COOK WAS REINTERVIEWED BY AGENTS OF THIS OFFICE ON OCTOBER TEN, LAST, AT HIS OFFICE, ROOM TWO THREE TWO FOUR, SOUTH BUILDING, DEPT OF AGRICULTURE, AND ASKED IF HE WOULD FURNISH A SIGNED STATEMENT CONCERNING ALGER HISS- APPROACH FOR PURPOSE OF OBTAINING EMPLOYMENT FOR ROBERT K. MCCONNAGHEY. HE ADVISED HE DID NOT CARE TO FURNISH SIGNED STATEMENT BUT IF NECESSARY HE WOULD TESTIFY CONCERNING THIS MATTER WHERE HE COULD COMPLETELY PRESENT ALL OF THE FACTS. SUBJECT: United States v. Alger Hiss

On direct examination, Alger Hiss testified that he was a member of the International Juridical Association and had written up cases for this Association that were published in the Association's Bulletin, the name of which he did not spell out.

It would appear from the testimony that this membership occurred during the years of 1932 and 1933. Mr. Murphy is desirous of knowing whether these articles appearing in these bulletins may be signed by Alger Hiss and suggests that we make an attempt to locate these old bulletins. It is possible that they may be obtained at the New York Public Library. However, if they cannot be located there, Mr. Murphy suggests that we check with the New York Bar Association on West 44th Street.

Alger Hiss will be on cross-examination, it is hoped, all day December 27th and it is suggested that this information be obtained as soon on December 27th as possible and that the results be made available to S.A. T. G. SPENCER, who can be reached in Judge Goddard's court, at Room 1305 of this building, during the progress of the trial on December 27th.

WILLIAM L. WHITE, a reporter for Reader's Digest, has been in daily attendance at the trial of ALGER HISS and appears to be rather friendly to the Government.

On December 20, in a conversation with AUSA Tom Murphy, he stated that he could obtain some copies of the reports published in connection with the Nye Committee hearings, particularly those dealing with ALGER HISS' examination of BERNARD BARUCH. These hearings of course are in connection with the Nye munitions investigation. He made these available late last night and sent along a letter in which he stated it might be worth while to check the Daily Worker for the period around May 27, 28, 29, and 30, of 1935, to see if the Worker picked up a story about BARUCH'S testimony before the Nye Committee. He stated that there was a possibility that HISS' name might be mentioned in connection with the interrogation of BARUCH.

It is suggested that the Daily Worker for the above dates be reviewed and any information that might be of value to the cross examination of HISS be obtained. In connection with obtaining this information, it is to be noted that HISS is on direct examination as of this day and cross examination of him will probably begin some time this morning.

This afternoon, Mr. Fred Baumgardner of the Bureau advised that Ray Whearty's secretary had called, inquiring as to the whereabouts of photographs of certain letters furnished to the Bureau by the Department and obtained by it from the House Committee on Un-American Activities. The letters were communications from HISS to CASE concerning one of the real estate transactions in which HISS was involved. Mr. Baumgardner advised that, according to the Bureau records, two sets of these six letters were forwarded to the New York Office on December 1, 1949, Special Delivery, Registered Mail. Mr. Baumgardner stated that Murphy had requested Whearty to expedite their submission to him.

I subsequently advised Mr. Baumgardner that we received the items in question and had turned them over to Mr. Donegan on December 6; that, however, since apparently they cannot locate them at the moment, we are giving him another set.

On the afternoon of December 20, SAC Boardman of the Philadelphia office called at the request of SA Kirkland of that office to furnish me with the following information:

Kirkland stated that in the report of SA James Frew dated April 6, 1949 at Washington, D. C. leads were set out to locate and possibly interview ROBERT RAY, alias RAY WARNER, former Communist leader in Washington, D. C. in the 1930's, relative to his knowledge of ALGER HISS. Mr. Kirkland advised that RAY had come to Philadelphia in 1938 and until recently he had not been located. Now, however, it is believed that he is serving a 100 year term in the Eastern State Penitentiary at Philadelphia as the Aspirin Bandit. Mr. Kirkland wanted to know whether, under the circumstances, RAY should be interviewed for any information he might have concerning HISS. I advised him we would consider this and inform the Philadelphia office as to what action should be taken.

During the direct examination of WHITTAKER CHAMBERS in instant case, he stated that he knew that ALGER HISS and his wife spent some time during their honeymoon at the Stafford Hotel in Baltimore, Maryland. The HISSSES were married on December 11, 1929. On cross examination yesterday, ALGER HISS denied that he spent any time at the Stafford Hotel during his honeymoon.

AUSA Murphy suggested that if it has not already been done that inquiry be made at the Stafford Hotel to determine whether any record is available showing the registration of ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS some time around December 11, 1929. It is suggested that the files be checked to see if this has already been covered, and if not, a teletype should immediately be sent to the Baltimore Office to have this investigation completed in time so that it can be used for the cross examination of ALGER HISS, who is presently on direct examination.

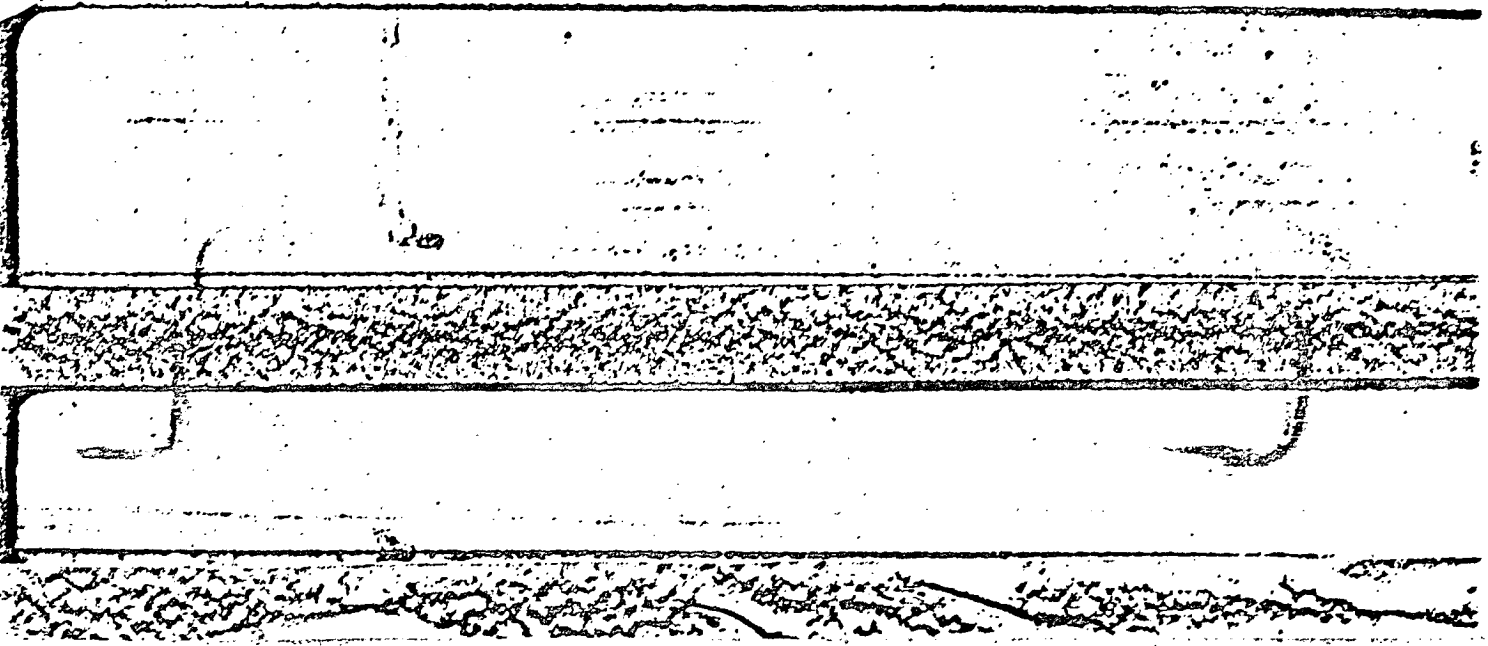

On the evening of December 9, 1949, in accordance with the request of SA THOMAS J. SPENCER, I telephonically contacted SA WILLIAM E. HUGHES of the Philadelphia Office and advised him that in connection with the above captioned case, it was desired that SA KIRKLAND of the Philadelphia Office endeavor to discreetly ascertain if JOSEPH R. BOUCOT was going to appear as a defense witness in the ALGER HISS trial; further, that if BOUCOT was coming to New York City to testify, it was desired that Agent KIRKLAND and a second Special Agent, who was present with Agent KIRKLAND at the first HISS trial, would also come to New York City to testify at the same time as BOUCOT. It was pointed out to SA HUGHES that if Agent KIRKLAND was unable to determine if BOUCOT was to appear as a defense witness, then under these circumstances SA KIRKLAND and the second Special Agent from the Philadelphia Office, name unknown, were to be present in New York City at 10:30 AM on December 12, 1949. SA HUGHES of the Philadelphia Office advised that he would advise Agent KIRKLAND of the foregoing.
