# 1955 INTRODUCTIONS 

From L. F. PEHRSON, Fafayette, Minn.

## EXCALIBUR-(450) (Late midseason) Seedling 837-11 Pehrson

Like the legendary sword of Sir Walter Scott's stories-long, slender, straight, dependable, Excalibur is a bright, self-colored medium red, with a light ruffle, and somewhat raised mid-ribs.

Opens 6-9 in the field and up to 10 indoors out of a total of 20 to 24 buds, with 6 more in color. Height usually $54^{\prime \prime}$ to $58^{\prime \prime}$. Flowerheads to 34. Attachment is very good. Seldom has a misplaced floret.

Stems are slender and stiff making very whippy, beautifully proportioned spikes. Bulblets are quite small and produced abundantly.
The outstanding characteristic of this glad is its ability to produce fine spikes despite long periods of heat and drought. There has never been a short or crooked
spike. We believe it may frequently beat more massively constructed reds on the show table because it will be easy to find that "good spike at the right time." Cut flower growers will like its ease of cutting.

It opens well in the field and water, too, so its value as a commercial is obvious. A spike I cut in the bud before a frost and placed in water, opened and held $10 . "$

KOERNERS MEMORY (E. C. Cole $x$ Multipetal No. 1)
18 petals, $3^{\prime \prime}$ flowers, 12 buds, 4 open, 4 in color on a $40^{\prime \prime}$ plant. Salmon color with cream throat, giving a peaches and cream effect. Sometimes reverts back to single. Very good for floral work and valuable for hybridizers.

## FRILLS OF PINK-Beauty's Blush x Multipetal No. 1

## BENGAL ROSE-(562) (Huntress x Evangeline) (Midseason)

In recent years the deep rose class has been greatly strengthened, but there is still a lot of room for top notch varieties. BENGAL ROSE is just that in color.

Add to this fine color these other characteristics and you have a really grand glad. Tall spikes- 5 feet and more-always straight and with $21 / 2-\mathrm{ft}$. flower heads, 20-22 buds, 8 open, perfectly arranged with $6-8$ in color. Florets over $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ in size and tightly attached.

The giant plants have broad leaves that stay green to the very end of digging and bulbs are disease free, easy to handle and large in size, and high crowned. A good type bulb to sell over the counter, due to its attractive appearance and so satisfying to the customer who is looking for those "big" bulbs when he buys. Makes lots of bulblets that germinate well and make good size bulbs from bulblets.

MADRIGAL-(442) (Evangeline x Corona) (Midseason)
Azalea pink, deeper diffused throat. A "different" pink that holds a great appeal for florist and amateur alike.

Husky plants with spikes up to 5 feet high, with $30^{\prime \prime}$ flower heads. $19-20$ buds, 8 open, well placed and tightly attached and $5-7$ in color. A fine exhibition glad asi well as a promising commercial.

Look at these show winnings!
Seedling award Rochester 1952. Trial grounds in 1953 rated at 83 with one operator noting it as "outstanding in every way- 10 florets open." Shown at the C.G.S. show in Brampton 1954, it was placed first in its color class over strong opposition.

Produces "millions" of bulblets that grow like weeds into good size bulbs in one year. Bulbs very healthy, clean well, and
handle easily. High crowned and large size that customers like.

REDHEAD-(Animation $x$ Commando)

## (536) (Early Midseason)

Soft self scarlet quite similar to its pollen parent Commando, a color that is quite different from most in this color class. The 536 class really needs some new faces as there are relatively few in it.

Tall strong plants $53^{\prime \prime}-55^{\prime \prime}$, Spikes always straight and flower heads $24^{\prime \prime}-26^{\prime \prime}$. $20-22$ buds, 8 open, well placed and attached and 6-7 in color. One year we noted 10 open in the field.

Honorable mention 1953 Trial Grounds with an average score of 84 and an award of merit from the British Gladiolus Society. Splendid bulbs. Bulblet production quite good but not a RUNAWAY. An excellent early glad that should do well everywhere.

## Two Butterfly Varieties for 1955 <br> EMILY'S BIRTHDAY-(Sdlg. x Sdlg.) <br> (324) (Very Early)

A fine addition to the few Butterfly varieties we now have. This one is ruffled and needlepointed and you will be pleased with the way it makes up into arrangements. In color it is an apricot salmon with a yellow throat dusted with scarlet.

First let's explain the rather odd name. The first year, it opened on July 9th and the latest date noted in any year is July 15th. July 9 th is Mrs. Emily Butt's birthday and at that time in our district we never even have glads in bloom from outdoor planting, so this name helped identify this exceptionally early glad and it has been called that for several years.

Medium tall spikes, always straight, 16-18 buds, 7-8 open and several in color, well placed and attached. Its strong point is
its extreme earliness (our first bloom by far) blooming when glads are a good price. A good butterfly type.

## KERRY DANCER-(Bo-Peep x Atom) (336) (Early)

This delightful ruffled Butterfly variety is an attractive shade of scarlet with a yellow throat dusted with specks of red. Delightful when arranged in a bold colored container either by itself or combined with other flowers.

Medium height spikes, always straight and with $6-7$ of the $15-16$ buds open and 5-6 in color. Excellent placement and attachment. Florets about $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ in size, just over the maximum measurement in the 200 class, so it is very close to being a ruffled miniature.

Bulblets are large, produced freely and germinate and grow well. Bulbs are of the golf ball type so dear to the hearts of all glads fans and disease resistant. KERRY DANCER embodies the spirit of grace and rhythm that is typified by the kerry dancer immortalized in song and music that is so close to all our hearts.
