Stoneville 3202 Increase Farms Are Constantly

Stoneville 3202 is the latest improvement of the wellknown Stoneville 5-A cotton. It is especially adapted to those areas where light foliage and early maturity are of primary importance.


In addition to light foliage and early maturity, Stoneville 3202 has the additional quality of high gin turnout as indicated by various Experiment Station tests.

Among the many successful growers of Stoneville 3202 is D. F. Flanagan, Leland, Mississippi. Mr. Flanagan has planted Stoneville 3202 for five years. His farm is 100% mechanized. He uses three mechanical pickers, cross plows and uses flame cultivation.

"I like Stoneville 3202 for its earliness and the fact that is stays in the boll and cleans up well. These factors are most important for machine picking. I am also very pleased with its high production record—it looks like we should pick between 650 and 700 bales off 450 acres this year."

Mr. Flanagan picks almost entirely by machine. He says that Stoneville 3202 picks well in the field and has excellent storm proofness.
