In connection with the recent moving of the HISS' attorneys to ask for a change of venue to the State of Vermont in connection with the retrial of this case, certain investigation has been requested by AUSA MURPHY in order to prepare him for arguments in connection with the opposition to this motion.

SA J. M. KELLY advised that there is a weekly program at 6:15 P.M. each Saturday over the Columbia Broadcasting Station which is entitled, "DON HOLLENBECK Views the Press". It is suggested that a review of this weekly program be made commencing with May 31, 1945 and continuing through July 30, 1949; in the event that it is found that any mention of the HISS case is made, that portion of the program should be obtained verbatim.

AUSA T. F. Murphy advised the writer on September 22 that he had received the following information from a contact of his:

Murphy stated that this contact received this information from an extremely reliable source, but the contact intimated that he felt the information was "probably gossip," giving it to Mr. Murphy for whatever value it might have.

This story is in effect that about two years ago, at the institution of the Loyalty Program by the Bureau, a good number of people in the State Department either quit because of the pending loyalty investigation, or were fired from the State Department because of the results of the loyalty investigation. A good many of these people, according to Mr. Murphy's informant, were said to have obtained positions with the Institute of Education, 2 West 45th Street, New York City. The Institute of Education allegedly relied to quite some extent for its financial backing on the Carnegie Endowment Fund.

According to Mr. Murphy's informant, ALGER HISS and LAWRENCE DUGGAN were very close friends, and the allegation is that when these people were let out of the State Department or resigned, ALGER HISS called or wrote DUGGAN and requested a position for these people, the insinuation being that HISS practically forced these people on DUGGAN, and again insinuating that if DUGGAN did not hire these people HISS, through his high connections with the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, would cut off the Institute of Education's funds from the Carnegie Foundation.

Mr. Murphy advised that if there is any basis for the fact that the Institute of Education does receive funds from the Carnegie Foundation, there is a possibility there may be some grain of truth in the above allegations; further, that if so, the possibility exists that there may be some correspondence in the files of the Institute of Education which might have some bearing on ALGER HISS and possibly of use to the retrial of this case.

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent Robert F. X. O'Keefe dated May 17, 1949, at New York City, which sets forth an interview had with Mr. ARTHUR W. ROARK, a private investigator in New York City who conducted a

good deal of investigation for some insurance companies in connection with the suicide of LAWRENCE DUGGAN. ROARK made available to this office copies of letters he allegedly obtained from Miss BESS N. TRINKS, Assistant to LAWRENCE DUGGAN at the International Institute of Education. Some of these letters are communications between DUGGAN and NOEL FIELD, and subsequently between DUGGAN, NOEL FIELD, and ALGER HISS. According to newspaper releases concerning the DUGGAN suicide, it appears that this organization is a fairly sizable one, as they maintain quarters on two floors of the building at 2 West 45th Street, New York City.

It is suggested that some effort be made to determine any financial connection between the Carnegie Foundation and the International Institute of Education, and if such a situation exists, it is suggested that inquiry be made through the officials of the International Institute for Education to determine whether there is any correspondence in the files of this organization that might be pertinent to the retrial of this case.

Reference is made to memorandum of SA THOMAS G. SPENCER, dated September 8, 1949, concerning a comment made by VICTOR LASKY of the "World Telegram" to Assistant United States Attorney THOMAS F. MURPHY, Southern District of New York, to the effect that in the articles written by HENRY JULIAN WADLEIGH in the "New York Post and Home News" was some information that was inconsistent with WADLEIGH'S testimony.

It is to be noted that in compliance with Bureau instructions, the writer recently reviewed the series of twelve articles which appeared in the "New York Post and Home News" under the by-line of HENRY JULIAN WADLEIGH and concluded that the information therein is the same as that previously furnished to the Bureau by WADLEIGH, and omits only the true identity of the woman with whom WADLEIGH was associated in the Communist Party Movement, namely, ELEANOR NELSON SOYRING. It is to be noted further, that no inconsistencies have been observed between the testimony of WADLEIGH or his oral and published statements.

On September 14, 1949, the writer asked LASKY precisely what he had in mind when he indicated to MURPHY the above described "inconsistencies" and LASKY declared that he has no recollection whatsoever of making any such statement to Mr. MURPHY or anyone else. He said he has read the WADLEIGH articles carefully, but noted nothing new of interest therein and reiterated that he could not recall ever having made the statement to Mr. MURPHY that the articles were inconsistent with other statements made by WADLEIGH.

It is suggested that the above development be brought to the attention of Mr. MURPHY.

During the trial of instant case ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS have testified that during the first two weeks of August, 1937 they visited a Summer Camp known as Rigs-O-Marlow, near Chestertown, Maryland, which was operated by J. KELLOGG SMITH. During this period the HISSSES were actually living at the home of Mrs. WICKES in Chestertown, Maryland. Testimony was also offered indicating that TIMOTHY HOBSON, ALGER HISS' stepson, had a broken leg at the time he went to the Camp and the purpose of ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS' visits to this Camp each day during the first two weeks of August was to assist TIMOTHY HOBSON in his recovery from this broken leg.

During the trial WHITTAKER CHAMBERS testified that during this two week period he accompanied ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS on a trip from Washington, D. With reference to the lead to determine what happened at the Carnegie Foundation for International Peace after CHAMBERS' accusation of ALGER HISS before the HCUA (Serial 4118), and the lead requesting that consideration be given to interviewing one or several of the trustees in order that a complete picture of ALGER HISS' connection with the Foundation might be obtained, it is to be noted that Doctor JAMES T. SHOTWELL, President of the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, and ARTHUR BALLANTINE, Trustee, have been interviewed. Both have suggested that it would be advisable to peruse the records of the Endowment and particularly the stenographic minutes of the meetings of the Board of Trustees which Doctor SHOTWELL, in particular, said would be made available to the Bureau.

Unfortunately, Miss SAYRE, who has taken these minutes and who is responsible for the records of the Endowment and who Doctor SHOTWELL says is the only individual who knows about them, is yet on her extended Summer vacation and will not return until Monday, October 3, 1949. On that date Reporting Agent will review these records and at that time determine whether or not it will be necessary or feasible to interview trustees other than those who served on the Executive Board.

Reference is made to the Los Angeles teletype of September 22, 1949, which sets out the results of the attempted interview with JOHN LOUIS SHERMAN at Los Angeles. The contents of this teletype were made available to SAAG T. J. Donegan, and he related that in view of SHERMAN'S uncooperative attitude it was his present intention to bring SHERMAN before a Federal Grand Jury. Donegan declared that this could be accomplished in one of two ways--that is, by having SHERMAN brought to New York to appear before the Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York, or to have SHERMAN brought before a Grand Jury in Los Angeles.

Along these lines, Donegan inquired whether ISAAC FOLKOV had been interviewed in connection with the HISS case. The writer informed him that it was not believed FOLKOV was interviewed in connection with the HISS case. Donegan suggested that if the Bureau had no objection and such interview would not interfere with any pending investigation by the San Francisco Office, such an interview should be conducted by the San Francisco Office. He continued that in the event FOLKOV was uncooperative or the results of the interview indicated FOLKOV had further information, it might be decided to subpoena FOLKOV before the Federal Grand Jury in Los Angeles in the event SHERMAN was subpoenaed before a Los Angeles Grand Jury.

A review of the CHAMBERS file should be made to determine whether FOLKOV was interviewed in connection with instant matter, and if he was not, the San Francisco Office should be informed of Donegan's request.

During the recent trial of the HISS Case, considerable testimony was given by the defendant and others indicating that during the first two weeks in August, 1937, ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS were in Chestertown, Maryland, every day during that period. CHAMBERS testified that on August 10, 1937, he accompanied Mr. and Mrs. HISS on a motor trip from Washington, D.C., to Hancock, Vermont, and returned to New York City. The Baltimore office has obtained a list of numerous people who were either campers or in some way associated with RIGS O. MARLOW, a summer camp operated by J. KELLOGG SMITH, where the HISS boy, TERRY HOBSON, was located during July and August, 1937. One of the individuals at Chestertown during this period is SESSALY COULDO. It has now been determined that she is Mrs. FREDERICK BURTON KRAFFT and resides at 89 South Highland Avenue, Ossining, New York.

It is requested that Mrs. KRAFFT be interviewed for any information she may have concerning TERRY HOBSON, ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS and particularly their presence in Chestertown and RIGS O. MARLOW during August of 1937.

Reference is made to the writer's memorandum of September 21, in connection with an interview had with NICHOLAS VAZZANA, an investigator for the law firm of Cravath, Swaine and Moore, New York City.

During the conversation with VAZZANA, he volunteered that it might be worthwhile for this office to confidentially contact JOHN G. BROADY, indicating that the latter had conducted quite a bit of investigation for the HISS lawyers in the early stages of this case. It will be recalled that HORACE SCHWALL did, so far as it could be ascertained, all of the legal work for BROADY, and as it will also be recalled, confidentially through ARMAND CHANKALIAN, administrative assistant to the United States Attorney, SDNY, turned over the results of his investigations. The most significant information revealed by SCHWALL was the rental by HAROLD ROSENWALD, one of HISS' lawyers and investigators, of a Woodstock typewriter of the same model as the FANSLER Woodstock typewriter, and which typewriter was kept in the office of Debevoise, Plimpton and McLean for several months prior to the trial of this case. It is of course possible that BROADY may have some information other than the information supplied by SCHWALL. However, in view of BROADY'S unsavory background and particularly the recent publicity of BROADY'S trial in connection with the wire-tapping episode revolving around the Kings County Buick Company, it is not believed that any approach should be made to BROADY.

It is requested that the New York Office ascertain from CHAMBERS whether or not he knows if either ALGER or PRISCILLA HISS used the alias of SMITH.

On the afternoon of September 20th I received a call from ASAC Lally of the Baltimore Office relative to our letter requesting that arrangements be made for Assistant United States Attorney Murphy and an agent of this office to interview CHAMBERS before the retrial of HISS. Mr. Lally advised that CHAMBERS has been in Wisconsin attending a Fair, where he has been displaying cattle from his farm. He is driving his truck back at the present time enroute to his home in Westminster, and will arrive at home on Thursday, September 22nd. He then plans to be at home from the 22nd until about the 30th, when he will leave in time to drive to another Fair in Iowa, arriving there on October 3rd. He plans to be in Iowa until October 8th. Mr. Lally advised that CHAMBERS had not known that the retrial was set for October 10th, and this may change his plans to attend the Fair in Iowa. Upon CHAMBERS' return on September 22nd, the Baltimore Office will interview him and let us know of his current plans, as he may well decide not to go to Iowa in view of the pending trial.

I advised Mr. Lally that such information will be furnished to Assistant United States Attorney Murphy.

Reference is made to Bureau ^{WFO} teletype dated September 19, 1949, which in substance states that LOU RUSSELL, Chief Investigator for the HCUA, is apparently in possession of information from NICHOLAS S. VAZZANA, 103 Park Avenue, New York City, indicating that IRMA COHEN, divorced wife of MAX LIEVER, was with PRISCILLA HISS and ESTHER CHAMBERS at a farm in Bucks County during the pertinent period. This teletype also states that MAXIM LIEVER is alleged to have married IRMA COHEN in 1924 and was divorced from her in 1932; that IRMA COHEN was born in New York City on April 10, 1905, and is the daughter of EMANUEL C. COHEN who resides or has offices at 1295 Madison Avenue, New York City.

On this date the writer interviewed VAZZANA, who, it will be recalled, was one of the investigators employed by the law firm of Cravath, Swaine and Moore, who represented CHAMBERS during the latter part of 1948 on behalf of Time, Inc. VAZZANA stated that he had made this information available to the HCUA and that the farm in Bucks County he had reference to was the Summer cottage which had been rented in 1935 by MAX LIEVER and WHITTAKER CHAMBERS. He related that he was quite positive that his information was to the effect that in 1935 LIEVER'S wife had been at the CHAMBERS - LIEVER Summer cottage in Smithtown and had seen PRISCILLA HISS there, and possibly ALGER HISS.

In view of the fact that CHAMBERS has related to agents of this office that LIEVER was not married in 1935 and further by the fact that in 1936 LIEVER had allowed the CHAMBERS family to use his farm in New Hope, Pennsylvania, and subsequently brought his "new wife" to live with the CHAMBERS for a short period of time, VAZZANA was questioned as to these facts. He related that he was unaware of how many wives LIEVER had or the dates on which he was divorced from any of these women, but was quite sure that the information he had concerned the Summer residence at Smithtown. VAZZANA also stated that he has several photographs of instant cottage at Smithtown which were taken in 1939, and would make these photographs available to this office in the event they were needed.

In connection with VAZZANA'S reference to IRMA COHEN, the divorced wife of MAXIM LIEVER, reference is made to the report of Special Agent *Spencer*

As a matter of speculation, the possibility may exist that LIEBER may have brought "CHARLOTTE" to the Summer cottage at Smithtown, and it is also possible that LIEBER might have palmed this woman off as his lawfully wedded wife. In view of CHAMBERS' statement that LIEBER brought his "new wife" to New Hope in 1936, it is possible that perhaps this woman may be the individual who VAZZANA has reference to. It is suggested, therefore, that efforts be made to determine the actual date of LIEBER'S divorce from IRMA COHEN whose name is now Mrs. LEONARD GALEN and the date of his subsequent marriage in order that the name of his wife might be obtained. This woman should be interviewed to determine whether she is the wife referred to by VAZZANA in his remarks to LOU RUSSELL. It is also suggested that Mr. and Mrs. CHAMBERS be again interviewed to determine whether they can recall any female accompanying LIEBER to the Smithtown cottage during the Summer of 1935, and particularly if this woman might be the unknown CHARLOTTE.

Winchell declared that "Judge Rifkind will not preside at the next Hiss trial."

He also said that the trial of Tokio Rose in San Francisco is about to end, and that it probably would not have been tried if he had not read on one of his broadcasts a letter he received from a Mother in Glens Falls, N. Y. He then asserted that Clark Lee, well-known newsman, had dug up the amazing story of U. S. Army Sergeant PROVOO and the latter's dealings with the Japanese. Winchell said that there would be brought out in the trial of PROVOO the circumstances surrounding the killing by the Japs of U. S. Army Captain Thompson who argued with the Japs for food for U. S. prisoners after Corregidor, and also the fact that PROVOO forced U. S. Army Nurses to launder the dirty underwear of the Japs.

Winchell also said that several West Coast supporters of Hitler would be prosecuted shortly.

He also commented that the Dep't. of Justice and the FBI know all about the Continental Congress held in Mexico City last week at which O. John Rogge and Mrs. Paul Robeson were among the speakers. Winchell declared that Henry Wallace and Charlie Chaplin wired their best wishes to the conference.

According to most recent information, ROULHAC left Seattle yesterday en route to New York City and later to Washington, D. C. Zander stated that Special Agent J. J. Walsh is entirely familiar with the situation concerning ROULHAC and the CATLETT family, and had contemplated interviewing ROULHAC. Zander suggested that when ROULHAC arrived in New York City inquiry should be made to determine if he is going to proceed immediately to Washington, D. C., and if so, Walsh will interview him upon his arrival in Washington. If, however, ROULHAC anticipates spending some considerable time in New York City, he stated that it would probably be advisable to have Agent Walsh come to New York City for the purpose of reinterviewing ROULHAC.
