It is fact that the American Communist party has responded with plans for the reorganization of its members inside the rail-

They are under orders to set up special "railroad dubs" in these districts. These club units are being woven into a national network under a single director now in New York, but soon, to operate out of Chicago.

The impact on the security of our nation which the Communists may have in the new concentration are too obvious for detailing here.

There are those who say that the Communist party organization is about as effective as a Frohibitionist rally in a Skid Row saloon Could be, but it fook Communist parties of less than 3,000 members in Peru and Venezuela to Shake our world.

Certainly the Communists have the manpower. They have enough to operate inside the rail system and a score of other industries, as well as in another directed drive to exploit the heartbreak of the unemployed.

Already party literature is being sent off to their workers in industrial sections. Additional material is being written in New York.



This is a letter of appreciation for your work as a public servant during the past generation, and an invitation to your agency to call on me for any service I may be able to render them at any future time.

I was born in New York city in 1924, six months after you had accepted an appointment as Acting Director of the Bureau from Justice The fact that now, thirty-three years later, I am able to raise my four children in a great and powerful nation which has kept comparatively free of the evil influence of international Communism and which has come through a great economic depression and a global war with its republican institutions intact, is in no small degree to the credit of your agency and its unceasing efforts on behalf of the highest interests of the American nation.

I have read Whitehead's brief history of the F.B.I., and have begun your own Masters of Deceit. Your book will be suggested reading for my students in American history next fall semester. It will prove an excellent antidote to the countless books on the reading lists which fail to distinguish clearly between the international Communist revolutionary movement and some of the native humanitarian movements that have crossed the pages of American history. More than that, after glancing ahead at your three concluding chapters, I can see that here is another work which can inform undergraduates correctly on American citizenship in terms of duty as well as of rights. This has been one of the great failures of the intellectual class in our country, and I think that it has gone hand-in-hand with the decline of the influence of classical thought in education; the great majority of those who wrote the books and who taught my generation in the classrooms (fortunately, I had such teachers only/on the level of graduate study) came to identify the concept of "freedom" with "license", and many of them still speak of "intellectual" or "academic" freedom as though it existed in a vacuum.

For your own service to our country pleased sect my sgratitude as an American citizen. Pages A5122-A5124, Congressman Robison, (R) New York, extended his remarks to include a speech delivered by Congressman Keating, (R) New York, during the Memorial Day program at the Bath, New York, Veterans' Administration Center on May 30. Mr. Keating commented on the Communist Party of America. He stated "It is amazing to me to hear the talk of those who have come to the conclusion that the threat of Communist subversion in America has been met and destroyed." He went on to state "the Communist Party is bent on getting across the idea that it is feeble in strength and numbers, without reference to the underground. It seeks to repair its tattered cloak and regain a semblance of respectability. It desperately desires to quiet voices which expose its real objectives, such as investigating groups and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and attempts to render them ineffective. \* \* \* I pose these tactics to you not as something which might be going on, or could some day be carried out. They are stratagems which are being employed daily in our country by those who would have us ground under the heel of Moscow. They are very real threats to our way of life and to the things for which the men whose memory we honor today fought and died. I pose these tacties to you so that perhaps you may be better able to spot them and thus be better prepared to play your part in combating them. In this connection, I would urge all of you read a book entitled Masters of Deceit,' by J. Edgar Hoover, the magnificent Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. This book embodies the findings of Mr. Hoover's 40 years of study of communism. He tells how to spot their tactics, what they are trying to do, and what we can do to stop them. I hope all of you here today will make an effort to read it. It is the be t antidote to a sense of complacency about the Communist threat and it is also the best way to learn how to fight this atheistic menace."

The indexes of both the Don Whitehead book, "The FBI Story, "and the Director's book, "Masters of Deceit," have not been indexed into Bureau files as such. Recently, there was an instance wherein an item appearing in the Whitehead book was brought to our attention by a reporter as the basis for an erroneous conclusion on his part. The search of the Bureau files which preceded our original outgoing letter to this reporter concerned the old motion picture "G-Men" and this file search did not make reference to the fact that this particular motion picture was mentioned in the Whitehead book footnotes. No effort has been be made in the Records Section to index the Director's book. As far as the Whitehead book is concerned pertinent portions concerning individuals. mentioned in this work have been filed into that particular individual's main file and so indexed. This, of course, is not complete since it is hardly possible to index such items as "Pearl Harbor," the gangster era, or "Operations of the Communist Party." These nonspecific items cannot be accurately indexed.

The Records Section has advised that the actual index of both the books in question can be indexed in Bureau files and that such a procedure would indicate to an individual having a search made that a particular item appears on page so and so of either the Whitehead book or "Masters of Deceit." It should be borne in mind, however, that the index to neither book is complete due to space limitations and the feasibility of such an indexing procedure is, therefore, questionable. There is, however, a possibility of avoiding possible contradictory communications if it were possible for the individual preparing Bureau communications to have references to a particular individual as they appear in these two books brought to his attention when a file search is made.



"THIS IS THE A. D. L., MR. HOOVER!" BY MYRON C. FAGAN ATTACK ON DIRECTOR'S BOOK, MASTERS OF DECEIT"

#### BACKGROUND:

The Washington Field Office, by Airtel June 12, 1953, transmitted a copy of the captioned booklet which had been furnished that office by a WFO Informant, who obtained it at a meeting of the Defenders of State Sovereignty and Individual Liberties in Arlington, Virginia, where a limited number of copies were distributed.

The booklet states that Fagan has been reporting on the war between the "Internationalist-Communist Conspiracy" and the American people for ten years. He attacks the Director's book as aiding this conspiracy by 'whitewashing" the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) and by "glorifying" the Anti-Defamation League (ADL). Fagan contends that these two groups are among the leaders of this "conspiracy."

### THE BOOKLET:

A perusal of Fagan's booklet reveals that Fagan, while parportedly devoted to combating communism, is equally avid in his Anti-Semitic and Anti-Negro views. This becomes readily apparent in his very vague efforts to find, in the inserted portions of the Director's boom, support of his views that the NAAC and the ADL both represent subtle agents to accomplish the objectives of international communism.

Fagan, for example, attempts to build his case by stating that "Mr. Hoover has never attempted to disprove" a statement made by the Honorable Eugene Cook, Attorney General of Georgia, concerning the alleged front group and subversive affiliations of various officers of the NAACP. He also alleges that the ADL served as the agent for Soviet



HE SUMMIT CONFERENCE FOR THE MORAL RE-ARMAMENT OF THE WORLD opened May 29 at Mackinac, Island, Michigan. This conference has been called together by statesmen who are convinced the time has come to demonstrate to the world the working answer.

Eight thousand from 75 countries are expected to attend during the summer. Many of the delegates from Europe, Asia and Africa will be in Washington during the time the plays are presented at the National Theatre.

On June 4 Dr. Frank N. D. Buchman, initiator of Moral Re-Armament, celebrated his 80th birthday at the conference. Messages poured in from around the world. In an age of doubt you have recalled us to the certainties of faith and the promise of a nation governed by God. These truths are the real heritage of America. They must become the living source of our national policy at home and abroad."

Messages came also from the Shah of Iran, the Emperor of Ethiopia, Chancellor Adenauer of Germany, President Garcia of the Philippines, President Chiang: Kai-shek of the Republic of China, the Prime Ministers of Burma, Ceylon and New Zealand, Hisato Ichimada, Finance Minister of Japan, the Premier of Eastern Nigeria, the President of the Austrian Parliament, the Minister of Defense of Switzerland, Lord Hailsham and twenty-seven Members of the British House of Commons, Robert Schuman, former Prime Minister of France, and Si Bekkai, former Prime Minister of Morocco.
