**BUCCANEER.** (Pat. No. 1119) Brilliant, unfading yellow buds open to cup-shaped flowers of about 30 petals, fragrant and long lasting. Of the new Grandiflora class, the plant is very tall and vigorous, with handsome healthy foliage and blooms constantly to late fall. **\$2.50** 

**CALIFORNIA.** (Pat. No. 449) The sensational coppery orange rose bordering our driveway. Each massive bush produces hundreds of big roses each season. Buds are vivid orange, foliage bronze green. Most outstanding of the orange-toned roses, particularly fine in coastal areas. \$1.50

**DAINTY BESS.** Popular single light pink flowers with red stamens. Tall vigorous plant, excellent for massing. \$1.35

**DAMON RUNYON.** (Patent Applied For) An outstanding new red rose of great vigor, the heavy canes clothed with deep green coppery foliage. Long spiral buds of bright scarlet unfold to big 50-petalled roses of lustrous crimson, richly fragrant. One of the most free flowering of all, wonderful for cutting. **\$2.00**



# Peace

Pat. No. 591. In 1946, Peace won the All America award as the finest rose. Since then, Peace has been winning innumerable other awards and is still considered the finest of all roses. The rich yellow buds open to soft yellow blooms of immense size, each petal edged with cerise pink. The roses are very double, high centered, with petals of heavy substance, produced on strong stems, and last for many days when cut. Plants are of great vigor, with shiny, almost holly-like foliage, and bloom from early spring to late fall. \$2.50

PEACE is available also as a Climber at \$2.50; as a Tree Rose, \$5.00.

FRED HOWARD. (Pat. No. 1006) AARS—1952. This glorious yellow rose was one of the last developed by the late Fred Howard, and was named for him. Plants grow to 4 ft. high, rugged and bushy, with lustrous dark green foliage. Long yellow buds are pencilled pink at the tips; the large graceful blooms, with 50 to 60 petals, are deep golden yellow, darker at the center, and suffused with pink at the edges. Cool weather in fall intensifies the yellow tone. The rich coloring, and fragrance, lasting qualities and heavy long stems combine to make Fred Howard the ideal yellow rose for the garden and cut flowers, from early spring to late fall. \$2.00 (See page 8 for illustration in color.)

**GOLDEN HOUR.** (Pat. No. 1009) One of the famous Paul J. Howard roses, the scion of Los Angeles and California. Buds and blooms are of lovely graceful form, very double and sweetly fragrant, on exceptionally long stems with few thorns. Golden Hour is rich golden orange, with reverse side of petals glowing orange deepening in cool weather. Bushy, well branched plants are of medium height, with leathery foliage, and bloom constantly. **\$2.00** (See page 9 for illustration in color.)

**GRANDE DUCHESSE CHARLOTTE.** (Pat. No. 774) Long stemmed buds and double roses of rich Morocco red, changing to coral, with fruity fragrance; tall, vigorous bush. **\$2.00** 

**HEART'S DESIRE.** (Pat. No. 501) AARS—1940. The rich deep red, non-fading, and true rose fragrance of this beautiful rose is not surpassed by any of the newer roses. Vigorous tall bush with luxuriant deep green foliage, nearly always in bloom. **\$1.75** (See color illustration on page 8.)

**HENRY FORD.** (Pat. No. 1218) This new Howard rose, the result of a cross between The Doctor and Pink Dawn, has long spiral buds and beautiful double, broad-petalled blooms of clear peach pink, intensely fragrant. The rugged bushes are free flowering, with heavy foliage. We consider this one of the finest pink roses. **\$2.25** (See color illustration on page 8.)

**LA JOLLA.** (Pat. No. 1103) Lovely buds and blooms of soft lilac pink, varying to cream and gold at the center; petals are broad and wavy. Plant is upright, vigorous and bushy, with glossy foliage; blooms freely. **\$2.75** 

**LOWELL THOMAS.** (Pat. No. 595) AARS—1944. Tightly furled golden yellow buds, large graceful canary yellow blooms with tea fragrance; plant thrives everywhere. **\$2.00**

MME. HENRI GUILLOT. (Pat. No. 664) One of the most richly colored roses; long buds and large open fragrant flowers of reddish orange to raspberry rose, on long strong stems. Big bushy plant with handsome foliage. \$2.00

OLIVE PERCIVAL. (Pat. No. 944) This Paul J. Howard rose belongs in every rose garden.
