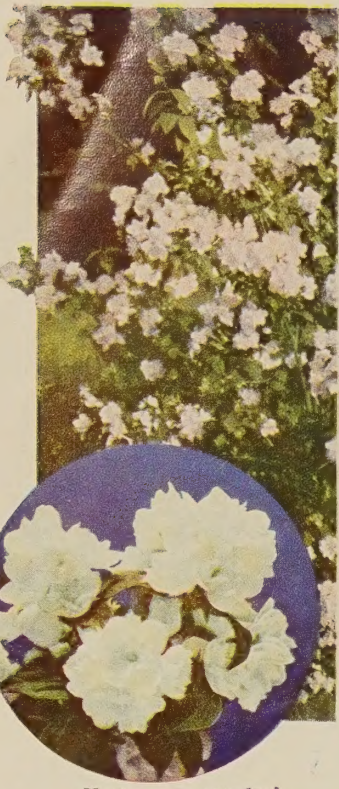
**PLANTING SEASONS.** While some planting is done throughout the year, the heavy planting is from October to May. Bulbs and Evergreens begin moving in early October, Deciduous Shrubs and Trees by November first.

**TRANSPORTATION CONDITIONS.** All plant material and supplies, unless otherwise specified, are offered f.o.b. our nursery. Shipment can be made by parcel post, express, freight, or motor freight, depending somewhat upon size of shipment. Small items offered in this folder can be sent by parcel post to points within a radius of three hundred miles by adding to your remittance 15% of the list prices to cover postage and special packing; three hundred to six hundred miles, 20%.

**TERMS.** Net cash, or 25% deposit on C.O.D. shipments. Remittances may be made by money order or personal check.

**REPLACEMENT GUARANTEES.** We are very careful in keeping our varieties true to name—and seldom have a report of plant material proving otherwise. In such instances we limit our adjustments to either refunding without charge or refunding full purchase price. Losses from transplanting our vigorous, carefully handled plant material are at a minimum, but we agree to share with our customers on a fifty-fifty basis any losses reported within 12 months from date of delivery by refunding at half catalog list price, provided original purchase was paid for as per sale terms and plant material has been given reasonable attention.

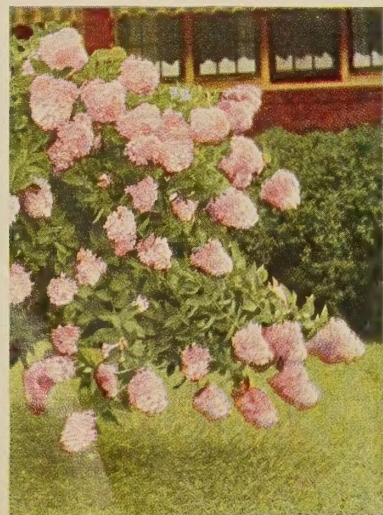

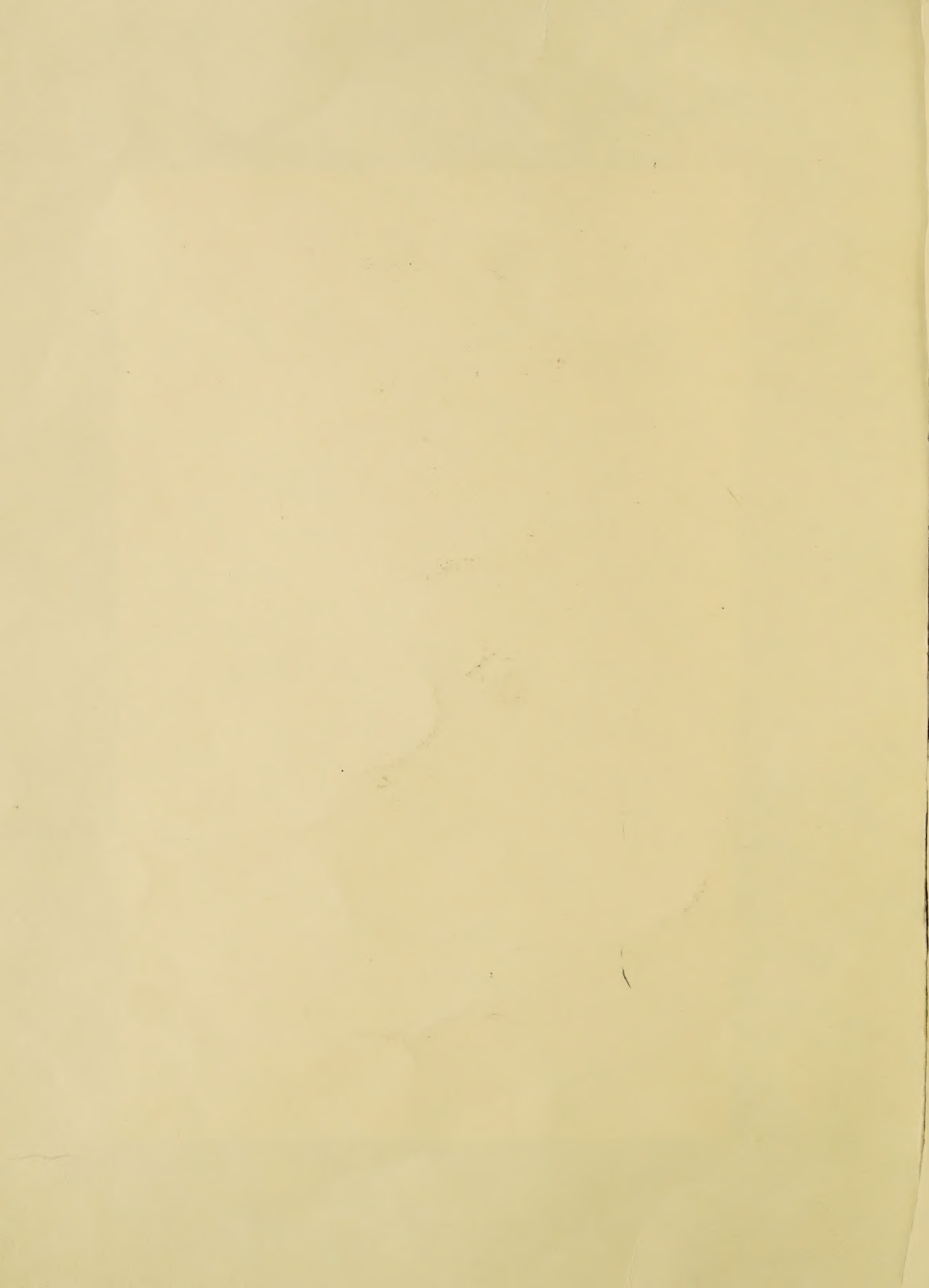
