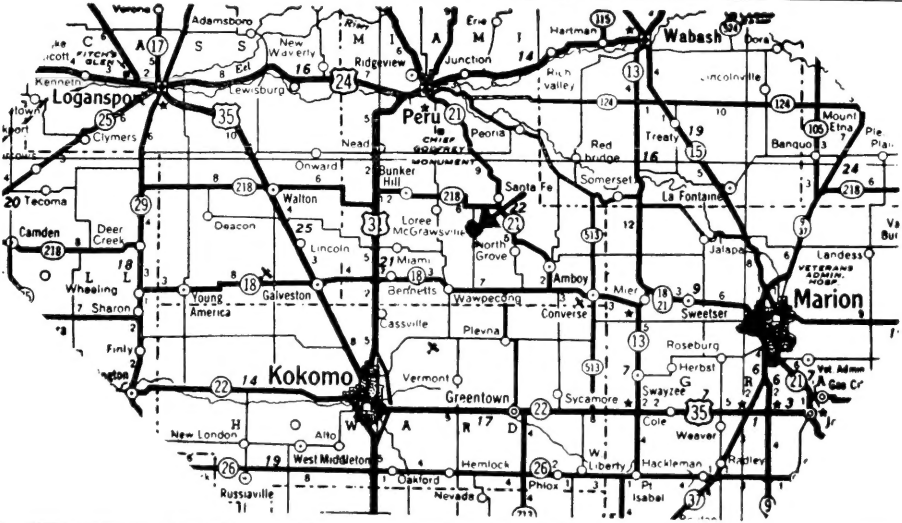

- HARLEQUIN — smooth, shiny leaves, dark brown edges with central pattern of greenish white.
- SYLVAN BEAUTY — silvery green leaves with medium brown margins.
- SPLENDENS (Silver Queen) — robust grower with emerald green leaf and broad silver markings.
- DIANTHIFLORA — small leaf, long trailing growth, deeply serrated white bloom.

- PANAMA (chontalensis) — small dark green leaves, light blue fringed flowers fall bloomer.
- LILACCINA — large soft hairy bronze leaves, flowers large.

AESCHYNANTHUS (lobbianus) — leaves vary dark green, scarlet flowers growing out of dark purple cups. \$1.00

ACHIMENES — these plants are the choicest for pots or boxes; they come in a great variety of colors and sizes of blossoms some grow low while others grow tall.

LITTLE BEAUTY — leaves deep green with red back, flowers are pure rose; a low grower. Plant 50¢—bulbs 3 for 85¢

In mixture we have all shades of blue, purple, lavender, white bulbs. 3 for 75¢—Plant 50¢ In small blossom varieties we have red to all the shades and tints, these are mostly low growing and have a wealth of blossoms. Bulbs 3 for 98¢

OXALIS

- O. REGNALLI** — large trifoliate, truncate (cut off squarely) red underside foliage nearly or quite evergreen and everblooming, large white flowers 50¢
- O. RUBRA** — low stemless growth lovely clover like dark green trifoliate foliage large deep rose, likes sun. 50c
- O. BASKET TRAILER** — stems very dark, small trifoliate leaves set on large 2" fleshy stems, everblooming small deep yellow flowers. 50¢

PANDANUS VEITCHI — foliage plant, does well in poor light. Long leaves striped in white; flowers on top of soil, look like carved wood. \$1.00

PELLONIA DAVEAUANA — trailer with pairs of frosty, silvered bronze edged foliage. 50¢

PELLONIA PULCHRA—trailing stems with light green black nerved foliage. 50c

PILEA SPRUCEANA (Panamegia) — dark brownish green quilted puffed leaves low growing plant with very small greenish flowers in clusters fanning out from center of leaves. 50¢

CEROPEGIA (the Rosary vine) — heart shape leaves are penciled in white pattern, flowers and sets bulbs on runners. 50¢

FERNS

NORWOOD — also called Fluffy Ruffles, compact, upright growth.

SPLENDIDA—long, fluffy, feathery fronds.
WHITMANI — ostrich plume fern, dwarf, feathery compact growth.

ADIANTUM WRIGHTII (Maiden Hair) — large fronds, a beautiful fern. This fern needs a lime soil, shade and ample water.

CRYTONIUM COMPACTA (Beautiful holly fern)

PLUMUM NANUS—the one called maiden hair of the old window gardens.

DAVELLA MARENSII—squirrels foot. \$1.50

GOLD MOUND — new trailing, bright golden yellow, small foliage, vigorous growth and free flowering.

SILVER MOUND — trailing, sweet scented, creamy white, small foliage strong growing and free flowering.

WEeping LANTANA — graceful and drooping, aromatic foliage, large clusters of lilac colored flowers. 79¢ each or all three at \$2.29

Be sure to wet the infested spots well, one spray will be effective. \$1.25

VC 13 — For nemetodes in soil. For soil: have soil free of hard clods, sprinkle solution on soil until thoroughly dampened clear through. Let stand 10 days before using, when plants are potted water with VC solution at once, be sure to wet soil thoroughly. For potting soil use 1 tablespoon to each gallon of water.
