There's nothing like a "mum" planting to add sparkle to your nursery or sales grounds in late summer anf fall. It is not necessary to have a large space to grow a variety of mums, as they can be planted quite close together. They can be sold direct from the growing area, or if it is away from your sales-ground they can be potted in tar-paper pots as they begin to show color. Their gay colors will attract customers to your grounds and swell your end-of-the-season sales. Add variety by trying a few new ones each year.

Interest in Daylilies (hemerocallis) is growing by leaps and bounds. We grow more than 400 varieties of these, so if you do not see what you want listed, write for prices. Siberian iris are good for both garden effect and cutting.

TERMS: Cash, or 50% cash, balance C.O.D. Minimum order \$5.00. No charge for packing. Plants shipped by express collect. Small orders can be shipped by parcel post if postage is included; any amount in excess will be refunded. You may order 25 of one variety at the 100 rate.

Prices are for strong, outdoor-grown rooted divisions. All stock offered subject to prior sale, and crop conditions. Shipping will start as soon as weather permits, usually the last of March, and continues through June. Orders will be shipped as near as possible to the time wanted. Our field divisions are from plants carefully watched and rogued through the bloom season for anything not true to name or up to standard in appearance. We strive to send out healthy, true-to-name divisions, also to rectify, so far as possible, any errors.

The first letter after the name denotes the type of flower: D, double; SD, semi-double: S, single. The second letter pertains to bloom season: VE, early September or late August; E, before Oct. 1; M, Oct. 1 to 15; L, Oct. 15 on. Dates are only approximate, as weather, time of planting, moisture and amount of sunshine can all make a difference in time of bloom.
