longer. Take out and serve at once with plenty of butter and salt.

How to Freeze Sweet Corn

Use only best ears. Husk and silk. Cook in boiling water for 2 minutes. Take out and put in cold water. Cool as quickly as possible. How to Plant and Store Turnips and Rutabagas

Turnips and rutabagas are easy to raise and easy to store. Early varieties can be sown in the spring just as soon as you get them in the ground, but most kinds do best as a fall crop. Sow 2 to 3 lbs. to the acre the last part of July. 1 oz. of seed will drill 150 feet of row. For successive crops, make 2 or 3 plantings at about 2-week intervals.

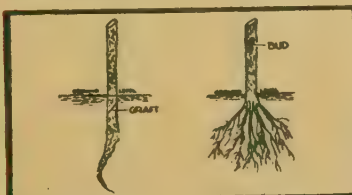

PLANT ROSA MULTIFLORA

For Field or Yard Fence

A3325—Rosa Multiflora grows vigorously in even the poorer soils, requires little ground space (its final height and spread is 6 to 8 feet), has no spreading roots to rob adjoining crops, does not "sucker" nor spread from seed.

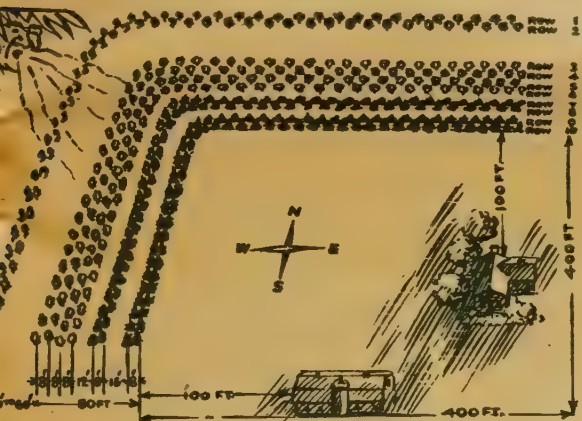
It forms a dense, thorny barrier that will stop any livestock excepting an occasional "breachy" sow. Planted as yard hedge, it stops children, dogs, bicycles, yet is a thing of beauty, having loads of small white single roses followed by masses of red berries that last through the winter. In addition, it provides food and protection for birds and small game.

You can use it as a pasture divider, contour guide, snow stop, and firebreak (there is no grassy growth beneath its branches). Its deep, fibrous roots make it ideal for erosion control.

This plant has probably received as much publicity as any. We do not recommend it for planting in large quantities north of central Ia. and Neb., unless there are established plantings in your area. However, we suggest that you try at least a dozen on your own land and see what it will do for you.

Set 18 inches apart. Beware of the tiny little "darning needle"-sized plants that are being quite widely offered. You are apt to take a terrific loss on such a small grade of plants. We ship heavy sizes only. Here are our prices:

HOW TO PLANT A WINDBREAK

A good windbreak which will protect the home and feed lot from winter winds, is easy and inexpensive to plant and practically takes care of itself.

Besides, it is a source of firewood, lumber, and posts, and is also a never-ending satisfaction in having something green and cooling right at hand for both man and animal. Gurney's have been supplying the great Northwest with hardy windbreak trees for 3 generations.

The drawing above is typical protection for Northwest winter winds. Trees for each row can be chosen according to taste or needs, but generally low trees on the outside, growing tall to about 3/4 way back, and then low again, is most practical. Evergreens are best on the inside rows. Here are suggestions:

Rows 1 and 2: Caragana, Russian Olive, Chinese Elm, Box Elder, Plum Seedlings, Willow, or Mulberry. Plants 4 ft. apart in the row. These two rows are known as snowbreaks. Leave 40 to 60 ft. between them and the next.

Rows 3 and 4: Green Ash, Chinese Elm, Diamond Willow, Laurel Leaf Willow, Golden Willow, or American Elm. Plants 6 ft. apart in the row.

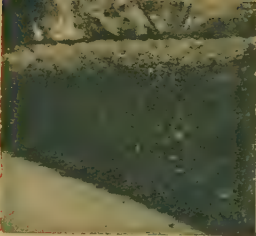
Rows 5 and 6: Cottonwood, American Elm, Chinese Elm, Green Ash, Silver Maple or Norway Poplar. Plants 6 ft. apart in the row.

Rows 7 and 8: Soft Maple, Hackberry, Mulberry, Cottonwood, American Elm, Honey Locust, or Black Walnut. Plants 6 ft. apart in the row. Or, Colorado Blue Spruce, Black Hills Spruce, Scotch Pine, American Arborvitae, or Norway Spruce at 8 to 10 ft. apart in the row.

Rows 9 and 10: Austrian Pine, Bull Pine, Spruce, Cedar, or Caragana and Russian Olive may be used again. If evergreens, 8 to 10 ft. apart in the row. If tree, 6 feet apart is the proper spacing.

EASY WAY TO PLANT

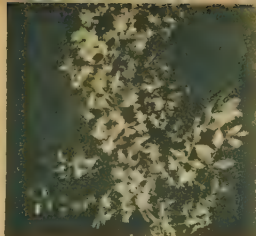
Here's a quick, easy way to plant windbreak trees. First take a walking plow, throw out a deep furrow along the row of trees to be planted. (Plow fast enough so as to throw dirt well out of furrow.) Second, put each individual tree against the straight edge of the furrow, then throw the loose dirt back in over the roots. Pack firmly with the feet. CUT ALL SEEDLINGS OR TREES BACK TO LESS THAN HALF THEIR HEIGHT AS SOON AS PLANTED (except Evergreens, which require no pruning). Use the cultivator plenty the first two summers.

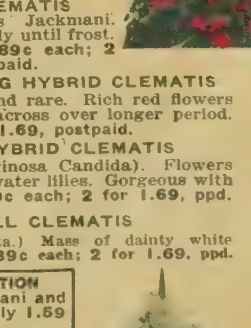

How to Plant

There's nothing to planting shrubs. Planting directions are included with every order but generally you set low growers about 2 ft. apart, medium growers 3 ft., and tall growers about 4 ft. apart. Spread roots out well, tamp earth back SOLIDLY, and prune back one-third to one-half of the growth. PRUNING IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT as the top must be cut back to compensate for the loss of roots.

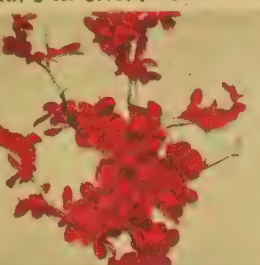
