"The concept of God is manmade and is based on ignorance."

The above statement is not new. In fact it is very, very old. Almost as old as man himself. It was a form of this disbelief in God's truth that caused the fall in the Garden of Eden. It is the fruit of this disbelief that has plagued the history of the world with war and injustice down through the ages. But never before in the history of mankind has an ~~organized~~ organized group so forcefully preached this lie as does an organization that exists today. This organization is modern communism.

The communists consistently denounce all creeds but their own. They denounce all religions, not realizing that they, themselves, are the members of a fantastic anti-God religion.

Unfortunately, the communists are not content with living in the shell of their darkness alone, but are actively and feverishly working to enslave the rest of the world in their Godless ideology. To Christian Americans, living in the sun of freedom's holy light, the attempts of the communists to sand the world into atheistic darkness seems impossibly futile. But two of communism's biggest bosses, William Z. Foster of the Communist Party, U.S.A., and Nikita Khrushchev of the Soviet Union, have both confidently stated that the United States

will be under communist domination within the next two generations. The ~~possibility~~ possibility of this occurring becomes more ~~obvious~~ ~~obvious~~ 32449 profound when one realizes that the communists now control 40 per cent of the world's population, although they have never won a free election. Sabotage and intrigue cast their ballots for them. Tight-knit and fanatically cunning, the communists need only a few well-placed sympathizers to overthrow a democratic government. The peoples of Hungary and East Germany ^{once} felt that their country ^{was} safe from communism just as we think America is, but that does not change the fact that today they are under communist rule. Let us keep this in mind always.

To better understand the communist system let us try to pick up the dark paths ~~of~~ of its beginnings. To do this we must go back to the Europe of over one hundred years ago and to a man named Karl Marx and another man named Friedrich Engels. These are the first of four men who communists reverently call their 'Big Four.' Marx was the serious, sardonic son of a prosperous lawyer; ~~Engels~~ Engels was a gay, fun-loving individual, the off-spring of a rich industrialist. These two men, apparently having nothing in common, gave birth to the system whose barbaric tactics have shocked the civilized world.

Marx, though an intellectual genius, lived in filth and slums all his days. His life as a father and breadwinner was as warped as his ideas of a utopia where there would be "no capitalists exploiting the people and where the workers would take their rightful places as the common rulers of the world." He rarely held down a job for any length of time and apparently had no desire to do so. He felt he would make himself a traitor to his own cause if he let his services be 'exploited' by the capitalists. His own mother took a dim view of the goings on and is reported to have said, "Instead of writing about

capital it would have been better if Karl had made some."

Marx's hatred of working for the capitalists put vast hardships on his wife and children. After their seventh child was born dead his wife Jenny began to long for the grave and death's offer of rest. Marx wrote that he really could not blame her. Here, in the home of squalor and disillusionment, was born communism.

Engels supplied Marx with much of the money he needed to continue his writings and study. Both were militant atheists and both held the hope of life without pressures of 'monopolized industry' and 'religious superstition.' Together they wrote the main thesis of communism which we will discuss later. The thing that we want to understand at this point is that these two men are the first of the gods of communist ideology and that from their pens poured the poison that enslaves millions today.

It has been proven that Karl Marx's personality was one that demanded complete obedience to his will from fellow human beings. When one of his followers resisted, the resistor became a hated enemy, unworthy of ~~even~~ even the saliva from Marx's clinched teeth. This resulted in the disbandment of early communist organizations under Marx. This situation made the appearance of another man on the scene inevitable if communism was to achieve its aims in unity. The wheels for communist thinking had been constructed and oiled by Marx and Engels but it took a man called Lenin to start them rolling.

Lenin was born in Russia in 1870. His father was a devout member of the Russian Orthodox Church, but at the age of sixteen Lenin denounced God and began to ~~reading~~ read the works of Marx. A brilliant student, though friendless, Lenin had all the autocratic traits of Karl Marx but added another one with it - ruthlessness. He also had patience. For almost all his life he plotted and planned the over-

throw of government, writing the ideology that communists today revere as their 'gospel.'

Russia at this time was ripe ~~area~~ for revolution. The people were hard-pressed by the autocracy of the czar and treason against the cruel monarchy government had been common for decades. But Russia was a backward, rural nation and for many years its people were unable to initiate any unified revolution. A full-fledged uprising finally appeared in 1917. This was Lenin's big chance and his communists, who called themselves Bolshoviks, seized power on the wings of the revolt of the disorganized Russian people.

A blood bath of cleaning out the capitalists or 'bourgeoisie' followed the communists rise to power. Ruthlessness was the by-word of Lenin and the extermination of his personal enemies gave him the chance to ~~experiment~~ experiment with it. Ruthlessness in carrying out the policies of state also obsessed him. He once said that the party would not progress as it should until the members became more 'ruthless.'

Western ~~observers~~ observers were struck with disbelief at the reports of Bolshevik justice. A justice that stripped man of his dignity and his very soul. A justice of terror, inhumanity, murder. A justice that could only be called injustice.

Lenin's ~~dictatorship~~ dictatorship - the dictatorship that he had dreamed of since his youth - lasted only a little more than six years. His death in January of 1924 brought the final face of communism's Big Four into view. The man who owned that face was Joseph Stalin.

Lenin had started the wheels rolling. Under his direction the communists had obtained their first hold on an entire country but it was under Stalin that the Soviet machine began its march. Systematically and irrevokably it swept over Europe and Asia, annexing country

after country and establishing communism as a distinct world power and a powerful world threat. Through mainly the efforts of Stalin, communism built an empire that now stretches from the Danube to the China Sea.

His successes gave Stalin more power than any of the other three members of communism's Big Four had been able to muster but soon after his death in 1953 he became its first fallen idol. Nikita Khrushchev denounced Stalin in one of the most damaging speeches ever written against a deceased national hero in 1956. Stalin was no longer Stalin the great emancipator and hero of the common man. Now he was Stalin the ~~man~~ vicious, revenge-minded dictator who used the glorious communist state as a tool in his struggle for supreme power.

Khrushchev's denunciation of his former political boss was just another case of communist sacrificing fellow workers on the party block; anything to advance the party or cover up errors in communist doctrine. We will learn more ~~about~~ about this 'sacrificing' later.

So these are the ~~men~~ Big Four of communism - Marx, ~~Engels~~ Engels, Lenin, Stalin. One hundred and thirty-five years spans the time of Marx's birth in 1818 to Stalin's death in 1953. It was in these years that the system of inhumanity, unrighteousness, and fanatical ruthlessness known as communism came into being. An immoral system invented and nurtured by Godless men; men who openly denied the existence of an immortal soul. The early denial of God by all four of these men led to a life dedicated to communism - communism in all its darkness and inhumanity. One can only shudder to think of the judgment God must deal to these men who willingly worked in Christless darkness all their lives and encouraged others to do ~~the~~ the same.

Just what are the main themes of communist propaganda? Why are many of its members so deeply fanatical about their cause? Why do they give up home, family, loyalty to country to follow Marxist teachings?

The reason is simply this: Communism represents a form of religion. Atheistic, yes. Immoral, yes. Materialistic, yes. But still a religion.

~~_____~~
Hungry hearts, longing for the love that only God can give, blindly look to communism to give them something to fill their hopes and dreams. In many cases ~~_____~~ they have never heard the wonderful story of Jesus and his promise of eternal life to those that love and follow Him. In other cases they have rejected Him. Whatever the reason, they are locked in the claws of damnation.

Marx teaches that the history of the world is a series of class revolutions. Violent revolution is the only answer and, according to Marx, inevitable. Each new revolution makes society a better place than before. This doctrine sites the ancient Roman slave society which was replaced by the serfdom of the middle ages. Our present system, called capitalism, was the result of the revolution from serfdom. Now is the time for the final upheaval - the communist revolution. A revolution, Marx said, that will bring to man the system of absolute good; the highest possible society. Marx teaches that communism is the social perfection that man has been dreaming about since time began.

If this is not false cultist religion, what is? A religion without ~~the~~ God and without justice for the individual. Everything must be suited ~~to~~ to communist doctrine. The human element is of no consequence, only the party. If there comes to light an error, it is not in the theories of Marx or Lenin but in man. Man is not perfect but communism is, hence any miscalculation must be blamed

on weak individuals and not party miscalculation.

Communists claim to be anti-religious but they actually have a religion all their own as witnessed by these communists writings that strangely resemble Christian expressions:

"To sacrifice one's personal interests and even one's life without the slightest hesitation and even with a feeling of happiness, for the cause of the party...is the highest manifestation of communist ethics... The true communist...must feel that the party does not owe him a thing; it is he who owes everything...to the party."

"To study the communist 'masters',...is to be made 'perfect' as they were 'perfect'" (This could very well be a horrible copy of our Lord's command to "Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven ~~is perfect~~ is perfect"--Matthew 6:48.)

"Test your work against Marxist-Lenin principle if anything goes wrong." (Again the communists copy the rules of Christian teachings for their own atheistic purposes because do we not teach that we should test our lives by Christ's principles?)

"...Anything that promotes the revolution is moral, legal, and beautiful."

To its adherents, world communism is inevitable. They are as certain that communism will rule the world as we are that Christ will return to rule it. Their minds are trapped by Satan in a snare of error and unrighteousness. The horrible thing about it is that many of communism's followers believe that they are actually doing something to lead mankind to a brighter world. Perhaps this was what Paul meant when he wrote that in the last days there would come men "Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away... Ever learning, and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth"-- I Timothy 3:5-7.

As anything without the spirit of ~~the~~ love, communism breeds solely on self-preservation. Human lives are cheap in the communist camp and reputations fall and rise swiftly. Khrushchev's speech against Stalin is a classic example of this policy. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~

~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ J. Edgar Hoover, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, in his book Masters of Deceit, has this to say:

"Communism is cannibalistic. Its servants are periodically offered as sacrifices on the communist altar. If something goes wrong, the trouble lies, in communist eyes, not in the policy decreed on high but in its human instruments. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ Whenever the 'infallible science' of Marxism-Leninism has been incorrectly applied, disciplinary action must follow."

Russian-type communism first appeared in the United States in 1919. Fanatical and crudely organized, its early attempts at penetration into American life were decidedly unsuccessful. The wild-eyed invitations to join an organization that claimed to be the advocate of violent revolution scared potential members away. The American people rejected the communist offers emphatically. But communism today is far different from its forerunner of the early twenties. Today it is clothed in attractive modern attire, full of promises of a better life for mankind and eternal ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ world peace. But it is only dressed in new clothing and its promises are empty. It is the same fanatical communist party ~~it~~ it has always been. Its ambitions to overthrow the governments of the free world remain the same. Its loyalty to Russia has never actually lessened, despite party statements to the contrary.

What, then, is the answer to communism? Will they, as they have ~~been~~ ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ predicted, overthrow the Christian democracies? What is the future of America and Russia? Of our way of life and

communism?

Wait a minute! Let us take stock of ourselves. We still live in a country that believes in God. We still hold the lighted torch of Christianity. The light of Christ still shines. Can the darkness of terror and inhumanity blow out the light of Christian love and justice? Is hate stronger than love? Is man stronger than God?

Down throught the ages men have tried to turn from or hide God's truth and love. Down through the ages men have warred against righteousness. But always, despite turmoil and battle, Christ has won out. Against all the great conquerors, against all the great dictators, against all odds. Now, once more, ~~the~~ truth and love and justice ~~and~~ and mercy are threatened.

We will ~~not~~ win. No, not we, but Christ. We will share in the victory if we keep faith. Man's indomitable spirit against communist ~~tyranny~~ tyranny has already ~~come~~ come to light in the Hungarian revolt of 1956 and the cheering crowds that greeted Vice-president Nixon recently in Poland.

The answer to communism, as is the answer to all questions concerning the affairs of men, is Jesus Christ. If we trust in Him, communism and all forms of autocracy will melt before us.

Let us then have faith. For faith in Christ Jesus will stand after all the faith in doctrines of this world are smashed into nothingness.

The Bureau is in receipt of a letter dated September 8, 1959, from the above-captioned individual. He says that he has enjoyed reading the Director's book, "Masters of Deceit" and that he has prepared a short article on communism which he would like to furnish for publication to a church publication, "Home Life Magazine." [Redacted] identifies himself as a 20-year-old student at Campbellsville College, Campbellsville, Kentucky. He indicates that he would like eventually to become a religious journalist.

Specifically [Redacted] asked for permission to use quotes in his article from "Masters of Deceit." A review of the article furnished by [Redacted] indicates that it is based in substance on the Director's book, taking its thought from the comment contained therein. It deals chiefly with a study of Marx, Engels, Lenin and Stalin and comments concerning communism as a false religion. He does quote from "Masters of Deceit," though the number of quotations is not great. It is felt that inasmuch as he does not quote extensively from the book that we can authorize him to use such quotations. [Redacted] has indicated grateful thanks to the Director for permission to use quotes from the book. He says that originally he desired to use the phrase, "based on J. 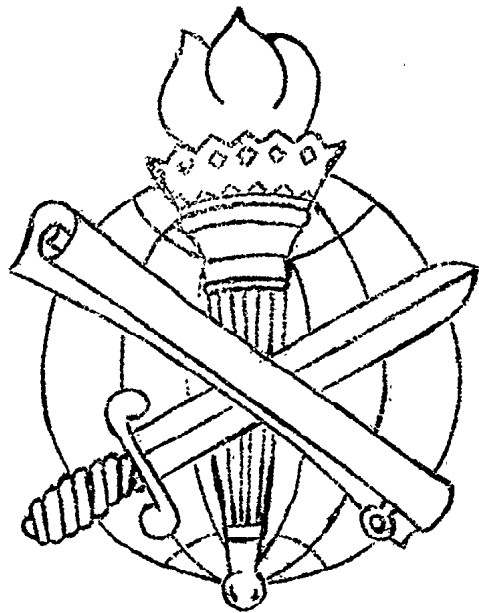

INTRODUCTION

Nuclear weapons and ideological issues have made the modern war of a few years ago as obsolete as the musket. More fire power has increased the war demands on civilian resources until nations at war has become a fact instead of a mere slogan. The depth of the modern battlefield and the intensity of modern battle have multiplied civilian involvement in military operations. The consequence is, that in the wars of tomorrow, unless they are fought on uninhabited islands, Civil Affairs will be an essential part of military operations from the beginning and not an incidental activity after hostilities have ceased.

Civil Affairs unit training is directed toward making units ready to do their jobs in the wars of tomorrow, if they should come.

As we all know the necessities of our training require us to concentrate on a series of specialized subjects. The opportunities for initiative and imagination are present but they are restricted, usefully, to the confines of the particular subjects. In this dynamic period in the history of war and specifically of our own field of Civil Affairs, less restricted opportunities should be available.

"Civil Affairs in the 352nd" is intended to be one such opportunity. One of its purposes will be to bring to our attention the thoughtful and thought provoking ideas of others who have a recognized professional standing in our field. The book reviews in this issue are one method by which we will do so. Another of its purposes will be to provide any of us with a means whereby we can put on paper "Why it ought to be done this way, instead of the way we do it now."

If we succeed, we will bring you stimulating and perhaps controversial ideas which will serve to stimulate your own constructive thinking.

It is fitting, we think, that our first review should be GENERALS AND STATESMEN. Joe Gallerman, after all, was one of us.

Josef Edmond Gellermann (New York: Vantage Press, 1959)

Veterans of the early days of the 352d (i.e. before Chovakia and its Forty... Copies was displaced by the encyclopedias of Trapline) will recall their late comrade-in-arms, Major Gellerman. Our remarkable and colorful colleague has left us an unfinished book which was fortunately sufficiently advanced to permit posthumous publication by his wife. The book endeavors to answer the question: "Can a distinguished general become a successful statesman? Or is there something in the cloistered-mind pattern of military training that sets him apart...?" Surely this theme is of interest to officers whose duties so often fall in the no-man's land between "generals" and "statesmen."

Gellerman seeks the answer to his question in impressionistic sketches of the lives of eight famous generals who turned to political careers. He shows how entrance into high politics affected the personal life of each subject and the consequences for his nation. Two of these generals-statesmen are American: Grant and MacArthur. Two are French: Pétain and De Gaulle. Three are German: Hindenburg, Ludendorff and Schleicher. The other is the great Finn, Mannerheim. What quality is common to this heterogeneous group and why does it not include such generals-statesmen as Washington, Jackson, Napoleon and Bolivar? The answer is found in the Author's design to limit his study to professional, career military men who, after a full lifetime of military service, are called, or bring themselves, into the treacherous currents of political life.

Whether by reason of the Author's intent or because of the unfortunate death which prevented his finishing the work, there is no final chapter of conclusions. The Reader is left to his own conclusions. But the implications of most of the sketches are fairly clear and the Author's viewpoint is frequently revealed by his incisive and at times irreverent comments (Gellermann the Author is eminently in character with Gellermann the Major!) The impressions of this Reviewer, arranged from the best to the worst of these generals-statesmen in descending order, were as follows:

Mannerheim was clearly the most successful statesman in the group. As a Finn who had spent his whole mature life away from home in the military service of the Russian Tsars he was an unlikely savior for a democratic Finnish Republic. Yet his political and moral, as well as his military, qualities were responsible in large measure for the survival of Finland.

De Gaulle, the successful Prophet of Free France failed to hold his preeminent position in the Fourth Republic. Events since Major Gellermann's death, of course, obviously reveal him in a more flattering light.

Pétain, as Gellermann explains with sympathetic understanding, sacrificed his person in order that France might survive.

Hindenburg, resembles Pétain. Like him, Hinderburg was satiated with honors and reluctantly came out of retirement from a sense of duty to the national good. Unfortunately, his Prussian cast of mind contributed heavily to political blunders that enabled Hitler to come to power.

Grant, was "a powerful, energetic, honest man" who "was pushed" by forces beyond his control to become a symbol of poor government, weak leadership and licentious corruption."

Mac Arthur, was a brilliant general but "the minute he touched politics or international affairs he got into trouble." His ventures into politics invariably ended in humiliating rebuffs.

Ludendorff, a talented if controversial strategist, was behind the German "psychological warfare" machinations which sent Lenin to Russia in a sealed box-car. This and other strokes of the erratic Ludendorff are described by Gellermann as "more 'psycho' than 'logical.'"

Schleicher, preserved the German Army after Versailles. But all the thanks he got after years of political maneuvering was Hitler's order to shoot him down in cold blood in 1934.

All in all it appears that the most successful generals-statesmen were those whose chief motivation was unselfish patriotism. Even these surred the consequences of their political ineptitude. Those who succumbed to personal ambition and the counsels of sycophants succeed only in tarnishing illustrious military records with the odium of political failures.

The Turn of the Tide

Arthur Bryant (New York: Doubleday, 1957)

Here is another of the many memoirs of World War II as taken from the diary of Field-Marshal Lord Alanbrooke from the years 1939-1943 and enlarged upon by the author. The diary itself was somewhat unusual in that it comprised a series of lock bound note books in which Brooke attempted each evening to enter the days events for transmittal to his wife, stressing his own viewpoints and opinions. As a result there are long passages of trivia which, to the military mind, might well have been omitted from this volume. I do not believe the present day student of World War II is interested in a vivid description of the view from the Hotel in Casablanca while world shattering plans are being discussed in the adjoining rooms.

For the American military student, we have another example of the British attempt to show their mastership of strategy, and a number of blunt statements to the effect that there was a lack of strategic knowledge among the leaders of their American Allies. Brooke says candidly that he often wondered since the war how different matters might have been if he had MacArthur instead of Marshall to deal with, "From everything I saw of him, I put him down as the greatest general of the war." And yet, MacArthur was behind Admiral King, who, apparently was always a thorn in the side of Brooke, insisting on the fight in the Pacific. Many times Brooke indicates his almost complete ignorance of the Pacific situation, which will not prompt an American to accept Montgomery's opinion that Brooke was "The greatest soldier, sailor, or airman produced by any country taking part in the last war." Montgomery must have made the statement with tongue in cheek, since Monty's most recent literary effort indicates he might apply the same statement to himself.

It appears to this reader that Brooke's greatest days are those prior to the evacuation of the British Expeditionary Forces at Dunkirk. From the day of mobilization, 3 Sept 1939 to withdrawal from France in May 1940, there is nothing but action on the part of Brooke - he seemed to be everywhere.

Early in the war, in Oct of 1939, he was aware of the magnitude of the refugee and displaced persons problem. In the area of Lille he saw the swarms of Belgians, Poles and displaced Saar miners and even Italians, with the "opportunities for spying unlimited." "The forward area is still crammed with civilians that ought to be evacuated, and no real serious efforts seem to be made to organize civilian labour to prepare defenses that are essential . . . I feel that the Germans would have been tackling the situation very differently."

Later in May 1940, a few days before the evacuation he noted the "refugee problem was getting worse and worse."

During the winter months Brooke had worked out a scheme for the evacuation of 800,000 of the population of the Lille area to northwest France, which was put into effect. But they had run into German armored forces and were congesting all roads in an effort to return home. The problem was solved by turning them over to the Prefet at Lille who took over and handled the situation.

Reference to Belgian Officers above impresses this reader with the complete lack of trust on the part of Brooke with the French high command and many Belgian officers. It appeared to him the French were more interested in good food than in discussing strategy. He doubted the ability of both allies to stand up to the German advance, and in this he was correct. About this time he sings his praises for his own compatriots - first among them Montgomery - a close alliance which continued until the end of the war, and which has been all too frequently documented to be repeated here. It is amusing to note that in a long distance telephone conversation with Monty at the height of the campaign in Africa many months later, Brooke told Monty he had not read a dispatch from Alexander because he was going grouse shooting, and could not "remain in touch with the strategic situation whilst in a grouse-butt". Thus the British mind.

While the book is full of superlatives for his compatriots, he reserves the greatest praise for Churchill, whom he had never met until 14 June 1940, and then over the telephone. Here commences the real theme of the book - the strategic planning for global victory by these two great British leaders. After becoming Chief of the Imperial General Staff in November 1941, Churchill took Brooke into his innermost confidence even relating his plan for bringing the US into the war. "Trying to ensure that under any given circumstances the US would also be brought in . . ." When the Japanese solved that problem on 7 December 1941, the loss of US Naval strength was of less importance than the fact that the US was in. The next day at a Chiefs of Staff meeting when it was suggested the cautious approach to America be continued, the Prime Minister answered, "Oh! that is the way we talked to her while we were wooing her; now that she is in the harem, we talk to her quite differently".

From the entrance of the US into the war, the book becomes controversial and at times contains information which indicates a lack of proper research as to the facts.

Brooke found President Roosevelt a charming man, wise in politics but not well versed in strategy - the same position in which he sometimes placed the Prime Minister. He respected

Harry Hopkins, who had influence even if he did not have an office. He respected Marshall - his opposite member - for his organizational ability but criticized Marshall's strategic knowledge and ability.

He admired Eisenhower for his personality and ability to handle the political situation among the Allies but "had little confidence in his ability to handle the military situations confronting him" in North Africa. Brooke takes full credit for the North African Operation (Torch) and claims for the progressive success in Sicily and Italy thus making him the master mind of the war. I am sure many will refute this assumption.

It is regrettable the respect and affection in which Brooke was held by his close American associates was not more fully reciprocated.

His was the top planning responsibility on a world wide basis with assists from Marshall and all the other Joint Chiefs of Staff. Only history will tell whether his criticisms were correct.

MASTERS OF DECEIT

By J. Edgar Hoover (Henry Holt and Co. 1958)

Here is the story of Communism in the United States and how to fight it. In this book the renowned Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation has presented a layman's guidebook for understanding, identifying, and combatting the Communist conspiracy in this country. Masters of Deceit contains a penetrating analysis of the structure and organization of the American Communist party, and a vivid description of the strategy and tactics which it used in attempting to further the goals of international communism.

With the possible exception of party members, both past and present, there is probably no one in this country in a better position to evaluate the internal threat of communism than J. Edgar Hoover. Since 1919, when he made an extensive study of communist doctrine, and identified its dangers to the American way of life, he has been in the forefront of the fight against internal communism. His many years as head of the Federal government agency designated to protect the country from internal subversion qualify him to speak with unquestionable authority on the history of the American Communist Party, and its structure, methods, composition, and activities.

Mr. Hoover opens the book with an historical and theoretical discussion of the origin of Communism, first abroad and then in this country. The start of the American Communist Party as a small disorganized band of fanatics in 1919 is described, as is its gradual growth in strength, influence, and power, and its transformation into a "dedicated, conspiratorial group operating under modern conditions as an arm of revolution." There follows a valuable section on the internal structure of the Party: How it is organized; how its leaders and members live; how the party's educational program operates; and its purposes; how the Communist man is fashioned through Communist indoctrination, literature, and the party press.

The Party's attack on the existing society through mass agitation, infiltration, and organization "fronts" is described. Here the reader is shown the tactics employed to hoodwink trustful citizens. The Party attacks our society not only through open activity, but also through underground channels. In recent years, particularly the period from 1951-1955, the underground has played an important role in Communist strategy, hiding men and records.

Masters of Deceit is documented by actual case histories, although these vignettes suffer somewhat from the lack of real names, dates and places, they clarify the subjects discussed and

maintain a continuous pattern of absorbing reading. An index, appendices, a bibliography of major Communist classics, and a glossary of over 40 terms frequently used by Communists all add to the value of the book.

Mr. Hoover makes several points worthy of mention. He forcefully states that the fight against Communism must be "waged with full regard for the historic liberties of this great nation. This is the fundamental premise of any attack against communism." (Emphasis supplied by Mr. Hoover). "Smears, character assassination and the scattering of irresponsible charges 'are said to' hinder rather than aid the fight against communism." Also Mr. Hoover takes pains to make clear that in spite of the fact that the Communists have concentrated their efforts on labor union members, as well as on Negroes, Jews, and other minorities, the overwhelming majority of persons in these groups have no sympathy for communism or its methods and goals.

Mr. Hoover's primary thesis is that internal Communism remains a grave threat to the security and well being of this country. Although the Communist Party has been experiencing severe troubles in the last 10 years including infiltration of FBI agents, the prosecution and conviction of many of its leaders, the disaffection of many others, and the decline of membership from a high of 80,000 in the "40's" to 22,000 or less, Mr. Hoover points out that numbers are not an indication of strength, and that the highly organized, tightly disciplined body is still a threat to our nation and everything for which it stands. In combatting this menace Mr. Hoover calls for assistance from all. The citizen is asked to recognize the communist's claims and techniques so that he is not fooled into becoming an innocent victim. Mr. Hoover demonstrates that information given by the ordinary citizen is often of vital assistance to him and his organization.

Although written for the general public (the author describes it "as in almost primer form") the book contains much useful material for those who have a more professional interest in the subject, and particularly for those in the civil affairs branch of the services. Mr. Hoover's vast experience in combatting the communist menace in this country, as recorded in this book, provides excellent source material for those who may someday be faced with a communist menace in another land. By relating in detail the character of the individual communist, the structure of the party, and its techniques of stirring unrest and dissension, and of arousing and controlling public feeling, Mr. Hoover has provided a fund of knowledge which could not help but be useful to a governing body in discovering and identifying Communists, and defeating their elaborate schemes and plots.

To discover a communist may not always be easy. Mr. Hoover points out that one can't tell by looking, since a communist may come from any race, creed, color or nationality, as well as from any social or class level. However, Mr. Hoover has set forth five categories of Communists and their helpers, and described them in a manner helpful to identification. Set forth are the "hard core" party member, the concealed party members, the fellow travelers, the opportunists, and the "dupes". The distinction between the paid functionary and the ordinary worker is drawn, as is that between the members assigned to a cell (now called club), and those operating at large. Of the different categories, the concealed party member may be the most dangerous, since many of the hard core members are leaders who make little attempt at concealment. Once identified, of course, the different groups should be treated differently, e.g. the dupe may need only to be informed of his errors, while to wean the hard core member away from the party is exceedingly difficult since it requires a drastic change in his beliefs, and his entire way of life.

Mr. Hoover has also related in detail the communist techniques and methods of agitation, and particularly in arousing dissension and discontent. Local tragedies and court cases are grist for their mill, and even the cook book is not overlooked in propagandizing their views and ideology. Case histories in the use of organization fronts as "Trojan horses" are given, as well as those of "opportunists" and "dupes". To advance their aims of conspiracy, revolution and rule by a minority through violence and dictatorship, communists shrewdly and brutally take advantage of everyone and everything possible. Key industries and organizations are infiltrated, fronts organized and transformed, petitions filed, mass meetings held, all without open Party participation.

The harsh and ingenious methods of raising finances, primarily through the efforts of the lower ranking members, is set forth. One early financing scheme was discovered through the apprehension of a sailor with \$50,000 worth of diamonds concealed in his trousers addressed to "Comrade Martens".

Infiltration into unions the major point of first communist attack and into civic and fraternal organizations is described in detail in the "Trojan Horse in Action". This is a portrayal of communist strategy and techniques, mass agitation, infiltration and the front, which can profitably be studied with care by any Civil Affairs officer.

Since the 1920's the Soviets have lessened their dependence upon the Party for use in espionage operations in the United States. Even here, however, the Soviets still rely on the Party members or sympathizers for assistance. In one major espionage apparatus discovered by the FBI twelve of seventeen participants had been Party members. The Rosenbergs, Ethel and Julius, who were executed as Soviet spies, both had communist backgrounds.

In short Masters of Deceit is a sound and practical layman's textbook concerning the Communist party and its activities in the United States for Civil Affairs officers it is highly recommended as an excellent source of information. Reviewed by: DANIEL F. BOONE

The Memoirs of Field-Marshal
The Viscount Montgomery of Alamein

(New York, World Publishing Company, 1958)

These excellent memoirs, tracing the path which Montgomery took in a military career of fifty years duration, illuminate the complex personality of the Field-Marshal as no other book has yet done. Here is a career of unusual scope, described with no attempt at great writing by a man who hammered his way to fame. The book is important for the light it casts upon Montgomery himself; essential to an understanding of his military philosophy, indispensable to the military historian, and valuable to the student of military leadership. As such, it deserves reading by all officers. Of particular importance here, however, are Montgomery's views concerning Civil Affairs and Military Government.

The problems which Montgomery faced at the end of World War II, as commander of the 21st Army Group, were appalling. In his words, "I had suddenly become responsible for the government and well-being of about twenty million Germans (including one and one-half million German soldiers). Tremendous problems would be required to be handled and if they were not solved before the winter began, many Germans would die of starvation, exposure, and disease." Transport and communication services had ceased to function and industry and agriculture were largely at a standstill. The population had to be fed, housed, and kept free from disease, in that order.

Since no other form of governmental organization to govern the British zone of Germany had been evolved by Montgomery's political superiors, he imposed Military Government through the Army as a temporary expedient. Corps, division, brigade and regimental headquarters were given areas of responsibility corresponding to the local civil counties, boroughs, rural districts, and so on. At the same time, he moved to establish the civil divisions of the Allied Control Council in Germany as quickly as possible, so that these divisions could begin dealing with local German governmental units themselves.

Through a series of public messages to the German population, Montgomery explained his purposes, the method of demobilization he intended to employ and the reasons for it (to gather up the arms and return agricultural workers to the harvest fields), and the policy of non-fraternization. "(We are) determined that you should learn your lesson — not only that you have been defeated, which you must know by now, but that you, your nation, were again guilty of beginning the war. * * * (E)very nation is responsible for

its rulers, * * * " Thereafter, the policy of non-fraternization was relaxed by degrees throughout the summer of 1945. 10

Montgomery found the attitude of the German population to be on the whole correct. They were willing to obey any orders issued to them, their chief fear being that they might be turned over to the Russians. Generally, they believed that there would sooner or later be another war to stop the march of Asiatic hordes, led by Russia, into Western Europe.

Difficulties with the Russians began on the very day that the Commanders-In-Chief signed the Allied declaration regarding the unconditional surrender of Germany and inaugurated the Control Council. Marshal Zhukov would not discuss establishing Control Council machinery--or even allow reconnaissance parties into Berlin until the American and British tactical units withdrew within the boundaries of their respective zones. It was finally agreed that American and British troops would withdraw to their zones in Germany at the same time that Russian troops withdrew to their zone in Austria. The British and U.S. forces were also given access to Berlin at the same time (July 1 - 4, 1945).

It became clear to Montgomery that the Russians were not going to agree to the reconstitution of Germany as one economic whole. He considered it a grave error to divide Germany into three separate zones, but, this decision having been made, he set about putting his own house in order. Montgomery succeeded in getting enough workers into the fields to bring in the harvest, coal production was raised, but only slowly, the fishing industry revived, and transportation facilities encouraged. Traditionally, Eastern Germany had produced a surplus of food to feed the Western area, while West Germany was the manufacturing heartland. Since the Russians were "creating a desert in their zone", Montgomery could expect no food supplies from that source. All of this meant short rations and cold houses during the coming winter.

Politically, Montgomery encouraged the restoration of local self-government on democratic principles. He permitted trade unionism to grow naturally, without pressure, so that unions would not fall into fascist or communist hands. Nazis were purged from office without exception and the judicial system overhauled. So far as education was concerned, it was necessary to eradicate all Nazi teaching and ideology from textbooks and screen all school faculties before schools and universities could be reopened.

By October 1945, it was clear to Montgomery that the Russians would never permit Four-Power government of Germany as a whole, and that the Western powers must prepare for a continuous struggle over a period of years. This meant that it was no longer practicable to de-industrialize the Ruhr, since that area must produce goods to exchange for food in the world market. Western Germany, the Mediterranean, and Libya mattered, and must be held--on the other hand, there was no chance of dislodging the Russians from the Balkans. Adequate

strength in the armed services had to be maintained, since the Russians understood nothing else.

Meanwhile, the transition was taking place from a completely military machine set up by the 21st Army Group to a civilian organization in which there was a German administration with British civilian control at the top. In the first phase, Corps District Commanders dealt with the local population through their own Military Government staffs. In the second phase, Regional Commissioners were trained to replace Corps District Commanders as Military Governors. In the third phase, Corps District Commanders ceased being Military Governors. In the fourth phase, personnel of Military Government detachments were gradually transferred to a civilian status and their strength much reduced.

In the third phase, put into effect about April 1946, Corps District Commanders had no responsibility for civil administration other than as troop commanders called up to act in support of the civil power or to lend it some administrative assistance.

In phase four, the real essence of the change was the shift from actual government by the military forces to self-government by the Germans with British control and supervision exercised by British civilians. Military forces were reserved for emergency use only.

Montgomery makes the important point that the time to expect trouble in an occupied country is when things seem to be improving, i. e., when the local population has sufficient food and is keeping warm. It is then that they will see that the recovery of their nation will not necessarily benefit them; because of reparations, and rapid demobilization would lead to substantial unemployment. This is fertile ground in which the seeds of discontent and trouble can be sown, and require the maintenance of adequate troop strength. Moreover, the period of National Socialism before the war was a time of full employment and a high standard of living for the German people. To prevent them from looking backward with longing to those days, during their present period of misery and want, Montgomery outlined several positive steps which had to be taken.

Montgomery pressed his political superiors to reach agreement as to what the western border of Germany was to be. "We must tell the German people what Germany is to consist of." Second, a higher level of industry for Germany had to be permitted, so that a reasonable standard of living could be attained, unemployment lessened, and the Western Zones made self-sufficient. Some sort of central administration had to be provided for the Western Zones. Fourth, an immediate increase in the food ration was essential. Fifth, the growth of democratic political organizations had to be encouraged and the process of de-nazification completed. Sixth, con-

tacts with the outside world should be encouraged so that the Germans could study a new ideology to replace that of the Nazis. Six, the whole age group, 18 - 25 years, who had been brought up in an atmosphere of National Socialism, had to be reeducated. Seventh, the younger children had to be educated correctly.

Although Montgomery did not remain on the job to see these aims carried out -- having been appointed Chief of the Imperial General Staff -- his successors did, and Monty's early conclusions turned out to be sound. These memoirs well illustrate that, in the field of Civil Affairs and Military Government, no area may be allowed to lie temporarily dormant, it is necessary to advance on all fronts at once.

German Rule In Russia 1941-1945

A Study of Occupation Policies

By Alexander Dallin. Published by The Macmillan Co., 1957

Scholarship, insight and style combine to make this 695 page book an important contribution to historical knowledge generally but more significant it is an exhaustive case history treatise for the student of Civil Affairs of "how" and "how not" to conduct civil affairs and military government operations. This tome, with its hundreds of footnotes, is a gold mine of information, but it could no more be considered light, casual reading than would be Blackstone's Commentaries on the Common Law of England.

The venture that began with Hitler's invasion of the Soviet Union in June, 1941 and ended in the final German debacle of April, 1945, is one of the dramatic stories of history, inviting obvious comparisons with the Napoleonic campaign against Russia. In magnitude, significance and consequences, it dwarfs any other episode of the Second World War. Few battles in history have a better title than the battle of Stalingrad to rank among the "decisive battles of the world". Few military defeats have been so complete and overwhelming as that which overtook Hitler's forces at the hands of the Soviet armies in the spring of 1945.

From the summer of 1941 to the summer of 1944, large parts - 400,000 square miles - of the Soviet Union were under German occupation. For the next year, several millions of former Soviet citizens were under German control as soldiers, prisoners, laborers and refugees. All told, approximately 65 million people fell under German rule during the course of the Russian Campaign.

Dallin presents, exclusively from the German side, a thorough and detailed account of the policies and actions of the German authorities, civil and military, in their dealings with occupied Soviet territory and with Soviet citizens.

In the author's own words, this is the way he set about doing it. "Part I of this book essays to describe the historical setting of the German invasion in 1941, the motivation of the German leadership, the first month of the war, and the organization of German occupation government. Part II surveys German long-range goals, with particular emphasis on the national question, and their implementation in the various areas of occupation - Ukraine, Belorussia, Baltic States, Caucasus, Crimea and Great Russia proper - each reflecting a different set of German premises, practices and personalities, and provoking bitter disputes among them. Part III seeks to analyze the German approach to certain major functional

areas, such as agriculture and industry, prisoners of war and forced labour, culture, education and religion. Finally, Part IV discusses German political policy, propaganda, and utilization of defectors, and concludes with a sketch of the 'political warfare' experiments in the last year of the war."

Dallin, of necessity, delimited his territory rather strictly. He has excluded altogether military operations and diplomacy. He has made no attempt to paint a picture of conditions in the occupied regions of the Soviet Union.

The fabric he weaves is in many - indeed in most - respects a horrifying story. Cruelty and brutality have been common enough in all ages, especially in war. But it may be doubted whether they have been so unrestrainedly indulged in modern times or on so vast a scale. It is certain that they have never been practiced in so whole-hearted and unashamed a way by a people possessing all the veneer of an educated civilization. For this reason it is unnecessary to draw up an indictment of German policy on German actions in the Soviet Union. It is only necessary to quote the official directives, and to add that there is ample evidence that they were faithfully carried out so long as it remained physically possible to do so. This Dallin ably does. There is scarcely a sign of dissent from, or protest against, any measure prescribed or recommended, except - and that rarely enough - on grounds of impracticability or of incompatibility with some other directive.

When the Wehrmacht smashed into Russia, Hitler had plans for military victory and for gathering victories economic fruits, but none for enlisting the help of the Russian people against the Stalinist system he was pledged to destroy.

The treatment of human beings from regions beyond the eastern frontiers of the Reich was notable from the first, in Dallin's words, for "the carefree way in which all human and political implications were ignored." Hitler's original desire to exclude these Untermenschen from German soil broke down owing to the need for "subhuman" labor. From the moment of the first victorious campaign in the summer of 1941, prisoners of war were carried off and put to work in Germany to sustain the war efforts. From the beginning of 1942, the recruitment of the civilian population in occupied territories, at first voluntarily, later under the most savage procedures of compulsion, went on and car loads of men and women from White Russia and the Ukraine were dispatched to Germany totaling in the end 2,800,000 people.

Towards these millions transported to Germany and those left behind in German control the policy was clearly defined: "It is a matter of total indifference to me (said Himmler) how the Russians, how the Czechs, fare . . . Whether the other peoples live in plenty or whether they croak from hunger, interests me

only to the extent that we need them as slaves for our culture; otherwise it does not interest us." Hitler forbade any curbs of medical care, sanitation or public health for the subject populations: "No vaccination for the Russians and no soap to get the dirt off them. But let them have all the vodka and tobacco they want (designed to counteract the alarmingly high birth-rate)."

An "Ostministerium" under Rosenberg was created for civil administration of the occupied territories, and a swarm of second-rate administrators, nicknamed "golden pheasants," moved in to positions of authority and luxury to exploit the resources and the "natives" of what was sometimes referred to as "Germany's India".

Rosenberg was plunged immediately into the chaos of personal and jurisdictional conflicts that characterized the "authoritarian anarchy" of National Socialism. The result - "Ostpolitik" was seldom made in the Ostministerium.

Economic policy in the occupied territory was formulated in two basic directions, known disrespectively as "Brown Camel" and "Green Jackass"; it amounted to mere colonial exploitation and was unsuccessful.

Expediency compelled slow and grudging changes of policy but almost in every aspect of "Ostpolitik" there was too little understanding and what understanding there was invariably came too late.

The German occupation of Russia was an economic failure, ultimately a military failure but above all a political failure.

Although Dąllin elaborately documents his conclusion that German occupation of Russia was a failure in every sense because it consisted of a narrowly self-centered despoiling of Eastern manpower and resource and the absence of any constructive or benevolent steps which he attributes to the basic deficiency of National Socialism itself, to date the West's military and political leaders have given little indications of great interest or clarity or enlightenment on subjects like "political warfare" and "occupation".

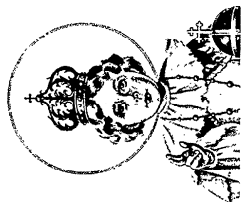

Dear Mr. Hoover:

May I express my regard and admiration for the Bureau in its work against Communism in our Country. I follow your articles in the magazine of the American Legion, and in newspapers, and praise the F.B.I. to my children. They will read "Masters of Deceit" when they are old enough.

My children and I saw "The Mysterians" and the other movie "The Lost Missile" (on separate occasions) at the local movie house during the last month. We have seen a good number of "space" movies over the last two years, but none of them have been just like these two. I have been so deeply disturbed that I must give voice to my concern.

"The Mysterians" was, for weeks, given quarter-page ads and radio publicity while it played in New York City. The children looked forward with delight to the day they'd see it. Movies of this type appeal to a large segment of the adult population, as well as to the younger generation. Thousands may have seen it.

Many parents do not accompany their children to the movies, and are therefore, if they are concerned at all, not aware that these "children's movies" contain propaganda topics (indoctrination, almost) that are the antithesis of the intent of the pro-American heritage. Communist countries (even "outlaws") are presented as accepted.

Beyond the pro-Communist propaganda, it pains me to realize that my children, and everyone else who saw these movies, saw our latest defenses presented in a light that left question (actually doubt, for they all failed) as to the effective hitting power of these defenses. Almost everything we could do, defensively, was just a farce. We attended these movies innocent of the fact that each was not simply a "Space Story." Surely they are much more than simply Space Stories?

What protection is there for parents who care? Is there a publication that lists propaganda movies, to which citizens could subscribe in order to protect themselves and their youngsters from repetitious, insidious, anti-American brain-washing propaganda?

Notes

Story laid in Japan. Plot has to do with invaders (on Japanese soil) from interplanetary space. Invading force has just built such an impregnable fortification, Japanese officials call for help from rest of the world. Mid-picture scene shows large black limousine arriving in front of impressive building. Many cheering citizens crowd near. American flag is displayed at front right fender. American Army officer leaves auto (face hidden as he faces toward rear of car), salutes, and quickly enters building. Another limousine draws to building. British flag at front fender. British officer in full dress salutes toward rear, and hurries into building. Next limousine has Soviet flag at right fender. Russian officer in blue and white uniform salutes to rear, and enters building. Last limousine arrives. Flag at fender is half furled; it closely resembles Russian flag, and appears to have stars in left corner. Officer is of slight stature. He leaves auto, salutes toward rear, enters the building.

Another scene shows room laid out as small-scale U. N. General Assembly meeting room. Camera ranges across faces of many people there who, obviously, are from many parts of the world. All are in civilian dress. Viewers can read signs on desks of inner-most circle: "United States," "United Kingdom," "U.S.S.R." U. N. flag prominently displayed behind speaker's stand.

In general, from this point on, as players seek solution to problem of getting rid of invaders, the theme is complete international cooperation and pooling of intelligence, efforts, men and equipment to conquer a common enemy, all under the guidance of United Nations.

Final scenes (accompanied here by loud cheering of small fry audience at movie house), show several different interior shots of "new type aircraft" attacking Mysterians' building and aircraft. Here are seen Japanese military men sitting in their aircraft with civilians of "international appearance" while these aircraft engage in the attack. Signs on sides of these aircraft: "WORLD AIR FORCE."

Questions about "The Mysterians."

Propaganda effect on children and adults of America (and of any other country where this picture might be shown) who see and hear:

1) American, British and Soviet military men being equally cheered by admiring crowds (from what nation was the fourth military person?), as an obvious demonstration of United States - Communist Russian "Togetherness."

2) U. N. taking over, controlling and solving a world problem after (the implication is that) individual nations are helpless to meet and cope with an emergency situation. This idea could be extended (in minds of viewing public) into thoughts of lack of confidence in the most advanced of American defenses, and the need and desirability, therefore, of leaning upon and counting upon international protection.

Recalling the tragic Korean "police action," and the terrible cost to

the United States in: killed and wounded and missing persons; materiel; loss of prestige; and expensive contributions of all types to the rest of the U.N. members to conduct this action, I have no starry-eyed admiration for any type of "One World - United Nations" activity. I don't want my children to see movies that advocat~~e~~ this.

3) The only other flag that resembles the Soviet flag is the Chinese flag. Was the Chinese flag on the fender the Red Chinese flag? I could not see the blue bloc on this flag. It was only half unfurled. Surely the Nationalist Chinese have never participated in such a "high level" military discussion as would involve the United States, Great Britain (over, say, France or Germany.) Then, if this actually was the Communist Chinese Military Representative, why is he shown on equal footing with the U. S., Britain and Russia?

4) American machine guns, flame throwers, Long Toms (cannons), Bulldog and M45 (tanks), and F-86, using its armament, were shown as useless against the space-earth unit. U.N. know-how, however, combined in a ONE-WORLD ACTION, produced the machine that destroyed the space-earth building.

5) "WORLD AIR FORCE" signs on sides of victorious air craft (being wildly cheered as "winners" by movie audience children) is a brain-washing technique toward the idea of "One World" and the attendant subordination of the idea of the sovereignty and strength of the United States of America.

~~"The Lost Missile"~~ released through United Artists.

The story is laid in America. Plot has to do with an unidentified, "lost" missile which is endlessly orbiting the world. It is held by earth's gravity so that it is five miles above the surface of the earth. It's intensely hot exhaust gases render desolate all nature and man-made structures, apparently as completely as an atomic blast could destroy. Time is supremely important before American cities are laid waste by the speedy missile. American scientists and military men are called together to try to identify missile (from a radar photograph), but it is not recognizable as belonging to any country.

Next, it is necessary to check with foreign governments as to whether any have knowledge of a "lost missile" of their own. Flow of faces of many foreign military men wordlessly wagging heads in negative reply.

Scene is now the office of American Secretary of State, who talks to aide. Subject: checking off countries contacted before reporting results to the President of the United States. Words to effect: We have checked with London and Peiping, and missile is not theirs ("London" and "Peiping" specifically and clearly mentioned.) Secretary of State then gives instruction that our Ambassador to Moscow quickly contact Russian officials for answer. Telephone rings. Aide first answers it, and gives instrument to S. of S. The Secretary speaks with great respect, then hangs up. Says to Aide, with relieved tone tinged with awe: "That was the Premier of the Soviet Union assuring us the missile is not theirs."

Next sequences bring about destruction of lost missile by a last chance American atomic missile (after last-minute delay by teen-age delinquents) in head-on collision.

- 1) American Secretary of State casually refer to having directly contacted Peiping (seat of government of Communist China.) This is patent pro-Red China propoganda.
- 2) Reference to a direct good-will telephone call from Soviet Premier to U. S. Secretary of State (what is protocol on this?) again demonstrates idea of United States - Communist Russian "togetherness."
- 3) Scenes show viewers failure of: U.S.D.E.W. (Distant Early Warning) setup, with their scrambled defense-attack planes using all their armament: F-89, F-86, F-100, F-102, and B-52, B-36, B-47 ... all useless against "lost missile."
- 4) Movie also depicts self-centered ugliness (murder and near-rape by teen-age delinquents who almost prevent delivery of hydrogen activator to American atomic missile ... national emergency, patriotism meant nothing to them.

Hoover's Communism Description Is Timely

Now that the "Butcher of Budapest" has come and gone, perhaps it would be good to soberly consider what Communism is and what the Communists would do to us.

The following are direct quotations from J. Edgar Hoover's recent book "Master of Deceit." He should know whereof speaks.

"Communism is more than an economic, political, social or philosophical doctrine. It is a way of life; a false, materialistic 'religion.' It would strip man of his belief in God, his heritage of freedom, his faith in love, justice and mercy. Under Communism, all would become, as we already have, 20th century slaves."

"Under Communism a tiny minority of perhaps 10 to 20 men would rule the United States. The capital city, as one Communist leader pointed out, would be moved from Washington, D. C., to a large industrial center, probably Chicago. National, state and local governments would

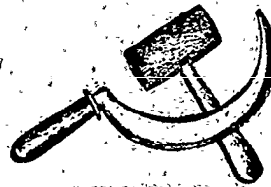
be eliminated. Councils would be formed throughout the nation. These would consist of local Communist Party henchmen who would depose and probably liquidate your mayor, chief of police, clergymen and leading citizens.

"The Constitution and all your laws would be abolished. If you owned productive property, you would be arrested as an exploiter, hauled before a revolutionary court and sentenced to a concentration camp—that is, if you convinced the judges you were worth saving at all. All property used in production would be confiscated, thus leading ultimately to total communism, meaning state ownership. This confiscation would include your home, business, bank deposits and related personal possessions. These would 'belong to everybody.' You have no 'right' to own them under the Communist scheme."

"Movies, radio, television and newspapers would be taken over by the government as agencies for government propaganda. Churches would probably not be closed immediately, but they would be heavily taxed, their property seized by the state and religious schools liquidated. Clergymen would be required to accept the party line. 'God does not exist; why worship Him,' say the Communists. Children would be placed in nurseries and special indoctrination schools. Women, boast the Communists, would be relieved of housework. How? Huge factory and apartment house kitchens would be set up, so that women would be 'free' to work in factories and mines along with the men.

"Communists want to control everything: where you live, where you work, what you are paid, what you think, what streetcar you ride or whether you walk, how your children are educated, what you may not read and must read and write. This is the ultimate and tragic aim of Communism."

In response to your inquiry, the communists use the term cooperatives most frequently in connection with agricultural production. They regard agricultural cooperatives as transitional steps in transforming agricultural production from small-scale individual farming to large collective farms. In these collective farms, which are to be established by force, if necessary, private ownership is, for all practical purposes, completely abolished. This concept is, of course, completely opposed to our understanding of cooperatives as groups which are voluntarily organized for the wholesale or retail distribution of certain products and whose profits are divided among their members.

As I have understood from what I have been able to read about the subject, Communist 'Cooperatives' are not cooperatives as we understand them in the United States- Just as Communist 'Trade Unions' or Communist 'Democracy' are entirely different from the American ideas about these terms.

I think your book should be required reading for any thinking citizen. I know in a vague way that Communism is antagonistic to the American way of life. I have read several books and articles about the subject by persons who have had direct contact with Communism, but I could never make myself come to a real understanding of how immediate the danger is. It seems almost fantastic to think that such things could be taking place here and now. Until I began reading your book, Communism, to me, was rather like the Spanish-Inquisition of the sixteenth century. Something far away in time and place. Instead, it is here-just outside the door, and in some cases already inside the room. Thank you for your book. Keep us informed. I suppose it must be discouraging sometimes to keep crying out-Danger-when it seems so few listen. Or perhaps more people are listening-and thinking-and acting-than I know of.

As I have understood from what I have been able to read about the subject, Communist 'Cooperatives' are not cooperatives as we understand them in the United States - Just as Communist 'Trade Unions' or Communist 'Democracy' are entirely different from the American ideas about these terms.

I think your book should be required reading for any thinking citizen.

The following article appeared in the 10/7/59, issue of "The Christian Century" and is being furnished for the information of the Bureau.

"The Century" is noted as "An Undenominational Weekly" on its cover and is published weekly by the Christian Century Foundation, 407 S. Dearborn St., Chicago 5, Ill.

Page 1145 contained an article entitled "Is the NAACP Communist? North and south, some sober-minded people still believe that the Negro organization is 'subversive.' Here are the facts for them." This article was written by ALFRED BAKER LEWIS. Pages 1146 and 1147 of this article reflect the following:

" J. EDGAR HOOVER, the head of the FBI, certainly knows more about the communists than they know about themselves, for FBI agents act as members of the Communist party and report to him. He would certainly know if the N.A.A.C.P. is communist-dominated. In his recent book on the Communist party, "Masters of Deceit" he has a chapter on communists and the minorities in which he tells how the N.A.A.C.P. effectively countered the attempts of communists to infiltrate it. Mr. HOOVER writes:

"The Communist Party has made vigorous efforts to try to infiltrate the NAACP. This organization in 1950 authorized its Board of Directors to revoke the Charter of any chapter found to be Communist controlled ... The NAACP's national leadership has vigorously denounced Communist attempts at infiltration. In 1956 when the NAACP and other organizations sponsored a National Conference on Civil Rights in Washington, the Party attempted to 'move in,' and started promoting the Conference. The NAACP countered by screening the delegates.

"Similarly in 1957 in the Prayer Pilgrimage in Washington the Party again attempted to move in and tried to exploit the Pilgrimage as a rallying point for unity. NAACP leaders publicly told the Communists they were not welcome and steps were taken to keep them off the platform.

"Here is a further quotation from Mr. HOOVER's book:

"One of the most effective anti-Communist measures I have heard of is the following: The NAACP had a meeting in Norfolk, Virginia, presided over by a clergyman. The minister opened the meeting with the simple statement that if any members of the Communist Party were present they would be excused. Silence ensued with no persons leaving. Then the chairman, starting with the front row, asked each individual if he was a Communist. All entered denials until he got to the back of the room where the state organizer of the Communist Party was sitting with a white woman. When asked the question, he stated he did not think it was a proper question to ask. The minister calmly replied, 'you are excused,' and the couple left.

"On page 252 Mr. HOOVER gives an example of the conflict between the International Labor Defense (which was communist-cominated) and the N.A.A.C.P. He says: '... according to WHITE, the Communists charged the NAACP with 'being in league with the lyncher-bosses of the South.' 'WHITE' was WALTER WHITE, then executive secretary of the N.A.A.C.P."

'Since Khrushchev Visit ...'

Democrats Losing Confidence Of Voters in Handling Issues

**Gap Between Parties Narrows
As Concern With Problems of
Keeping Peace Mounts in Poll**

By GEORGE GALLUP

PRINCETON, N. J., Oct. 15—With Nikita Khrushchev's visit putting the problem of keeping the peace uppermost in American minds, GOP hopes of profiting from recent "cold war" diplomacy are looking up.

Although the Democrats still hold a slim edge over the Republicans in terms of the public's confidence in their ability to handle the nation's top problems, they have lost ground markedly in re-

cent months.

Last spring, a 15-point margin separated the two parties on this Gallup Poll party confidence barometer. Today, only a 2-point gap remains.

This approach, which measures the national political implications of the problems that voters themselves feel are the most pressing, has proved to be a reliable indicator of the political climate.

After first being asked what they felt was the most important problem facing the country, all voters citing a problem were asked this question by Gallup Poll reporters:



"Which political party do you think can do a better job of handling the problem you have just mentioned—the Republican party or the Democratic party?"

Since May, there has been a sharp drop in the vote for the Democrats which has been nearly balanced by a rise in the number of voters who see little difference between the two parties. The net effect is a much closer division between the two parties than was true in May, as the following shows:

As was the case last spring—and, in fact, has been the case with few exceptions since the early days of the "cold war"—the problem of keeping international peace is the one uppermost in the minds of voters today.

But as the following comparison shows, concern with finding a road to peace increased noticeably during a period in which President Eisenhower embarked on a course of personal diplomacy and invited the Soviet leader to the U. S.:

At the time of the 1956 presidential election, the Republican party had a comfortable lead on the Party Confidence barometer. Among those who saw a difference between the two parties, the vote—just before the Eisenhower-Nixon landslide—was 55 per cent for the GOP, 45 per cent for the Democrats.

In the 1952 election, with the Korean stalemate and the threat of war as the top issue in voters' minds, the Republicans had a 57 to 43 per cent advantage over the Democrats on this question.

Just previous to the 1958 Democratic Congressional landslide, by way of contrast, the Democrats led the Republicans on the Party Confidence barometer by a wide margin.

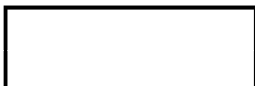

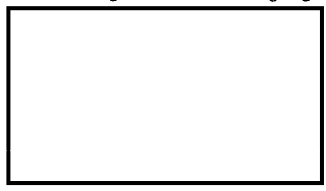

Only God-Forces Can Halt The Anti-God Communists

Editor, The Telegraph: We can learn from the Bible how to deal with Red Communism.

During the first 2000 years, approximately, of Man's history, as told in chapters one through 11 of Genesis, the great RED dragon [that old serpent called the Devil and Satan, Rev. 12:3, 9] seemed to be minding his own business. He caused the downfall of

our first parents in the Garden of Eden; the wickedness preceding the Flood; and the paganism with resulting confusion of tongues at Babel, later Babylon.

Throughout the next 2000 years or so—from Abraham to the birth of Jesus—he operated largely through the Edomites and kindred peoples. These, according to chapters 25 and 36 of Genesis, were descendants of Essau, surnamed Edom: And Edom means RED. They troubled Israel from the Iron Curtain incident of Num. 20:14-21 through Old Testament history—anti-God forces against God-Forces.

Babylon, as of Rey. 17—"... a woman arrayed in purple and scarlet color" sitting upon a scarlet colored beast—joined the Edomites on a widening scale in persecuting the Chosen People until 586 B. C. when they conquered Jerusalem and carried away most of the Hebrews captive.

Between the Testaments Rome overcame Palestine and drew it into her World Empire. RED was the color of Imperial Rome, an anti-God force.

During the almost 2000 years of the Christian Era, Satan has worked without ceasing through RED individuals, groups and nations to bring about the downfall of God's Kingdom on earth. Of course, God and His Forces always win in the long run.

But oh, that long run! We are living through one now, troubled by REDS as were all God's People before us.

Today America is the leading Christian Nation of the world. Worthily or not, we stand for the Ten Commandments and the Golden Rule. Our ideologies are in a death-struggle with the ideologies of atheist Communist nations.

The Bible tells us plainly that we can overcome the anti-God forces of our time—Red Communists—only by becoming God-Forces through the Red Blood of Redemption.

For Our Nation To Survive, We Must Learn The Bible

Editor, The Telegraph: Learn the Bible entire we must—as a nation—if we are to survive as a nation. Our very lifelines run far back into its sacred pages.

In the news we read about the Isaac-Ishmael feud. Isaac was heir to the promises God made to his father Abraham. Ishmael was banished with his mother, a bondwoman. The legal son Isaac continued the Hebrew Nation; Ishmaelites became the Arabians of today: And the feud goes on—as in Genesis.

Less well-known but quite as important and far more widespread in its ramifications is the Jacob-Esau feud, persistent through the ages.

We may read in Genesis 25 how these twins struggled together before birth that wise Rebekah "enquired of the Lord."

God told Isaac's wife that she would be the mother of two nations—two manner of peoples; that one people would be stronger than the other; and that the younger would rule the elder.

That young couple of about 1900 B. C. must have known what an explosive situation those circumstances would create in their family

life; but only God could foresee that the fires would be still smoldering—on an international scale—in the year 1957 A. D.

For the elder twin who sold his birthright to his brother Jacob was named Esau, surnamed Edom: And Edom means RED.

That feud goes on also—as in the Bible—although the Edomites, Israel's enemies were last heard of as the four infamous Herods of the Gospels, a line of Idumean kings who held office in Palestine under Roman authority. Idumea, the last remnant of Edom, disappeared from history after Jerusalem was destroyed in 70 A. D.

But by that time the color RED seems to have become a symbol for the enemies of God's People—both Babylon and the Roman Empire can be identified in the Bible by that color—and the symbol has held through the centuries until today.

So we go back to God's Word for our lifelines, our hopes for survival over powerful anti-God forces.

First we must realize the significance of the oft-repeated words in the Old Testament: "The battle is the Lord's."

Then a glance down the long perspective of nearly 6000 years will show that

Red Used To Symbolize Opposition To God's Force

Editor, The Telegraph: In the Bible we find the color red used repeatedly as a symbolic expression for whatever opposes God and His forces.

Oriental think in symbols more than do we of the West, and to a far greater extent employ them in their writings.

Some passages in the Scriptures seem obscure because we are not familiar with the figures of speech, and scholars do not agree on the meaning of their imagery.

However, some Divine Truths are so often expressed by the same figures that we cannot fail to see their meaning. The color red for opposition to God is one of these.

The serpent of Gen. 3:1—unmistakably the red dragon of Rev. 12:3, 9—must head the list... Sin is often referred to as red: "Though your sins may be scarlet, they shall be as white as snow." Is. 1:18... War, we find in Rev. 6:4, is depicted as a red horse whose rider was given power to take peace from the earth. Nahum in Chapter 2 describes the conquest of Nineveh by the Babylonians and Medes in terms of that color: "The shield of his mighty men is made red, the valiant men are in scarlet."

Yet by no means are all Biblical references to this color of adverse import. In all its different shades of scarlet, crimson—and even purple in ancient times—the color red was used in dress and interior decoration. The decor of both the Tabernacle and the Temple included these shades.

Signally, at the most important Event which ever occurred in all history, the Son of God glorified that color on the cross when his blood was shed for our salvation.

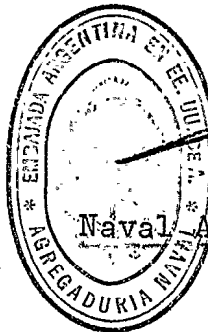

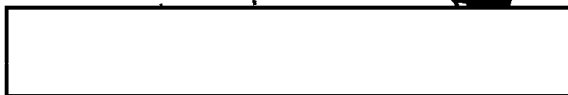

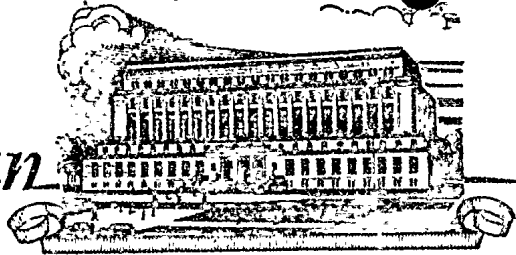

My dear Mr Hoover:

Having just finished rereading your valuable "Masters of Deceit" find there are still one or two points that seem to me to need clarification.

First, Section 8 of Part 3 (Why Do people Become Communists?) seems to me rather inadequate in spite of the fact that it is very comprehensive. Let me put it this way (I may fumble a little, but I desire to be very clear). As a general rule a person acts only according to his own advantage, fancied or actual. What George Washington said about nations being trusted only when their advantage was in plain sight applies equally to individuals. In my own book communists can be divided into two classes, Damned Crooks and Damned Fools, the first numbering all officials of the party and the second everyone else. Now this second class is astonishingly large and, to my mind, astonishingly impersonal. Take out classic "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness": with the communist, his life is held precariously; he has no liberty and his pursuit of happiness is highly dubious. There must be something more; and while I cannot put this "something more" in exact terms I can roughly define it by saying that it partakes of a pseudo religious nature. In fact, it is rather like the Crusades, those mass movements which were engendered by jackasses and carried out by a mixture of hysterics and thugs for a very dubious end. It doesn't seem to me that anything as hair-brained as communism could attract the followers it has in any other way or on any other terms. (The repudiation by communism of religion seems to indicate that they too realize the truth of this). Communism is the universal substitute not only for common sense but for the hardly acquired knowledge of the ages.

Further, I wonder if we are not making a mistake in thinking we are fighting communism at all. If the Russians want to paint themselves red and walk about on their hands what do I care?, just so long as they confine their vargaries to their own country! It really doesn't matter to me what goes on in Russia just so long as they don't try to import it; and, moreover, import it by forcible means. What we are actually fighting is the same old imperialism that has raised unlimited hell with civilization since the dawn of recorded history. Speaking for myself, I am vigorously against all imperialism, against all proselytzing of any kind, even of democracy - I have ~~always been against~~ foreign missions - because it seems to me that it always, in the long run, leads to trouble. If a people or a person needs something you have, give it to them by all means, if you can spare it!, but never, never force it on them, even though you feel it may be for their own good. In the present instance we are fighting something that we feel is bad - so much the stronger may it make us! - but good or bad, the fight is there just the same. Communism is probably only a splash in the pan; at most it is a bad excuse for the imperialism that has been our curse for centuries. Now we must fight both.

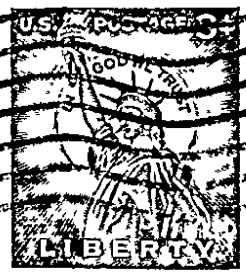

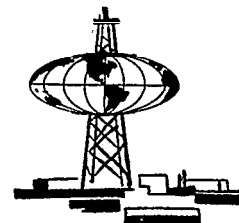

On 12-5-57 [redacted] Crawfordville and West Memphis, Arkansas, when contacted by SA [redacted] on another matter volunteered he was in the company of [redacted] [redacted] when the latter complained to Congressman E. C. Gathings at West Memphis regarding the actions of the Federal Government in connection with the Little Rock integration issue. This action resulted in Gathings sending a letter to the Director. [redacted] furnished this information in the nature of a personal apology for having been inadvertently present on that occasion (44-12284-1001).
