C.—cutting, which means just what a leaf produced, usually about 3 plantlets; many leaves however produce only 1 plantlet; we try to strike a satisfactory average for you. Usually cuttings are ready for you to divide and pot separately; very new varieties are sometimes too small to be divided; reset too-young cuttings in starting medium and grow them on for a while before dividing; don't divide until plantlets are an inch high and sturdy; many divide too young for good results. R.L.—rooted leaf, some of them rooted in charcoal water; set these out in starting medium, turn a glass over for a week, and they should produce plantlets for you soon. L.—leaf fresh cut from plant. No G.—insufficient stock to allow as gifts.
