The New Left organizations in the Salt Lake City Division which are of possible interest under this program are the following:

(1) April Committee. SU file 100-10160 Bufile 62-111877.

> This organization is an accredited organization on the campus of the University of Utah, Salt Lake City, Utah. It has in the past sponsored anti-Vietnam demonstrations and a demonstration in opposition to CIA. In October, 1967, eight of its members staged a sit-in demonstration in front of the Induction Center, Salt Lake City, but this was not an official April Committee (AC) activity. Within recent months its principal leaders have ceased to be active in the organization, either through leaving the area or losing interest.

The most recent activity sponsored by the group was a "Happening" in the latter part of April, 1968, on the University of Utah Campus. The ostensible purpose of this activity was to make it possible for persons on the campus to distribute literature and speak in favor of their candidates for President of the United States. All shades of political direction were represented. This "Happening" was entirely peaceful but security officers at the Whiversity of Utah observed that marijuana was being openly smoked during



this "Happening." Before the security officers could obtain authority from the school officials to make arrests of those using marijuana, the smokers had dispersed, with the exception of one nonstudent, who was arrested. As a result, the University of Utah is considering withdrawing the accreditation for the AC, so it may cease its activities as an organization.


In view of the above, it does not appear at the present time that counterintelligence activities with respect to the AC are advisable. In addition to this, the AC during the Summer of 1967 was essentially inactive. This organization and its leaders will be closely observed for counterintelligence potentialities.

(2) Student Opportunity University League (SOUL). SU file 157-116.

This is a Negro group, which is accredited at the University of Utah. Its stated purpose is to develop pride in being a Negro. It has been relatively inactive. It appears to fit more closely among racial groups rather than New Left groups. It is therefore not considered that it should be considered at this time under this program. In the event its activities warrant, recommendations will be made to the Bureau.

(3) Student Freedom Party (SFP). SU file 100-10336.

This is a relatively new organization which has sprung up on the Utah State University Campus, Logan, Utah. In April, 1968, it staged a protest demonstration against the personnel recruiting activities of Dow Chemical on that campus. In connection with this demonstration, its members abided by the agreements which had been reached with the administration of the university pertaining to the demonstration. It is possible that future activities could lead to the desirability and need for counterintelligence, but this is not deemed advisable at this time.



This office has no individuals in its territory who could be considered as key activists at this time, according to the understanding of this office of this term.

In view of the above, it does not appear that this office is in a position to recommend the implementation of the Counterintelligence Program at this time. Normally New Left activities decrease perceptibly during summer months in this area because of the reduced activities on the campuses of colleges and universities. This office will, however, remain alert to new developments and will immediately recommend any logical counterintelligence action which appears advisable.

1. False Allegations of Police Brutality

This office has had no allegations of police brutality by members of the New Left Movement.

2. Immorality

There is no information presently available that members of the New Left Movement in the Salt Lake City Division are scurrilous and depraved to the extent that they would lend themselves to the Counterintelligence Program at this time.

3. Action By College Administrators

There have been no incidents in this area which can be used at this time to show the value of a firm stand by college administrators toward elements of the New Left. In the incidences which have occurred in this division where confrontation was possible, the representatives of the New Left have discussed the matter with the school administrators and then have abided by the results of the discussions. This was true in the case of the Student Freedom Party and its demonstration at the Utah State University, Logan, Utah. It was true in connection with the planned demonstration against Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) by the April Committee, Salt Lake City, Utah. This demonstration against CIA was initially to have taken place on the campus of the University of Utah, but later took place in downtown Salt Lake City, since the CIA representative interviewing possible applicants for employment with CIA changed the location of the interviews. The April Committee also abided by the ground rules set up____ for its happening on the University of Utah campus in April, 1968, even though there were elements from the hippie

mmunity in Salt Lake City, who smoked marijuana at this happening, one of whom was arrested.

It appears at the present time that the New Left Movement in Utah is relatively inactive and will remain so at least for the summer months. This office realizes that during this time of inactivity, efforts must be made to obtain appropriate coverage of the New Left Movement and to seek ideas for implementing the Counterintelligence Program in this area.

The three numbered items above will be given due consideration in connection with the submission of periodic communications to the Bureau in connection with this Program.

This organization has had no activities since Salt Lake City letter of 5/27/68. It is located on the campus of Utah State University, Logan, Utah. It is not anticipated that there will be any activities on the part of this organization prior to the beginning of the school year 1968-1969, and it may not become active at that time.

The possibility for counterintelligence against this organization will be given regular consideration.

- c. Specific Counterintelligence Considerations.
 - (1) False Allegations of Police Brutality.

There have been no allegations of police brutality by members of the New Left since Salt Lake City letter of 6/13/68.

(2) Immorality.

There has been no additional information pertaining to immorality since Salt Lake City letter of 6/13/68.

(3) Action By College Administrators.

There have been no instances involving the New Left with college administrators since Salt Lake City letter of 6/13/68.

This office has no individuals in its territory who could be considered key activists at this time.

In view of the above, this office is not in a position to recommend the implementation of the Counterintelligence Program at this time. This office will, however, remain alert to new

These LH's set forth in summary form the pertinent information pertaining to them for this program. All of the information set out can be backed up by filed sources.

The LIM pertaining to the University of Utah has been classified Confidential since some of the information therein is based on information from Security Informants and could reasonably result in identification of these informants, who are of continuing value, and could compromise effectiveness thereof.

The activities of the Student Freedom Party (SFP) at Utah State University (USU), Logan, Utah, have been insufficient for a more precise or extensive characterization than is included in the LHM.

The April Committee (AC) receives coverage by this office through information furnished by and None of these are members of the AC. This office also obtains some coverage of this group through established sources in nonacademic positions at the University of Utah, Salt Lake City, Utah, and through a review of student publications of that university. A specific assignment has been made in this office for the obtaining of adequate informant coverage of the AC. This will include contact with Armed Service intelligence agencies, as suggested by the Bureau by airtel of 6/6/68, entitled "INVESTIGATION OF THE NEW LEFT." In connection with the development of informants, counterintelligence potentialities will be carefully evaluated.

Coverage of the SFP has been obtained through established sources in nonacademic positions at USU, Logan, Utah. There is no certainty that this group will continue during the school year 1968-69. A specific assignment has been made for the obtaining of suitable informant coverage in the event this group continues.

On the basis of past indications, it appears the potential for violence at universities or colleges in Utah is not great. The only two such institutions which have New Left activities are the University of Utah, Salt Lake City, and USU, Logan, Utah. Up to the present time those associated with such activities have been willing to abide by agreements with administration officials at these schools with respect to the extent of the activities in which the organizations can engage. This has resulted in peaceful demonstrations where demonstrations took place, and there have been no attempts to take over buildings or otherwise engage in open confrontation. There are no presently visible ringleaders who appear to lean in the other direction.

The fact that the statement of the Students For A Democratic Society (SDS) tonvention in Michigan early in June, 1968, obviously raises the question with respect to violence, since SDS has been prominent in violence at other universities. The name of the past been known to advocate the use of violence. His activities will be carefully watched so that it can be determined whether the effect of the SDS Convention has changed his thinking in this respect.

Student Freedom Party (SFP)

This is a student group. There is no certainty that it will continue during the school year 1968-1969. It has approximately ten members, none of whom could be considered ringleaders in the present stage of its development.

On March 29. 1968, SFP sponsored a demonstration on the Utah State University Campus to protest the presence of a Dow Chemical Company recruiter on the campus. The demonstration was generally orderly and was followed by a panel discussion. The demonstration and the discussion opposed the manufacturing and use of napaim on moral grounds. Two faculty members participated in the panel discussion. SFP ran a slate of candidates for student offices in May, 1968, but all were unsuccessful.





The AC has engaged in no disruptive activities of the University of Itah Campus. The sit-in demonstration for which was arrested involved eight persons, all of whom were AC members. This sit-in was not an AC-approved activity. The AC engaged in an anti-Vietnam demonstration in Salt Lake City on October 71, 196%. It engaged in an anti-CIA demonstration in Salt Lake City on January 11, 1968. This was to have been a campus demonstration at the University of Utah, but moved to the Federal Building, Salt Lake City, when a CIA representative changed the site of interviews. These demonstrations were peaceful.

The AC staged a "happening" on the University of Utah Campus on April 25, 1968. This was peaceful, but some of those present were observed smoking marijuana. Some consideration was given by the university to withdrawing AC's accreditation, but this has not been done up to the present.





APRIL COMMITTEE

Source 1 on April 19, 1967, furnished the following information:

The Chairman of the Communist Farty (CP) of Utah is having the library of the CP of Utah checked over in order to make available some of the books for the use of the April Committee (AC) in Salt Lake City, Utah.

Source 1 furnished the following information on April 21, 1967:

At a meeting of the AC on April 19, 1967, the AC stated its desire to have the CP help it in any way possible.

Source i furnished the following information on May 2, 1967:

One of the members of the Salt Lake County Club of the CP of Utah was told on April 28, 1967, to remain as close to the AC as he could and keep the Salt Lake County Club of the CP advised of the AC's activities.

Source 1 on October 21, 1967, advised that eight members of the AC on October 20, 1967, staged a sit-in at the Armed Forces Examining and Entrance Station, Salt Lake City, Utah, for which they were arrested. They did not have approval of the AC for this action.

Source 2 on December 12, 1967, advised as follows:

The AC was organized in March, 1967, for the purpose of sponsoring a peace demonstration and teach-in against United

States involvement in Vietnam scheduled for April 15, 1967, and to serve as a rallying center for persons opposed to United States policy in Vietnam on a continuing basis. The Committee was organized as an accredited student organization on the University of Utah campus, with some nonstudent members.

The CP of Utah has been regularly interested in and sympathetic to the activities of the AC but has had no control over its policies. The AC is part of the "new left" in Utah and does not look to the CP of Utah for guidance, even though both oppose the United States policy in Vietnam.

None of the officers of the AC are oriented toward the CP at this time, nor have they been in the past.




The "Daily Utah Chronicle," student newspaper of the University of Utah, Salt Lake City, in its issue of January 11, 1968, stated the AC had cooperated in setting up a draft and information counseling center in Salt Lake City.

Source 2 on May 8, 1968, advised that the AC has been relatively inactive in recent months, but was in danger of losing its accreditation at the University of Utah, Salt Lake City, Utah, because marijuana was smoked at one of its campus activities in April, 1968.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. Gus Hall, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1955, SDS National Convention, an anticommunist provisc was removed from the SDS constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of April 18, 1967, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.


The Utah Committee On Vietnam (UCV) was organized in the Spring of 1967 by people connected with the University of Utah. Salt Lake City, Utah. Its activities are primarily connected with the University of Utah even though the organization seeks wider influence. It is headed by University of Utah professors.

The UCV has the principal purpose of creating a wide discussion of the war in Vietnam with the aim of bringing about its discontinuance. It adopts a reasoned approach in its activities. The Communist Party of Utah considers UCV to be part of the new left but has no influence over its policies.

This source advised on May 8, 1968, that UCV has had no activity since the latter part of 1967.

1. Potential Counterintelligence Action

There has been no activity during the past three months of the April Committee or the Student Freedom Party. LHMs concerning these groups were furnished under date of 7/2/68.

A group known as the Utah Peace and Freedom Party (UPFP) held a meeting at the Campus Christian Center of the University of Utah at Salt Lake City, Utah, on 7/24/68. This meeting was covered by a PSI of the Salt Lake City Office. who reported that such persons as known Communist Party (CP) members, and


who attended the Students For A Democratic Society (SDS) Convention in June, 1968, were in attendance. The SDS has been known to participate in violence in some universities.

A confidential source of the Salt Lake City Office has advised that the UPFP is considered part of the New Left by the CP in the Ftate of Utah.

On 10/1/68 the "Deseret News," a Salt Lake City daily newspaper, carried headlines as follows: "FBI Sees Security Threat in New Left." It is contemplated that this type of publicity from the FBI might succeed in alerting the public, as well as university students and faculty, to the dangers to our security of the New Left organizations.

The April Committee and Student Freedom Party have been totally inactive during the past three months.

The Students For A Democratic Society (SDS) was recently admitted to the University of Utah Campus, Salt Lake City, Utah. To date, the activities of this group have afforded little opportunity for counterintelligence action. Prior to the SDS being admitted to the campus, this office cooperated fully with

discreetly furnishing him with information regarding the activities of the SDS that might serve to block the admission of the group on the campus.

Salt Lake City will observe the activities of the SDS and individual members of the group closely for opportunities to capitalize on any situation that could be utilized to discredit the group as a whole or to bring the activities of individuals to the attention of their parents.



1. Potential Counterintelligence Action

On 2/24/69, Salt Lake City, Utan, advised that the April Committee (AC) is a defunct organization on the University of Utah Campus.

On 2/10/69,

Utah State University (USU), Logan, Utah, advised that the Student Freedom Party (SFP) is no longer in existence on the USU Campus. He advised that members of the SFP had met and formulated a new group known as Students For A Democratic Action (SDA). This group has been inactive to date and, therefore, has not afforded any opportunities for counterintelligence action by the Salt Lake City Division.

On 2/24/69 devised that the Students For A Democratic Society (SDS) are currently holding weekly meetings on the University of Utah Campus but have not sponsored or participated in any activities in the Salt Lake City area to date. The SDS was recognized at the University of Utah as a student organization during November, 1968, and in view of its inactivities, it has afforded little opportunity for counterintelligence action. 

Utah, who is a confidential source of the Salt Lake City Office, advised that the two current New Left groups on the USU campus are the Students For A Democratic Action (SDA) and Students For A Democratic Society (SDS). He advised that both these groups have been inactive and have not sponsored any demonstrations or created any disturbances on the USU campus since origination advised that a group of students who participated in organizing the SDA met on 5/26/69 under the auspices of SDS for the purpose to determine what activities should be undertaken by this group when classe; resume at USU in the Fall of 1969. Advised that this is the only meeting held at USU to knowledge in which either of these groups formulated plans for activity.

It is noted the above-mentioned sources on the USU campus and the University of Utah campus have been discreetly furnished information in the past concerning the activities of SDS and individual members of this office will continue to furnish this information in an effort to discourage or curtail activities of these New Left groups.

It is noted the Salt Lake City Office has in the recent past furnished information to the Salt Lake City Police Department concerning members of the Salt Lake City Draft Resistance (SLCDR) and their connection with marijuana and related drugs. Sources cognizant of SLCDR activities have advised that this group has been relatively inactive in the recent past and has not sponsored or planned any activities in the Salt Lake City area.

Salt Lake City Police Department, has advised that his department is remaining alert in an effort to secure prosecutive information regarding the possession of drugs by members of the SLCDR. It is noted the furnishing of this information has not provided any tangible results to date and this office will continue to provide local authorities with this type of information.

Salt Lake City will continue to closely follow the activities of the above-mentioned organizations so as to remain alert for opportunities to discredit the individual members of these organizations or the organizations as a whole through counterintelligence action.



During the past quarter contact has been maintained with sources cognizant of New Left activities in the Salt Lake City Division, as well as Captain and Lake City Division.

Information furnished by these sources indicates that the only New Left type organization currently active in the Salt Lake City Division is the University of Utah Chapter of Students For A Democratic Society (SDS). These sources advised that the University of Utah Chapter of SDS has held several meetings during the past quarter but has otherwise been inactive with respect to instigating student agitation at the University of Utah or causing any issues on campus. It is noted the only occurrence of any significance with respect to the University of Utah during the past quarter was the appearance of JERRY RUBIN on the University of Utah Campus as a speaker during February, 1970. AUBIN's appearance on the University of Utah Campus was sponsored by the Student Council, and the University of Utah Chapter of SDS was not responsible for his appearing. Subsequent to RUBIN's appearance on the University of Utah Campus as a speaker, the University of Utah received much opposition from alumni and citizens of the Salt Lake City area in regard to their selection of speakers, and it is felt this opposition has caused the university to take a new look at their speaking program.

All sources advised it is their opinion that SDS is without issues or problems on the University of Utah Campus, and therefore has been unable to gather any student backing




During the past quarter the Salt Lake City Division has continued to maintain close contact with all informants and sources cognizant of New Left activities within the State of Utah so as to insure that every opportunity for counterintelligence action is taken. At the present time the University of Utah, Salt Lake City, Utah, Chapter of Students For A Democratic Society (SDS), which aligned with the Worker-Student Alliance faction of SDS nationally, is the only New Left-type organization within the State of Utah which offers potential for participation in demonstrating activities or any degree of violence. It is noted that during the past quarter they have been without an issue on the University of Utah Campus which they could use to foment disruption or otherwise create student-type demonstrations. Informants and sources have provided excellent coverage of SDS meetings at the University of Utah, and most of the meetings have consisted of twelve or less persons in attendance. Contact has been maintained with the University of Utah Security Police, who also closely cover the University of Utah Chapter of SDS activities, and they have failed to furnish any information which would be of counterintelligence value.

It is noted the University of Utah Chapter of SDS has not gained success in connection with any programs they have attempted to establish during the past quarter. On two occasions during the past quarter they attempted to organize student demonstrations in connection with tenant-worker issues, without success.

and had difficulty getting people to travel to Sacramento 3/19/71, and contacted CJCC to recruit young Negroes to travel to Sacramento even though they were not previously affiliated with University of Utah Chapter of SDS or PLP. PSI advised was able to recruit eight Negro male Job Corpsmen, names of whom are available.

PSI advised group rented three Ryder rental vans on 3/19/71 and departed Salt Lake City, Utah, for Sacramento late evening 3/19/71. A Special Agent of FBI also observed departure from residence at 11:50 pm, 3/19/71, and the Negro males were observed entering the vans and departing with the group.

OBJECTIVE

It is noted CJCC is operated by Thiokol Chemical Company, Clearfield, Utah, and one of the rules regarding corpsmen is they must have permission to leave the Center and specific authority to leave the State of Utah. Information received indicates Job Corpsmen will be sent home if they do not abide by rules and specifically if they violate rules by leaving the state without permission.

If information is given to the point of a confidential basis, it is felt this will result in their dismissal from JCC and will tend to discourage any further recruitment from JCC by SDS leaders. 1. Potential Counterintelligence Action

During the past quarter the Salt Lake City Division has continued to maintain close contact with all informants and sources cognizant of New Left activities within the State of Utah so as to insure that every opportunity for counterintelligence action is taken. It is noted the only New Lefttype organization within the Salt Lake City Division with any degree of activity at the present time is the University of Utah Chapter, Students For A Democratic Society (SDS)/Worker Student Alliance faction, at Salt Lake City, Utah. It is felt this is the only New Left-type organization within the State of Utah which offers potential for participation in demonstrating activities or any degree of violence. Regular contact is maintained with the University of Utah Security Police, who also closely follow the University of Utah Chapter of SDS activity. These contacts are maintained so as to insure prompt receipt of all information which may be of value with respect to counterintelligence.

The Salt Lake City Division recently submitted a proposed counterintelligence act against the University of Utah Chapter of SPS.

The only other New Left-type organization currently active within the Salt Lake City Division is the Young Socialist Alliance Chapter, Utah State University (USU), Logan, Utah. It is noted this chapter consists of three known members and has failed to participate in or organize any activities on the

Salt Lake City developed information concerning eight Job Corps trainees at Clearfield, Utah, who violated Job Corps regulations by leaving the Job Corps Center, at the request of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), without permission, in order to attend a New Left demonstration in Sacramento, California. Salt Lake City suggested that this information be furnished on a confidential basis to the Job Corps security officer at Clearfield, in anticipation that this would lead to the dismissal of eight trainees and would deter further recruiting by SDS among Job Corps personnel.

Authority for this proposal is being denied since it appears that this information should be disseminated by the Bureau through normal channels to the Office of Economic Opportunity (OEO). It is noted that funds for the operation of the Job Corps Center at Clearfield, are supplied by OEO.
