# INSTRUCTIONS FOR ORDERING

(Please read carefully)

The numbers preceding each variety are the size and color classification. The name and numbers following each variety in ( ) is originator and year of introduction.

**MAKING OUT YOUR ORDER.** Please put everything down on the order blank just as it is listed in the catalogue. After adding it up, figure your bulb discount and add on the extra bulbs of your choosing. Minimum order \$3.00. All retail orders prepaid anywhere in the United States or Canada. Quantity prices f.o.b. Albert Lea, Minnesota.

**EXTRA BULBS FOR CASH ORDERS.** On cash orders of \$5.00 to \$10.00 you can select 10% extra in bulbs of your own choosing. \$10.00 and over select 15%. Discounts do not apply to 1954 introductions nor can they be used as extra bulbs when figuring discounts. These discounts do not apply to collections or quantity prices. All orders will receive over-count and extras but the special discount of extra bulbs is for cash orders only.

**BUSINESS TERMS.** Remittance must be included with an order from the retail list if the amount is less than \$5.00. Larger c.o.d. orders must be accompanied by 25% of their value. However, to get your special discount of extra bulbs payment in full must be made before shipment. It is our intention to send out only healthy bulbs, true to name, and we will gladly refund the purchase price if the bulbs are found unsatisfactory upon receipt. We cannot, however, guarantee results as planting conditions are beyond our control. (Note: 5 bulbs will be sold at one-half the price of 10.) Stock is state inspected both in the field and in storage.

**ORDER EARLY.** To be sure of getting the varieties you have planned on, send your orders as soon as possible. Orders for large bulbs will be filled with No. 1 size as long as they last and small bulbs will be No. 5 as long as they last. Early orders will get preference on the size.

**BULB SIZES.** In the retail list L means large size which is No. 1 and No. 2 bulbs (1¼ inch and up); M means medium size which is No. 3 and No. 4 bulbs (¾ to 1¼ inch); S means small size which is No. 5 and No. 6 bulbs (¼ inch to ¾ inch).

**CULTURAL DIRECTIONS** - A sheet of complete cultural directions will be sent with every order.

All quotations are subject to previous sale. We urge that you place your orders early so that you may not be disappointed. Each year we are unable to fill late orders for a number of varieties. Orders are segregated at once after being received, but will not be shipped until after danger of freezing is past, unless you request otherwise. However, bulbs can be sent any time desired. No substitutions will be made without your permission. If we are out of a variety you order, your money will be refunded unless you give us permission to make a substitution in size or variety.

**GOOD MORNING**, Lacey-Nieb, Class 503 (E. the Queen X Blessed Damosel)

Larger and more showy than Corona or Columbia, which it resembles in color and pattern, GOOD MORNING opens 7-8 with 6-7 in color on 18-21 bud spikes. There is a large rose band around the white florets when bloomed in normal weather, but during extreme heat the band narrows and some of the rose color migrates to the white part of the floret making a beautiful color combination. It attracts immediate and respectful attention at any show and is a heavy blue winner. The bulbs are like those of the seed parent and covered with excellent bulblets which germinate and grow well. A very rapid increaser from bulblets and a first class exhibition and commercial variety. Opens well from tight bud and keeps a long time after cutting. Of the large glads introduced this year this seems to be the best.

**SCARLET Tanager**, Kleinhans-Nieb, Class 336 (Burma X King Lear)

A world beater in everything but size, brilliant scarlet in color, opening 6-8 with 7-8 in color on 20-22 bud spikes with beautifully ruffled florets, SCARLET Tanager attracts instant and favorable attention wherever exhibited. At seedling shows it has scored as high as 88½ points and has never left a show without at least one blue ribbon. When it comes to producing bulblets this one don't know when to stop. The first seedling bulb of this variety had over 300 bulblets clinging to it. This variety seems to me to be the best of the 300 class introductions for this year.



- 440 **Bonnie Brae** (Mode - 51) This very beautiful blush salmon pink, opens 8 frilled florets on a long spike, really a ribbon of beauty. L \$.35; M \$.25; S 2 for \$.25; Blts. 25 for \$1.00.
- 440 **C.D. Fortnam** (Kadel - 50) Beautiful blush pink, opens 6 to 8 heavily ruffled florets with 8 buds in color. This is a leading show winner. A real beauty. L \$.40; M \$.30; S \$.20; Blts. 10 for \$.25.
- 590 **Cherokee** (Snyder - 53) A new and distinctive color distinguishes Cherokee. It is a rich velvety bronze red, slightly deeper to edges of petals. The blooms are beautifully formed, wide open, ruffled and fluted. It has excellent texture and opens 7 to 8 well attached, perfectly placed 5½" blooms on 30" flowerheads of 20-22 buds. Spikes grow 54" tall with dark green healthy plants. Propagation and germination excellent. Winner of American Home Ach. medal 1951; Award of Merit and various blues 1952. Rated A in Canada and Washington test gardens and scored 83½ in Michigan Trials which was second highest in gardens. Was Grand Champion at Detroit show (53). - 406 **Cream Orchids** (Fischer - 51) The waxy, creamy heavily lacinated florets more closely resembling an orchid, than does any other variety, make the name appropriate. Winner of the American Home Achievement and numerous other awards. L \$1.00; M \$.60; S \$.40; Blts. 3 for \$.25.
- 570 **King David** (Carlson — 51) King David is a class 570 deep royal majenda, or purple, with rich velvet-red throat. It is very ruffled, winged and fluted. Florets run 5½ inches in diameter with a pronounced picotee edging. It is a tall grower, producing perfectly straight spikes, carry 22 to 24 buds, holding 10 open and 10 more showing color. Unlike many purples, florets do not burn. The propagation and germination are excellent. King David has a fine record of show winnings, with 3 American Home Achievement medals, namely Minnesota '49, Boston '50, and Indiana '50. - 400 **Mother Fischer** (Fischer — 51) One of the best of the new whites, immaculately chaste, heavily ruffled and strong in vigor and growth. Surpassed only by Evangeline in height. Sometimes show a trace of pink in cool weather. Ruffling and florescence leave nothing to be desired. Really a beautiful white. None better. L \$.40; M \$.30; S \$.20; Blts. 20 for \$.25.
- 540 **Nordic Queen** (Fischer — 52) Soft glowing flesh pink, blending into a creamy-yellow throat. Nordic Queen has exceptional substance and a glistening sheen, delightfully fluted. It has a striking beauty of form, its prominent midribs giving style to the unusually broad petals. A pastel beauty deserving a place in everyone's garden. We like this one very much. - 301 **Pink Dots** White with pink dot at tip of each petal. A very intriguing arrangement glad. A must have for something different and beautiful. L \$.35; M \$.25.
- 450 **Poinsettia** (Johnson — 52) A 1952 release noted for its extreme richness of color, healthy stock and fine growing habits. A pure light spectrum red, florets slightly ruffled. It makes a large quantity of jumbo bulblets which are fairly slow in germinating. Poinsettia is a consistent producer of both show and commercial spikes. - 452 **Red Velvet** (Bastian — 52) A red of about the same color as Red Charm, save that Red Velvet has more sheen or sparkle, a more live color. It consistently makes tall spikes and I have seen no tendency to crook. It is a medium early bloomer, season about 80 days. It grows to a maximum of 60 inches with a flowerhead of 28 inches, carrying 18 to 20 buds and opening 6 to 8 wide open florets. It is a good propagator and germinator. 
