DELFO 531-C

PLANT TYPE—Extra spreading and prolific. Very similar to, but more vigorous and disease resistant than Delfos 531-B.

BOLL SIZE—75 to 80 bolls to pound of seed cotton, depending on soil and climatic conditions.

MATURITY—Very early.

PICKING QUALITY—Very Good.

LINT PERCENTAGE—33 to 35 percent.

STAPLE LENGTH—1-5/32 to 1-3/16 inch.

FOLIAGE—Light.

The Delfos 531-C has all the good characteristics of its forebears, the Delfos 6102 and 531 strains, and has been selected primarily for its ability to produce more lint per acre. All records of official tests indicate that it is adapted to all alluvial and fertile sections of the cotton belt, where quick fruiting, dwarfiness, light foliage and staple length are of interest.

It produces the staple length now wanted in great quantity for fine yarns needed in manufacturing the requirements of the armed forces. It is one of the few varieties producing the required staple, of which seed is available in quantity from reliable sources. Premiums assured by the 1942 loan values will make it as profitable as most any short cotton.
