Re Bureau letter to all offices, 5/10/68.

1. Potential Counterintelligence Action:

In view of the upcoming demonstrations scheduled for Washington, D. C., in May, 1971, there is a fast developing situation wherein the Northern Virginia area will most probably be used as a staging area for some of the activities in Washington, D. C. Most probably the demonstrations would be opened with a large rock concert in the Northern Virginia area and it is anticipated that some participants will camp out in the Northern Virginia area. In view of these developments, Alexandria will remain alert for potential counterintelligence situations and keep the Bureau advised.

Alexandria at present has no other potential counterintelligence action.

2. Pending Counterintelligence Action:

Alexandria currently has no pending counterintelligence action.

3. Tangible Results:

Alexandria Division has achieved no tangible counterintelligence against New Left groups.

1. Potential Counterintelligence Action:

In last quarterly letter Alexandria Division reported under this section that it would consider approaching the owner of a building which housed the "Americong", an alleged New Left organization in Arlington, Virginia. Investigation at Arlington has since determined the "Americong" is nonexistent and Alexandria has closed its investigation in this matter. Therefore, Alexandria will submit no separate request to the Bureau in this matter.

Alexandria at present has no other potential counterintelligence action.

2. Pending Counterintelligence Action:

Currently, there is no pending counterintelligence action within the Alexandria Division.

3. Tangible Results:

Alexandria Division has achieved no tangible counterintelligence against New Left groups.

1. Potential Counterintelligence Action:

Alexandria Division currently has under investigation a commune known as "Americong" (Bufile: 62-112252) located at 1531 North 18th Street, Arlington, Virginia. Investigation has determined the owner of the building where this commune is located is [REDACTED] Arlington, Virginia, [REDACTED]. It is reported that [REDACTED] originally furnished the house at 1531 North 18th Street to the St. Charles Roman Catholic Church in Arlington, without charge, so that it could be used for youth programs. The building was, in fact, used for youth programs until approximately a year ago when the individual in charge of youth programs for the church was reassigned to another area. After that "hippies" moved in and the building has been used by various individuals since that time and is now the residence for the Americong.

Alexandria will develop background information on [REDACTED] and if he appears to be an upright citizen, Alexandria will submit a letter to the Bureau recommending he be interviewed to determine if he is cognizant of the purpose for which his building is now being used and further to determine if he would consider evicting the residents.

2. Pending Counterintelligence Action:

At this time, there is no pending counterintelligence action within the Alexandria Division.

1. Potential Counterintelligence Action

Investigation of New Left groups within the Alexandria Division has shown the formation recently of an anti-draft group called The Northern Virginia Resistance (NVR), whose leader is [REDACTED] at George Mason College, Fairfax, Virginia, and a well known anti-war and anti-draft activist. Alexandria is currently attempting to uncover financial irregularities in the support of this group and will submit its recommendations under a separate cover.

2. Pending Counterintelligence Action

At this time there is no pending counterintelligence action against the New Left within the Alexandria Division.

3. Tangible Results

As yet Alexandria Division has achieved no tangible counterintelligence against New Left Groups.

Re Bureau letter to all offices dated 5/10/68.

1. Potential Counterintelligence Action

In the prior three-month period, the only request for Bureau authority in a potential counterintelligence action was to request Bureau approval to exploit a situation where [REDACTED] and activist, was arrested as an accessory after the fact in a local car theft case. However, it was decided this situation had already received adequate press coverage, and the matter was not pursued.

2. Pending Counterintelligence Action

At this time, there is no pending counterintelligence action against the New Left within the Alexandria Division.

3. Tangible Results

As a result of his activist affiliations, [REDACTED] has had his teaching contract terminated at George Mason College effective at the end of the 1969-1970 school year.

Reurairtels related to a proposal for exposing [REDACTED] in the local press following his implication in a car theft.

Since the local newspapers have already carried news items relating to this incident which identify [REDACTED] as [REDACTED] George Mason College, as well as a draft resister, it is not felt that any benefit to the Bureau would accrue from further releases on the matter. Since [REDACTED] has already been charged with violation of Virginia statutes relating to car theft, you should take no further steps to have him charged with contributing to the delinquency of a minor.

Your interest in this Program is appreciated and you should continue to give it your closest attention.

NOTE: [REDACTED] was recently identified in local newspapers as [REDACTED] at George Mason College who has been a draft resister and who was arrested as an accessory after the fact in a car theft. Alexandria suggested that this information be released to the press through [REDACTED]. This has already appeared in the news. Alexandria further requested authority to explore possibilities of having [REDACTED] discuss with the parents of the car thief who is a minor the possibility of pressing local charges against [REDACTED] for contributing to the delinquency of a minor.

For the information of the Bureau, [REDACTED] at George Mason College, Fairfax, Va., a part of the University of Virginia (UVA), and is a [REDACTED] to the SDS on that campus. He is the subject of Bureau case [REDACTED] and has been active in anti-war and anti-draft activities in the Northern Virginia area. In the Spring of 1969 the UVA administration advised him that his teaching contract would not be renewed after its termination at the end of the Spring semester in 1970. As [REDACTED] will be teaching at George Mason College during the 1969-1970 school year without hope of returning, it is expected he will become even more active in his "New Left" activities. REC-85

As the purpose of the captioned program is to neutralize the activities of "New Left" organizations and leaders and to expose them for what they are, it is recommended that immediate consideration be given for authorization to the Alexandria Division to pursue the exposure of [REDACTED]. An excellent opportunity for the exposure of [REDACTED] can be capitalized on in the following manner:

The [REDACTED] through [REDACTED] has revealed an incident concerning [REDACTED] where he aided an AWOL 17-year old soldier to dispose of a stolen car. [REDACTED] advised on 9/11/69, this day, that he has obtained a local warrant for [REDACTED] charging him with violation of Section 18.1-11 of the 1950 Virginia Code, as amended, as an accessory after the fact in the car theft. Full details of this incident are contained in the attached FD-302 and investigative insert. This information can be released to the press through [REDACTED] and Bureau permission is requested to pursue this incident and also explore the possibilities of having the [REDACTED] discuss with the parents of the car thief the possibility of also pressing local charges against [REDACTED] for contributing to the delinquency of a minor.
