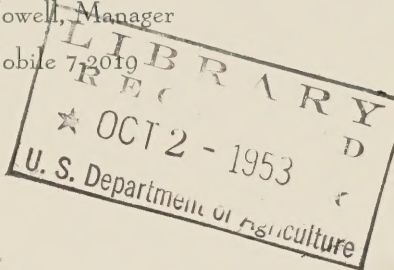

PRICES

The prices in this list are for the wholesale trade. These prices cancel all previous quotations and are subject to change without notice.

DISCOUNT

On truckload orders or where no crating of plants is necessary a 20% "cash and carry" discount is allowed on all azaleas, except liners. And on all B&B camellias and B&B ornamentals.

SHIPPING

Cash with order for immediate shipment. Please state medium of transportation—whether parcel post, express, motor freight or rail freight. For parcel post shipments allow for postage.

CLAIMS

Claims should be made immediately upon arrival of stock. Our responsibility ends when plants are delivered to the carrier. Risk and cost of transportation is assumed by the purchaser. We will correct any mistake made by us, liability in all instances limited to the purchase price of the plants.

CAMELLIA SASANQUA

PINK SNOW

The original plant was found under an old specimen of Mine-no-yuki in the garden of Mr. Paul E. Hines of Beaumont, Texas. Pink Snow is registered with the American Camellia Society. The flower is composed of ten to twelve petals and twelve to fifteen petaloids. Clear, light pink . . . occasionally mottled white, a result from grafting. Blossom measures over three inches across. Habit of growth upright, compact and formal. Foliage medium green resembling Mine-no-yuki.

We are more than pleased over the fine reception the following new varieties of Sasanquas received. It is suggested that you make it a point to see them blossom this fall . . . then you, too, will be a Sasanqua enthusiast.

CHOJIGURUMA

(Cho chee goo roo mah). This is a strange sort. Occasionally, two distinctly different types of flowers. One anemoneforme, rose pink, like a miniature Prof. Sargent . . . the other is a large single, two-tone, like Oleifera sasanqua. Colorful foliage. New growth a striking red to purplish.

FLAPPER (Ocean Springs)

The Ville de Nantes of sasanquas. Single to semi-double. Petals with pure white base rouged red. (Reminding of a young girl in her first effort with make-up.) Dog-eared petals project from center. Pollen a chrome yellow, vividly different. This is a gay number. In grafts only.

HINO DE GUMO

(He no day goo mo). The largest single flower we know of in sasanquas. White, margined amaranth pink. Petals crimped, wavy. Handsome, narrow, deep green leaves. Darn nice.

HIODOSHI

(He oh dough she). The most fascinating variegated sasanqua. No two blossoms alike. The crimson and white blossoms, moire pat-

tern, measuring two and a half to three inches, with nine petals. Profuse bloomer. Thick, deep green foliage.

HIRYO NISHIKI

(He ree yo knee she key). Beautiful cherry-red, blotched white. Semi-double. Petals narrow, wavy. Petaloids. The hardiest blossom of this lot. Growth tall and slender.

LITTLE GEM

(Kowgyoku—Cow gee oh koo). Full double . . . imbricated. White to faint pink. Erect growth, dense. Foliage different. Interestingly beautiful. Does not set buds when young, but in profusion when aged.

OLEIFERA

(Oh lay ee fay rah). Large white with deep pink margin. Crinkled petals. Fast grower. And so will your fondness be after you see it.

SHISHIGASHIRA

(She she gah she rah—Beni Kantsubaki). Double, bright rose-red. Dwarf. Excellent for patios, rock gardens and pot culture. Foliage deep green, dense. Blooms profusely, and when young. Some liners with buds.

USU BENI

(Ooh sue bayney—Showa no sakae—Usuiro Kantsubaki). Sea shell pink sometimes mottled white. Flower increases in size as it ages on the plant. Color changing from pink to orchid pink. Enchanting! Buds often set on one-year grafts six to twelve inches down the stem in clusters of two or more. Liners will set buds. Truly a heavy bloomer. Flowers last. Considered the finest of this group.

NOTE: Our field plants are grafts, two years and older and with buds. Most of the above varieties are better as a graft for a quick start. Additional varieties in grafts and in liners are
