## Monticello, Florida

In our fields we have many thousands of Azaleas and Camellias growing in the open where they get sun and the elements, so they get somewhat toughened up. These are nice bushy plants, and when transplanted and given the care they will get in most yards, they certainly respond with an excellent growth. While they don't grow quite so fast in the open field, they do make a somewhat more compact growth, and set plenty of buds.

Plants from our sandy loam soil seem to grow off well and get new feed roots

started quickly in almost any type of soil, as the balls do not form any hard crust. Try

some this season.

- Pride of Dorking: Deep clear red flowers, medium size leaves. Midseason.
- Prince of Orange: Deep orange flowers, rather spreading growth. Midseason to late.
- Pink Macrantha: Very bushy and compact small leaves, clear pink flowers, very late.
- Vervaine: Rather compact plants, pink to white, late flowering.
