On the afternoon of April 27th, Mr. Leo Laughlin of the Bureau called relative to Grand Jury Exhibits 47 and 48 in this case. He advised that the Laboratory had made its examinations based on photostatic copies and not on the originals of the State Department documents. The Laboratory feels that it is possible in the trial that the examiner would be asked if he had examined the originals and if not why not. The Bureau has the original State Department documents now. It will take a full week of examination to go over these documents. Before undertaking this examination the Laboratory would like to know if a re-examination is needed based on the original documents. Mr. Laughlin requested that we ascertain from Mr. Donegan or Mr. Murphy whether, in their opinion, this examination is needed and that we advise the Bureau of the results of our conversation.

I called Mr. Laughlin back on the afternoon of April 27th to advise him that by teletype dated April 18th the Bureau had advised that it had the original documents in its possession and had inquired whether the examination should be made. We had replied by teletype of April 18th that as Assistant United States Attorney Murphy had been sick a definite statement as to whether the exhibits would be used in the trial could not be obtained but that SAAG Donegan was of the opinion that the original documents should be examined. Mr. Laughlin was advised that the same situation exists now as Murphy is still sick but that we are of the opinion the documents should be examined. Further, that we have discussed this with Assistant Director Connelley who, likewise, is of this opinion.

On the afternoon of April 25, Mr. T. J. Donegan advised me that the Circuit Court of Appeals had reversed the conviction of WILLIAM ROSEN for contempt. The reversal was based on grounds that ROSEN had been questioned before the HCUA and because of that questioning might be placed in jeopardy if he answered questions before the Grand Jury.

On April 13, 1949 Special Agent WENTON S. GORDON of this office interviewed Dr. JOHN K. FAIRBANK of Harvard University with reference to another matter and, in the course of the interview, FAIRBANK volunteered the following information:

While in Washington, D. C. he was closely associated in Government business and socially with ALGER HISS. He regards HISS as absolutely loyal and believes that by background and training he is representative of one of the best classes of American citizens. FAIRBANK stated if HISS were proven guilty of perjury in New York then FAIRBANK's faith in his associates at Harvard would be shattered.

FAIRBANK also noted that he had only recently discussed the HISS case with Federal Judge CHARLES WYZANSKI, who advised FAIRBANK that not only were his feelings identical with those of FAIRBANK but also that he, WYZANSKI, had agreed to take the stand as a character witness in New York on behalf of HISS. WYZANSKI is further alleged to have commented that his making himself available as a witness would be regarded as unusual by many, particularly since he was to be a witness for the defense in a criminal case. He felt he knew the defendant so well, however, that there was no choice open to him.

It is to be noted that Mrs. JOHN FAIRBANK was previously interviewed relative to her association with Mr. and Mrs. ALGER HISS. The purpose of this interview was to obtain any correspondence that may have been carried on between Mr. and Mrs. FAIRBANK and Mr. and Mrs. ALGER HISS.

The reliability of Dr. JOHN K. FAIRBANK is not known to the Boston Office.

On June 3 and 6, 1947 a confidential letter was submitted to the Director concerning the activities of Judge WYZANSKI. Also, on July 2, 1947 a confidential letter was submitted to the Director concerning a matter which had arisen in court during the testimony of a Special Agent of the Boston Office. 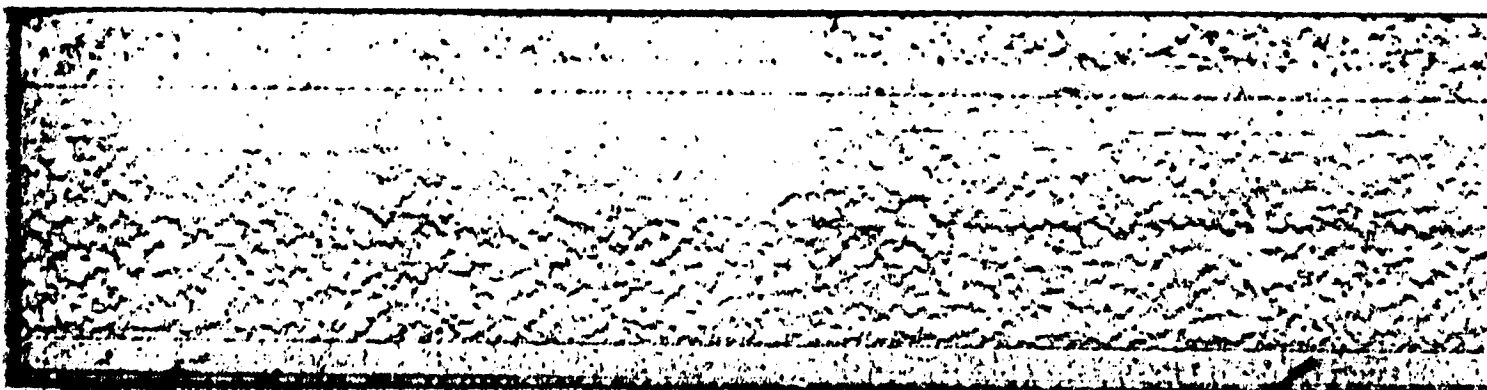

On this date SA J. M. KELLY and the writer had a conference with SAAG T. J. DONEGAN in connection with the statement in this case which has been supplied by CHAMBERS. In a previous conference AUSA THOMAS MURPHY had indicated the probable desirability of leaving this statement unsigned. On this day Mr. DONEGAN stated that he had a telephone conversation with Mr. MURPHY at the latter's home on the previous day, and it was now both MURPHY'S and DONEGAN'S opinion that CHAMBERS should not sign the lengthy general statement that has been obtained from him over the course of the past several months.

DONEGAN pointed out that since CHAMBERS would be a Government witness and a friendly one, no material benefit could be gained by him signing this statement. He pointed out that on the other hand, if he did sign it, this fact might be brought out during the course of the trial, and although the statement might not be actually presented to the jury there was a possibility that the Judge might allow the defense attorneys to read the statement, which would probably result in some complications. It was pointed out to DONEGAN that CHAMBERS has already signed three rather brief statements but he indicated that he does not believe that these statements will cause any conflict if they are introduced, in view of the fact that they are brief and are concerned with specific matters. He pointed out that the statement in question, of course, is very lengthy and if the defense attorneys got their hands on it, they might use some of the material therein to at least cloud the issue.

DONEGAN suggested that although he is aware that this is contrary to the general Bureau custom, he felt that if the Bureau actually wanted

the statement signed that arrangements could be made whereby CHAMBERS could set his signature to this statement subsequent to the trial. In the event that the Bureau has no objection to this procedure, it is contemplated that within the next few days a report, containing about 300 pages which will deal with the CHAMBERS statement, his background and the interview with Mrs. CHAMBERS, will be prepared.

In connection with quoting the statement in this report, the first paragraph dealing with the fact that CHAMBERS has voluntarily given this statement, etc. will be deleted and a substitute paragraph indicating that the following information was obtained from an interrogation of CHAMBERS will be supplied. } OK

In view of the length of this report, it is anticipated that copies will be sent only to those offices which have been conducting extensive investigations, such as the Washington Field, Baltimore, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Denver, New Haven, Boston and Philadelphia.

It is to be noted that all of the stencils have been cut and upon receipt of the Bureau's views as to the signing or not signing of the CHAMBERS statement, this report could go forward within a week or less after receipt of Bureau's comments.

Plant that he has determined that the couple referred to by him as living in Westchester County are JONATHAN MITCHELL and his wife, DORIS STEVENS; that MITCHELL was once a representative of the New Republic in Washington, D. C., but quit when that publication began to condone fellow travelers of Communism. BARVINE also told SA Plant that MITCHELL and his wife are friends of WESTBROOK PEGLER and live near PEGLER on Croton-on-Hudson.

SA Plant also learned from BARVINE that he was introduced to this couple by Col. TRUMAN C. SMITH, who is listed in the Manhattan telephone directory as residing at 179C West 12th Street, New York City, telephone WA 9-8119.

Assistant Director E. J. Connelley has requested that SMITH be interviewed and it is suggested that MITCHELL and wife also be interviewed in connection with the circumstances related by BARVINE and for any additional relevant information they may possess.

On this date the writer talked to Ken Delavigne of the Washington Field Office and pointed out the discrepancies appearing in the report of Special Agent John J. Walsh dated February 24, 1949, in the above-entitled matter, relating to the leases and telephone records in connection with HISS' residence at 30th Street and Volta Place.

On page 4 of this report the Potomac Telephone Company records indicate that the telephone service at 1245 - 30th Street was disconnected on December 29, 1937, and was connected at 3415 Volta Place on December 29, 1937.

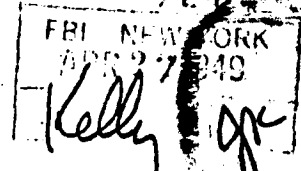
On page 5 there appears information to the effect that the lease at 1245 - 30th Street, between SARAH W. S. MILLER and ALGER HISS, extended from September 1, 1937, to August 31, 1938, and between ALGER HISS and EDWARD D. HOLLANDER at 1245 - 30th Street from January 1, 1938, to August 31, 1938. This report also reflects that a lease was entered into between CATHERINE H. FLANAGAN and ALGER HISS for the address at 3415 Volta Place from October 1, 1938, to September 30, 1939, and another lease between FLANAGAN and HISS for 3415 Volta Place from January 1, 1938, to September 30, 1938.

Mr. Delavigne was also asked when the information concerning the examination of the known handwriting specimens of HARRY WHITE could be expected. Later this afternoon Special Agent Bert Zander of the Washington Field Office called and stated that in connection with the HARRY WHITE material, some difficulty was being experienced in getting at these records, and that this information could not possibly be expected until some time next week.

In connection with the discrepancies as to the leases and the telephone records, Zander stated that this was being checked out and the New York Office would be advised by teletype as soon as these discrepancies had been taken care of.

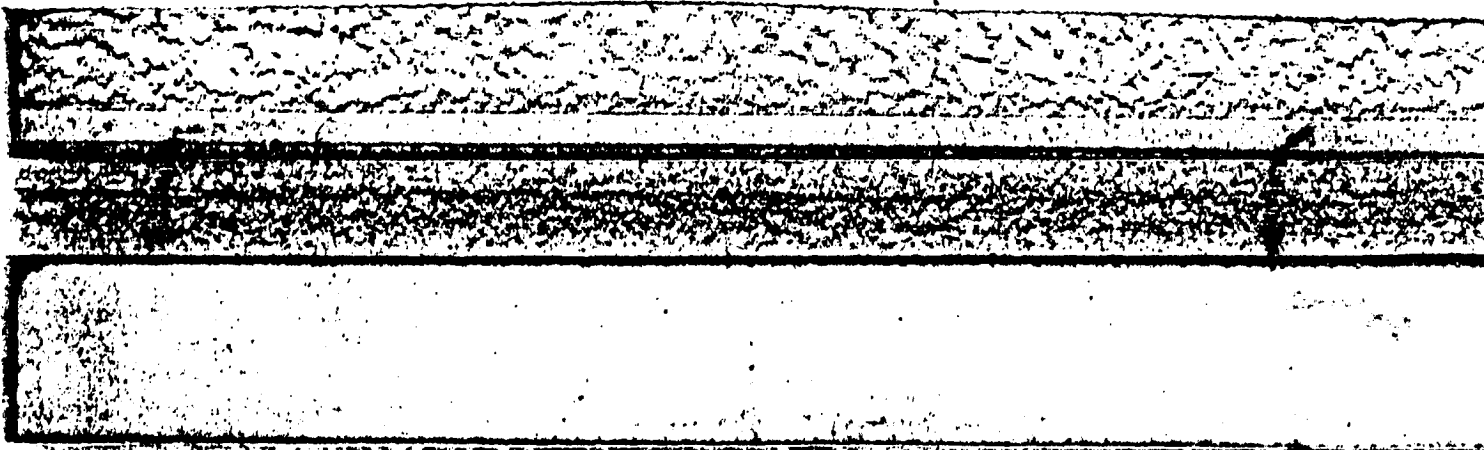

Background and Personal History of HENRY RHINE.

HENRY RHINE was born on 8/23/08 at NYC (not verified) and presently resides at 3218 Chestnut Street, Philadelphia, Pa. He attended evening session of CCNY in Brooklyn, New York, from 2/19/26 to January of 1929 at which time he discontinued his studies. During this period he completed approximately one full term of work, and his grades were average. His courses were primarily English language studies.

His employment record, as obtained from his H.R.A. personnel file, is as follows:

- 1925-1926 - Alexander Hotel, NYO, bellhop.
- 1926-1927 - Workman's Circle, 175 E. Broadway, NYC, as accountant and bookkeeper.
- 1927-1929 - Department of Public Welfare, New York City, Custodian of Children, Pleasantville Branch.
- 11/6/33-3/31/36 N.R.A. - Washington, D.C. - Junior Assistant, Consumers' Advisory Board.

On October 26, 1935, subject was notified of his dismissal, to be effective on 11/15/35. This was later postponed until 3/31/36, the date of his actual release. Under date of 11/14/35, a letter from NRA Lodge #97, American Federation of Government Employees, was sent to L. J. MARTIN, Accounting Administrator, stating that subject had been dismissed because of union activities and was a case of obvious union discrimination.

This letter was signed by JESSICA BUCK, Secretary, who was subject's wife. Subject was vice president of union.

4/1/36-5/1/36 Temporary appointment on Wheeler Senate Committee.

According to Selective Service records, RHINE married JESSICA BUCK RHINE at Batavia, Ohio, on 9/13/34, and has two children. These records further indicated he was hired on 6/13/37 as National Representative for the United Federal Workers of America, CIO.

A confidential informant of the Washington Field Office advised on January of 1943 that RHINE had been told by the Executive Committee of the Communist Party that he was not effective in his current work and would have to resign his position with U.F.W.A. RHINE was subsequently sent to Philadelphia, Pa. to work in a union in a minor position..

On January, 1949, the Bureau requested that RHINE be interviewed for any possible information he may have in connection with instant case. Agents of the Philadelphia office contacted RHINE telephonically at his home on 3/11/49. He claimed a slight illness and stated he would call back. On 3/14/49, he contacted the Philadelphia Office and declined to be interviewed.

The Bureau had requested RHINE be interviewed because his name and that of his wife, JESSICA BUCK RHINE, appeared on an anonymous letter addressed to the President of the United States on 4/14/44, which set forth a list of persons active in the underground apparatus of the Communist Party. It was determined that the writer of the letter was KATHERINE WILLS PERLO.

Following is the information concerning RHINE'S activities:

Prior to her marriage, HELEN MILLER, reputed Communist, lived with the RHINES in Washington, D.C.

RHINE a member of Tom Mooney's Defense Committee in D.C. in 1937

An admitted former Communist, Orville Chester Miller, subject of a Custodial Detention card at the Washington Field office advised on 6/19/41 that HENRY RHINE was a Communist. He added that RHINE had contributed money to Communist movements.

A confidential informant of the Washington Field Office advised that RHINE could not be an organizer for the U.F.W.A. unless he was a Communist.

The Washington Post of 10/23/42 carried an advertisement urging all readers to write to the Capitol Transit Co., demanding that they hire negroes as operators. HENRY RHINE was listed as one of the sponsors.

In 1943 the name of HENRY RHINE appeared on the active indices of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action and also the American Peoples' Mobilization.

Records of the Investigative Division of the Civil Service Commission showed that HENRY RHINE was present at a rally in the National Press Club Auditorium protesting the suspension of HELEN MILLER, Labor Department Employee, alleged to be a Communist.

Background and Personal History of JESSICA BUCK RHINE

JESSICA BUCK RHINE was born in Chicago, Illinois in 1914. From November of 1933 to January of 1942, she was employed in various government agencies in Washington, D.C. She was married to HENRY RHINE in Batavia, Ohio on 9/13/34. Her present address is 825 Eugene Street, Indianapolis, Indiana.

During her Government employment she was very active in unions and held various offices in the local wherever she was employed.

A confidential Informant of the Washington Field office advised on 11/7/41 that she was president of the United Federal Workers of America, CIO, local 13 in the Railroad Retirement Board. RHINE shared her apartment at one time on "P" Street, N.W. Washington, D.C. with ELEANOR NELSON and HELEN SCHNETZLER, aka HELEN MILLER. NELSON has been identified by informants as a member of the Communist Party, and MILLER was dismissed from the Labor Department in 1941 for Communist activities.

JESSICA RHINE'S friends were almost exclusively Communists. In 1943 she succeeded SADIE SOKOLOV as president of Local 27, UFWA. She was subsequently active in Local 242 of the American Federation of Government Employees. The charter of this local was later lifted by the National Headquarters because of alleged Communist activities of RHINE and 4 other individuals.

JESSICA RHINE was a member of the Tom Mooney Defense Committee in Washington, D.C. and her name was listed on the active indices of both

the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, and the American Peace Mobilization.

At the present time, she is employed by DON KROGER, Attorney, Security Trust Building, Indianapolis. She was formerly State Director for the Progressive Party for the State of Indiana.

On interview by Agents of the Indianapolis office on 3/11/49, JESSICA RHINE volunteered the information that she had been acquainted with VICTOR PERLO. She states that she is not now and never has been a member of the Communist Party.

Information was furnished recently to WHITTAKER CHAMBERS by a close friend that there is a report circulating in New York, that CHAMBERS apparently had been a visitor at the ALGER HISS residence in Washington, D.C., more often than appeared in the public testimony concerning the HISS-CHAMBERS matter; that sometime in 1936 or later, HISS is supposed to have discovered that CHAMBERS was having homosexual relations with TIMOTHY HOBSON, and thereupon HISS ordered CHAMBERS from the house and forbade him to return.

Further that CHAMBERS is supposed to have returned to the HISS home when he knew that ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS were not there and that on such occasions CHAMBERS had been admitted to the house by TIMOTHY HOBSON. It appears possible that the defense in the perjury prosecution of HISS may attempt to show that on these later occasions, CHAMBERS had access to the Woodstock typewriter without the knowledge of ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS, and prepared the so-called "Baltimore Papers" on this typewriter. CHAMBERS has vehemently denied that he has had any relations of this type with TIMOTHY HOBSON.

On page 8, of the report of SA JOHN J. WALSH, dated February 28, 1949, at Washington, D.C., there is set out information as to the attendance of TIMOTHY HOBSON at the Landon School, Bethesda, Maryland, and it is noted that the records of that institute reflect he entered that school in September, 1936 and attended through June, 1940.

In order to make available to the prosecutive officials for possible rebuttal use, all obtainable information re the whereabouts of HOBSON during the period covering the time CHAMBERS alleges he received documents one through sixty-nine from HISS, it is requested that a highly discreet inquiry be made at the Landon School in an effort to ascertain whether HOBSON boarded at the school during his attendance there, particularly from January 1, 1938 through the end of the school term that Spring. If it is established that he was a boarding student, efforts should be made to determine if he spent weekends at home or otherwise had occasion to be home from the school during the pertinent period.

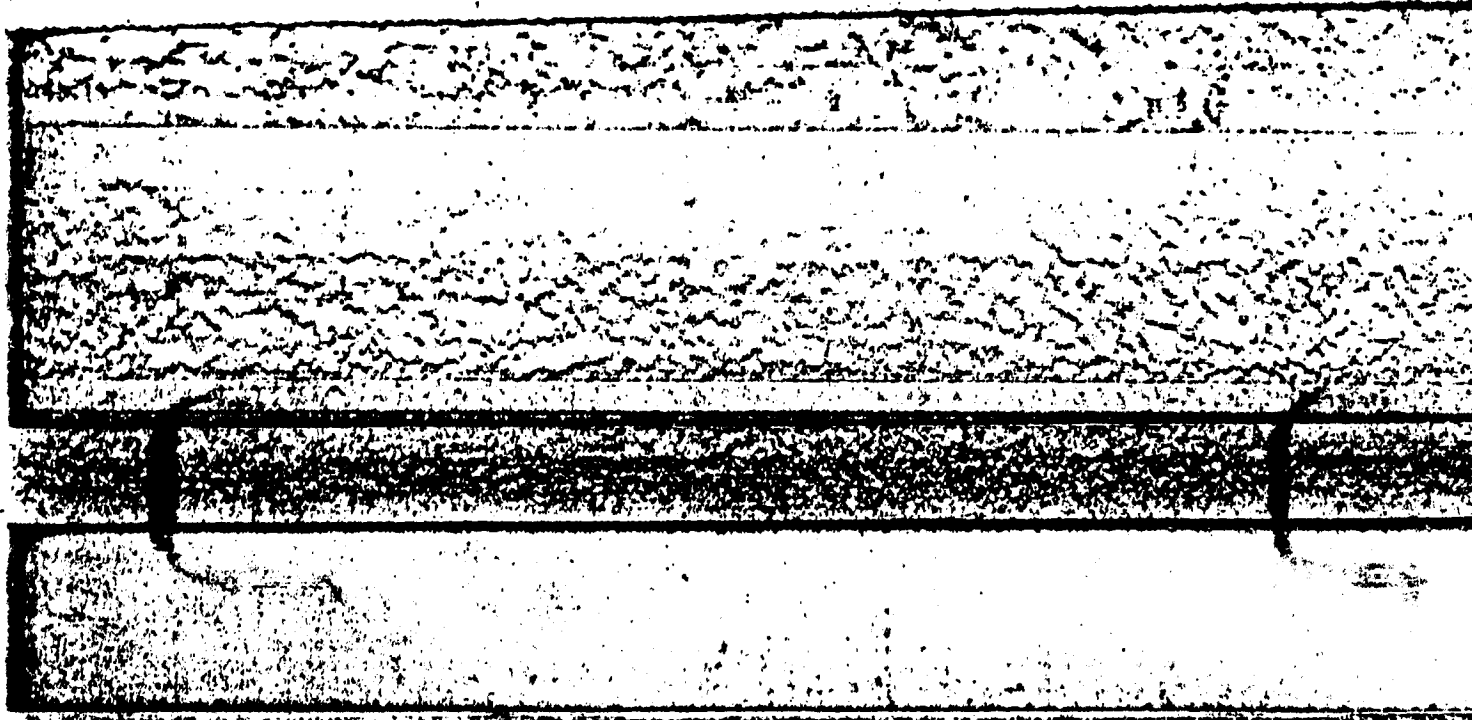

ARTHUR M. ROARK, Jr., with an office at 2 Broadway, New York City, Telephone Bowling Green 9-4453, called on me today. Mr. ROARK is a private investigator (New York Detective License No. 5041) for insurance companies.

He stated that LAURENCE DUGGAN had insurance policies with the New York Life, the Home Life, and the Aetna Life Insurance Companies. Mr. ROARK was retained by the Home Life and the Aetna Life Insurance Companies to conduct an investigation into the death of LAURENCE DUGGAN for the purpose of determining whether his fall from a window of his office was a suicide, accidental, or caused by foul play. Mr. ROARK stated that he is of the personal opinion, as a result of his investigation, that it was a suicide.

In connection with his investigation, Mr. ROARK obtained photostatic copies of a number of letters written by LAURENCE DUGGAN to NOEL FIELD and also one copy of a letter written by ALGER HISS to NOEL FIELD. Mr. ROARK stated he had talked with the officials of the insurance companies and they had agreed with him he should make any information he has available to the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Department of Justice. He stated he had talked with the Attorney General in Washington and it was suggested that he contact me in New York and also the FBI. He stated he had talked with an official of the FBI in Washington but could not recall his name.

Since Mr. ROARK stated it was his intention to talk with an official of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in New York City, I advised him that I would inform the New York office that he had been in to see me and the FBI would undoubtedly contact him for the purpose of arranging a time for him to come to the New York office for the purpose of an interview.

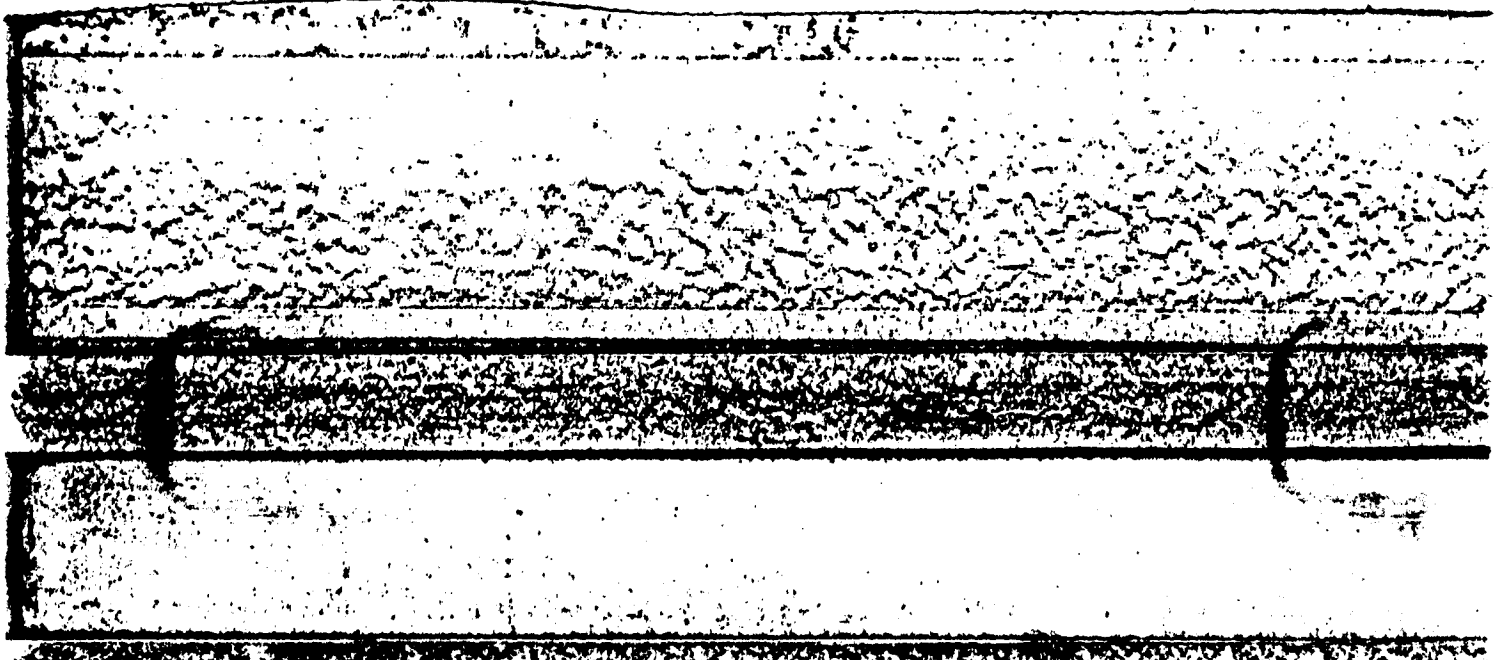

Re: Report of Special Agent JAMES P. [redacted], at Washington, April 6, 1949. On page nine of this report it is noted that T-5 [redacted] could furnish no information concerning ROBERT E. RAY. It is also noted that RENNO [redacted] named RAY WARNER as one of the persons who supervised his Communist Party activities in Washington, and that WARNER'S Party name was ROBERT E. R.Y.

It is the recollection of Special Agent H. H. FINZEL, now assigned to this office, and who handled [redacted] at Washington, during 1947--1948, that this informant mentioned an individual named WARNER as a person active in the early formation of the group which subsequently became the UNITED FEDERAL WORKERS OF AMERICA, and who attended meetings on Eleventh Street when WILLIAM ALLEN was organizing the Communists in Government service, 1935--1938.

It is possible that the WARNER mentioned [redacted] might well be identical with RAY WARNER (ROBERT E. R.Y). Reference report does not indicate whether [redacted] was questioned as to her knowledge of RAY WARNER but only concerning ROBERT E. RAY. If this has not already been done, therefore, it is requested that [redacted] be recontacted concerning her knowledge as to the present whereabouts of RAY WARNER.

Reference report also indicated that SOPHIA MINKIN may have come to Philadelphia around 1938, and may have married the editor of The Pilot (NWU). If the Washington Field Office can further identify this editor, the Philadelphia Office will be in a position to locate for interview the former SOPHIA MINKIN as to the present whereabouts of ROBERT E. RAY (WARNER).

Mr. WATLINGTON telephoned the writer at 10:45 A.M. from his office in the Murin Company Advertising, Time and Life Building, New York, telephone Circle 7-6641. He gave the writer a telephone booth number in the building, Circle 7-9780, because he explained he did not wish anyone at his office to overhear his conversation. Mr. WATLINGTON is a former room-mate of a personal friend of the writer.

Mr. WATLINGTON stated that last evening he was in company with friends at the home of Mrs. RAYMOND S. WADHAM, 27 Washington Square North. One of the persons in the group was Mrs. HARRY V. K. HENDERSON (MARTHA), 20 West 8th Street. He said the conversation got around to Communism and someone mentioned the name of WHITTAKER CHAMBERS.

Earlier, Mrs. HENDERSON made the statement that VIRGINIA BARNES, who is the ex-wife of HOWARD BARNES and sister-in-law of JOSEPH BARNES of the "New York Star", with whom she is very friendly, told her that she was once in a group at her father-in-law's home in Connecticut in which were ALGER HISS, LAURENCE DUGGAN and HOWARD and JOSEPH BARNES.

Mr. WATLINGTON said that Mrs. HENDERSON had mentioned that she had been interviewed that day concerning an individual named McCLELLAN. WATLINGTON asked if she had given this information about this group to the FBI or any other authorities. Mrs. HENDERSON answered that she had not and abruptly changed the subject.

Mr. WATLINGTON said that he was unable to ascertain any date when such a meeting occurred but that Mrs. HENDERSON indicated that it was about the time when the HISS-CHAMBERS association started. He was also unable to ascertain the location of the house in Connecticut of HOWARD and JOSEPH BARNES' father. He said the situation was such that with the abrupt closing of the discussion that he could not say for certain whether the name CHAMBERS was included as among those who were present. He was also unable to comment

on what might be VIRGINIA BARNES or Mrs. HENDERSON'S attitude toward discussing this matter. He does not know VIRGINIA BARNES' address, but stated that it, of course, could be secured from Mrs. HENDERSON. He was asked whether contact with Mrs. HENDERSON would embarrass him, and said that it might, but he did not care about that, inasmuch as he had definitely stated his mind that any such information should be in the hands of the FBI.

It is suggested that if this information is not already in the possession of this office that Mrs. HENDERSON be interviewed to locate VIRGINIA BARNES so that Mrs. BARNES, who was present at the time could be interviewed to establish whether or not CHAMBERS was present with HISS and also to secure any information as to the subject of discussion.

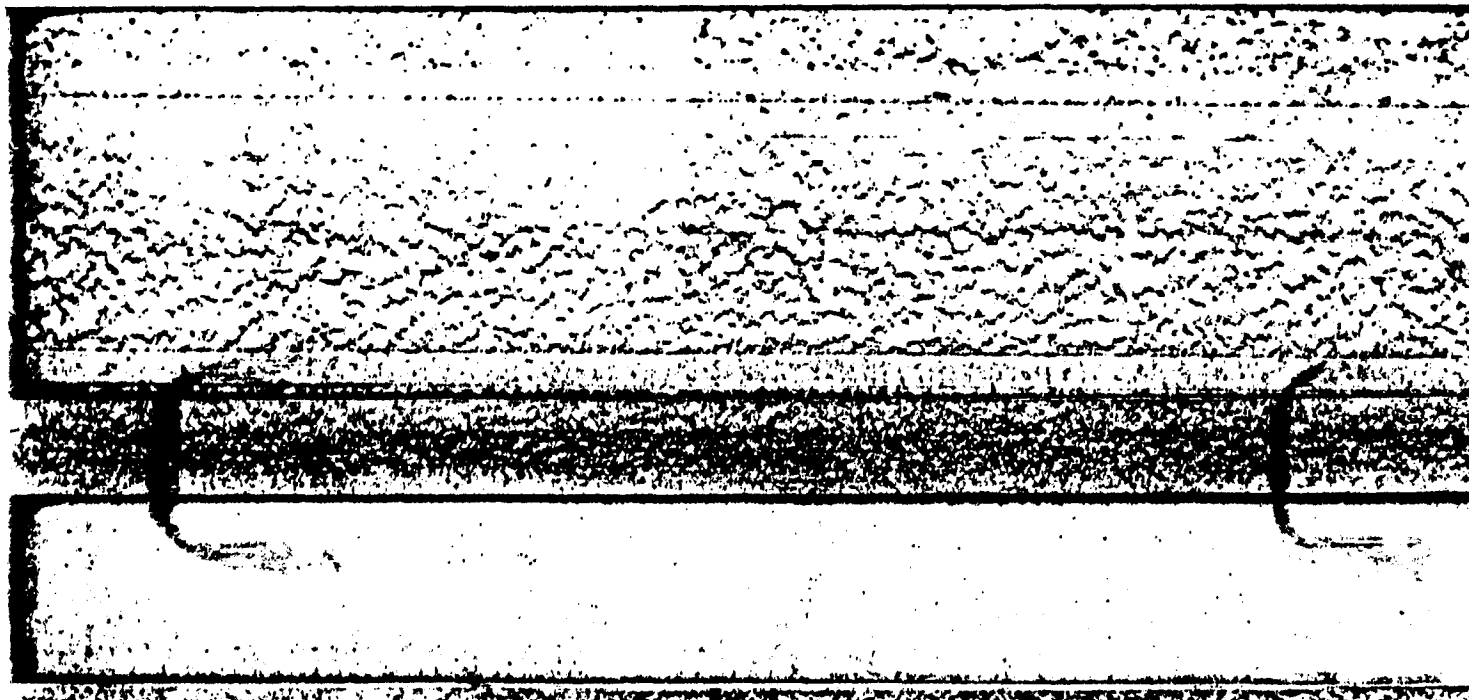

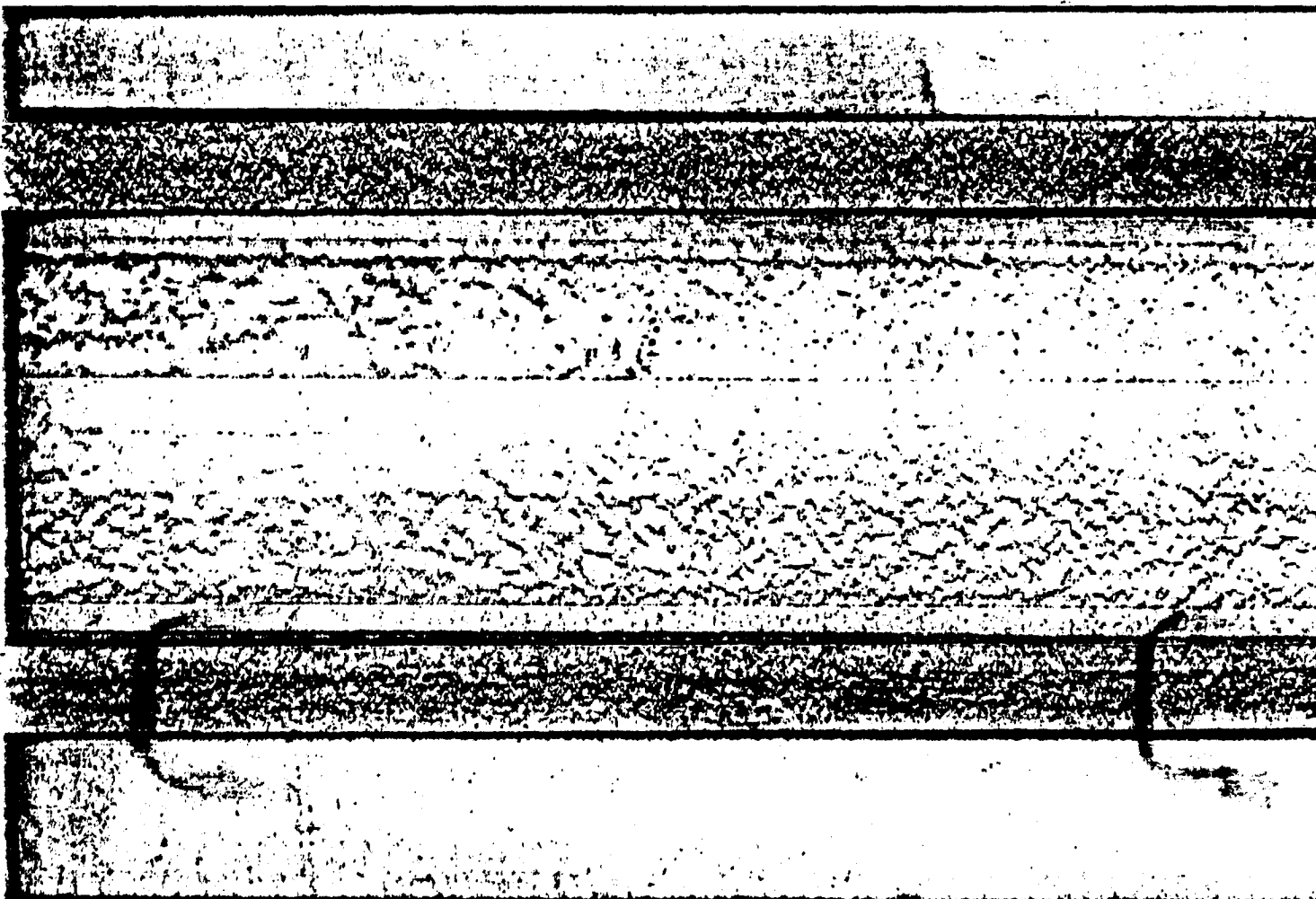

JAY DAVID WHITTAKER CHAMBERS, WAS, ET AL, PERJURY, ESPIONAGE DASH R, INTERNAL SECURITY DASH R. VLADIMIR V. DE SVESHNIKOFF REINTERVIEWED APRIL FOURTEEN LAST. AS ON PREVIOUS OCCASION WAS VAGUE IN STATEMENT AND DIFFICULT TO INTERVIEW. HE FURNISHED FURTHER DETAILS CONCERNING STEPANOFF WHO OPERATED ENGINEERING COMPANY NEAR ADDRESS OF JOHN MATWIN ONE ONE THREE THREE BROADWAY, NYC, LOCATED IN BUILDING THREE BLOCKS FROM THIS ADDRESS ON SAME SIDE OF STREET. DE SVESHNIKOFF CLAIMS HE MET STEPANOFF ABOUT NINETEEN TWENTYFIVE OR SIX. DID NOT KNOW HIM AT RUSSIAN ARTILLERY COMMISSION. STATED BETWEEN DATE OF MEETING AND APRIL THIRTYONE PERFORMED SERVICES FOR STEPANOFF SUCH AS PATENT SEARCHES, EXAMINATION OF TECHNICAL ARTICLES AND FINALLY ADMITTED SUPPLYING MECHANICAL JOURNALS, RECEIVING PERIODIC PAYMENTS FROM STEPANOFF. DE SVESHNIKOFF ALSO ADMITTED KNOWING JOHN MATWIN WHOM HE MET ABOUT SAME TIME, TWENTYFIVE OR SIX, THROUGH RUSSIAN ACQUAINTANCES IN NY. DECLARES HE DID NOT KNOW MATWIN DURING ARTILLERY COMMISSION DAYS IN WORLD WAR ONE. STATED HE FURNISHED SERVICES TO MATWIN OF SOMEWHAT SIMILAR CHARACTER, NAMELY PATENT SEARCHES AND REPRESENTING MATWIN IN WASHINGTON BUT NOT FURNISHED MILITARY DATA OR JOURNALS TO MATWIN. ADVISED HE PERFORMED SERVICES FOR MATWIN AS LATE AS FORTYTWO AND THREE WHEN MATWIN WAS ASSOCIATED WITH FRENCHMAN NAMED ROUX AND RECALLED PATENT SEARCH CONNECTION.

WAS QUESTIONED CONCERNING CRANE-S ALLEGATIONS AND BECAME HIGHLY PERTURBED. ANNOUNCED HE WAS VERY UPSET AND ABRUPTLY AROSE, PUT ON HIS COAT AND DEPARTED IN A VISIBLY DISTURBED CONDITION. REPORT FOLLOWS. REFERENCE IS MADE TO SUMMARY REPORT OF JOSEPH M. KELLY DATED MARCH THIRTY LAST AT NYC. IT APPEARS REFERENCE TO UNKNOWN RUSSIAN OFFICERS CONTAINS ERROR AND OFFICERS ONE AND TWO ARE REVERSED IN PARAGRAPH FOUR.
