The approximate maturity dates given will show the relative time when different varieties will be ready to use.

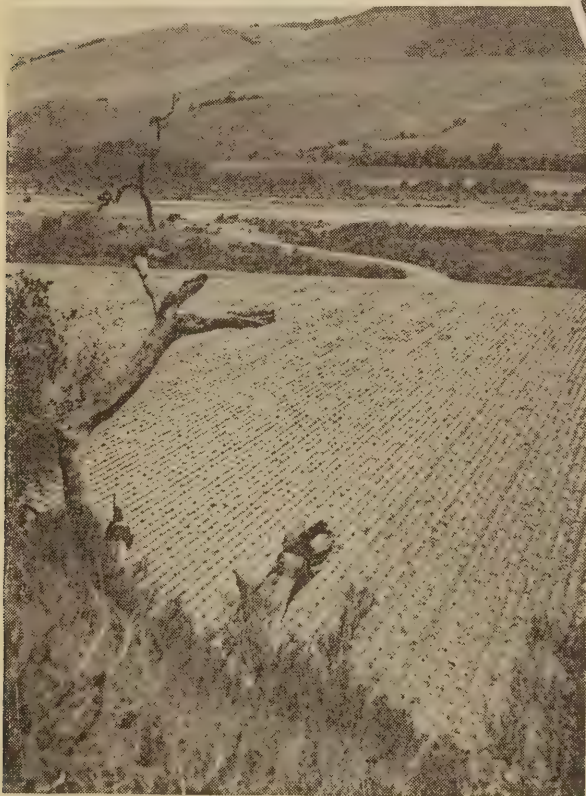
