Hybrid Tulips are the result of crosses between the Cottage, Breeder and Darwin Tulips. They flower approximately at the same time as the Breeders and Darwins during the month of May, with the exception of the Far Soutb, where they bloom in April. They are often marked by long, ratber pointed petals and thin, wiry stems.

They are prized for cutting becuuse of their long stems and graceful babits, and are especially adaptable for permanent, bardy flower borders where they sbould be freely planted in large clumps and in masses.
