[redacted] former secretary of the late Justice Murphy, by letter dated 6/10/58 to Miss Gandy, requested that a copy of "Masters of Deceit" (which she forwarded) be autographed to General Myron Cramer. She identified him as a friend of Mr. Hoover's.

File 100-7321-19 reflects that in February, 1943, the National Lawyers Guild sponsored a "war convention" in Chicago. Among the speakers listed was Major General Myron C. Cramer, Judge Advocate General, U. S. Army.

In 1942 Major [redacted] furnished information about General Allen Gullion, Provost Marshal General, and an "organization" which Major [redacted] said had been built up by him in the Army. The aims of this "organization" reportedly were to take over the country to save America from radical labor, the communists, Jews and Negroes. Among those reportedly associated with the group was a "Major General Cramer, not identified by position, but apparently Major General Myron Cramer, (100-94623-13).

On 8/10/42 Myron C. Cramer identified as Judge Advocate General, War Department, wrote a cordial letter to Mr. Hoover complimenting the Director on the work of the FBI in the trial of the eight Nazi Saboteurs. Relations between the Bureau and Cramer have been limited, the last exchange of correspondence being in 1943. (94-4-5963; 65-38612-336, 337)

# U. S. Reds' New No. 1 Target: Rails

In the New York national headquarters of the Communist party, U. S. A., there recently arrived directives from Moscow for "penetration" of America's nerve system—the rail lines. Chicago is the solar plexus of this system, which some day may have to hurtle men and machines to some boundary or point of embarkation.

Therefore, the Communist timetable calls for the shifting of their national headquarters here.

There are cynics who will laugh and say there's too much movie-type intrigue in all this, but the nine top Communist party leaders who make up its new national executive committee—the American praesidium—will not laugh.

They will wonder who talked out of turn about their "orders" to pull "sleepers" out of other industries and switch them to the rails.

## 'Clubs' Planned

It is fact the American section of the Kremlin's international action secretariat has ordered its agents to "concentrate" on the U. S. railroads.

It is fact that the rails have been singled out as the primary target of Communist activity for the next year or more.

It is fact that the American Communist party has responded with plans for the reorganization of its members inside the railroads.

It is fact that loyal party members are being sent now to various key cities throughout the nation, including Chicago.

They are under orders to set up special "railroad clubs" in these districts. These club units are being

woven into a national network under a single director now in New York, but soon to operate out of Chicago.

The impact on the security of our nation which the Communists may have in the new concentration are too obvious for detailing here.

There are those who say that the Communist party organization is about as effective as a Prohibitionist rally in a Skid Row saloon. Could be, but it took Communist parties of less than 3,000 members in Peru and Venezuela to shake our world.

Certainly the Communists have the manpower. They have enough to operate inside the rail system and a score of other industries, as well as in another directed drive to exploit the heartbreak of the unemployed.

Already party literature is being sent off to their workers in industrial sections. Additional material is being written in New York.

## 'Common Ground'

The line is that Communist operatives must now say that there is a common ground between unions and the Communists to fight, as in the old days, to provoke militant action by the jobless.

It is fact that there are scores of Communist cells meeting throughout the country. The jobless are considered ready.

Maybe the Communists have delusions of the grandeur of the '30s. Maybe not. Those rocks didn't up and throw themselves at Dick Nixon. It could happen here, too.

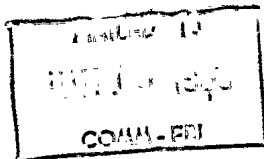

Reference is made to the attached letter dated June 7, 1958, from the above-captioned individual. [Redacted] makes favorable mention of the Director's book, "Masters of Deceit," but then makes reference to the May 1, 1958, issue of "Common Sense" (which she encloses with her letter). She states that "Common Sense" claims that sixteen pages of "Masters of Deceit" are a clever maneuver on the part of ADL and AJC. (Anti-Defamation League and American Jewish Congress).

As you know, "Common Sense" is a very violent anti-Semitic and the May 1, 1958, issue severely attacked "Masters of Deceit." This publication asserted that Jewish groups obviously had subverted Mr. Hoover to a pro-Jewish position.

It is felt that [Redacted] letter should not be acknowledged as to answer her would probably only encourage further hostile communications. Bufiles contain no record on correspondent.

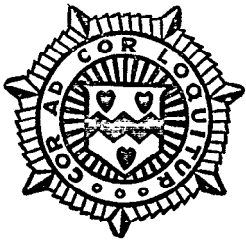

I have just read your book: MASTERS OF DECEIT. It has confirmed many of my suspicions about Communist methods.

All of which have an appeal to most men. At first glance the magazines look both attractive and harmless. I have found however, that they contain almost without exception, a large amount of communist propaganda. Every attempt is made to smear or discredit the armed forces. Officers in particular are blasted as being stupid or tyrannical. Soldiers are pictured as "Heroes" or guys "with guts" when they defy their superiors or resist military discipline. All manner of "concealed" attacks are made upon the government of the United States. It is the usual and accepted way of these magazines to make a mockery of family life and to use God's name as profanity.

I feel these magazines have but one main purpose: corruption of the minds of all who read them, and it is apparent that many people do.

Mr. Hoover, if I have properly evaluated these magazines, what is the answer to them? Are they able to stay in business because this is what Americans want to read? Are they published by concealed Communists or a "Front" ? If so, why are they not exposed for what they are?

It really hurts to see them take the "Lime light" of the news stand.

Enclosed, you will find two such magazines that are typical of the mass.

I have always admired your leadership of the F.B.I. and it gives me and all other loyal Americans, a feeling of security to know our way of life is guarded by your eternal vigilance.

This is a letter of appreciation for your work as a public servant during the past generation, and an invitation to your agency to call on me for any service I may be able to render them at any future time.

I was born in New York city in 1924, six months after you had accepted an appointment as Acting Director of the Bureau from Justice Stone. The fact that now, thirty-three years later, I am able to raise my four children in a great and powerful nation which has kept comparatively free of the evil influence of international Communism and which has come through a great economic depression and a global war with its republican institutions intact, is in no small degree to the credit of your agency and its unceasing efforts on behalf of the highest interests of the American nation.

I have read Whitehead's brief history of the F.B.I., and have begun your own Masters of Deceit. Your book will be suggested reading for my students in American history next fall semester. It will prove an excellent antidote to the countless books on the reading lists which fail to distinguish clearly between the international Communist revolutionary movement and some of the native humanitarian movements that have crossed the pages of American history. More than that, after glancing ahead at your three concluding chapters, I can see that here is another work which can inform undergraduates correctly on American citizenship in terms of duty as well as of rights. This has been one of the great failures of the intellectual class in our country, and I think that it has gone hand-in-hand with the decline of the influence of classical thought in education; the great majority of those who wrote the books and who taught my generation in the classrooms (fortunately, I had such teachers only on the level of graduate study) came to identify the concept of "freedom" with "license", and many of them still speak of "intellectual" or "academic" freedom as though it existed in a vacuum.

For your own service to our country, please accept my gratitude as an American citizen. You may pass my name along to your field representatives with the knowledge that I would be pleased to be of any service to the Bureau in the future.

SUBJECT: The Congressional Record

Pages A5122-A5124, Congressman Robison, (R) New York, extended his remarks to include a speech delivered by Congressman Keating, (R) New York, during the Memorial Day program at the Bath, New York, Veterans' Administration Center on May 30. Mr. Keating commented on the Communist Party of America. He stated "It is amazing to me to hear the talk of those who have come to the conclusion that the threat of Communist subversion in America has been met and destroyed." He went on to state "the Communist Party is bent on getting across the idea that it is feeble in strength and numbers, without reference to the underground. It seeks to repair its tattered cloak and regain a semblance of respectability. It desperately desires to quiet voices which expose its real objectives, such as investigating groups and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and attempts to render them ineffective. \* \* \* I pose these tactics to you not as something which might be going on, or could some day be carried out. They are stratagems which are being employed daily in our country by those who would have us ground under the heel of Moscow. They are very real threats to our way of life and to the things for which the men whose memory we honor today fought and died. I pose these tactics to you so that perhaps you may be better able to spot them and thus be better prepared to play your part in combating them. In this connection, I would urge all of you read a book entitled 'Masters of Deceit,' by J. Edgar Hoover, the magnificent Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. This book embodies the findings of Mr. Hoover's 40 years of study of communism. He tells how to spot their tactics, what they are trying to do, and what we can do to stop them. I hope all of you here today will make an effort to read it. It is the best antidote to a sense of complacency about the Communist threat and it is also the best way to learn how to fight this atheistic menace."

SUBJECT: INDEXING OF "THE FBI STORY" AND "MASTERS OF DECEIT"

The indexes of both the Don Whitehead book, "The FBI Story," and the Director's book, "Masters of Deceit," have not been indexed into Bureau files as such. Recently, there was an instance wherein an item appearing in the Whitehead book was brought to our attention by a reporter as the basis for an erroneous conclusion on his part. The search of the Bureau files which preceded our original outgoing letter to this reporter concerned the old motion picture "G-Men" and this file search did not make reference to the fact that this particular motion picture was mentioned in the Whitehead book footnotes. No effort has been made in the Records Section to index the Director's book. As far as the Whitehead book is concerned pertinent portions concerning individuals mentioned in this work have been filed into that particular individual's main file and so indexed. This, of course, is not complete since it is hardly possible to index such items as "Pearl Harbor," the gangster era, or "Operations of the Communist Party." These nonspecific items cannot be accurately indexed.

The Records Section has advised that the actual index of both the books in question can be indexed in Bureau files and that such a procedure would indicate to an individual having a search made that a particular item appears on page so and so of either the Whitehead book or "Masters of Deceit." It should be borne in mind, however, that the index to neither book is complete due to space limitations and the feasibility of such an indexing procedure is, therefore, questionable. There is, however, a possibility of avoiding possible contradictory communications if it were possible for the individual preparing Bureau communications to have reference to a particular individual as they appear in these two books brought to his attention when a file search is made.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Records Branch index the indices of both "The FBI Story" and "Masters of Deceit."

BACKGROUND:

The Washington Field Office, by Airtel June 12, 1958, transmitted a copy of the captioned booklet which had been furnished that office by a WFO Informant, who obtained it at a meeting of the Defenders of State Sovereignty and Individual Liberties in Arlington, Virginia, where a limited number of copies were distributed.

The booklet states that Fagan has been reporting on the war between the "Internationalist-Communist Conspiracy" and the American people for ten years. He attacks the Director's book as aiding this conspiracy by "whitewashing" the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) and by "glorifying" the Anti-Defamation League (ADL). Fagan contends that these two groups are among the leaders of this "conspiracy."

THE BOOKLET:

A perusal of Fagan's booklet reveals that Fagan, while purportedly devoted to combating communism, is equally avid in his Anti-semitic and Anti-Negro views. This becomes readily apparent in his very vague efforts to find, in the inserted portions of the Director's book, support of his views that the NAACP and the ADL both represent subtle agents to accomplish the objectives of international communism.

Fagan, for example, attempts to build his case by stating that "Mr. Hoover has never attempted to disprove" a statement made by the Honorable Eugene Cook, Attorney General of Georgia, concerning the alleged front group and subversive affiliations of various officers of the NAACP. He also alleges that the ADL served as the agent for Soviet

Bufiles reflect that we have been involved in difficulties with [redacted] off and on since 1949. He is the Director of the Cinema Educational Guild, Inc., of Hollywood, California, and has been responsible for the distribution of numerous pamphlets related to Anti-Negro and Anti-Semitic matters. He has, on more than one occasion, attempted to use the Director's name for furtherance of his professed anticommunist programs, and it has been necessary on numerous occasions to have the Los Angeles Office admonish him to refrain from mentioning the Director's name or the FBI in any manner. The Cinema Educational Guild, Inc., is characterized in Bufiles as an organization allegedly anticommunist, but actually ultra-nationalistic and Anti-Semitic.

It has been cited in a pamphlet of the HCUA as one of the rankest organs of communist propoganda. MF circulation as of 10-2-57 was 9,123. The article by [redacted] is a typical example of the scurrilous attacks by the communists against the FBI, which in this case is against the Director's book "Masters of Deceit."

"Honest People Should Be Silent"

From this chapter one learns that this book is necessary at this particular time - a time of unemployment, of juvenile crime, a time when people are upset by the atomic experiments and by the threat of war.

But they try to use this to turn honest people into communists, may God save them...

Sounds senseless? Not at all! There is a crafty, police trick behind this.

There is no end to the problems they can use to approach people! What about the problem of the terrible inflation - at a time of an economic crisis? And what about the frightful torture of looking for an apartment, taking into account the financial ability of the average wage-earner?

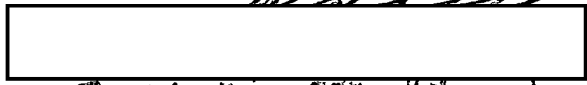

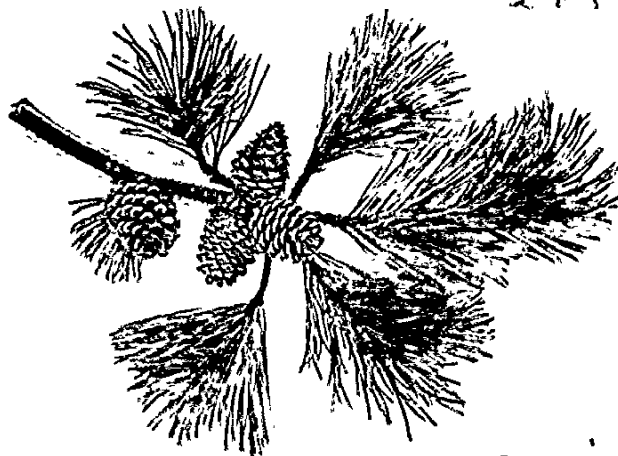

**T**HE SUMMIT CONFERENCE FOR THE MORAL RE-ARMAMENT OF THE WORLD opened May 29 at Mackinac Island, Michigan. This conference has been called together by statesmen who are convinced the time has come to demonstrate to the world the working answer.

Eight thousand from 75 countries are expected to attend during the summer. Many of the delegates from Europe, Asia and Africa will be in Washington during the time the plays are presented at the National Theatre.

On June 4 Dr. Frank N. D. Buchman, initiator of Moral Re-Armament, celebrated his 80th birthday at the conference. Messages poured in from around the world. Twenty-four Members of the Senate and fifty Members of the House of Representatives wired to Dr. Buchman their "expression of thankfulness for the service you have rendered this country." They said, "In an age of confusion and ferment you have pioneered the ideology of freedom. In an age of division you have shown the way to unity. In an age of doubt you have recalled us to the certainties of faith and the promise of a nation governed by God. These truths are the real heritage of America. Messages came also from the Shah of Iran, the Emperor of Ethiopia, Chancellor Adenauer of Germany, President Garcia of the Philippines, President Chiang Kai-shek of the Republic of China, the Prime Ministers of Burma, Ceylon and New Zealand, Hisato Ichimada, Finance Minister of Japan, the Premier of Eastern Nigeria, the President of the Austrian Parliament, the Minister of Defense of Switzerland, Lord Hailsham and twenty-seven Members of the British House of Commons, Robert Schuman, former Prime Minister of France, and Si Bekkai, former Prime Minister of Morocco.

*The Crowning Experience* and *He Was Not There* come to Washington straight from the conference at Mackinac. An American newspaperman who saw them there had this to say:

"These two plays are mighty expressions of the destiny of America, a thrilling challenge to America's leadership and to her masses.

"This is America at her best, a bright light in a new dark age of history.

"This is what America is looking for to tell the world.

"This is the conscience of a nation, poured out in words and song that the world will understand and turn to, a rededication to the deepest convictions for this land of our founding fathers."

Inspector George H. Ashley, RCMP Liaison Representative, advised on 6/17/58 that he has been requested by his headquarters to determine if it would be possible to purchase, through the Bureau at the Bureau's price, 16 copies of "Masters of Deceit" for the use of various officers attached to the directorate of security and intelligence at RCMP headquarters. Ashley explained that these books would be the personal possessions of individual officers and would be used in connection with their work. The RCMP considers this an excellent book and considers it necessary for the various officers to have it available as reference material. Inspector Ashley stated that if it is impossible for the Bureau to work out these arrangements, he will merely so advise his headquarters and the RCMP officers will then purchase these books on the market in Canada at approximately \$5.50 each.

Since Ashley is the official RCMP Liaison Representative accredited to the FBI and since these books will be used by the RCMP officers in connection with their work in security matters, it is believed that it would be possible to accede to Ashley's request. The books could be purchased either by the Liaison Section or by Legat, Ottawa.

It is recommended that we accede to the request of Ashley that the necessary arrangements will be made for him.

Box 46205, Cole Branch, Hollywood, California. The informant obtained this booklet on 6/6/58, at a meeting of the Defenders of State Sovereignty and Individual Liberties in Arlington, Va., where a limited number of copies were being distributed.

The booklet states that FAGAN has been reporting the war between the "Internationalist-Communist Conspiracy" and the American people for 10 years. He attacks the Director's book, "Masters of Deceit" as aiding this conspiracy by "whitewashing" the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People and by "glorifying" the Anti-Defamation League. FAGAN contends that these two groups are among the leaders of this "conspiracy."

WFO files contain little information regarding FAGAN except that his activities are well known to the Bureau and that on one occasion he was reprimanded by Special Agents for unauthorized use of the Director's picture.

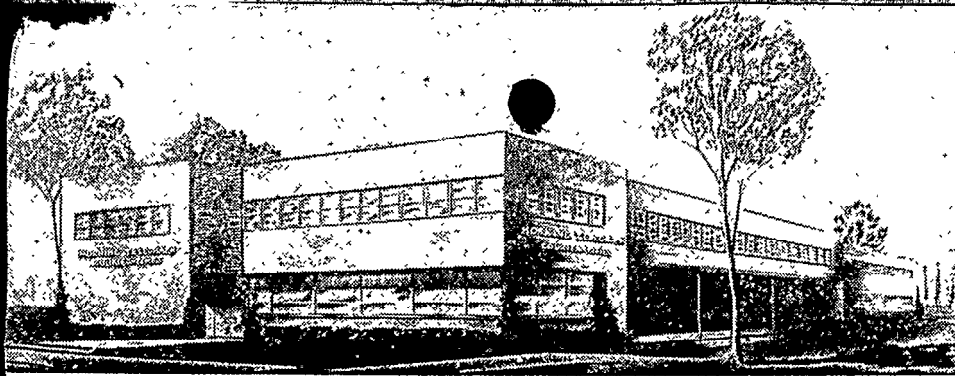

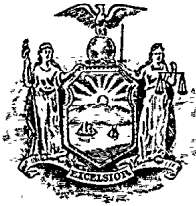

*Do I Know My Enemy?*

One of the first laws of self-preservation is to know your enemy. This truism applies not only to human but all forms of life. The measures that individuals and groups of individuals take to safeguard their lives attest to the proven soundness of this realization.

The mortal who does not know the wiles and guiles of the devil that hovers in the region of his soul is certain to fall victim to his deathly charms. The man who refuses to walk down a dimly lighted street knows that there lurks in those shadows the type of character who prefers the darkness in which to operate against the unwary pedestrian. The mailman who will not go beyond the gate of a certain residence to deliver his mail does so because he knows there is a vicious dog on that porch which will bury its teeth in his leg if he takes one step along that flowered path.

Yes, it is wisdom of the highest value to know your enemy.

The most ferocious enemy of freeman abroad in this world today is the communist. This satanic creature has swollen in size from an individual (Karl Marx) to a nation (Soviet Russia). Additional nations are now part of the red conspiracy that is feverishly grasping for world conquest. The wicked, ruthless, maniacal deeds of this mad mob are so devilish in force that normal minds find it almost impossible to comprehend their motivations.

How much do you actually know about communism? Is what you

The publisher of the book is HENRY HOLT & COMPANY, INC., 383 Madison Avenue, New York 17, N. Y. (This publishing firm has offices in Chicago and San Francisco.) The price of this priceless volume is \$5. (This is indeed a mild fee for us to pay in order to learn all that is to be known at this hour of the mortal enemy of ourselves, our Church, our nation, our world, our destiny and the destiny of our children in the world-beyond.)

Mr. Hoover has named Archbishop Richard J. Cushing of Boston as the one who inspired the writing of this revealing volume. The Archbishop has purchased one thousand copies of "MASTERS OF DECEIT" and distributed them to every parochial school and rectory in the Boston

archdiocese. This should be wrapped up evidence for us on how vital a document this publication truly is.

Would that there could be quoted word-for-word the entire contents of "MASTERS OF DECEIT." "Hatred of all gods was the credo of Karl Marx. Yet communism is in effect a secular religion with its own roster of gods, its own Messianic zeal, and its own fanatical devotees who are willing to accept any personal sacrifice that furthers the cause.

"The church, in communist eyes, is an enemy institution to be infiltrated, subverted and bent to serve Party aims," writes Mr. Hoover.

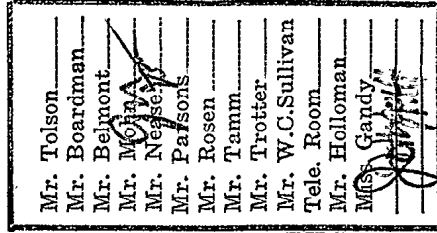
