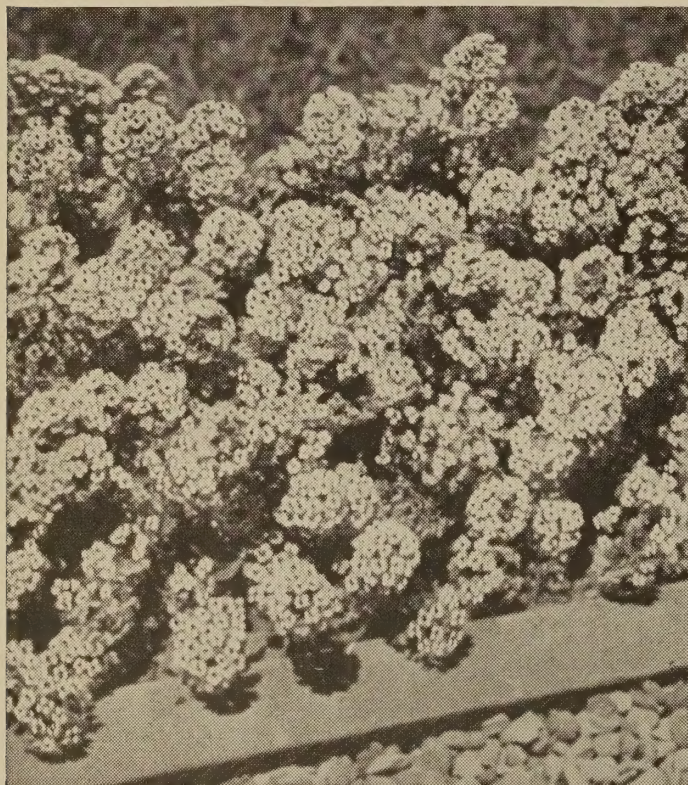

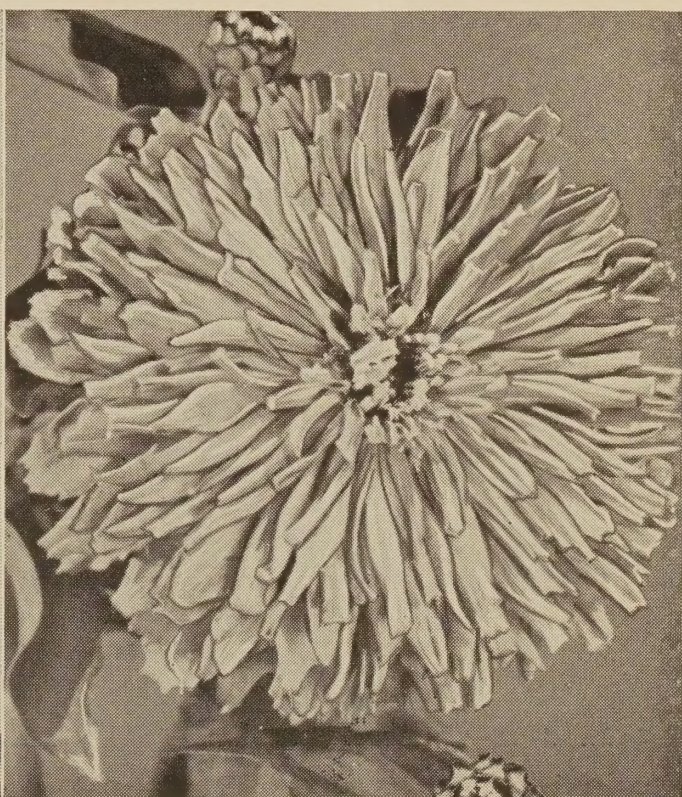

Hybrid Tomatoes are strong, vigorous growers and have the ability to outyield regular varieties, the extra quantities coming, in large measure, from the soil. It can be readily understood that because Hybrid Tomatoes can produce larger plants and higher yields they must be fed more than standard tomatoes. Tests have shown that hybrid tomato seedlings started in 4 in. pots or 4 x 4 in. bands, produced earlier and heavier yields than those started in 2½ in. pots or 2 x 2 in. bands when transplanted to the garden. To produce a maximum crop of large fruits, we recommend that you maintain good fertility and moisture in your soil. For this purpose, it is desirable to make your fertilizer application at the time of transplanting.

Seedbed soil should be kept warm—85°F. daytime; 70°F. at night—and proper moisture content should be maintained in order to assure maximum germination of vegetable hybrid seed.

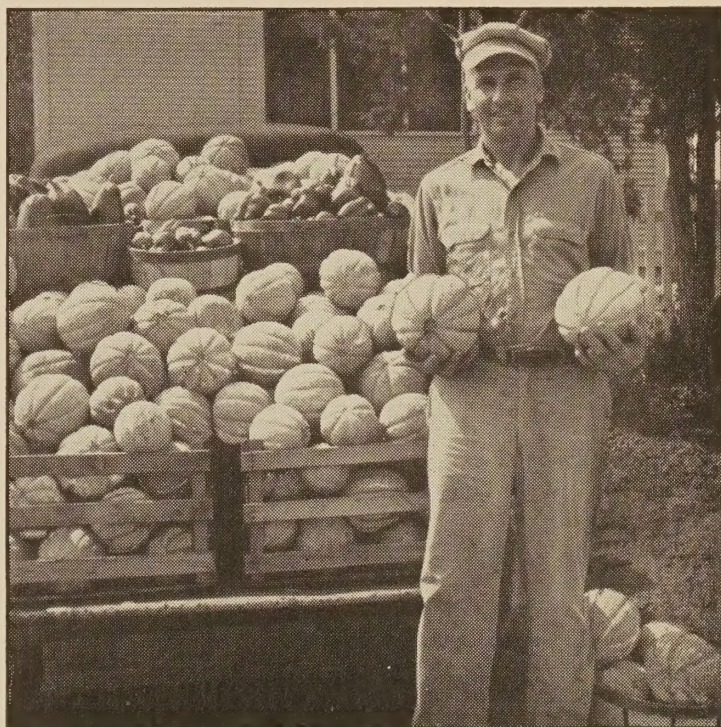

Burpee's Seed Laboratory in its Philadelphia Office is busy the year around making germination tests on every lot of seed. These safeguards to quality are an unseen part of every package of Burpee Seeds.

Average number of days required from the time hybrid seed is sown until vegetables are ready for use is given with each variety. Where plants must first be grown, such as Eggplant or Tomatoes, the number of days to maturity is from the time plants are set in the garden. Of course, the time is average; some variation is to be expected, depending on the season, locality and time of sowing. The approximate maturity dates given will show the relative time varieties will be ready to use.

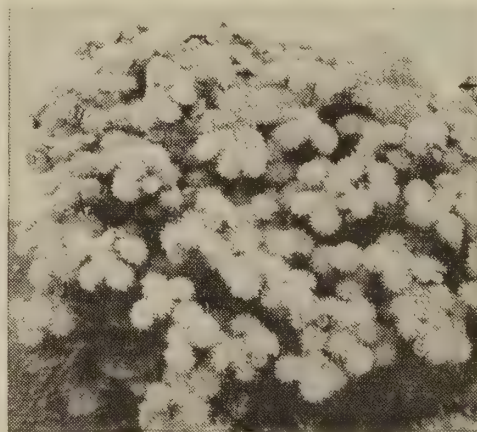

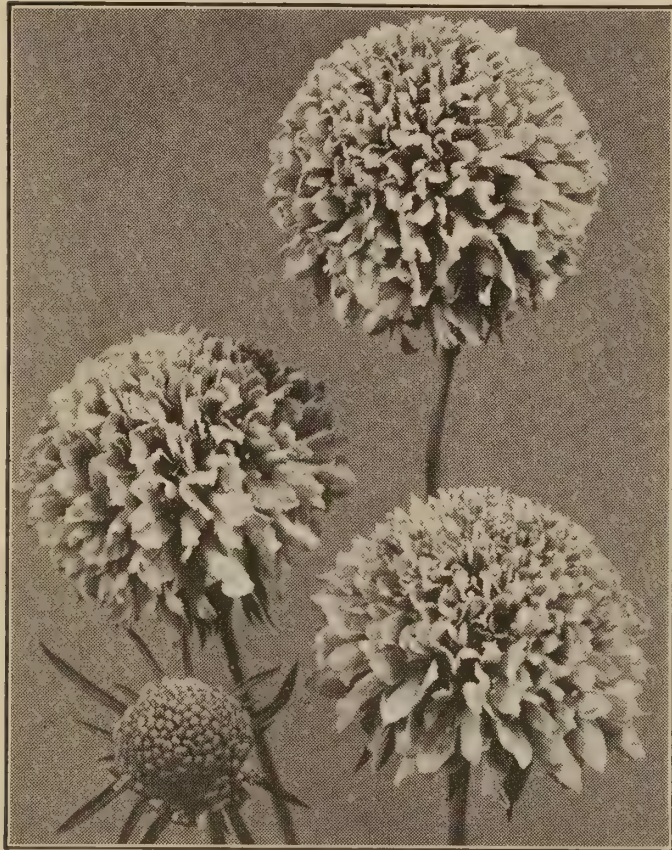

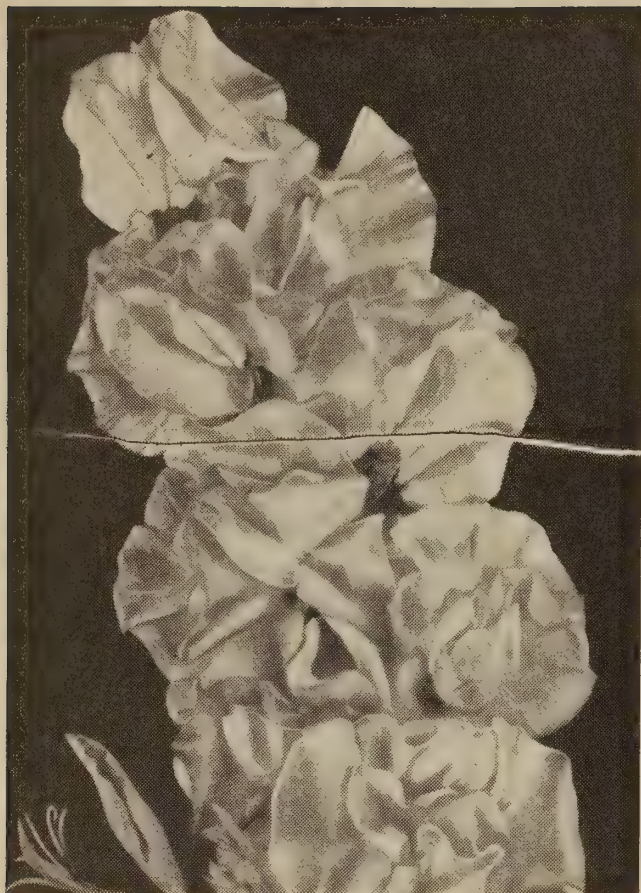
