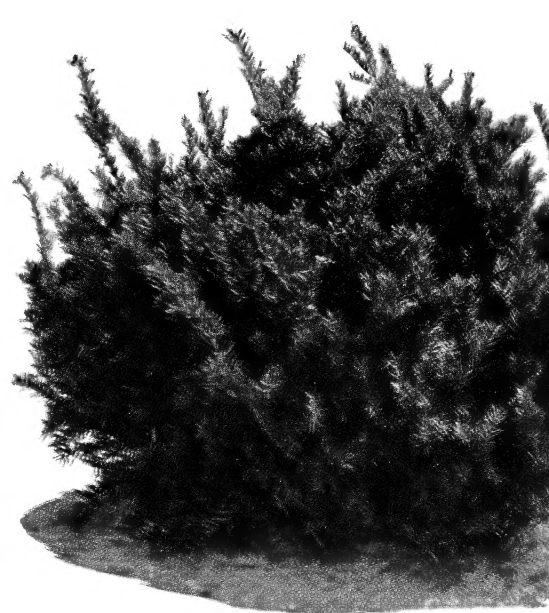
PLANT THIS FALL

ALL EVERGREENS are taken up expertly to secure the tender roots and balled and burlapped in wet moss. This eliminates fifty to sixty pounds of soil, making low cost express shipments possible, insuring excellent growth and quicker root action. In planting, remove the burlap and use peat moss in hole around roots.

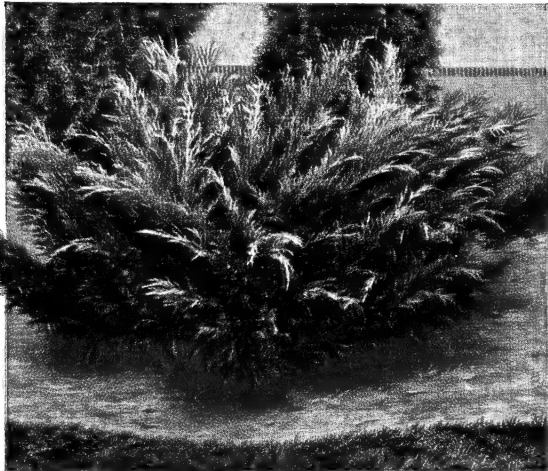
