SPECIAL REPORT  
DEMOCRATIC NATIONAL CONVENTION

The following hard information has been received from sources considered reliable and represents the more noteworthy developments in the current demonstration and resistance atmosphere surrounding the Democratic National Convention.

Roy Wilkens, leader of the NAACP, has reportedly been marked for assassination on Wednesday, 28 August by members of the Black Panther Party of Newark, New Jersey. Wilkens' killing is to be accompanied by fire bombings in Chicago, Newark, New York and other major cities, with the ultimate hope that Negro riots will erupt throughout these areas. The contract for Wilkens' death allegedly was offered by Italian mobsters to the Revolutionary Action Movement (RAM) but was rejected at a meeting held on 25 August 1968 in New York. Wilkens has been alerted to the plan and does not intend to visit Chicago for the Convention.

Bobby Seale, Black Panther Party member made a highly inflammatory speech to a crowd of 2000 persons gathered in Lincoln Park on 27 August 1968. Seale, working the crowd into a highly mobbed, called for the people to take up arms and go to the Loop area in small groups and create as much violence as possible.

Labor strife in Chicago still compounds the confusion and unrest associated with the Convention. Fire bombings and incidents of rock throwing have highlighted the current transit strike. Two companies of the Illinois National Guard have been ordered to assist police in dealing with possible violence arising from demonstrations planned by the Chicago Transit Workers and the Students for Democratic Society.

The American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) is reportedly handling the Yippies in the refiling of a suit against the City of Chicago. An ACLU attorney has allegedly enlisted photographers to photograph police actions, and persons who have been injured but not arrested have been requested to file a complaint with the ACLU.

Information had been received from the National Socialist White  
People's Party (American branch) that they plan to confront the Nippies in Lincoln  
Park during the evening of 19 August 1963.

At 0230 hours, 20 August 1963, 7500 National Guardsmen assisted  
police at the Hilton Hotel in dispersing a large group of demonstrators away from  
the hotel.

Members of the Nippies and the National Mobilization Committee plan  
a rally on 28 August 1963 to take place in a park somewhere in the central  
area of the city. Several thousand demonstrators are expected. Other  
participants in the rally will include the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.,  
Leadership Conference on Civil Rights, the Southern Christian  
Leadership Conference, the National Committee on Anti-lynching, and the  
Black Panther Party.
