It is a matter of controversy at this time whether the light series begins before the deposition of Croesus. The style of this coin would indicate that it is early in the series.

## MYSIA

17. Cyzicus. 550-475 BC. EL Twelfth. (1.32 gms.). Forepart of lion left, looking right, tunny behind. Incuse punch. Cf. von Fritze 40. Near VF. Nicely centered.

18. Cyzicus. 460-400 BC. EL Stater. (15.94 gms.). Nude, beardless warrior kneeling right, holding arrow in right hand and bow in left, wearing crested Corinthian helmet, to left tunny downwards. Irregular incuse punch. Boston 1490, Weber 5001. Nice VF+. Better centered than the Boston or Weber specimen. Rare

This interesting and artistic electrum stater of Cyzicus emphasizes the point that electrum coins had different values assigned to them at different times - due to the value of the gold and silver that make up the natural alloy electrum. Since the exact composition could not be exactly determined and therefore the exact value could not be set, the badge of the city, the tunny fish, guaranteed value. This aesthetically pleasing design of a warrior (Ajax?) is one of the many designs used on this varied series.

## EGYPT

21. Kings of: Ptolemy IV. 221-204 BC. AV Octadrachm. ( 27.91 gms .). Dated 211 BC . Head of Arsinoe II right, veiled and wearing stephane, to left $\Lambda$, border of dots around. Double cornucopiae with fillet, AP $\Sigma I N O N \Sigma \Phi I \Lambda A \triangle E \Lambda \Phi O Y$ around. Svoronos 1165, SNG Burton Berry 1489 (This coin). Superb XF. Rare and seldom offered.

This coin illustrates an important aspect of religious culture in ancient Egypt. The Ptolemaic dynasty combined the Hellenistic concept of the divine ruler with the native Egyptian belief of a "Pharoh-God". The Pharoh represented the fertility of the Nile valley and hence he was responsible for its fate. It was necessary to worship the pharoh and his "divine predecessors". A cult was established for the worship of Arsinoe II as is indicated by the continued use of her portrait on octadrachms after her death. The fertility of the Nile valley is directly correlated to the iconography of this coin. The ram's horn, worn by Arsinoe, is derived from an Egyptian god of childbirth, while the cornucopiae is an obvious symbol of fertility.

## MARCUS AURELIUS. 161-180 AD.

24. AV Aureus. (7.18 gms.). AVRELIVS CAES ANTON AVG PII F, Bearded bust of Aurelius right. TR POT XI COS II, Apollo standing left holding patera and lyre. RIC 469a, Scarce. Nice VF with underlying luster.

## GORDIAN III. 238-244 AD.

25. AV Aureus. (4.93 gms.).IMP GORDIANVS PIVS FEL AVG, laureate bust right. LAETITIA AVG.N, Laetitia standing left holding wreath and anchor. RIC 101. $\mathrm{VF}+$, flan slightly irregular.

MAXIMINUS II. 311-313 AD.
26. AV Aureus. ( 5.27 gms.). Alexandria mint. MAXIMINVS PF AVG, laureate bust right. SOLI INVICTO, Sol, radiate, standing left in long robe, holding head of Serapis, below ALE. RIC 132. Rarity 3. Near XF/XF. Rare and seldom offered for sale.

Aurei of Maximinus II from the Alexandrian mint are quite rare, as is all gold from this time period at this mint, owing to the fact that "the main burden of production moved northwards (i.e. Antioch) as Maximinus prepared to oppose Licinius." In the battle Tzirallum, near Heraclaea, Maximinus was defeated and his authority ceased from that date (April 30, 313). This coin was issued 1675 years ago almost to the date of this auction. The reverse type of Sol holding the head of Serapis is artistically engraved and is very appropriate for a coin of the Alexandria mint. The reverse employs major divinities of Egypt and Rome.

## THEODOSIUS II. 402-450 AD.

33. AV Solidus. ( 4.48 gms .). Constantinople mint. DN THEODOSIVS PF AVG, helmeted and cuirassed bust seen from the front, head inclined right, spear on shoulder. SALVS REIPVBLICAE, Theodosius II and Valentinian III standing facing, each holding mappa and globe, star above. RIC Hunter 10. Choice XF. Rare and interesting reverse type.

Grierson \& Blackburn, Medieval European Coinage Vol. 1 - Plate $10,168-170$ variant. XF/VF. The style of this piece indicates that it is probably an imitative issue.

## JUSTINIAN II. 1st Reign. 685-695 AD.

47. AV Solidus. ( 4.37 gms ). IhS CRISTOS REX REGNANTIUM, bust of Christ facing with cross behind head, with long hair and full beard. DN IVSTINIA(VS SERV CHRISTI) H, Justinian standing facing holding cross potent. SB 1248, D.O. 7f. Choice XF, edge possibly a little shaved. Rare.

This coin is historically important as it marks Justinian's innovation of placing his own portrait on the reverse of the coin and Christ's portrait on the obverse. This portrait of Christ is considered to be one of the most beautiful renditions of Him on a coin, and as such is a turning point in Byzantine numismatics.
48. AV Solidus. ( 4.26 gms.). +IhS CRISTOS REX REGNANTIUM, bust of Christ facing, cross behind head. Christ has long hair and full beard, wears pallium and colobium, and raises his right hand in benediction. D IUSTINIANUS SERU ChRISTU, Justinian standing holding cross potent left. SB 1248. XF, dies a little rusty. Rare.

## LEONTIUS. 695-698 AD.

It is a matter of debate in regard to the Carthaginian dekadrachms as to the meaning of the Punic legend B'RST. Once thought to represent the Greek name for the citadel of Carthage, "Byrsa", others have derived the name from a Semetic word meaning "fortified place." Recently scholars have repudiated these meanings and instead suggest a translation of "in the land" for B'RST, "possibly a reference to the Carthaginian prefectures in North Africa". G.K. Jenkins suggests that possibly Punic Sicily was organized as a Carthaginian district and hence regarded as part of Carthage. This would also explain the choice of Pegasus as a reverse type since other coins bearing Pegasus, did circulate in Sicily, such as Corinthian staters and local issues reflecting Corinthian types.

"Some of the Wappenmunzen types conceivably contain allusions to personal names, certain of the horse types, for instance, representing magistrates whose names began in "Hipp-". (One immediately thinks of Peisistratus' sons Hipparchus and Hippias, one or both of whom might well have served as moneyers under their father if not after his death.)". The emergency coinage of 406 BC in Athens became necessary after the Athenian disaster against Syracuse in 413 BC. The Athenian economy, which was based on dues paid by subject allies (who revolted one after another) and the silver produced by the mines at Laureion, was in chaos. The dues were being withheld and Sparta was disrupting the supplies from Laureion, hence the war reserves put away by Pericles (1.5 million tetradrachms) in 431 BC were needed and released in 412 BC. After another defeat at sea it was necessary to equip a new fleet, but there was no reserve left. In 406 BC the decision was made to issue a new emergency coinage issue. It was to consist of two types of coin. The bulk was to be provided by copper coins plated with silver and intended to pass at the same value as existing tetradrachms and drachms; these were to be backed by a limited issue of gold coins. Unfortunately, Athens soon lost the last battle of the war and her collapse was complete, but not without having introduced an important numismatic legacy.

Sent by Nero to Judaea, this legionary commander's task was to suppress the Revolt of the Jews against their Roman overlords. By 68 AD, Vespasian had suppressed and claimed victory over all of Judaea, with the exception of Jerusalem and several small fortresses. Upon the death of Nero, he was proclaimed Emperor and returned to Rome. Shortly after his return, he sent Titus to finish his chores in Judaea. Judaea was a constant thorn in the Romans' side. This coin is one of the many issued to constantly remind the public of the successes of the Legions of Rome - a great propoganda campaign designed to maintain peace within the ever expanding borders of the empire.
