Excellent for planter boxes.

Roses listed are two year old California field grown. They are not dug until December when they are fully mature. On arrival we immediately plant these fine roses in five quart containers. After potting our roses are held under burlap until new root action has started. When we offer them for sale, beginning in late January, they are over the transplanting shock and are ready to give you top performance.

It's more fun to select and plant your roses in bloom. With our system of handling, this is not only possible, but is the most practical way to buy your roses. Deduct 25c per plant for roses purchased before March 15. Add 25c per plant for roses purchased after April 15.
