CORTLAND-Vigorous grower, heavy cropper. Flesh is purest white, not darkening in salads. Medium size, shiny red and quite crisp

## WINTER APPLES

HARALSON-A great big red apple originated by Minn. Fruit Breeding Farm that ranks tops in every way. Quality excellent. They keep in ordinary cool cellar all winter. ## CRAB APPLES

Chestnut -Large high quality dessert crab, keeping well into Nov. Flesh yellow, skin a light red blush or striped over yellow.
EARLY STRAWBERRY-Early, hardy, good yielding crab. Good eaten fresh or canned. SWEET RUSSETT-Very sweet and tastes like pear ; good canner and heavy yielder. Fruit greenish, ripening to yellow, with russet cast.
