- Chris. Columbus Oct. 1 - Intermediate cream decorative. Short, compact and prolific. Foreground garden use and pots (p. 74). S-6
- Avalanche Oct. 5 - Large decorative. Tall. Flowers on early crown buds. Price Class. S-2
- Horizon Oct. 5 - Intermediate white pompon. Outdoor cut flower. Responsive and productive in the cloth house (p. 68). S-4
- Benora Oct. 8 - Intermediate pompon. White with ivory centers. Polished foliage, rigid stems, and dwarf-spreading growth habit. Pots (p.74). A real improvement over Chris. Columbus for durability. Prolific bloomer. S-3
- Maestro Oct. 10 - White pompon. Dwarf, compact growth. Excellent for borders and pot plants (p. 74). S-2
- Classic Oct. 10 - Small white semi-formal pompon. Outdoor cut flower. Follows Horizon. S-3
- Silverplate Oct. 12 - White decorative. Outdoor cut flower. Pot plant variety (p. 74). S-3

8-Week Varieties

- Pilgrim Oct. 15 - Intermediate pompon. Clear white. Temperature tolerance of Chris. Columbus. Improving that variety in all respects. Pot Plant programs (p. 75). Durable compact garden variety. S-2
- Blizzard Oct. 15 - Small formal pompon. Clear white. Tolerates 52^o. Durable and productive. Spray programs (p. 60). Cloth House (p. 68). Earlier, larger, more productive than Pinocchio. Excellent growth. Best spray formation obtained when treated as a 9 week variety. S-4

- Calif. Wh. Daisy Oct. 15 - Intermediate pure white single. For the very early cloth house. Very temperature tolerant. (Kimoto's White). S-3
- Irene Oct. 15 - Small pompon. S-2
- Gardenia Oct. 15 - Large white decorative. Compact and responsive. Vigor improves Ostosa. Pot plant programs (p. 75). Prolific and showy garden variety. Benefited from disbudding. S-5
- Norona Oct. 15 - Small ivory white solid pompon. S-3
- Pristine Oct. 20 - Intermediate pure white pompon. Disspray. Cloth house (p. 68) and greenhouse variety (p. 60). S-6
- Shibuya White Oct. 20 - Intermediate white daisy. West coast variety. Larger than Calif. White Daisy. S-2
- Silvertone Oct. 24 - Intermediate white daisy. Similar in habit to Reward and Buckskin. Vigorous and productive. Fine high temperature performance. Tolerates 54°. Cloth house (p. 68) and greenhouse (p. 60). S-4

9-Week Varieties

- Popcorn Oct. 25 - Intermediate white pompon. Light pink at low temperatures. Outstanding production. Greenhouse (p. 60) and cloth house (p.68). S-5
- White Popcorn Oct. 25 - White sport of Popcorn. No trace of pink in flower at low temperatures. Greenhouse (p. 60) and cloth house (p. 68). S-6
- Monty Oct. 25 - Intermediate clear white disbud decorative. Breaks freely, spreads well. Supplements and strengthens the white pot plant program. Pots (p. 75). More durable than Wilson's White. Stretches and responds unevenly under high temperatures. S-5
- Silver Bow Oct. 25 - Large white formal disbud pompon. Responsive and productive in the Fast Disbud programs (p. 78). Displays a high degree of tolerance to summer greenhouse temperatures. A marked color and growth improvement over White Doty. S-3

- Keepsake Oct. 25 - White pompon. Fine high temperature performance. Light pink suffusions at low temperature. Sprays (p. 60) and cloth house (p. 68). S-7
- White Keepsake Oct. 25 - Intermediate ivory pompon. Selection from Keepsake. Like White Popcorn, it is devoid of pink tinges at low temperatures. At high temperature finish, more ivory than Keepsake. Will tolerate 56°. Spray programs (p. 60) and cloth house (p. 68). S-5
- Pinocchio Oct. 25 - Small pure white pompon. Formal and distinctive. Sprays (p. 60) and cloth house (p. 68). S-6
- Songster Oct. 25 - Intermediate white pompon. Withstands heat well. Green house (p. 60). Requires high light intensity. Cloth house (p. 68). Price Class. S-5
- Vesta Oct. 25 - A trim white button pompon for summer and early fall flowering (p. 60). Best during the long day period of the year. Very high quality in natural season. Cloth house (p. 68). S-4
- Arcadia Oct. 28 - Intermediate pompon. S-3
- Memento Oct. 30 - Intermediate chalk white single with green discs and durable petals that retain their original form into maturity. Reliable cloth house variety (p. 68). Greenhouse (p. 60). Tolerates both low and high temperatures for bud development. This single embodies the versatility of Silvertone with a form and clarity of color superior to Halo. S-3
- Silver Cloud Nov. 1 - Intermediate white single. Greenhouse (p. 60). S-3
- Halo Nov. 1 - White daisy for high temperature periods in the greenhouse (p. 60). S-5
- Sea Gull Nov. 1 - Intermediate ivory pompon. S-5
- Alaska Nov. 1 - Intermediate white anemone with white cushion. Temperature tolerance of Shasta. Productive, responsive and versatile. Spray programs (p. 60). Cloth house (p. 68). Fast crop disbuds (p. 78). Pots (p. 75). A greater degree of cushion development than Shasta in summer temperatures. S-6
- White Doty Nov. 1 - Large pompon, dispray and disbud. S-4

10-Week Varieties

- Freedom Nov. 5 - Intermediate pure white single. Fine green eye. Cloth house (p. 69) and greenhouse (p. 61). S-2
- Whitetop Nov. 5 - Intermediate chalk white decorative. Productive and dependable. Top notch white. Greenhouse (p. 61) and cloth house (p. 69). S-9
- TIPTOP Nov. 5 - (Krueger) A distinctive form mutation from Whitetop. The petals are completely tubular. Possesses fine substance and does not shatter. When cut on the green side, Tiptop is unusually attractive and has no counterpart in present pompoms. Valuable in the same periods as Whitetop. Cloth house (p. 69). Greenhouse (p. 61). S-5
- FEATHERTOP Nov. 5 - (Krueger) An unusually beautiful sport from Whitetop. Petals are deeply serrated or feathered in a manner similar to Snowdrift. Non reflexing petal habit coupled with partially tubular petals contribute to larger size flowers having more substance than parent. Improved vigor and response. Chalk white with smart green eye. Feathertop is not a novelty. It will increase the demand for white in all periods and areas where Whitetop is grown. In many arrangements it can serve the purpose of carnations. Cloth house (p. 69). Greenhouse (p. 61). S-5
- Iceberg Nov. 5 - Large chalk white pompon. Tall vigorous growth. Color clarity of Whitetop and Belray. Good as a year'round disbud (p. 79). When not disbudded, suggest adding one additional long day week for best spray formation. Sprays (p. 61) and cloth house (p. 69). Temperature tolerance of Whitetop. Tolerates summer temperatures well. S-7
- Madonna Nov. 5 - Intermediate white pompon. Spring and summer program (p. 61). Takes high temperature well. Cloth house (p. 69). S-5
- Encore Nov. 5 - Intermediate pompon. Pinks at low temperatures. Requires 60° minimum for bud initiation. Sprays (p. 62) and cloth house (p. 69). Superb form and rigid growth. S-6
- White Anemone Nov. 5 - Large anemone, dispray and disbud. S-3

WHITE POMPONS, DECORATIVES, SINGLES & ANEMONES10-Week Varieties (Cont'd)

- Whitehouse Nov. 5 - Intermediate white anemone. Breaks vigorously and thrives best with high temperatures. Very uniform and responsive. Recommended for pot programs (p. 76). A summer Little America for pots. S-2
- White Mensa Nov. 5 - Large ivory single. S-2
- Moonglow Nov. 8 - Intermediate pure white pompon. Requires 60° minimum for initiation. S-3
- Pacesetter Nov. 10 - Intermediate pure white single. Sprays (p. 62). A very fine pot plant disbud (p. 76). Cloth house (p. 69). S-6
- Ice Cream Nov. 10 - Intermediate decorative with 3-4" diameters. White to cream depending upon temperature. Very reliable. Extraordinarily vigorous having a wide range of temperature tolerance for bud initiation. A valuable addition to the fast disbud program (p. 79). As large a disbud as Iceberg. S-2
- Illini Igloo Nov. 10 - Intermediate ivory white pompon. Good for outdoor shading. Formal and durable. Tolerates 56°. Greenhouse (p. 62) and cloth house (p. 70). S-6
- Shasta Nov. 10 - Large anemone. Tolerates 56°. Very dependable. Sprays (p. 62), cloth house (p. 70) and disbuds (p. 79). S-9
- Dynamo Nov. 10 - White pompon. Excellent in natural season. Requires 60° minimum for initiation; 55° or lower for development. Greenhouse (p. 62) and cloth house (p. 70). S-3
- Vesper Nov. 10 - Intermediate pompon. S-3
- Nagona Nov. 10 - Intermediate white single. S-2
- Little America Nov. 10 - Intermediate pure white anemone. Greenhouse (p. 62). Excellent disbudded for pots (p. 76). S-6
- Illini Snowdrift Nov. 12 - Novelty, intermediate, feathered decorative. Valuable in artistic arrangements. Sprays (p. 62). Pots (p. 76). S-6

- White Taffeta Nov. 15 - Pure white sport of Taffeta. A fine late cloth house pompon (p. 71). Greenhouse (p. 63). Most valuable of the Taffeta group. Especially recommended for April. S-5
- Sculpture Nov. 15 - Large ivory white daisy. Greenhouse (p. 63) and cloth house (p. 71). S-4
- White Norma Nov. 15 - Large anemone. Disbud (p. 80). White rays and yellow cushion. S-3
- Snowflurry Nov. 15 - A white button pompon. Larger than Pinocchio. Requires 60° for initiation. S-3
- Illini Starflower Nov. 18 - Large semi-anemone spoon. Single. A novelty in white for retail growers. Disspray or disbud. S-3
- GRECO'S CARNATION Nov. 20 (Greco)-Intermediate white pompon. Petals are finely serrated and form somewhat resembles a carnation. Clear white 11-week poms are scarce. Performs best under high light and cool finishing temperatures. Suited to the late cloth house (p. 71). Greenhouse programs (p. 63). Valuable for its natural Thanksgiving season. Not suited to early spring programs. S-1
- Seafoam Nov. 20 - Intermediate ivory white pompon. S-3
- Long Island Beauty Nov. 20 - Large anemone. Yellow cushion. Disspray. Fast disbuds (p. 80). Tolerates 56°. S-5
- Highbrow Nov. 20 - Ivory white decorative. Very productive. Superb quality in the late cloth house (p. 71) and in the greenhouse (p.63). Price Class. S-5
- Nevada Nov. 20 - Intermediate anemone. Chartreuse cushion. Fast disbuds (p. 80). S-4
- Priscilla Nov. 20 - Intermediate clear white pompon. S-5
- Illini Bountiful Nov. 23 - Small ivory pompon. S-2
- Crystal Beauty Nov. 23 - Intermediate pompon. S-2

- Paramount Nov. 23 - Intermediate ivory white pompon. Spray programs (p. 63). Cloth House (p. 71). Valued for its formal form. S-6
- Belray Nov. 24 - Large white pompon. Tall grower. One of the best large whites for spring flowering in the greenhouse (p. 63). For the cloth house (p. 71). Remove center buds. Bud development slowed by high temperatures. Tolerates 52^o. Fast disbuds (p. 80). S-7
- Carrara Nov. 24 - Intermediate pure white decorative. A short variety that tolerates low temperatures. Bud development is retarded by high temperatures. Finish cool. Tolerates 56^o. Spray programs (p. 63). S-4

12-Week Varieties

- WHITE PRINCESS Nov. 25 (Coward) - Pure white button. Sport from Princess. Hard and very durable. Requires high temperature for maximum initiation of buds. Tolerates a wide range of temperature for development. Best in high light areas. Well suited to the late cloth house (p. 72). Greenhouse (p. 65). S-5
- Silvercrest Nov. 25 - Small white formal pompon. Markedly improves the appearance and quality of Snowcrest. Sprays (p. 65) and cloth house (p. 72). S-4
- White Lady Nov. 25 - White sport of Beautiful Lady. Disbud. Short and adaptive to fall and winter pots. S-3
- Illini Peace Nov. 25 - A productive white anemone for Thanksgiving. Sprays (p. 65). S-3
- CHAMP Nov. 28 (Y.B.) - Large white disbud anemone. Growth is clean and vigorous. Larger than Illini Glacier, approaching the size of White Supreme. Response is uniform and production high. Fast disbud programs (p. 81). Cushion is large, develops well, acquires a chartreuse green overtone. Provides outstanding winter disbuds in a needed anemone form. S-1

White Valencia	Nov. 28 - Large single. Requires high temperatures for bud initiation. Disspray and disbud (p. 65). Fast disbuds (p. 81). Cool finish. S-4
Cordova	Nov. 30 - Intermediate pompon. Natural season. S-4
Fortune	Dec. 1 - Formal white pompon. An outstanding quality flower. Sprays (p. 65) and cloth house (p. 72). S-6
Illini Glacier	Dec. 1 - Medium anemone. Clear white with white cushion. Durable, productive and uniform response. Disspray (p. 65). Fast disbud crops (p. 81). Improves Long Island Beauty in color, form and keeping quality. Requires 60° initiation. Cool finish. S-4
Monarch	Dec. 1 - Large ivory white decorative. S-2

13-Week Varieties

Cameo	Dec. 5 - Intermediate ivory decorative. Natural season. S-4
WHITE ENCHANTRESS	Dec. 5 - Large disbud and disspray anemone. Color requires high light intensity and 60° temperatures for maximum clarity. Under cooler finishes it is a smooth shell pink of great beauty. Habit and performance is the same as the original Enchantress. Cushion development is stable and uniform. Recommended for regular (p. 66) and fast programs (p. 82). S-4
Acclaim	Dec. 5 - Large formal type pompon. Lights and shades well. An ivory white Corsair. Sprays (p. 66). Excellent with cool 60°. S-8
Spangles	Dec. 5 - Small white pompon. A late white Sunnyside. S-4
Cotillion	Dec. 5 - Intermediate semi-formal pompon. Requires 60° for bud initiation. Sprays (p. 66). S-2

WHITE POMPONS, DECORATIVES, SINGLES & ANEMONES13-Week Varieties (Cont'd)

ILLINI ALBA	Dec. 5 (Univ. of Ill.) - Intermediate chalk white daisy. Devoid of any tendency to pink either from low temperature or aging. Easily grown and of clean habit. Best described as a white Debutante. Alba will tolerate 56° for initiation and development. Responses are dependable and uniform when lighted through mid March. Best spray formation and height control is obtained with Illini Alba when it is treated as a 14-week variety (p. 66). S-1
Orway	Dec. 8 - Large white single. An improvement over Yukon in flower quality and growth habit. S-2
Snowdrop	Dec. 8 - White button pompon. Pink tinges at low temperatures. Price Class. S-2
White Snowdrop	Dec. 8 - Pure white sport of Snowdrop. Does not pink. Sprays (p. 66). S-4
Illini Starlet	Dec. 10 - Intermediate white anemone. Improves Garza in form, growth and clarity of color. Spray programs (p. 66). S-4
Imp. White Supreme	Dec. 10 - Large anemone. Tall disbud. Finish cool. S-3
Yukon	Dec. 10 - Intermediate chalk white single. Tolerates 56°. Spray crops (p. 66). S-3
ICECAP	Dec. 10 (Y.B.) - Intermediate chalk white pompon. Icecap combines the responsiveness of Acclaim, the vigor and production of Corsair with the formal beauty of Snowcap. It has Silversmith color clarity without a trace of pink. Will initiate and develop at 56° although, equally as valuable in 60° programs. Because of its extra vigor, best treated as a 14-week variety. An achievement in white sprays. Long sought for and highly desirable in northern, winter programs (p. 66). S-1
Satellite	Dec. 13 - Intermediate cream white pompon. Very tolerant of cool 60°. Spray crops (p. 66). S-4

WHITE POMPONS, DECORATIVES, SINGLES & ANEMONES

13-Week Varieties (Cont'd)

- Dolomite Dec. 13 - Intermediate clear white pompon. Smaller, later version of Carrara. Taller, more vigorous. Sprays (p. 66). Adds quality and color clarity to the December season. Tolerates 56°. Price Class. S-3
- Snowcrest Dec. 13 - Small pompon. Distinctive green eye. Responsively uniform in cool 60° crops. Sprays (p. 66). S-5

14-Week Varieties

- Trenton Dec. 15 - Good form and substance. An intermediate pompon for natural flowering. S-4
- Silversmith Dec. 15 - Intermediate pure white decorative. Fine sprays and production for winter crops (p. 67). Improved by cool 60° environments. S-7
- Snowcap Dec. 15 - Large formal pompon. When grown at a 60° F. minimum night temperature, this is one of the outstanding flowers available to winter spray programs (p. 67). S-5
- Garza Dec. 15 - Intermediate anemone. S-5
- White Riviera Dec. 15 - Intermediate ivory decorative. Equal in size, form and vigor to parent variety Riviera. Spray programs (p. 67). Does not show pink tinges with low temperature finish. Must have 60° initiation and cool finish. S-2
- ELEGANCE Dec. 20 (Greco) Intermediate white decorative. Produces larger flower than Silversmith in addition to being more sharply responsive in 60° programs. Flowers naturally for Christmas. Clean growth with high production and good spray (p. 67). Growth is stiff, whippy and without a trace of vegetativeness. Tends to become too short and clubby in late January and February. S-1
- Heirloom Dec. 20 - Intermediate decorative. S-3
- Wedding Bells Dec. 20 - A small to medium white formal pompon. Purer white than Snowcrest. Uniform and productive in natural season. S-3

WHITE POMPONS, DECORATIVES, SINGLES & ANEMONES15-Week Varieties

- Revelation Dec. 25 - Intermediate decorative. Excellent for late natural flowering with 50° finish. S-6
- Snow Dec. 25 - Intermediate pompon. Requires 60° for initiation. S-6
- Talmeda Jan. 5 - Intermediate white pompon. Improves Revelation. Just about the latest white pompon. Good form and substance. S-5
- Illini Cascade Jan. 5 - Large clear white decorative. Improves the color, size, vigor, and response of Illini Snowbound. Tall, responsive. Finishes well at high 60° or low 50° temperature. Disspray programs (p. 67). A valuable addition to the northern winter program. Suggested as winter disbud (p. 82). Fine for cool 60° units. S-5
- Illini Snowbound Jan. 5 - Large informal white decorative with cream center. Requires 60° initiation and 50° development. S-4

YELLOW POMPONS, DECORATIVES, SINGLES & ANEMONES7-Week - Garden Varieties

- Yel. Chris. Columbus Oct. 1 - Sport of Chris. Columbus. Intermediate lemon yellow decorative. A proven pot plant (p. 74). S-6
- Moonlight Oct. 1 - Intermediate sulfur yellow pompon. Short compact growth habit. For borders and pot plants (p. 74). S-2
- Polaris Oct. 5 - An early golden buff daisy. An Arctic hybrid. Background garden variety and October cut flower. S-2
- Astoria Oct. 5 - Intermediate bright lemon yellow pompon. Free flowering and responsive. More prolific than either Yel. Chris. Columbus or Moonlight when grown as a spring pot (p. 74). An early foreground garden variety. S-3
- Chas. Nye Oct. 5 - Large deep yellow pompon. Showy, prolific garden variety. S-3

- Chiquita Oct. 5 - Small deep lemon yellow button pompon. Chic for spring and fall pots (p. 74). An intermediate garden variety. S-3

- Lee Powell Oct. 10 - Large golden yellow decorative. Vigorous background and cut flower variety. S-2

- Golden Herald Oct. 25 - Large decorative. Tolerates 56°. Dispray or disbud (p. 60). Fast disbud (p. 78). Cloth house (p. 68). S-6
- Gold Coast Oct. 25 - Intermediate formal pompon. Deep lemon. Tolerates 56°. Greenhouse (p. 60). Cloth house (p. 68). Dispray at high temperatures. S-8
- Early Yellow Daisy Oct. 25 - Intermediate yellow single. Selection from Calif. Yellow Daisy that will mature 7 to 10 days earlier. A west coast cloth house variety. S-2
- Yellow Dot Oct. 25 - Small pompon. Two-tone with golden bronze eye. S-3

YELLOW POMPONS, DECORATIVES, SINGLES & ANEMONES9-Week Varieties

- Happiness Oct. 28 - Large golden yellow single having broad, flat ray petals. Normally outproduces Sauterne and is noticeably more reliable in high temperature summer greenhouses than either Aztec or the Halos. In the greenhouse (p. 60). Clothhouse (p. 69). This variety is a combination of beauty, productivity and versatility. Tolerates 56°. Price class. S-3
- Sunup Oct. 28 - Small deep yellow pompon. A little smaller than Gold Coast and larger than Pixie. Withstands high temperatures and heavy cropping better than Gold Coast. Greenhouse (p. 61). Cloth house (p. 69). S-4
- Yellow Arcadia Oct. 28 - Intermediate lemon pompon. S-3
- Sauterne Oct. 30 - Intermediate intense yellow single. Recommended in the greenhouse (p. 61). In the cloth house (p. 69). Outstanding natural. Tolerates 56°. S-5
- Gondola Oct. 30 - Intermediate yellow daisy. Large flower similar to Starbright. Recommended in the greenhouse (p. 61). Fast disbuds (p. 78). S-3
- Yellow Halo Nov. 1 - Sport of Halo. Intermediate single, deep lemon yellow. Tolerates 56°. Greenhouse (p. 61). S-4
