Stoneville 3202 is the latest improvement of the well-known Stoneville 5-A cotton. It is especially adapted to those areas where light foliage and early maturity are of primary importance.

In addition to light foliage and early maturity, Stoneville 3202 has the additional quality of high gin turnout as indicated by various Experiment Station tests.

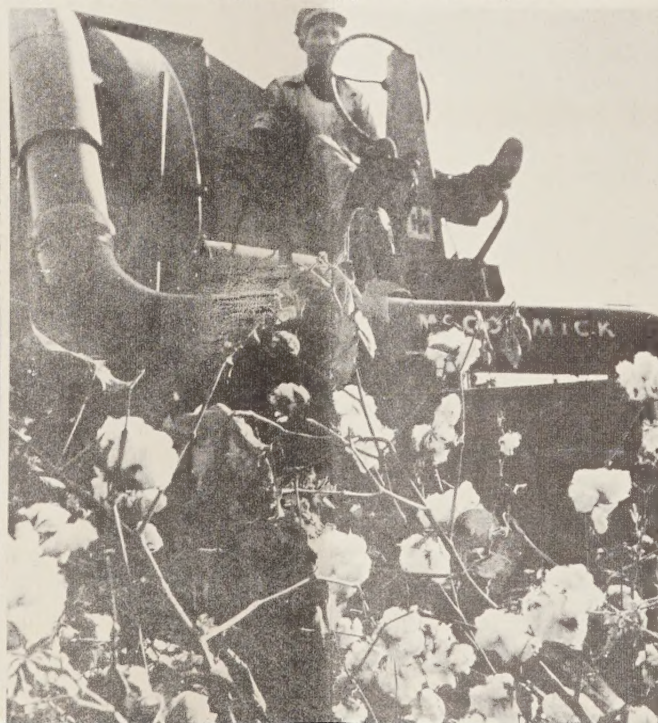
Among the many successful growers of Stoneville 3202 is D. F. Flanagan, Leland, Mississippi. Mr. Flanagan

has planted Stoneville 3202 for five years. His farm is 100% mechanized. He uses three mechanical pickers, cross plows and uses flame cultivation.

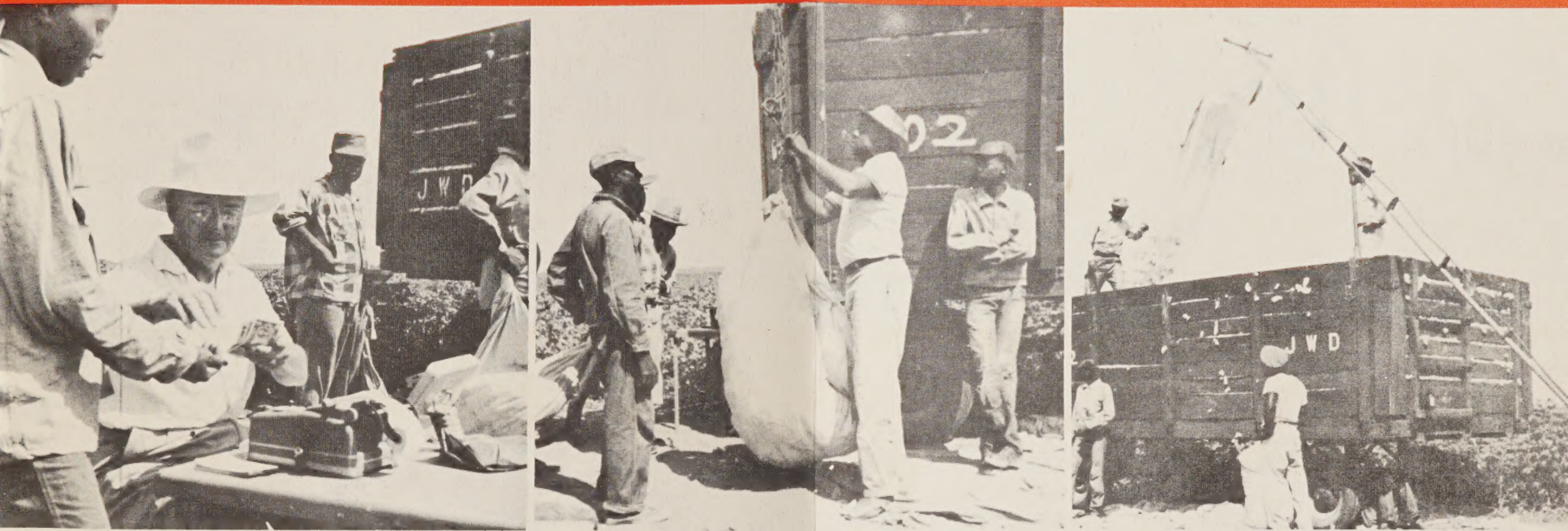
"I like Stoneville 3202 for its earliness and the fact that it stays in the boll and cleans up well. These factors are most important for machine picking. I am also very pleased with its high production record—it looks like we should pick between 650 and 700 bales off 450 acres this year."

Mr. Flanagan picks almost entirely by machine. He says that Stoneville 3202 picks well in the field and has excellent storm proofness.

Scenes showing some of the operations on the John Dickens Plantation, Leland, Mississippi. Claude Mansker, manager, is shown in picture at left.

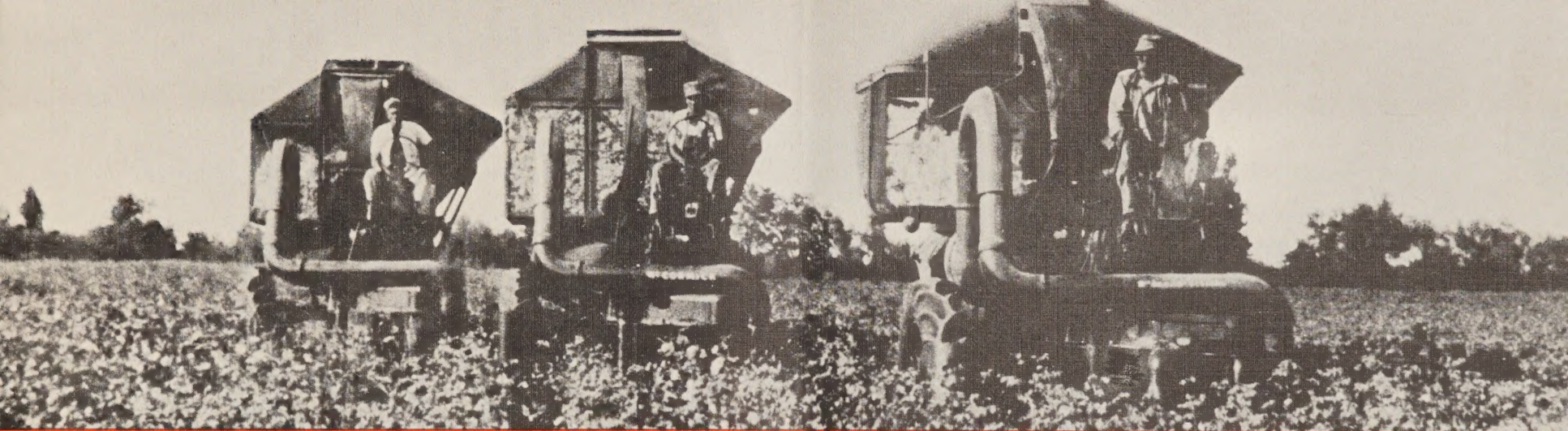

Gentlemen:

We have been planting Stoneville 5A cotton seed for the past four years and have found it to be the most satisfactory cotton we have ever planted. It is about ten days earlier in maturing than any other varieties we have planted in the past. It has a high gin turnout, about 37 to 38 per cent lint. The staple runs in length from 1-1/32 to 1-1/16 inches and our average yield the past four years has been a little better than a bale to the acre.

We have planted many varieties of cotton the past 38 years but had never found a variety that fully suited us until we started planting Stoneville 5A. Our crops for the past four years have been planted 100 per cent in Stoneville 5A, and we will continue to use this variety exclusively.
