An open letter from the president.

Anniverseries are usually an occasion for celebration, reflection, and speculation. so on this our 10th anniversary, I trust you will bear with the writer as he ruminates on the past, the present, and the future.

Although incorporated ten years ago, Growers Exchange is actually an idea of the writer's father, that goes back many, many more years. The first feeble steps in this direction were taken in 1933-25 years ago-but World War II interrupted this first attempt.

The second attempt in 1948 has succeeded far beyond expectations—not necessarily on the financial level. In fact, there have been years when crop failures have caused us to work for exactly nothing! The success we speak of lies in the consolidation over a ten year period of the wide variety of material we are able to offer from world-wide sources. We have been rewarded too by the close and warm friendships formed over the years with our customers, our employees, and our suppliers.

We have been amused, too, from time to time, by the folks who write in saying, in effect, "We'd like to buy from you but your prices are so low we're afraid something must be wrong with the stock." Our low prices are the result of two simple economic factors: (1) Low overhead; and (2) the tremendous volume we handle over 10,000,000 bulbs and plants a year.

By far the greatest bulk of our bulbs are imported from world famous growers in the Netherlands—truckload after truckload arrive in Farmington each Fall. Because of this great volume we have for years allowed Special Quantity Discounts on purchases of Dutch bulbs as follows:
