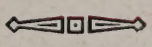

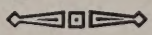

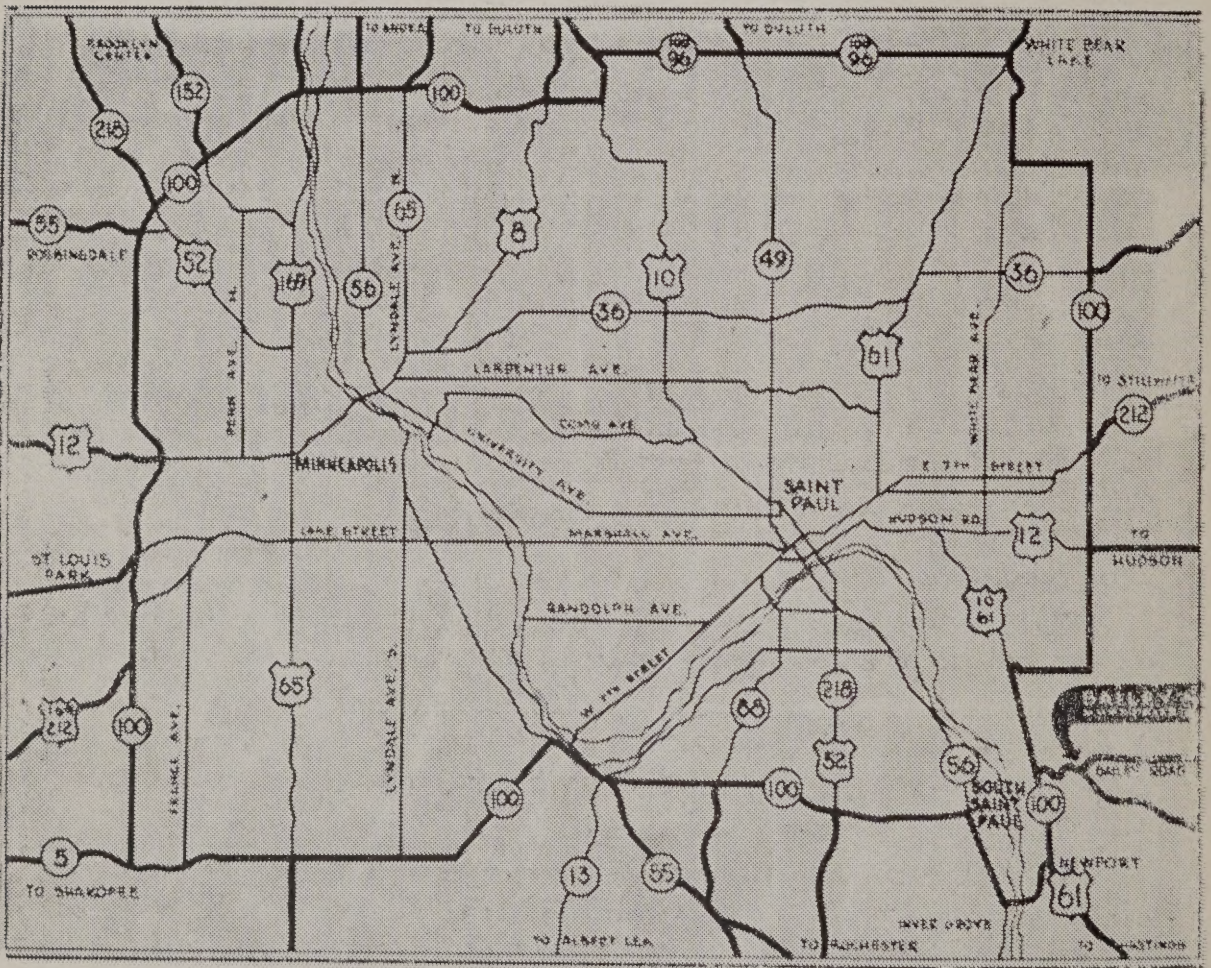

POTTING SUGGESTIONS

A good portion of the business in a well-operated garden lot comes from the sales of preplanted or potted nursery stock. The West Coast Nurseries have been selling potted nursery stock for close to 20 years and the volume in sales increases each year.

Offering potted nursery stock is comparatively new for our Central Northwest. It will be developed into a big business for the alert nursery firms. The right thing **MUST** be done at the right time to get the utmost results from potting nursery stock, otherwise there will be heavy losses. The following steps are outlined to help you get better results in your potting.

No. 1 Timing—

You will have to take into consideration the climatic conditions at your nursery as to when you should start your potting operation in the spring. In the Twin City area our records over a period of years show that we start doing field work on April 5th. We can start potting the more hardy plants, such as fruit trees and hardy shrubs and setting them out in the potting lot without protection by March 25th. The roses, tender shrubs and vines, such as Philadelphia Aurea, Red Barberry, Potentilla, large Flowering Clematis, etc., we feel it is safe for us to start potting by April 1st and putting them in the potting field where we have provided protective frames set up in a sunny, well-drained area.

No. 2 Protective Frames—

It will be necessary for you to build protective frames. A frame built to the following specifications is ideal and not too bulky. For the sides of the frame use a 10 inch board 12 feet long, for the ends use a 10 inch board 4 feet long. This frame, 12 feet long and 4 feet wide is ideal for roses when one frame is placed on top of the other making the height 20 inches. Where 30 inch height is needed you add another frame. When the roses, etc., leaf out you will only need the bottom frame. The other frames can then be used in the garden lot for B & B evergreens as it is a good idea to cover the balls of the B & B evergreens while they are on display.

No. 3 Soil—

The arrangement for what soil you will need for your potting operation must be stock piled in the fall or during the summer previous to when it will be used for potting. It should be kept covered as much as possible so that it won't be frozen and impossible to use when needed. The type of soil to use for best results is a good loam which is adapted to the majority of plants. By loam is meant the top soil out of a pasture of grass land under the grass for a few inches. It is full of fiber and enriched with decayed vegetation. It is generally brown or almost black. It is also rich in humus. It is possible that you will have to make your potting soil. The basis for a good potting soil is to make a compost consistency of one-half loam mixed with leaf mold, sand, ashes and well rotted cow or horse manure in a moderate quantity. These ingredients should all be well mixed together and put through a shredder. A special type of soil may be created as needed. A heavy loam resting on clay soil is ideal for growing roses.

No. 4 Pruning and Potting—

We get the best results when we prune the plants quite severely that we pot. Roses will give best results if pruned to six inches above the bud. The shrubs should be pruned back at least one-third, the same is true of fruit trees. In potting roses fill one-third of the pot with a mixture of clay and well rotted cow or horse manure, prune the roots, then spread the roots of the roses over this clay and fill the pot with prepared potting soil. Be sure to tramp the dirt firmly around the roots of the roses and everything potted. The potting of shrubs, fruit trees, etc., is comparatively simple. Use a pot large enough to accommodate the roots. Fill one-fourth of the pot with potting soil, then spread the roots and fill the pot to within one inch of the top.

POTTING SUGGESTIONS—Continued

No. 5 Growing—

When a portion of the potting is completed it should be placed out in the potting area to grow. For the more hardy items we spread two or three inches of sawdust on the ground and then set the pots on it. Allow about four inches between each pot. These hardy items are fruit trees, hardy shrubs, shade and ornamental trees. The more tender items such as roses and tender items before mentioned, under Timing, after being potted must be placed in the protected frame allowing about three inches space between each pot. Water each pot. Cover the frame with burlap securely fastened over the frame to keep out all draft on the plants. Keep this burlap wet. It will be necessary to sprinkle the burlap several times a day. The tops of the roses or plants under the burlap must not be allowed to be dry. Keep the burlap over the frame until the leaves on most of the plants in the frame turn green. Note: To green or harden up the plants the burlap can be removed each day during the warmest part of the day.

No. 6 Fertilizing—

There are many ways to fertilize. We fertilize by using Vigoro Plant Food. We put a teaspoonful of Vigoro in each pot often enough to keep each plant in good growing condition. This will vary two to four applications each growing season, depending on the plant and the type of growth they are making.
