The following suggestions are being made for the future guidance of your office in preparing quarterly reports in captioned matter.

An opening statement in the Details of rerep appearing on Page 1D indicates that characterizations of organizations are set forth in the Appendix. This is also revealed in the Table of Contents, Page 1C, where it is indicated that Pages 220-252 contain an Appendix Glossary of Organizations. In view of these statements at the outset of the report, it should not have been necessary to have made statements throughout the Details, as was done, indicating that specific organizations are characterized in the Appendix.

Rerep contains a section devoted to an Appendix Glossary of Individuals. Pages 180-219 are devoted to the characterizations of individuals. However, throughout the report there appear numerous characterizations of individuals which duplicate characterizations in the Glossary. Attempt to justify this characterization is stated on Page 1D where it is explained that some characterizations of individuals are included in the narrative for clarity and ease in reading. The procedure utilized has resulted in much duplication. In order to avoid unnecessary duplication and effect savings in Agent and clerical time, as well as savings in space, it is believed that a uniform practice should be followed. That is, either include all characterizations of individuals in the Glossary or include them all in the narrative.

On May 24, 1955, Claude Lightfoot was heard to complain bitterly before members of the staff of the Communist Party (CP) of Illinois concerning financial assistance he was receiving from the National Office of the Party. He noted that although he is head of the Illinois District and head of the National Negro Commission, he gets no funds from the National Office to travel or to cover his other expenses. He stated that he intended to take this matter up with the National Office in the near future.

Page 356 of a Communist Party Nominating Petition of Councilman PETER V. CACCHIONE, dated 8/19/43, line two, contains the name of [REDACTED] Brooklyn.

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Page 1249, of a Communist Party Nominating Petition for Councilman PETER V. CACCHIONE, dated 7/31/45, contains on line one, the name and address of [REDACTED] Brooklyn.

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In referenced airtel and LHM information was set forth concerning a movement which was underway to have a sit-in to protest segregated policies of the Hammermill Paper Company in its Alabama mills at the company's annual meeting in Erie, Pennsylvania, on 5/11/65. The sit-in, which was sponsored by college students, was being promoted by [REDACTED] (ph), according to [REDACTED] who is a student at Oberlin College in Ohio.

Inasmuch as the sit-in was being sponsored by college students, it would appear that [REDACTED] mentioned above is not identical with [REDACTED] (ph) in view of the apparent difference in age. A review of the indices did not reveal any information which would tend to link [REDACTED]

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NY 2010-S* has reported that on 5/17/65, [] (LNU) contacted HENRY WINSTON who was at the National Office of the CPUSA, and expressed a desire to see WINSTON, who said that was impossible.

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[] said he comes to New York weekly to go to the Veterans Administration, but that he had to be back on the job in Baltimore on the morning of 5/18/65. He noted he had finally met GEORGE MEYERS about 12 days before, but MEYERS had to leave, but was to see MEYERS on 5/20/65.

[] noted that he sees TED BASSETT, who is on the editorial staff of "The Worker," quite often when BASSETT goes to Washington.

[] asked WINSTON if he had been receiving the material he had been sending, and WINSTON acknowledged that he had, saying it's been very good.

[redacted] said a big thing is coming off on the 29th in Washington - "they're having a big encampment on the MFDP (Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party) because it's coming up for a vote again on the 4th. Rev. [redacted] (ph) just told me about it. [redacted] and the others are sending all kinds of people down there". [redacted] thought that they should get in on it, and WINSTON agreed.

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[redacted] said he would get more on it and send what he can to WINSTON. He said he is supposed to start another workshop, and "the reason I want to talk to you, HENRY, is that I'm in on all these things and I want to know how to work and there are many other things I want to talk to you about."

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[redacted] said he would see WINSTON the following week after finishing with the Veteran's Administration.

[redacted] as of 3/15/65, was residing at [redacted] NYC, and employed as [redacted]

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[redacted] NYC. He was arrested in a demonstration at the [redacted]

He called also for the establishment of CP contacts in the Negro freedom organizations such as Southern Christian Leadership Conference, The Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee and others. The Party should also concern itself with Negro-Labor unity.

MEYERS talk, in the form of proposals, was to be presented to the CP, USA National Committee meeting later on the weekend.

The Staten Island Chapter of C.O.R.E. held a meeting on May 18, 1965 at the Marikam Houses Community Center in Staten Island. Meeting began about 8:30 P.M.

Eight people attended and normal C.O.R.E. business was discussed. There was one unusual item however. [redacted] who has been active in the "Staten Island Peace Group" attended the meeting, and participated in all the discussion. This was his first appearance at a regular meeting. On at least three occasions he commented on civil rights matters by making references and comparisons to U.S. activities in Viet-Nam and the Dominican Republic. His comments were sarcastic and intended (supposedly) to be humorous. On the occasion of each comment, when the trend of the discussion did not change and his comments were generally ignored, he would tell a brief "joke" apparently to give the impression that his entire comment was intended only as a joke. For instance, after trying to draw a parallel between Viet Nam and a current problem in the deep south, he quipped "Oh well, I guess we would be even if they send Marines into Mississippi".

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What makes his appearance at the meeting more unusual is that [redacted] and [redacted] have not appeared at the last two or three meetings.

On April 26, 1965, source learned the following information:

On that date [redacted] was in contact with CLAUDE LIGHTFOOT at Communist Party headquarters in New York City, at which time LIGHTFOOT told [redacted] to contact HENRY WINSTON while he was in New York. LIGHTFOOT advised [redacted] that a meeting was all set to discuss the forthcoming NAACP National Convention to be held in Denver, Colorado, in June, 1965. LIGHTFOOT also advised [redacted] that he should attempt to contact PETTIS PERRY, who was residing in the same hotel as LIGHTFOOT. Source advised that he also learned that [redacted] attempted to contact both PERRY and WINSTON, however both these individuals were tied up at that time and were unable to meet with [redacted]. Source added that [redacted] was also in contact on April 26, 1965, with BILL ALLEN of Detroit, and ALLEN stated that he planned to go to the Soviet Union with PETTIS PERRY in the near future. Source also learned that PERRY planned to spend a month in a sanitarium in the Soviet Union.

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Source also learned that [redacted] and TED BASSETT met on April 27, 1965, to set up a meeting for April 28, 1965, to discuss the NAACP Convention. Also to be at this meeting in addition to BASSETT and [redacted] and [redacted].

On April 28, 1965, BASSETT and [redacted] met for the proposed NAACP discussion; however, [redacted] and [redacted] failed to appear, and the meeting was re-scheduled for April 29, 1965. On April 29, 1965, BASSETT and [redacted] again met and again [redacted] failed to show up. BASSETT and [redacted] then decided to go ahead with their discussion concerning the NAACP National Convention. These individuals discussed the following points for consideration at the forthcoming National Convention of the NAACP:

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1) Question of vote - reiterated the line set forth by CLAUDE LIGHTFOOT to the effect that the Party must strive for voter registration in the South and for an increase in quality representation in the North.

It was stated that the National NAACP office now seems ready to go further on a political action program; therefore, the Party must explore possibility of trying to commit the Convention to a broader policy regarding active participation in election campaigns.

2) Foreign affairs - It was decided that it would be good to raise the problems of Viet Nam and Africa; however, no decision was arrived upon concerning this issue since the Party forces at the Convention must wait to see what other forces are available and what resolution may be made in this field. It was decided that Party forces at this Convention could not on their own introduce such resolutions.

3) Domestic - It was decided that all effort must be made to defeat the Chicago NAACP attempt to reject the multiple branch plan. In this plan which involves the splitting of a large NAACP organization into five or six smaller branches, it was felt that Party forces would be in a position to function more effectively. It was stated that this plan had previously been tried in Texas and California; however, the Chicago NAACP is against the plan and is formulating a resolution to reject it. It was decided that all efforts must be made to oppose the Chicago recommendation.

On May 21, 1965, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished information on that date that a meeting of the Research Committee would be held at Harry Wachtel's office from 12:00 until 4:00 PM, on May 28, 1965.

The same source has furnished information that when reference is made to a meeting of the Research Committee, it means a meeting of Martin Luther King and his advisors, and, in the past, has been held at Harry Wachtel's office, 575 Madison Avenue, New York City.

On the morning of May 28, 1965, the same confidential source furnished information which revealed that Clarence Jones was in contact with Stanley Levison on that date. Levison inquired of Jones whether it would be possible for him to meet with Martin Luther King for thirty minutes on that date. According to the source, Jones told Levison that it would not since King would be tied up in a meeting (Research Committee meeting at Wachtel's).

The same source advised later during the morning of May 28, 1965, that Clarence Jones was in contact with an unknown man on that date and during their contact they discussed their plans for the day. Jones said he had to go down to the Astor Hotel, New York, New York, to confer with Martin Luther King about his legal difficulties arising over the Gilligan case.

In regard to the Gilligan case, it is noted that Lieutenant Thomas Gilligan of the New York City Police Department (NYCPD) is suing King and others for libel arising out of the Harlem riots during the summer of 1964. Gilligan was the officer who killed a teenage Negro boy during a fracas in front of a public school in New York City. The suit against King is for remarks he reportedly made on the National Broadcasting System (NBC) in regard to Gilligan.

On May 28, 1965, a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that on that date Stanley Levison was in contact with Clarence Jones. Levison discussed with Jones the possibility of seeing Martin Luther King for one half hour to discuss one [redacted] Levison felt this was important enough for him to cancel a trip to Wilmington, Delaware, if the meeting with King could be arranged. However, Jones advised him that it would not be possible because of a meeting to be held from 11:00 AM to 4:00 PM (a meeting of the Research Committee consisting of King and his advisors on May 28, 1965). Levison added that he would be willing to go to Atlanta for an hour's discussion in order to settle it.

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Jones asked Levison how he, Jones, could get the information to Levison if there is a definite agreement to take [redacted] on. Levison replied that if "he" (King) is willing to go along with that he, Levison, did not have to know until Saturday (May 29, 1965). Levison said he is concerned that if Jones gives the proposal to King "in bare bones", King and [redacted] of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference) (SCLC) might say they do not know [redacted] that well, that he is white, and that it raises some questions. This source further advised, on May 29, 1965, that, on that date, Clarence Jones told Stanley Levison that he had spoken to Martin Luther King about [redacted] (being employed by the SCLC). He said that King advised him to speak to [redacted] and get him to commit himself. According to Jones, King told him that he could go ahead and hire [redacted]. Levison stated that he would contact [redacted] and pin him down on this.

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The source stated that they also discussed Warrensburg, (Virginia) with Levison wanting to know how Jones was going down (to attend the SCLC leadership meeting scheduled to begin on June 8, 1965). Levison said that "they" wanted them down there on Wednesday (June 9, 1965) and that it would last through the 10th and 11th. He added that he and Jones could take a plane to Washington and rent a car there. Jones commented that he could leave at any time and Levison expressed a preference for leaving in the morning so they could enjoy the whole day.

Jones mentioned that [redacted] [redacted] of the SCLC) had been invited to speak to the Lawyers Constitutional Defense Committee about getting prominent people from the Wall Street Community together at an unpublicized luncheon. He said that [redacted] was impressed with some names that had been given him and wanted Jones to contact King to make sure he would go along with it. Levison felt this was good and that [redacted] could play a role in things such as this because there always is a need for someone who can arrange things.

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Levison inquired if anything had been discussed concerning the Summer Community Organization and Political Education (SCOPE) project. Israeli Participation in IX Festival
Is In Doubt

FOR
IMMEDIATE RELEASE

It is with deep regret that the American Youth Festival Committee finds it necessary to announce that at this time the possibility exists that there will be no delegation of youth from Israel at the IX World Youth Festival in Algiers, Algeria, July 28 - August 7, 1965. We were advised by the International Preparatory Committee (IPC) on May 11 that "the IPC estimates that the political position of Algeria toward Israel does not allow the participation of an Israeli delegation at the IX World Youth Festival at this time."

It is unfortunate that the highly charged atmosphere between the Arab world and Israel has made it extremely difficult for the IPC of the World Youth Festival to successfully solve the problem of inviting an Israeli delegation to Algeria.

We feel however, at this time there is still hope that some solution might be found which would result in the participation of Israeli youth.

The spirit of the World Youth Festival cries out against political divisions which are responsible for keeping young people from joining together in international festivities. The Festival should be a means of bringing together young people from all walks of life, national origins, and cultures as an antidote to ancient, divisive political doctrine. The AYFC feels that participation in the Festival must be open to young people of all nations for the Festival to properly be a forum for the exchange of ideas. We are opposed to the exclusion of youth from any country, and we feel this is a contradiction to the aims of the Festival - peace and friendship. The AYFC will continue to encourage participation by Americans at the Festival for the Festival itself will contribute toward breaking down these barriers. At the same time, we will continue to urge the IPC to welcome participation by Israeli young people.

We hope there is yet time to find a workable compromise to effect participation by an all-Israeli delegation as in past Festivals, and we urge that all concerned individuals, organizations and governments do all in their power to make this possible for the sake of a future of peace and freedom.

On May 31, 1955, Claude Lightfoot, leading functionary, Communist Party (CP) of Illinois, and head of the National Negro Commission, CP, USA, stated that in August, 1955, there is a Pan-African meeting scheduled to be held in Accra, Ghana. Since he is in charge of the Party's Negro Commission and since he feels that the American communists should be represented at this meeting, he is now making preparations to go to Africa for this meeting. He stated that he had not, however, discussed this matter with Gus Hall, General Secretary, CP, USA, but would go ahead with his personal preparations for such a trip.

Claude Lightfoot further advised that he is worried about Chou En-lai's forthcoming trip to Africa and he is of the opinion that the CP, USA cannot ignore it. According to Lightfoot, it is his opinion that Chou will make an all-out bid during this visit to Africa to gain influence for the CP of China's position.

The first session of an Enlarged Meeting of the CP, USA National Committee opened at about 7:30 P.M., 4/23/65, at the Hotel Astor, NYC.

HENRY WINSTON opened the meeting by greeting all those present. [redacted] was then elected Chairman.

HALL's report was on the "War in Viet Nam" which he called imperialist aggression. President JOHNSON's policy is the result of the ideas of monopoly capitalists in responsible positions in U.S. government. He accused the U.S. of setting up a corrupt regime in South Viet Nam, which would be favorable to the U.S. imperialist policy. The nations of the world are almost unanimous in their condemnation of U.S. policy.

According to HALL, the U.S. is able to escalate the war because of the Sino-Soviet dispute. The socialist countries need unity. The forces of peaceful co-existence must unite in the struggle against imperialism.

The current aggressive policy of the U.S. gives heart to the ultra-right. The CP should expose this as well as the invisible government of imperialists surrounding President JOHNSON.

HALL said there is now a strong grass roots movement consisting of people of all persuasions demanding the cessation of hostilities and a total withdrawal of U.S. troops in Viet Nam. The Party must enter this movement with militancy and aggressiveness. It must be in the forefront of the fight. With this ground swell of the American people speaking out against Viet Nam, the CP can afford to be more open and outspoken in its criticism of LBJ and his Viet Nam policy and should furnish leadership to that movement.

All districts he said should look into political action groups and get involved with them. The CP should work with any group where there is agreement with the condemnation of the U.S. policy in Viet Nam.

The second day's session on 4/24/65, at the Hotel Astor consisted of speeches by almost all present regarding HALL's report on Viet Nam.

TOM DENNIS was elected Chairman. There were more than 20 speakers who were supposed to be limited to 15 minutes each.

While most agreed with HALL's estimate of Viet Nam there was a group who did not. This group consisted of JAMES TORMEY, SI GERSON, DOROTHY HEALEY, MICKEY LIMA, AL RICHMOND, CHARLENE MITCHELL, BEN DOBBS and others. Their disagreement with HALL was sharp, basic and it appeared that they had discussed it among themselves.

What HALL advocated in substance was a considerable change toward President JOHNSON. The CP supported him in his election as a liberal and a leader against the ultra-right.

HALL argued for a position change from somewhere left of center to the far-but not ultra-left position of the Asian parties. He called for defeat of President JOHNSON's policies in Viet Nam and urged militant highly aggressive action on this line. He alleged the great majority of the American people were against the war and the CP should go to the forefront of this movement.

DOROTHY HEALEY, et al, while abhorring the Viet Nam war argued that HALL had overestimated the ground-swell of American public opinion and that for the Party to commit itself to this line would result in its complete isolation.

The difference here was basic and HALL became livid when he tried to summarize his report and minimize the difference at the third session on 4/25/65.

HALL did summarize his report on 4/25/65 and called for its adoption. At this time HEALEY, et al, in a devious show of outward unity, all spoke in a manner to wit: "I am voting for HALL's report as I understand it to mean....." and then restating their earlier positions. As each in his turn did this, the effect of HALL's report was undercut.

At the 4/24/65 session, GEORGE MEYERS introduced proposals agreed to at a meeting of the CPUSA Negro Commission held on 4/23/65. These proposals which were adopted were:

1. Each district set up a committee to organize work in the South.
2. Districts should send literature to the South.
3. Establish cadre and send to areas of concentration in the South.
4. Recruit Negro Youth.
5. Raise money and keep the Negro struggle in motion.

At the third day's session on 4/25/65, some discussion of HALL's report continued.

JAMES JACKSON then gave a report on his attendance at a Conference of Communist Parties in Moscow in March, 1965. According to JACKSON, the British and Italian delegates were responsible for the subdued statement, i.e., not calling for an 81 Party Conference, coming out of this conference. It was felt that an 81 Party Conference would result in a showdown and an open break of the Asian parties from the international. It was felt that there could be unity around such things as Viet Nam on which they all agree with the hope that the existing differences would resolve themselves in time.

JACKSON presented a resolution calling for unity of parties and for an 81 Party Conference at some later date. Thus in accordance with the Soviet line.

[redacted] presented a resolution calling for a CP National Convention in the first quarter of 1966 and for the establishment of committees to prepare documents by October 1, 1965, for discussion and presentation to the Convention.

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A motion was also presented to hold a conference within the next two months to discuss CP organization, building, leadership and education.

HALL summarized his report and the meeting as set out above.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in April, 1964, that Stanley Levison was a secret member of the Communist Party, United States of America (CPUSA), in July, 1963. In late 1963 and early 1964, he criticized the Communist Party (CP) for not being sufficiently militant in the civil rights struggle. Levison was described by certain CP leaders as being to the "left" of the CP in his position on civil rights. His differences with the CP, however, are merely tactical and he continues his ideological adherence to Communism.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on June 3, 1965, that on June 12, 1965, there will be held a Communist Party (CP), USA, National Negro Commission meeting at 23 West 26th Street, New York, New York.

The source knows 23 West 26th Street to be the headquarters of the CP, USA.

According to the source the discussion at the forthcoming meeting will concern plans for basic resolutions on the Negro question.

Among matters to be discussed at the meeting will be (1) stages in the struggle for Negro equality and political action; (2) Negroes and agriculture, problems and solutions; (3) problems and solutions, Negroes in industry; (4) discussion on how to win over white workers who are opposed to the advancement of the Negro worker; (5) features of the Negro question which reflect on their racial character; and (6) the role of communists and left forces in the struggle for Negro equality.

NY 2399-S* on 5/28/65, advised that GIL GREEN, that date in Communist Party (CP) Headquarters, gave a short report concerning a demonstration of the National Committee to Abolish the House Un-American Activities Committee in the recent past (believed to be held in Chicago).

GREEN said he attended the meeting and at first, was concerned whether there would be red-baiting of Communists and an attack on the Committee at the same time. GREEN said this did not happen even though it was not a Communist audience. According to GREEN, a representative of the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom, had been asked if she had any objections to Communists being in leading positions in her organization and she replied, "No if they agree with our program and work for peace-we screen nobody".

GREEN continued that there were representatives from the Southern Christian Leadership Conference and from Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee at his demonstration.

GREEN said the most important factor of the demonstration was the merging of the issue of civil liberties with the issue of civil rights. According to GREEN, it was pointed out that the IMAC had received an appropriation of \$50,000 to ostensibly investigate the Ku Klux Klan (KKK). The civil rights movement wanted a commission, such as the Warren Commission, to investigate the killings in the South.

On June 1, 1965, Confidential Source One advised that RANDOLPH T. BLACKWELL (Program Director of Southern Christian Leadership Conference, SCLC) continues to become a more important figure in the operation of SCLC. In the Source's opinion, BLACKWELL is somewhat contemptuous of Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., Reverend RALPH ABERNATHY and other ministers at SCLC and has indicated that these ministers, while creating a favorable impression for the organization, do not really understand the purpose of the organization. BLACKWELL has indicated that he is hostile to law enforcement agencies. He has urged other persons at SCLC not to call upon law enforcement agencies for assistance, particularly the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

BLACKWELL has developed a close relationship with [redacted] employees at SCLC. Their relationship appears to be of a political nature and the [redacted] appear to have a common political outlook with BLACKWELL. It is known that the [redacted] were responsible for the receipt of copies of the publication "Freedomways" at SCLC headquarters and distribute copies of this publication at SCLC.

LEVISON said he and JONES could take a plane to Washington and rent a car there. LEVISON expressed a preference for leaving in the morning so they could enjoy the entire day.

Such information will be immediately furnished WFO and Richmond by the most expeditious means when obtained. In any event, the WFO will conduct surveillances of JONES and LEVISON to place them on a plane to Washington and both offices advised.

WFO and Richmond should conduct physical surveillances of JONES and LEVISON and Richmond should endeavor to physically observe JONES and LEVISON with KING, it being noted that JONES and LEVISON plan to be in Virginia for several days. Information should be developed to show LEVISON's attendance at the Virginia meeting.

In the past, JONES has used Eastern Airlines Gattle service out of New York for trips to Washington, D.C. WFO should check rental car service for reservations in the name of JONES and LEVISON.

There are enclosed for WFO and Richmond photographs of CLARENCE JONES and STANLEY LEVISON.

Atlanta should advise Richmond of the exact location of the SCLC meeting.

For the information of WFO and Richmond, STANLEY LEVISON has been described as a secret member of the CPUSA, and was at one time a close advisor of MARTIN LUTHER KING. For a time, his contacts with KING had been held to a minimum but recently his contacts with KING have increased.

"Greetings--I started this letter 2 weeks ago, but got side-tracked;

"Our telephone conversation, re the tape of the [redacted] meeting, left me with the distinct impression that you were making oblique references to something--", you knew all about the meeting", -- and it led me to conjecture as to what you might be alluding to. I recalled that [redacted] had said that she would write you, or [redacted] or both, about differences we had had about the meeting before it occurred. She verified that she had written.

"I want to state the situation as I saw it:

"(1)- Prior to the final decision to have [redacted] I had occasion to speak to the Philly CORE leader, on matters unrelated to the assassination. It came up, and on his own, he told me of his intentions to exert great efforts to try to reduce the hostility between the Muslim and the OAAU people, which he thought dangerous.

"(2)- Our contact with the OAAU is thru someone I'll call [redacted]. I went to see him, with the leaflets and tickets; besides which I was to work out an arrangement with him for co-ordinating his people and ours, as to security, particularly. (We had dealt with [redacted] as the OAAU representative up to that time, with no questions, to my knowledge, that we had any reason to doubt him.) When I spoke to him on that score, he stated that neither he nor his people could be expected to attend! Astounded, I pointed out what efforts we had expended to build the meeting, and that frankly we felt that the success of the

meeting depended in good part, on his groups efforts to build the meeting, and kept pressing him to tell me the score frankly. (His attitude, though friendly, still exhibited the wall between a Negro dealing with a white), He began hinting of a fear of the consequences of holding a meeting with [redacted] Finally, under further pressing, the wall lifted, and he talked, not with fear, but earnestness, that he had good reason to feel that the Muslims would attach the meeting, in some form; - that his people felt sure of that; that he had not been listened to when he warned the NY OAAU people that the security was dangerously slack, and that we should take seriously into account what he was saying suggesting we substitute another speaker for Shabazz.

"In reply, I pointed out the fact that the NY Militant Labor Forum's meeting for [redacted] had run thru without incident. His answer was that in Philly relations were hot; that to the Muslims it was a matter of survival; they saw the competition from the OAAU and the new religious organization, as that much of a threat.

"Now - I still understand that, though we do not speak of it, we believe that the assassination was executed by the Muslims. At least, I had no reason to think otherwise, up to the conversation with [redacted] Also, recall my account of the conversation with the CORE leader.

"I ask you this: could we just disregard Henry's statements? Did we, in view of all the above, have the right to feel that risk was not involved?

"Leaving aside [redacted] willingness to assume the risk, how about our own considerations? May I say, at this point, that even though the meeting was a great success, it by no means obviates the questions I am raising, as they stood before the meeting! These questions were not answered!

"My answer to the situation, to [] that evening, after relating on detail the conversation, was:

"1-We did not know enough about what was transpiring in the Ghetto to have the right to disregard [] opinions, and the CORE leaders attitude;

"2-It followed that we had to assume that a risk was involved;

"3-We had no forces capable of acting as a guard. We had no Negro sympathizers whom we could depend on;

"4-The very success of the meeting was open to grave question, in view of the difference, at the NY meeting, between the Malcolm attendance and that turning out for []. If NY could only draw 145, how many could we expect, without OAAU support? (We would need about 90 attendance to cover costs).

"5-Assuming the worst, an armed attack (a) our name would be mud, since [] would spread the word that he had warned us (our friends of his were listening to our conversation), and we whites had disregarded his advice. On top of that, who could say what would happen to our small Party and YSA forces?

"6-Assuming a less drastic form of attack, one simply designed to break up the meeting (of which they are easily capable) wouldn't that have a long-lasting effect on future attendance at public functions? When we are painfully, but with successes, just beginning to rebuild a forum attendance?

"Therefore since no great principle dictated that we must hold a [] meeting now, we change speakers trying for [] to talk along the line of an appreciation of Malcolm.

"The content of [redacted] objection was that the publicity had gone out; she inclined toward doubting Henry, that he had given up, as some comrades had when the Old Man was assassinated.

"I respect [redacted] organizational ability and her instinct. As best as I could judge, however, she was animated by instinct mainly.

"However, my belief is in objective consideration of the evidence at hand, and if facing trouble, judging the relationship of forces. If we appear to have insufficient forces, especially raw and undependable, to cope with the situation, we find a way to withdraw from it, and try to handle it another way. You can't disregard instinct and intuition, but it has always made me highly uneasy to depend on it absolutely.

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"Such situations have arisen before, and I'm not aware that anyone has found the answer, completely. But in the situation described, I still think a conservative attitude was called for.

"If you care to show this to [redacted] it's OK with me.

On May 29, 1965, the source advised that Clarence Jones and Stanley Levison conferred on that date regarding the SCLC meeting scheduled for June 8-11, 1965, in Virginia. In that regard, Levison told Jones that "they" wanted them (Levison and Jones) down there on Wednesday (June 9, 1965). Levison and Jones discussed what means of transportation they would use to go down there.

On May 29, 1965, a confidential source advised that Stanley Levison and Clarence Jones, New York City, were planning to attend a meeting of officials of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) to be held at Warrenton, Virginia, on June 9, 1965. The meeting was to extend through June 11, 1965.

A second source advised on June 8, 1965, that reservations were to be made for Stanley Levison, Clarence Jones and Adele Canto, an employee of the SCLC office in New York City, to travel to Washington, D.C., on June 9, 1965.

At 6:35 P.M. on June 9, 1965, at the Washington National Airport (WNA), Arlington, Virginia, Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) observed Stanley Levison, accompanied by an unknown white female, about forty years of age, debark from an Eastern Airlines shuttle flight, which originated in New York City. Also debarking from the same plane, but not in close proximity at the time of departure was an individual identified as Clarence Jones.

A few minutes later, Levison, the unknown woman and Jones were observed conversing in the main lobby of the Terminal Building. At 6:50 P.M. they were observed to enter a taxicab after which they were driven to the Dulles International Airport (DIA), where they were observed to arrive at 7:35 P.M. At the Terminal Building of the DIA, they met an unknown white male, 60 - 65 years of age. The above four mentioned individuals walked to an airport parking lot where they entered a late model red Pontiac automobile bearing District of Columbia license RB 169.

On June 10, 1965, it was determined through records of the Avis Rent-A-Car System, Washington National Airport (WNA) that a red Pontiac automobile bearing District of Columbia license RB 169 was rented at WNA at 4:57 P.M. on June 9, 1965. BLACKWELL (Program Director of SCLC) that on June 12, 1965, SCOPE would begin an orientation period to be held on the campus of Morris Brown College, which is part of the Atlanta University System. [redacted] an officer of SCOPE, mentioned that several hundred people were expected to attend this orientation. [redacted] indicated that the staff of SCOPE was poorly prepared for this orientation and was working on the program late into the night of June 11, 1965.

Source advised that on June 13, 1965, BLACKWELL advised [redacted] a member of SCOPE, that on that date he would meet with HOSEA WILLIAMS, Director of Voter Registration, SCLC, and currently in charge of SCOPE, GWEN GREEN, member of SCOPE and BAYARD RUSTIN regarding the current SCOPE orientation.

Source advised that on June 13, 1965, [redacted] to the President of SCLC) explained to ERIC KINDBERG (SCLC Field Representative) that Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. (President of SCLC) was anxious to have RUSTIN talk with him.

BAYARD RUSTIN

In "The Saturday Evening Post", issue of July 11-18, 1964, page 76, BAYARD RUSTIN is the subject of a feature article captioned "The Lone Wolf of Civil Rights." In it, RUSTIN is said to have come

to New York in 1938, as an organizer for the Young Communist League (YCL), and as such, he had the job of recruiting students for the "Party". Furthermore, the article reports that during his first years in New York, RUSTIN gave most of his earnings to the "Party". He reportedly left the "Party" in 1941, the article states.

The YCL has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The "Daily Worker", February 11, 1957, page 1, column 2, reported that BAYARD RUSTIN, Executive Secretary, War Resisters League, was an observer at the 16th National Convention of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA), held in New York City, on February 9-12, 1957.

The "Daily Worker" was an east coast Communist publication until it ceased publication on January 13, 1958.

Confidential Source Two advised on September 25, 1963, that during a meeting of the National Board, CP, USA, on that date BENJAMIN J. DAVIS remarked that, "RUSTIN calls me constantly--openly."

Confidential Source Three advised on February 19, and 20, 1964, that BAYARD RUSTIN contacted BENJAMIN J. DAVIS on those dates, and sought his advice as to how he could escape from a speaking engagement to which he was committed. On the latter contact, DAVIS told RUSTIN that he was working on his request and had contacted friends who had contacts with the group to which RUSTIN was to speak.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished information on June 12, 1965, concerning a contact between Clarence Jones and a man unknown to the source. Their contact was in regard to a three day conference of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) (headed by Martin Luther King, Jr.) Advisory Committee and Board, which took place at Warrenton, Virginia, on June 8-11, 1965. Jones, in apprising the unknown male what transpired, said the discussion centered around the moving of SCLC operations North, specifically New York and Chicago. The purpose for moving North, according to Jones, would be to make gains in housing, schools and other basic needs.

Jones, in explaining his position, said he told those in attendance that it would be a mistake to conduct non-violent campaigns and demonstrations on school desegregation in the North since there were more important issues; that if they were to move North, a lot of militant support for the Southern movement would be cut off by people in the North; that the power structure in the North would not look kindly on the SCLC if demonstrations were brought North.

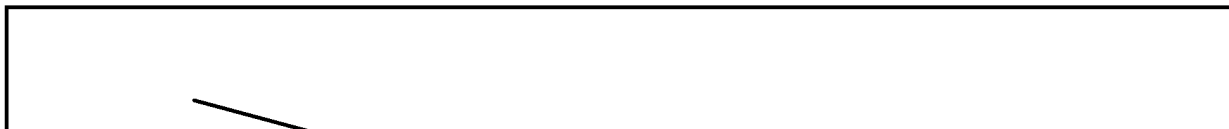

On June 13, 1965, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Stanley Levison and Clarence Jones were in contact on that date. Levison related to Jones what he had gathered from a recent conversation he had with Harry Wachtel. According to Levison, he was confident that Wachtel was trying to "sink a knife in Jones' back" concerning Martin Luther King (President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, SCLC). Levison said Wachtel was also against Walter Fauntroy (head of the Washington, D.C. office of the SCLC) and Andrew (Andrew Young, Director of the SCLC).

Wachtel, Levison said, remarked that King needed him to represent him, and that "nobody was going to push him (Wachtel) out of Washington". Levison said Wachtel's attitude was such that King should be informed; that King knew that Wachtel was trying to take over as his number one advisor. Levison commented that Wachtel could not make it on his own in Washington, therefore, he was going to make it through King. Levison said Wachtel's attitude was that "when you are talking to me you are talking to King".

Levison and Jones agreed that Wachtel was an individual who would need a great deal of watching.

Jones told Levison not to worry about the relationship between Bayard Rustin and Wachtel because the "weight of the relationship will destroy itself". Levison answered that he was not worried about Rustin and Wachtel because Rustin "does not threaten him because he (Rustin) is an established leader in his own right".

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in April, 1964, that Stanley Levison was a secret member of the Communist Party, United States of America (CPUSA), in July, 1963. In late 1963 and early 1964, he criticized the Communist Party (CP) for not being sufficiently militant in the civil rights struggle. Levison was described by certain CP leaders as being to the "left" of the CP in his position on civil rights. His differences with the CP, however, are merely tactical and he continues his ideological adherence to Communism.

A source has advised that on October 26-27, 1963, a conference of members of the COMMUNIST PARTY (CP), including National Functionaries, met in Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of setting in motion forces for the establishment of a new national Marxist oriented youth organization which would hunt for the most peaceful transition to socialism. The delegates to this meeting were cautioned against the germ of anti-Soviet and anti-CP ideologies. These delegates were also told that it would be reasonable to assume that the young socialists attracted into this new organization would eventually pass into the CP itself.

A second conference of over 20 persons met in Chicago on December 28-29, 1963, for the purpose of initiating a "call" to the new youth organization and planning for a founding convention to be held in June, 1964.

A second source has advised that the founding convention for the new youth organization was held from June 19-21, 1964, at 150 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, California, at which time the name W.E.B. DU BOIS CLUBS OF AMERICA was adopted. Approximately 500 delegates from throughout the United States attended this convention. The aims of this organization, as set forth in the preamble to the constitution, are: "It is our belief that this nation can best solve its problems in an atmosphere of peaceful co-existence, complete disarmament and true freedom for all peoples of the world, and that these solutions will be reached mainly through the united efforts of all democratic elements in our country, composed essentially of the working people allied in the unity of Negroes and other minorities with whites. We further fully recognize that the greatest threat to American democracy comes from the racist and right wing forces in coalition with the most reactionary sections of the economic power structure, using the tool of anti-communism to divide and destroy the unified struggle of the working people. As young people in the forces struggling for democracy, we shall actively strive to defeat these reactionary and neo-fascist elements and to achieve complete freedom and democracy for all Americans, thus enabling each individual to freely choose and build the society he would wish to live in. Through these struggles we feel the American people will realize the viability of the socialist alternatives."

The constitution further states that this new organization shall be a membership organization open to individuals, or if five or more people so desire a chapter can be formed which shall in turn be guided by the policies and principles of the parent organization.

The second source has also advised that at the founding convention it was voted that the organization should be temporarily headquartered in San Francisco, California, although no specific physical location was decided upon. This same source advised on June 29, 1964, that the temporary headquarters of this organization is 1007 Mc Allister Street, San Francisco, which is the headquarters of the W.E.B. DU BOIS CLUB OF SAN FRANCISCO.

Both sources have advised that at the founding convention two officers were elected:

- PHILIP CHAPIN DAVIS - President
- CARL ELLENGER BLOICE - Publications Chairman

A third source has advised that on October 26, 1962, PHILIP DAVIS attended a CP recruiting class held at 1579 Scenic Avenue, Berkeley, California.

A fourth source has advised that CARL BLOICE, reporter for the "People's World" newspaper, was, on April 3, 1964, elected to the newly organized San Francisco County Committee of the CP.

The "People's World" is a West Coast communist newspaper published weekly in San Francisco, California.

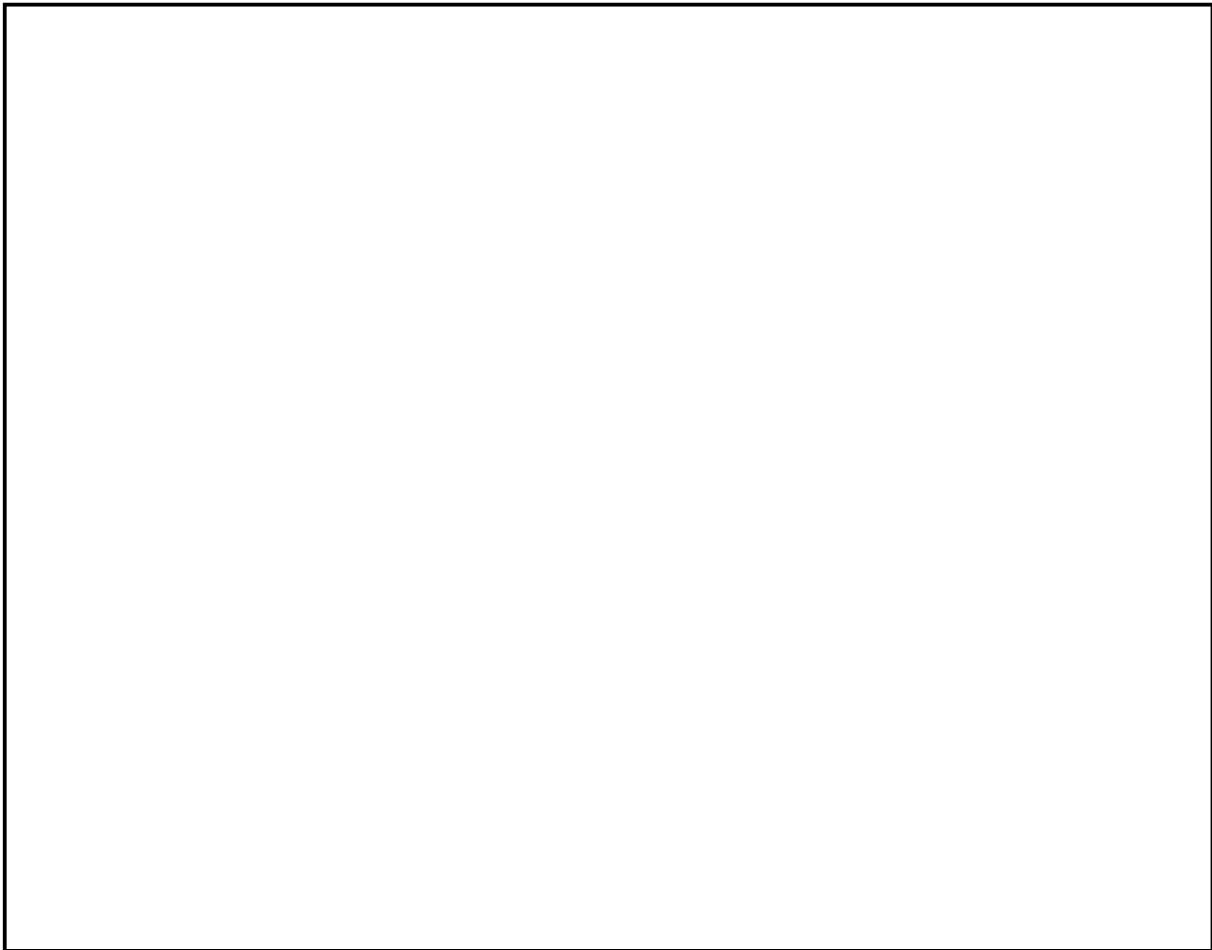

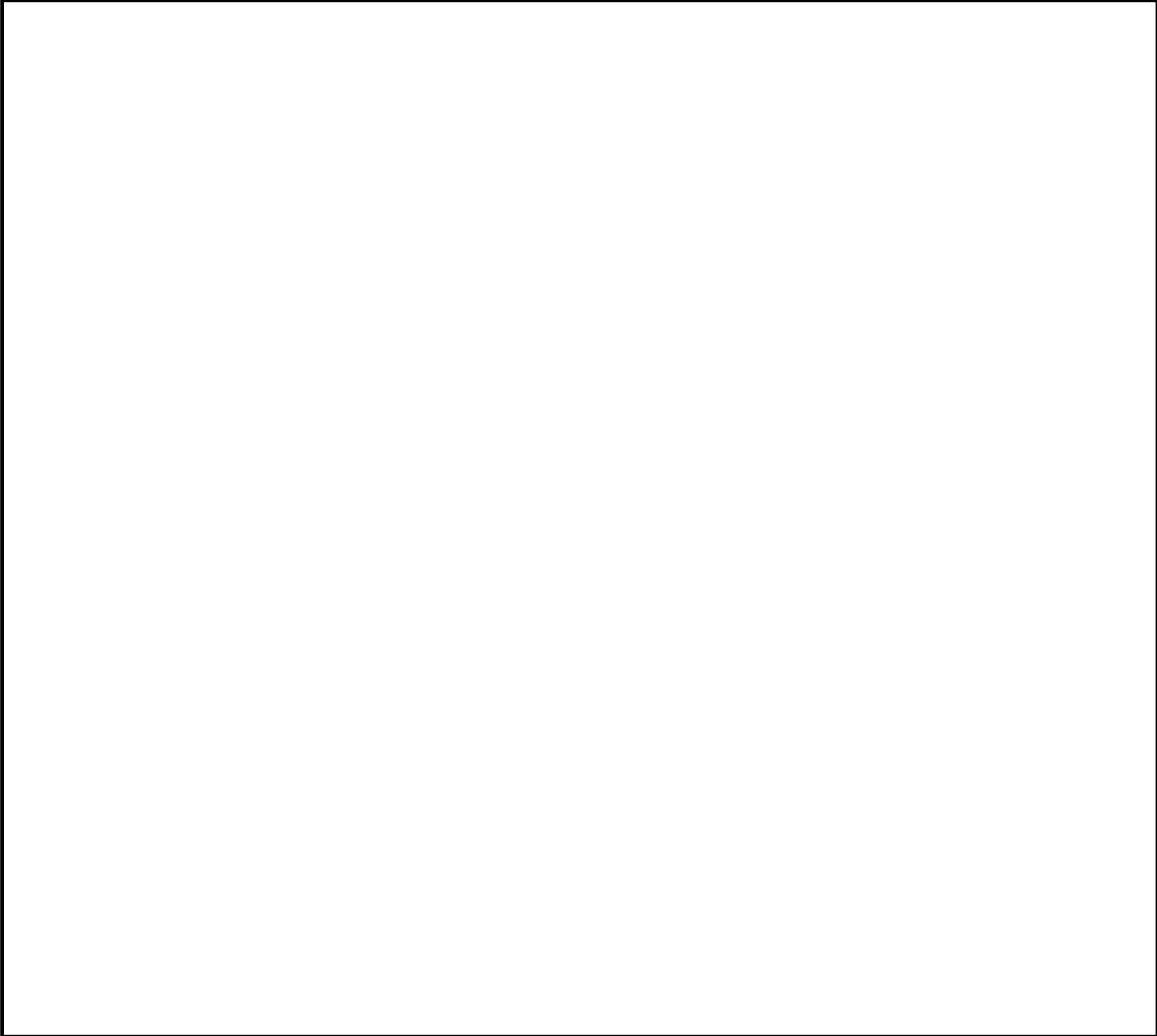

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In regard to KING, [redacted] stated that an assassination of KING would best serve the purposes of the Peking Communists in that it would create chaos and confusion.

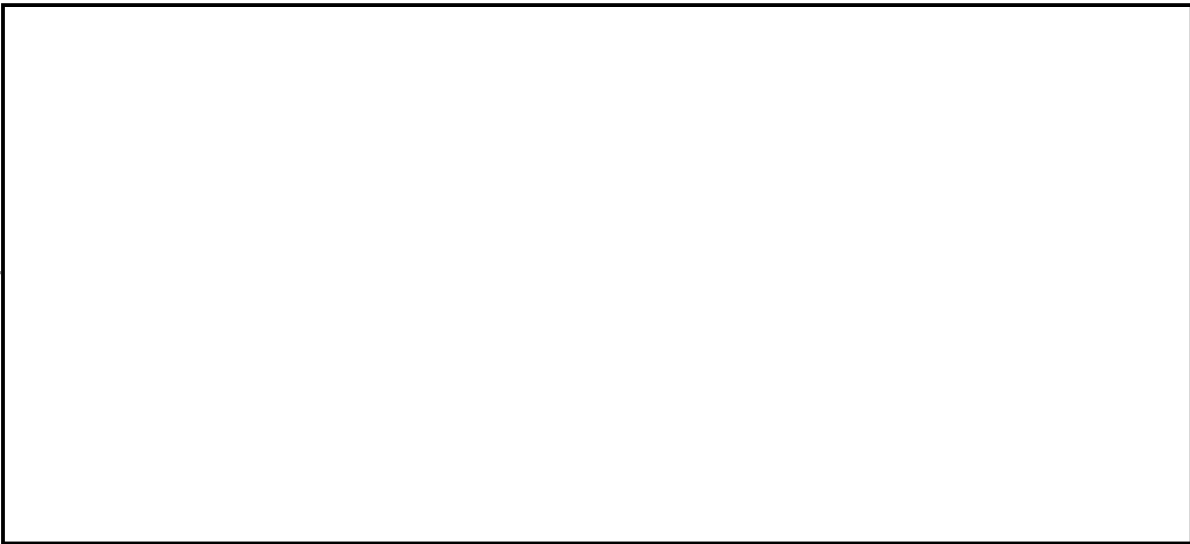

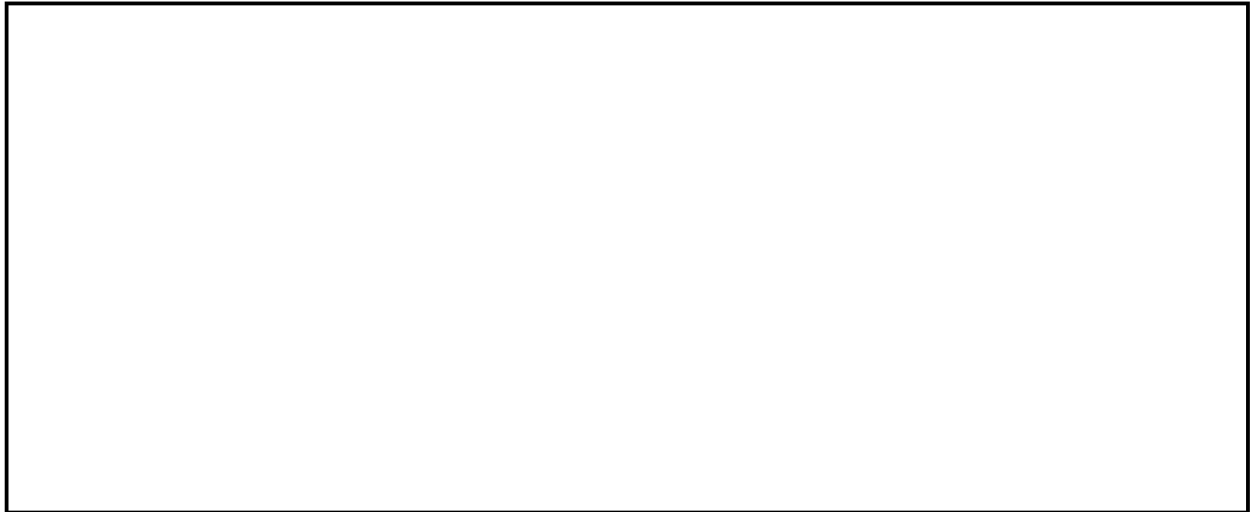

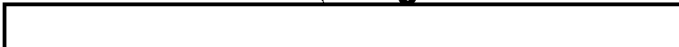

On 6-2-65 there was a meeting of Harlem Communist Party members, interested in the Harlem Freedom Forum, and a representative from Communist Party headquarters. The following were present:



[redacted], from C.P. headquarters.

The meeting was held at the apartment of [redacted]



[redacted] started by stating that the Forum was very important to Harlem and that this meeting, to formulate policy, should have been held a long time ago. He then introduced [redacted] as the Chairlady. [redacted] explained that if the Forum was to continue to function successfully, it had to have closer cooperation with the Communist Party. She stated that the Forum would have to have financial help and also physical help; that this was necessary to get out leaflets, etc. and that help was necessary from C.P. people.

[redacted] thought it was necessary to decide whether the Forum was to continue to exist. [redacted] agreed that policy should be formulated, stating that it was evident that the Forum had come to be more important to the C.P. than at first thought. [redacted] stated that if the Forum had been functioning last year, the C.P. would not have had to use [redacted]. The impression was gained that, unknowing to [redacted] the C.P. had backed him because he was the only platform or vehicle; however, [redacted] stated that for future purposes, the C.P. could "speak" through the Forum. He stated that he did not want the Forum to be just the voice of the C.P., but rather wanted it to be a broad mass organization through which the C.P. would speak.

[redacted] mentioned that the Freedom Forum should have the best Forums inasmuch as Columbia University was situated in their area. [redacted] suggested that the Forum have a "Study-in".

[redacted] mentioned that they would need money and help. [redacted] stated that the C.P. did not have money, but that probably the C.P. could take care of getting leaflets printed. [redacted] is to see [redacted] about this matter. The study-in is tentatively scheduled for 8-25-65. [redacted] is to discuss this with [redacted] and that they would give assistance. [redacted] is also to try to get the Elks Hall for this affair.

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[redacted] suggested that forums should be held to educate the people regarding the coming elections.

JAMES JACKSON at the outset of the meeting made a lengthy report based on the following topics:

1. Stages in the Struggle for Negro Equality and Political Action
2. Negroes in Agriculture
3. Negroes in Industry
4. The Problem of the White Worker who was Opposed to the Advancement of the Negro Worker
5. Features of the Negro Question which Reflect on their Racial Character
6. The Role of Communists in the Struggle for Negro Equality.

In essence JACKSON's report was an analysis of the Negro struggle for first class citizenship. JACKSON spoke at length on the Negro struggle in the South making reference to specific demonstrations and pointing out that mass participation in the securing of rights for Negroes was consistent with the Socialist movement as outlined in the Marxist-Leninist doctrine. JACKSON stated that the struggle of the Negro people had already caused many changes not only in the U. S. but in the world. He pointed out that the American Negro in particular was increasing his power in the Government and politics by vote and mass action. He stated that although the Negro was making advances in industry, he was also suffering from the reactionary attitude of his white co-workers. JACKSON said that he was especially concerned with the Negro in agriculture. He stated that the Negro needed special consideration in this area because of the diminishing number of Negroes who own farms but the increasing number of Negroes who were being tied to the soil as share croppers and tenant farmers. JACKSON called for a working class unity and stated that it was to the advantage of the Negro to be allied with white workers who in the main suffered from the same exploitation as the Negro. JACKSON made a number of points which stressed the fact that the Negro should be for Socialism but was unable to give a reason why the Negro was not in fact more active in the Socialist movement.

At the end of his report JACKSON said that his report and the discussion that followed would be used to prepare a resolution for action by the CP.

At the outset of the discussion HOSEA HUDSON called for work in the Southern U. S. as the primary goal of the CP.

JACK STACHEL asked for Negro and white unity and emphasized that the Party should let the average American citizen know what it stands for and know what it is doing in the Negro struggle.

HERBERT APTHEKER said that integration was not assimilation and that the Negro was mainly interested in integration. APTHEKER said that the Negro people's struggle was a revolution in the Marxist sense.

APTHEKER also called for emphasis by the Party on current U. S. foreign policy, particularly in Vietnam and Santo Domingo. He wanted the Party to focus attention on the educational system in the U. S. wherever discrimination was practiced and also urged that an attempt be made to see to it that Negro youth was drawn into the Socialist struggle.

GENE GORDON said that he felt that the Party should actively and openly support self-defense by the Negroes who were not protected by law enforcement agencies.

CARL WINTER asked that the resolution give a complete picture of the civil rights movement and point out that youth must play a more important role in determining the goals of the day-to-day struggle.

HENRY WINSTON said that the resolution should point out that Negro and white working class unity was essential and asked for a better relationship between civil rights groups, progressive groups, and Trade Union organizations.

[redacted] asked that the resolution stress the role that women can play in the Negro movement and the need for a better home life for the Negro. She asked that the resolution definitely state that imperialism was the enemy of the working class and the Negro people.

At the conclusion of the discussion, JACKSON stated that self-defense for the Negro, a topic that had been raised by

GENE GORDON and which had divided the comrades during the discussion was not identifiable with the struggle against capitalism and could not be advocated or supported by the Party.

During the latter part of the meeting some comrades from Baltimore criticized the National leadership for failing to present a program of action for the Negro people and working class comrades. GEORGE MEYERS, CP District Chairman, who lives in Baltimore, immediately disassociated himself from the report and said that it was distorted. The comrades from Baltimore who were led by JACOB GREEN, Chairman of the CP of Maryland, then stated that CP activity in the Baltimore, Maryland, area, had not proceeded actively enough because of MEYERS' failures as a leader.

CRITICISM

As a result of the Baltimore report, it was decided to send a member of the National leadership to Baltimore in the future to examine the situation there.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on June 16, 1965, that on that date, Stanley Levison was in contact with Clarence Jones. Jones commented that he had heard that Adam (Clayton Powell, United States Congressman from New York City) wants to get together with Martin (Luther King) to have a lengthy conference in depth with no publicity. According to Jones, Adam said Martin knows his, Adams', opinion of Bayard Rustin and some other people he has around him. Adam thinks that he and Martin have a lot of things of mutual interest, and, Jones continued, it will be assured that there will be no publicity.

Levison inquired if Jones had heard anything from Harry (Wachtel). Jones said he had, that Harry told him that Jones, Wachtel, and Levison are authorized to do something which Jones could not recall. Levison felt it might be in connection with a conference in the fall, getting some ideas, and Jones thought that might be it.

Jones stated that he told Wachtel that Levison will be a constructive addition to the Research Committee (Martin Luther King and his advisors). Jones also told Levison that the thing on Sunday (King's speech at the graduation exercises of Hofstra University on Sunday, June 13, 1965) was a complete bust. He said he received complaints from Saul Mills and several other friends that King was an hour and a half late at the Hofstra commencement exercises and kept everyone waiting. Jones added that King was booed by right wing people and the faculty was "up in arms". He said King arrived when they were getting ready to have someone substitute for him.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in April, 1964, that Stanley Levison was a secret member of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA), in July, 1963. In late 1963, and early 1964, Levison criticized the CP for not being sufficiently militant in the civil rights struggle. Levison was described by certain CP leaders as being to the "left" of the CP in his position on civil rights. His differences with the CP, however, are merely tactical and he continues his ideological adherence to Communism.

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Communist Influence in Racial Matters

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A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in May, 1950, that Saul Mills was one of those persons whom he knew to be a concealed Communist.

On June 29, 1950, the confidential source advised that during the 1940s up until 1945, he knew Saul Mills personally as a member of the CP.

On May 28, 1956, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that she knew Saul Mills as a member of the CP all through the period 1938-1947. The source stated that Mills had been one of the most important persons in the CP and could be considered on the level with William Z. Foster (who was Chairman of the CP, USA during this period). The source further advised that she attended literally hundreds of meetings of the CP, at which Saul Mills was present, as well as hundreds of Trade Union meetings run by the CP. In respect to Saul Mills' knowledge of the CP nature of these meetings, the source stated that there is no question but that Mills was cognizant at the time they were official meetings of the CP. The source stated that she observed Saul Mills in 1944, at a meeting called by the National Committee of the CP, and observed him at a meeting of top functionaries of the CP, held following the 1944 convention, at which time Mills delivered a speech.

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Communist Influence In Racial Matters

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On May 25, 1956, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that in the late 1930's and early 1940's, Saul Mills was looked upon as being a highly trustworthy person and one whose word could be accepted and acted upon with respect to action the CP might take in regard to discipline cases involving individuals known to Mills.

On 6/21/65, telephonically contacted the NYO and spoke to SA SEATON. He mentioned that MARTIN LUTHER KING, Jr. is ready to start his organizational program (for the SOUTHERN CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE), but he stated that he does not know where the program will be started or of what it will consist. He also stated that continues trying to exert influence over KING.

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In speaking of the situation in Indianola, Mississippi, about which he furnished information on 5/24/65, stated that he still thinks that violence will erupt in that area and will come about "as a result of non-violent action". He mentioned that the group "THE DEACONS" will be involved. He once again indicated that the Chinese Communists are still trying to gain control of this situation. said that one of the reasons for the present holding situation in that area is that the Chinese Communists refuse to yield one inch to the Soviet Communists.

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stated that JAMES FARMER is confused about the whole situation, and he stated that he was not going to do anything about this. He said that FARMER will have to learn to think for himself. further stated that he would let FARMER alone for awhile, but he said if FARMER does not do something he would have to go to FARMER and get him started to think.

It is to be noted that this information is essentially the same as previously furnished. was unable to give any specific sources for his information, but he stated that he bases it on items which he has seen in the various news media and thirty years experience in these matters.

It is reported that [redacted] of the SCLC, [redacted] and Randolph Blackwell, met with Bayard Rustin 6/16/65 and discussed forthcoming plans of the SCLC. In discussing the possibility of SCLC activity in the Harlem area of New York City, [redacted] said that he does not trust anyone in Harlem except Jack O'Dell. [redacted] described O'Dell as the one person who really knows Harlem and can help get a SCLC program going there. [redacted] commented that perhaps SCLC can justify to the public the assistance of O'Dell because he is the one person who knows Harlem so well.

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Because of the prior public exposure of O'Dell as a communist, it remains to be seen as to whether or not O'Dell's services will be engaged, openly or covertly, in connection with any SCLC activity in Harlem, should the SCLC move into that area.

Recipient offices should be most alert through their investigation of captioned matter, CIRM, O'Dell and other related matters for any information which would indicate O'Dell's services are being used within the civil rights movement on behalf of the SCLC and/or its head, Martin Luther King, Jr. Keep the Bureau promptly advised of all pertinent developments and furnish positive information by letterhead memoranda.

On June 22, 1965, at 6:22 PM, Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) observed Stanley Levison leave the office building at 1841 Broadway, New York City, where he has office space, and wait on the corner of Broadway and 60th Street, until 6:34 PM, when Clarence Jones came up. From there they went to the Ginger Man Restaurant, 51 West 64th Street, New York City. They entered the restaurant at 6:49 PM.

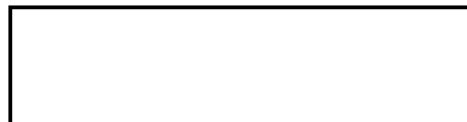

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on June 25, 1965, that, on that date, Stanley Levison was in contact with Clarence Jones. Jones mentioned that he had had a good trip and had seen (Livingston) Wingate, (Head of Haryou-Act, a youth anti-poverty program in New York City), Adam Clayton Powell, Sargent Schriver, and the Attorney General.

(The same source had advised on June 24, 1965, that Jones, on that date, stated he could be reached at the State Department Building, Conference on Law and Anti-Poverty, Washington, D.C.).

The source continued that Levison remarked that he had spoken to Harry (Wachtel) and [redacted] of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference) (SCLC). Levison stated that Martin Luther King is considering going to Switzerland to a place run by the World Council of Churches and, if he does go, will take off a year for the kind of rest and reflection he needs. Levison added that the time for this trip had not been set yet but that King had been offered a house for his family and other things. Levison noted that this could be serious from a standpoint of what could happen to the organization (the SCLC), as well as to the possible questions as to what he was doing over there.
