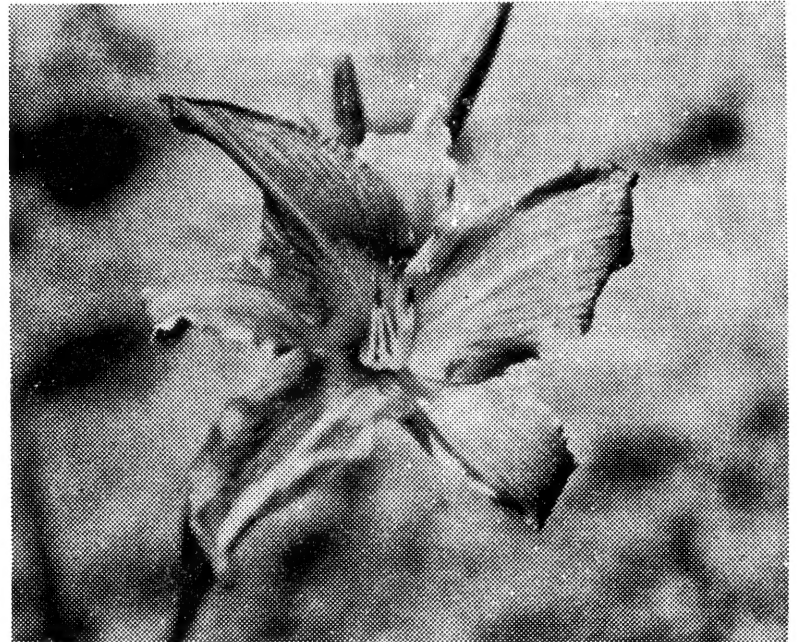

Greetings, Fellow Gardeners --

Our Garden Shop is on the east side of US-131, three miles south of Grand Rapids city limits, which is the junction of US-16 bypass and 131. Coming from the south, we are four blocks north from where the four-lane highway starts. We can list only a very small part of our stocks, and you are invited to come in and browse around at any time.

The Daylilies give their best show through July, but we have them in bloom from iris time until freezing weather. Other interesting displays through the season are the Iris, with splashes of bright Oriental Poppies; Phlox from late June into August, and the brilliance of the Mum fields from September on.



PINK PRELUDE

Daylilies (Hemerocallis)

An investment in Daylilies is where you get the "mostest for the leastest"--the most in bloom, garden value, and downright enjoyment, for the smallest amount of money spent. There are many beauties at a cost most reasonable, and then, after you are thoroughly inoculated with the fever, there are the newer, more expensive varieties, if you wish something new and rare.

They need time to become established, and should be left undisturbed for some time, as they do not start to give their best performance until their second or third year. Prices are for strong single divisions, and we ship in early spring or in late summer and fall.

Abbreviations used are as follows:

- E - Early; late May and early June in this locality.
- EM - Early midseason; June into July.
- M - Midseason, or July.
- ML - Late midseason; July into August.
- L - Late; August and September.
- Re - Has repeat bloom.
- Ext - Has extended bloom; stays open late.
- fr - Is fragrant.
- D - Dormant foliage habits.
- Ev - Evergreen foliage.

Culture

Daylilies will grow in any good garden soil, and are very drought resistant, but do appreciate watering. Space from 2 to 3 feet apart to permit increase in size of clumps. Spread roots out well when planting, and pack soil firmly around the plant. Well rotted manure or compost with bone meal may be mixed in the soil, and peatmoss has been found beneficial. They should have sun for at least half of the day.
