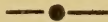
## **GUARANTEE**

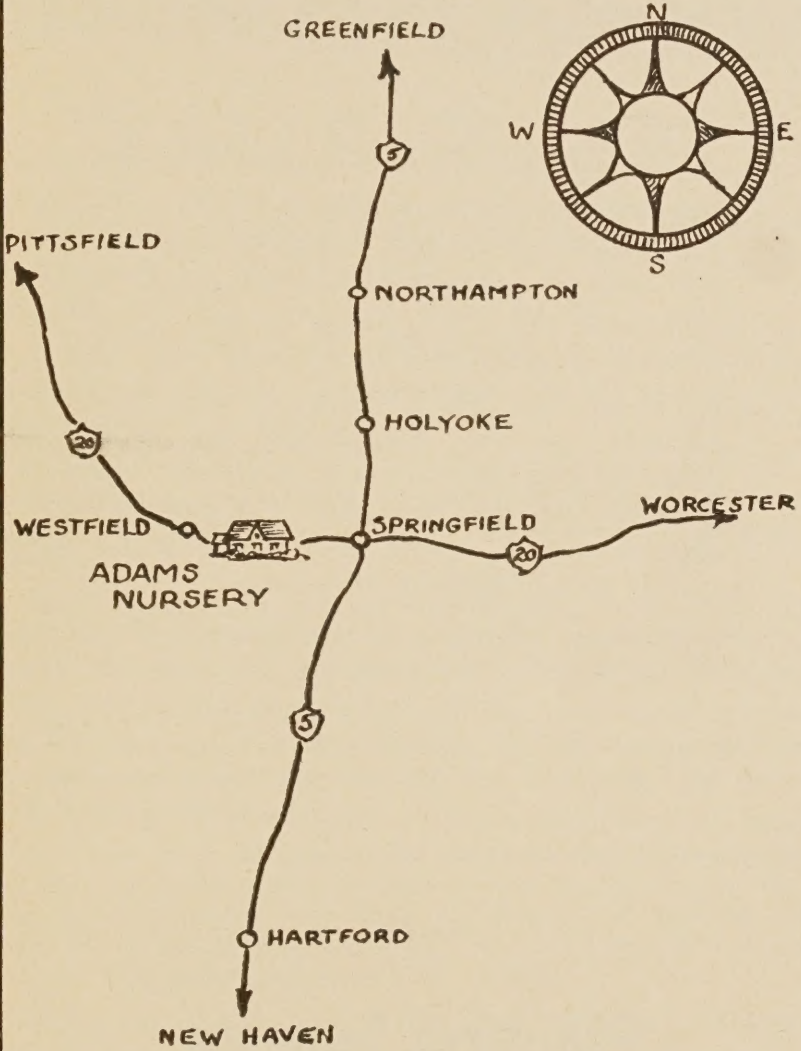

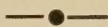
## Landscape Department
