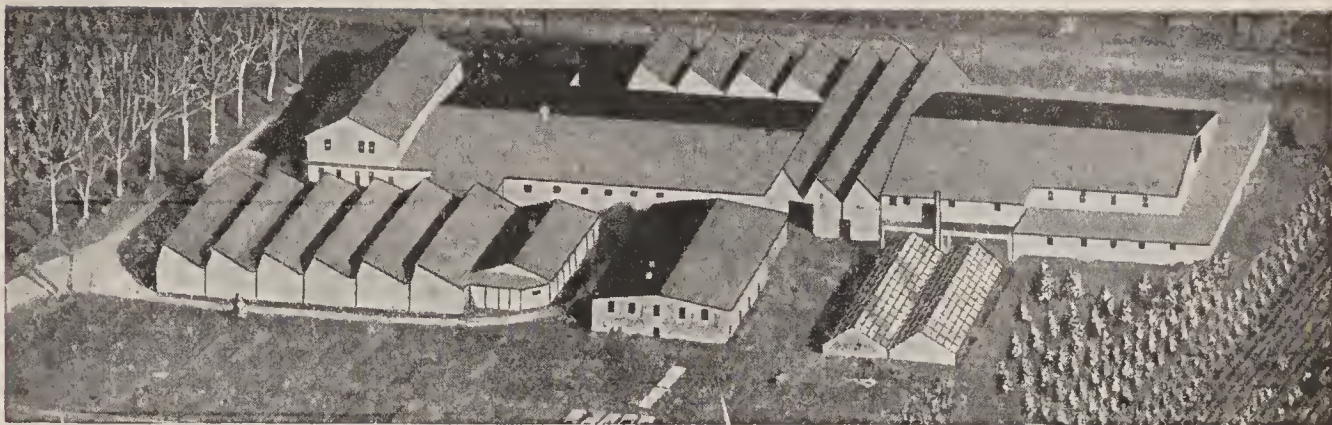

CULTURAL DIRECTIONS FOR GROWING ROSES

Follow these simple directions and all should succeed with our hardy roses. The plants should be unpacked as soon as received from the nursery and planted. If weather conditions do not permit immediate planting, bury roots in moist soil, being sure to pack soil firmly around roots to eliminate air pockets.

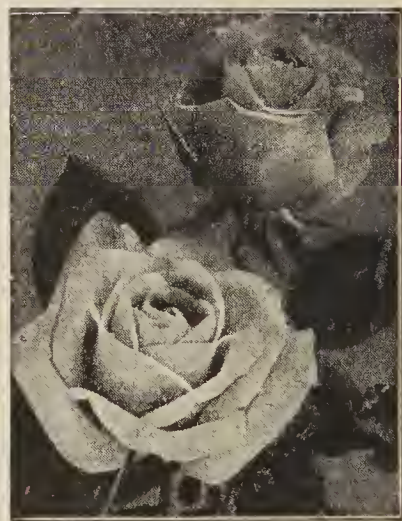
Dig large hole which will accommodate roots so they can be spread out naturally. A well drained soil is essential. With heavy soils adequate drainage should be provided. Plant below the bud or where the branches start. This is usually about 2 inches deeper than they grow in the nursery row. After planting, mound up about 6 inches high around top of plant. Cut off top of rose bushes 1 or 2 inches above top of mound. Do not remove mound for at least ten days. Plant roses in beds 18 to 24 inches apart. Water well when planting. Fertilize with manure or any good commercial fertilizer about two weeks after roses have been planted.
