At about 2000 on 12 or 13 September 1953, it was observed from PW Corp. [REDACTED] in Rostov that a fiery glass moved from north-northeast to south-southwest 5 km west of the corp at a constant altitude of 1,000 to 1,500 meters and a constant speed. The weather was clear and cloudless. The glow of fire was yellowish red in front and became dark red to the rear, but its shape did not change to the rear. No smoke trail was observed nor were sounds heard. The glass was observed for about 3 seconds during which it covered a distance of about 1,250 meters. This was not confused with an aircraft because no air activity was conducted during the period of observation.

Field Comment. The information confirms previous observations of unidentified flying objects in the Enakhty/Rostov area.
