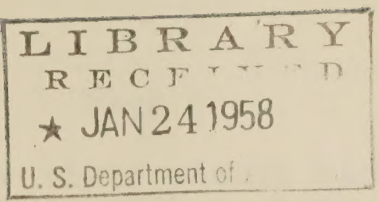

KOHLERIAS

- AMABILE- Lovely soft apple green foliage, chocolate markings, rose pink flowers Bulbs .50
- ERIANTHA- Dark green foliage, red edge, bright red flowers Bulbs .50; cuttings .40; seeds-small packet .50
- LINDEANII- Brownish green foliage, brown markings, white flowers Bulbs .50; plants .75-1.00; seeds-small packet .50
- BOGOTENSIS- Dull green leaves, brownish shadings, Bulbs .50; plants .75-1.00; seeds-small packet .50
- SCIADOTYDEA- Hybrid. Lovely green foliage, flowers in many shades of purple with white or brown dots. Bulbs .50; plants .75-1.00; seeds 1.00

RECHSTEINERIAS

- CARDINALIS- Green foliage, bright red flowers, will bloom several times in a year. Bulbs .50; plants .75; seeds .75
- MACROPODA- Lovely dark green foliage, bright red flowers shading toward orange. Bulbs .50; plants .50-1.00; seeds 1.00
- LINEATA- Almost the same as above except the stems have red streaks and the blooms more on an orange red, dark marks in throat. Bulbs .50-1.00; plants .75-1.00; seeds 1.00
- LEUCOTRICHA- New and very lovely pale green leaves frosted with white hairs. Seedling plants 2½" pots 1.00
Seeds when available 1.50
- LEOPOLDII- Similar to Cardinalis, foliage lighter, vines, flowers cherry red. Small bulbs .75; no plants until Spring
- WARSCEWICZI- Tall silver frosted pale green leaves, brilliant orange flowers Seeds 1.00; plants 1.00

SINNINGIA

- EUMORPHA- Dark green leaves, white pouch shaped flower. Seeds 1.00
This is one of the parents of many of the new crosses.
- MACROPHYELLA or BRAZILIAN SLIPPER- Dark green leaves, silver veins, dark blue blooms, red underneath. Seeds 1.00
- REGINA- As above - no red under leaves Seeds 1.00

GLOXINERA

Several crosses between the Sinningia and the different Rechsteinerias such as Rosabells, by Schulz and similar ones by Neil Ackerson and others.

Small plants when ready 1.00; seeds 1.00; larger bulbs when ready 1.50.

This will be a scarce item so would suggest orders be placed early and we will ship as soon as available. These plants have the large dark green leaves with the different shades of rosy red to bright red and pinkish bells hanging down. A sturdy and compact plant which will hold its shape well.

EPESCIAS

These are lovely basket or shelf plants much admired for their unusual foliage Evergreen and some will be heavy bloomers all year.

Plants 1.00; cuttings .50; seeds 1.00 with the exception of Canal Zone Yellow. Plants 2.50; cuttings 1.00. Canal Zone Bronze, Canal Zone Jade Green, Canal Zone quilted both green or bronze, Canal Zone Dark Marie.

Furred Species. Plants 1.75; cuttings 1.00

ROEHRS LILACINA- Jade green foliage, blue flowers - Cuttings 1.50.

FANNY HAAGE- Blue flowered broad pattern of green foliage.

CHONTALENSIS- Blue flowered, small leaf, light center vein.

EMERALD QUEEN- Red flowers, emerald green foliage, silver midrib.

ACAJOU- Broad silver pattern on dark background, red flowers.

SILVER SHEEN- Leaves silver with dark margins, red flowers.

HARLEQUIN- Smooth leaves, dark brown edges, red flowers.

VIRIDIFOLIA- Smooth nile green leaves, red flowers.

TETRA- Peterson. Similar to Viridifolia only bloom is larger.

WESTWOOD- Peterson. To me this is one of the most beautiful. The foliage is either bright green soft with an antique gold sheen or soft Antique gold overcasts to foliage depending on food and light; red flowers with orange in them.

CHOCOLATE SOLDIER- Beautiful foliage, red flowers, free bloomer.

DIANTHIFLORA- White fringed flower, dull finished fat green leaves.

PUNCTATA- White flower, brown specks in throat.

LADY LU- Mottled pink leaf, red flower. Plants 3.00.

CANAL ZONE

BUTTER BALL- Crinkled bright green foliage, bright butter yellow flowers.

DARK MARIE- Very dark foliage, hairy indented veins, very unusual.

BRONZE QUILTED- Bronze smooth foliage, veins quilted, red flowers.

GREEN QUILTED- Bright green foliage, veins quilted, red flowers.

JADE- This is a beautiful thing, veins are indented and it has a silver sheen bloom over the foliage, flowers red.

Cuttings 1.00

HAZE- Dark foliage, hairy purple bloom on foliage.

FURRED QUILTED- Dark foliage, quilted fur, red flowers.

GREEN GILT- The foliage is very lovely on this green vein on darker green foliage and splashed with golden green on leaves, red flowers.

MARIE- This is very lovely. The foliage is thick, almost puffed in appearance and thickly pebbled, red flowers. This one will not be ready until Spring and will be scarce..

Seeds 1.50; seedlings 2.00; cuttings 1.50

These are the most outstanding of the Canal Zone but will have a lovely mixed seedlings 3" pot next shipping time at .75 cents each.

COLUMNEA

These are striking plants for basket, some being very compact while others grow larger. The flowers are striking in shades of red, orange with brown markings, yellow, rose.

Easy to grow and most of them, if kept moist and fed, given sunlight and a mixture of Osmunda or Orchid bark and peat will bloom all year.

ARGUDA- Sharp green foliage, large red flowers.

ALLENII- Small fernlike leaves, red flowers.

AURES NITEUS- Begonia Society seedlings, soft slender leaves; has not flowered as yet.

AFFINIS- Large, rough foliage with red hairs, red hairy flowers.

BANSKI- Small fat hard-finished leaves, bright red flowers.

BANSKI HYB- As above, only some red under the leaves. Will not pollinate.

DIMINUTIFOLIA- Similar to MICROPHYLLA.

GLORIOSA PURPUREA- Small fat, very dark green leaves overcast with a purple tint, buds almost black turning to fiery red flowers.

GLORIOSA SPECIES- Long slender leaves spaced far apart on stem, either orange striped with brown or red flowers.

HIRTA- Very compact basket plant, hairy stems and fiery red flowers.

LINEARIS- Also a good compact grower if given light, sharp pointed green leaves, pink or rose colored flowers.

LEPIDOCAULA- Red flowers, yellow throat.

MICROPHYLLA- Tiny fern like foliage, flowers large scarlet.

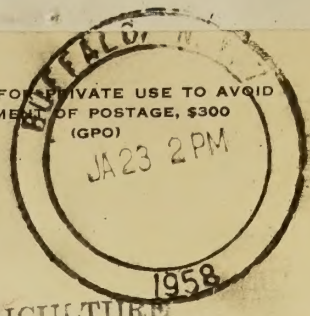

NICARAGUENSIS- Sometimes called Localis. Large green leaves, scarlet flowers.

SANQUINEA- Large rough leaf, small yellow flowers.

STENPHYLLA- Botanical Gardens dark hard finished green leaves, not flowered yet.

SCHIEDEANA HYBRID- Long narrow leaf, some red underneath, orange flowers.

SCHIEDEANA HYBRID- Very compact grower, leaves in groups and close hiding flowers. Flowers orange.

TULA FLAVA- Compact grower, yellow flowers, small green leaves, constant bloomer.

VEDRARENSIS- Botanical Gardens dark green foliage; has not bloomed.

VERECUNDA- Botanical Gardens yellow flowers.

Have about 16 new ones that haven't started to grow as have just received the shipment. At this time I am not sure what they will be. When large enough will send cuttings to growers to see if they are known.

In the future I shall have a special list of new plants received and anyone interested in Orchids will have a listing of them. Most of these will be Species.

AESCHYNANTHUS, Basket Plants

These plants are very lovely, sturdy growth, Evergreen and free flowering, with one or two exceptions do not grow too large for window space. Mixed varieties grown from seed from Mr. Hammond are lovely.

Cuttings 1.00; Plants 1.75.

SPECIOSA- Dark green hard finished leaves, red flowers

SPECIOSA #2- Dark green leaves as above only orange red flowers.

SPECIOSA #3- Larger leaves widely spaced on stem, Cinnamon flowers.

BELGIUM- Medium size leaves of dark green, young tip leaves have frosted appearance.

LOBBIANUM- Scarlet and yellow flowers, dark purple Calyx.

MARMORATUS- One of the larger growing plants, mottled foliage, green and brown flowers.

PULCHER- Bright red flowers. These are the old TRICHOSPORUM.

ALLOPLECTUS ----- Will be ready in Spring.

HYPOCYRTA NUMMULARIA ---- Lovely basket plant, small leaves, fast grower and Evergreen, the bright pouched flowers with their pouch, if grown with sun, will flower continuously. Cuttings - 1.00

NAUTILICALYX ---- These are beautiful foliage plants, flowers set deep in Auxillary Cluster.

Cuttings or rooted leaves .50

BULLATUS- Epescia Tesselata. Large pebbly leaves, yellow flowers.

LYNCHII - Olive green large leaves, yellow flowers.

FORGETTII- Has tapering leaves with chocolate herringbone markings.

STREPTOCAROUS---- These are very lovely plants with showy colorful flowers, evergreen, both the Streptocarpus and Didyocarpus Species have the strap-like leaves.

Seeds 1.00; cuttings 1.00

SAXORUM- Fat light green leaves on thick vine stem, flowers of blue.

CAULESCENS- Medium size green indented veins, flowers purple.

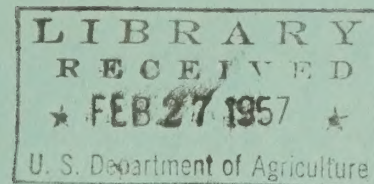
GLOXINERIA ---- These are crosses made by Cornelious Ackerson, Mr. Hammond, Peggie Schulz; all have the lovely green foliage of the Macropod or Eumorpha and the flowers vary in color thru the reds, orange and some pink. All are bell like and hang free from stem.

SMITHIANTHAS ---- These are mixed foliage and color including Orange King, Rose Queen, Compacta, Zebrina and others.

GLOXINIAS

Mixed bulbs, \$3 per doz., postpaid, not labelled. No other bulbs until spring. Seeds of the most unusual in colors, \$1, Trade Pkt. Merkle's new hybrids as follows:

Old Lace—Inside petals heavily dotted in lace pattern, large blooms, flat leaves. Red, pink, blue or cerise.

Cathedral—Highly arched white into petals, large bloom. Red, pink, blue.

Leopard Spots—Inside of throat and petals covered with both closed and open dots. Blue, purple, red, pink.

Moon Glow—Very new. Seeds, \$1.50 pkt.

Watermelon Pink—With dash of orchid inside throat, three shades of pink, large bloom.

Dusty Purple—Lighter band.

White—With touch of pink in throat.

White—Slightly fragrant.

Dark Purples—Reds and pinks, blues, violets.

Streptogloxinias—Old-fashioned name, Stroxinias. Large flowers in dark pink, dark red, with purple or maroon bands in throat.

Sinningia Eumorpha—Pouched white slipper, dark green foliage.

Macrophyella or Brazilian Slipper—Dark blue flower, green leaves with silver veins and red underneath.

Regina—Same as above, with no red underneath. Red, pink, blue and purple slippers.

EPESCIAS

Basket or trailing plants, beautiful foliage. Grown like A.V. Must be kept at temperatures above 55°.

Red Flowered—Chocolate Soldier, Silver Sheen, Emerald Queen, Harlequin, Sylvan Beauty, Splendens, Westwood. Others in new Canal Zone type. Seeds, \$1 large packet. Plants 50c to 75c. Cuttings 20c.

Blue Flowered—Lilacina, Fanny Haage, Canal Zone.

White Flowered—Dianthiflora cuttings, 35c, seeds \$1. Punctata; Dianthiflora X Punctata: Plants, 50c to 75c; seeds \$1. Some very lovely Canal Zone species, also the yellow flowered ones will be ready in the Spring.

Nautilocalyx Lynchii—Dark maroon foliage, pale yellow flowers.

Nautilocalyx Bullatus—Sometimes called Epescia Tesselato, dark green foliage.

Nautilocalyx Forgette—Very rare, green leaves, chocolate markings.

Cuttings of the Nautilocalyx only 50c; leaves 30c.

KOHLORIAS

A free blooming plant over a long period of time, raised easily from seed, makes a beautiful plant on account of its foliage.

Amabilis—Rose pink flowers, chocolate markings on leaves. Bulbs, 35c to 50c.

Bogotenis—Was called Isoloma Pictum, red flowered. Cuttings, 2 for 35c.

Sciadotydea Hybrid Arnold—Lovely shades of purple to orchid flowers. Bulbs 35c to 50c; small plants 75c.

Eriantha—Wooly orange red flowers. Bulbs 50c; cuttings 35c.

Lindinii English—Light green dark mottled leaves, white flowers, blue throat. Bulbs 75c; cuttings 50c.

AESCHYNANTHUS

Mixed nice basket plant. Seedlings 50c each; cuttings 35c each.

Passion Flower Seeds—Mixed, including red. 50c pkt.

Smithianthas Mixed—Red, pink, rose, orange. Bulbs 35c to 50c; seedlings 50c. This mixture will include Orange King, Rose Queen, Zebrina Cinnebarina, German Dwarf and Compacta. Seeds \$1 trade packet.

Didymocarpus—Seeds 35c.

Barnhaven Select Primroses—\$3.50 per dozen or 35c each.

Mauranda Vine—Cuttings 35c, blue.

Creeping Gloxinia—Cuttings 35c, pink.

COLUMNEA

This is a beautiful basket plant, easy to grow from cuttings and has large bright colored flowers hanging from leaf joints, and then fruit.

Hirta—Red hairy leaves, vermilion flowers.
Linearis—Pink flowers, bushy plant.
Nicaraguensis—Profuse bloomer, scarlet flowers.

Arguda—Small sharply pointed leaves, red flowers.
Alleni—Round leaves.
Microphylla—Fern-like leaves.
Samgoinea Hybrid—Large leaves, some splotches of red underneath, yellow flowers.
Canal Zone—Bushy plant, supposed to have blue flowers. X
Lepidocaula—Upright growth. X
Vedraninise—X
Vedrariens—X
Diminufolia—Cross, not bloomed as yet. X
Tula Flava—Heavy bloomer, yellow flowers, compact basket type.
Diminufolai—X
Affinis—Large coarse leaves, red underneath. X
Stenophylla—X
Schieneana—Orange and brown flowers.
Maginifica—X

The ones without the flower color after them have not bloomed as yet for me.

Mixed seeds \$1 per packet. Cuttings, with exception of those marked with X are 50c each. The others are not ready for cuttings and several as yet have not been released. Cuttings \$1, when ready.

RECHSTEINERIAS

These are bright flowering plants and will flower several times during the year, easily grown from seeds. Seeds \$1.

Cardinalis—Sometimes called Stovepipe Plant. Bulbs 75c to \$1. Seedlings, when ready, 35c each.

Macropoda—Darker green foliage, flowers hang like bells. 75c to \$1. Seedlings 35c.

Lineata—Similar to Macropoda except red lines on stems. 75c to \$1. Seedlings 35c. New plants.

BEGONIAS

This is only a partial list of Begonias as I am growing all the new ones put out by the Begonia Society as well as many others. Small seedlings, 20c each or 2 for 35c; 2" pots, 35c each.

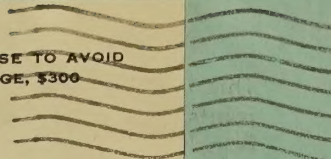
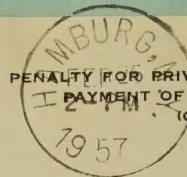
