PROJECT MERRIMACK - Special Report

A confidential informant of known reliability was in attendance at a 26 July 1968 Vietnam Peace Negotiations Rally at the Manger Hamilton Hotel, Washington, D.C. This meeting was Chaired by Dagmar WILSON of Women Strike for Peace and two speakers were Julius HOBSON and Robert GREENBLATT. HOBSON made the following remarks in answer to a question from the floor, "What do you think it will take for the advancement of the black to progress?" Answer: "The violent overthrow of the present existing power in this country. As I said before, it makes no difference if it's democrats or republicans, they have to be thrown out if it takes a revolution, and it may just come to that. People are being armed, as you know, and if things get to the revolution stage it's going to be bad. I don't like it but I want to be on the winning side."
