
Dear Mr. Cohelan:

I should like to call to your attention an incident that has been troubling me and that might conceivably involve an improper use of public funds. I want to stress that I am doing this as a private citize and do not represent in any way the library for which I work.

An FBI agent called today in the Mills College Library to inquire whether we had a copy of Mr. Hoover's "Masters of deceit". He offered to provide for us as many free copies of this book as we might need or want. When asked whether the FBI was paying for this project he answered that the offer was made by a private party which did not want to be indentified. My question as to why was an employee of a federal agency making inquiries for a "private party" was not answered. He did however affirm that he was an duty and identified himself with a bona fide badge.

There are two things on my mind. First, are we paying trained FBI people who I am sure have their hands full of other more important business to go from library to library to virtually "push" their chief's book? And what is that private party which can enlist the help of a federal agency in a project that although worthwhile, is certainly not public business? Secondly, it seems to me that there is potential danger of intimidation involved here. Any library is glad of gifts, but it must have an option to reject them. Mr. Hoover's book is a very good contribution to the field and our library had already possesed a copy. But suppose the material was less worthy: would a librarian - a person easily intimidated anyway- feel free to say "no" to someone who opens the conversation with "I am from the FBI..."?

I would very much appreciate if you could have some inquiries made into this project. It should certainly be publically explained, as many librarians are probably wondering what to think of this visit in their libraries. I want to stress that our library would be glad to give information about their book stock to anyone and welcomes gifts of material. It is the method in which this particular offer was made that makes me feel that an explanation should be made. I repeat again that I am turning to you as an individual tax-payer and also to a certain extent as a professional librarian, but not as a member of the Mills College Library staff.



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



It is stated that he is employed by the Oklahoma Natural Gas Company as an accountant where he has been employed since 1935. It is stated that he has a record of steady employment. There is no record of suit, judgement or bankruptcy. It is stated that is well regarded as to character, habits and morals. He was favorably regarded by his employer. His high credit is shown as \$363 and his manner of payment was 30 days and as agreed. There was no record of collections. A legal news item of 6-18-46 reflected a divorce action by _____ from DELMAS NC CLENDON. This was refiled on 11-6-47 and it was granted on 1-7-48.

In a report dated 9-25-58 it is stated that he has been in file since 8-31-45, that he was born 6-27-90, that he is white, married and he is employed as a Manufacturer's Representative in which employment he has been engaged since July, 1953. It was stated that he has a record of steady employment and was well regarded as to character, habits and morals. His high credit was shown as \$39 and his manner of payment was 30 days and as agreed. There was no record of collection or legal item. He was previously employed by the First Presbyterian Church, Chandler Frates, an industrial petroleum association.

The file contained a newspaper article shown as having appeared in the February 26, 1945 issue of the Tulsa Tribune which stated that HOWARD W. MEYER, Veteran, Tulsa Boy Scout worker and former executive of the Tulsa Area Council had been called to serve as an administrative pastor of the First Presbyterian Church. It was stated that MEYERS, then head of the Santa Fe, New Meixco Council would succeed Rev. who resigned effective January 1. It was said that because of work already underway in Santa Fe it might be June or July before MEYERS arrived to assume his position.

The article said MEYERS served as Scout Executive in Tulsa for nearly thirteen years before he was assigned to a similar post in Houston, Texas. He came to Tulsa in 1913 from St. Louis where he had served as Scout Master. It was said that in Tulsa he resumed his interest in boys work and undertook various assignments in the promotion of scouting before becoming executive on 1-2-22. It was said that the transfer to Houston Council was regarded as a promotion since he served three times as many as in Tulsa. He remained at Houston until nine years ago and since has served at Albuquerque and Santa Fe.

On February 23, 1962, Mrs.

Identification Division. Tulsa Police Department, Tulsa, Oklahoma, and Jail Records, Tulsa County Sheriff's Office, searched the records of their respective departments and advised SA PEARSON that they could locate no arrest record for DELMAS B. MC CLENDON or HOWARD W. MEYER.

He works very closely with Sergeant of the Tulsa Police Department and Fire Chief J. G. Sanders, Tulsa Fire Department.

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The SAC of the Oklahoma City Division met MC CLENDON while in Tulsa on other business on 1-30-62. It is the SAC's opinion that MC CLENDON is very sincere in what he is doing and is convinced of the clear cut statement of the objectives of Communism set forth in the book "Masters of Deceit" written by the Director. MC CLENDON appears to be a super-patriot and is known to be associated in these efforts with formerly an informant or source for the Bureau and with J. BRACKEN LEE, a former governor of Utah who is particularly opposed to income tax prodedures of the Federal Government.

BACKGROUND:

You will recall my memorandum to you of 2-19-62 set forth information from the "Tulsa Daily World" newspaper, Tulsa, Oklahoma, on 2-11-62 to the effect that Mr. and Mrs. Howard W. Meyer of that city had contributed a substantial number of "Masters of Deceit" to schools in that area in memory of their son who died in a Japanese prison camp in 1942. Mr. and Mrs. Meyer had joined in efforts of D. B. McClendon to provide 10,000 such copies for public schools in Tulsa. It was recommended and approved that autographed copies of "Masters of Deceit" be sent to both Mr. Howard W. Meyer and D. B. McClendon if appropriate field checks were favorable. Subsequently, by airtel of 2-20-62, SAC, Oklahoma City was advised to conduct a discreet background check on McClendon and Mr. and Mrs. Meyer.

RESULTS OF FIELD CHECK:

By airtel of 2-24-62, the Oklahoma City Office furnished the results of appropriate agency checks relating to Delmas B. McClendon, 5435 South Marion, Tulsa, Oklahoma, and Mr. Howard W. Meyer, 5035 East Fourth Street, Tulsa, Oklahoma, which were favorable to them. In 1961, 4, 331 books were donated to graduating students through his efforts. He plans to distribute 10,000 additional books this year. Howard W. Meyer has long been associated with Boy Scout activities and church groups and is well regarded in his 62-104277-2591 community.

The SAC points out McClendon is associated with Matt Cvetic, the wellknown former Bureau informant and J. Bracken Lee, the former governor of Utah whose moral character is most questionable because of his drinking and associations with prostitutes. The SAC feels McClendon is very sincere and is convinced of the clear-cut statement of the objectives of communism as set forth in the Director's book, However, because of this background, it is not felt we should send an autographed book to him as originally planned.* 111 05 MI 'F?

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

Dear Mr. Hoover:

This is the first occasion that I have written to you, and I want to take this opportunity to express my great admiration for your outstanding public service that you have rendered for a lifetime.

From my observation, I do not believe there is anyone in our Government that holds the respect and confidence of the American people as much as you do.

I am sure that if you were not hampered with legal barriers, there is much more you could have done, particularly in the field of national security.

I have read many of your publication, including your book "MASTERS OF DECELT." As a matter of fact, I have distributed many, many copies of this book among my friends and acquaintances.

The enclosed clipping from the Chicago Daily News restates part of your article that was published in the American Bar Association Journal. I am somewhat concerned about this article, particularly the implication of all the damage that can be done by anyone fighting Communism, without having some definite to offer that we as individual Americans should do, other than studying what Communism is.

The problem with an article such as this is that it encourages too many Americans who are reluctant to do anything or say anything for fear that they may be harming their Government more than they would be doing good. While I can appreciate the

wisdom of such thinking, I do not feel we can win the fight against Communism by inaction and merely hoping that the Government can cope with all these problems, especially in the light of the many inexcusable mistakes made by our Government in the past 28 years, which are responsible for the world mess we are in today.

I don't belong to societies such as the John Birch Society, or the National Indignation Society, but I find it difficult to condemn these organizations and to discredit everything they are doing. At the same time I am also concerned about some of the members in such organizations when they appear to be going overboard in their fight against Communism.

I recall well the struggle of Senator Joseph McCarthy in his courageous fight in trying to rout Communist influence from the Government and our Armed Forces. His effort was labeled McCarthyism, given the implication of a bad word, and something that was not very good for America.

I believe that our country and the world would be better off today if we had taken his advice more seriously at the time.

All Americans love their country, and I am sure that they want to keep it as it is. It would seem that as long as the feeling is mutual that there should be more common ground where we could work as a united front in helping our Government cope with the Communist threat of today.

Perhaps, you may have some suggestions along this line. do I would be happy to receive them. I would also appreciate receiving a complete copy of your article that appeared in the American Bar Association Journal.

He wrote that many non-Communists may legitimately take positions on issues that also are held by Communists.

"Their opinions, though temporarily coinciding with the party line, do not make them,

and not brand as Communists any individual whose opinion may be different from our own."

HOOVER suggested that Americans should not adopt the Communist attitude toward law and order.

"Cries for legal shortcuts, vigilante methods and less reliance on legal processes, though based on the most patriotic of motives, are most shortsighted. These would undermine our cause," Hoover said.

He praised the American Bar Assn.'s program to combat communism by education.

I have received your letter of February 25th and want to thank you for writing and for your interest in my book, "Masters of Deceit." It is always reassuring to hear from citizens who demonstrate an awareness of the -evils of communism and who desire to combat this threat to our freedoms.

With regard to the matter you discussed. I would like to point out that the Communist Party in this country has attempted to infiltrate and subvert every segment of our society. However, the Party's efforts are being thwarted by the FBI's internal security programs, by investigation, arrest and prosecution of Party functionaries, and by widespread, intelligent public opposition to the communist philosophy. These achievements are being accomplished through orderly, legal procedures.

We must, however, continue to be alert to these infiltration efforts. I wish to emphasize most strongly that communism is a grave threat to the continued existence of the United States. Because of this, it is doubly imperative that we be calm, rational, and thoroughly accurate in what we say and do in opposing communism. This is no time for rumors, unfounded suspicions, gossip and the hurling of false accusations.

In response to your other question, the FBI is strictly an investigative Y of the Federal Government and, as such, neither makes evaluations nor commendation conclusions as to the character or integrity of any organization, publication or individual. In this connection, information contained in our files must be maintained as confidential in accordance with regulations of the Department of Justice.



"Tulsa Daily World" newspaper, Tulsa, Oklahoma, on 2-11-62 carried article titled "Parents of Tulsa War Hero Assist In Distribution of Anti-Red Book." Article related that Mr. and Mrs. Howard W. Meyer of Tulsa had contributed "substantial" number of Mr. Hoover's book in memory of a son, Staff Sergeant William H. He said he was 64 years of age, 1954, which would make him 71 years old now. Director send him letter on 8-17-54 thanking him for his interest in sending in the clippings and making his observations known to the Director. Director enclosed a number of articles on communism with his letter to Mr. Meyer (94-5-43105). Delmas B. McClendon wrote Mr. Hoover in 1961 concerning his distribution of "Masters of Deceit" to 3, 403 Tulsa graduating high school seniors. His correspondence reflects deep admiration for Director and deep seated desire to fight-communism. 

BERLIN—Communist East German border police yesterday barred Berlin's American Commandant Major. General Albert Watson from driving into East Berlin on a mission to Soviet headquarters. BRIEF SUMMARY OF BOOK

As indicated, the bulk of the book is an exact copy of the William Z. Foster publication of 1932. As will be remembered, Foster, in this book, sets forth ideas relative to a Soviet America, indicating what the communists would do to various phases of our society. In fact, Part I of "Masters of Deceit" is based directly on Foster's "Toward Soviet America," setting forth what a communist take over in America would mean to our Nation.

Congressman Walter in his foreword states that the communists have tried to suppress copies of the 1932 Foster book. "For 'Toward Soviet America' disclosed exactly what those geniuses of evil plan for this country under the hammer and sickle. The plan has not changed. 'Toward Soviet America' still reveals what your fate under that symbol of slavery is intended to be."

All of the five chapters in the Foster book are preceded by comments These comments are designed to expose the communist blueprint for capture of the United States. They are designed to serve as guidelines to the noncommunist reader in interpreting the Foster book. b6 b7C



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

By letter 3/9/62, Legat, Rome has furnished a copy of the Italian version of "Masters of Deceit" which is entitled L'FBI Contro Il Comunismo and is published by Editore Sugar. Legat, Rome further advises that the 100 copies purchased by his office amounted to \$362.32, which has been paid.

You will recall that in late 1960, CUSIS began negotiations with Editore Sugar to have the Director's book published in Italian. The USIS agreed to purchase 500 copies of the Italian version, and asked that the Bureau make a commitment to purchase a number of the books. By letter 11/8/60, the Director advised. Legat, Rome that his office was authorized to purchase 100 copies at the price of \$4.00 per copy; Legat, Rome was instructed to forward the bill to the FBIRA at Bureau Headquarters for payment. We, of course, gave our permission for Editore Sugar to translate the book, as did the publisher, Holt, Rinehart and Winston, Inc. We also gave permission for them to use the title as set forth rather than the Italian translation of "Masters of Deceit."







Your letter of March 21, 1962, has been received, and I want to thank you for your kind comment regarding my book, "Masters of Deceit," and my administration of the FBI.

While I would like to be of assistance to you with regard to your inquiries, the FBI is strictly an investigative agency of the Federal Government and neither makes evaluations nor draws conclusions as to the character or integrity of any organization, publication or individual. In this connection, information contained in our files must be maintained as confidential in accordance with regulations of the Department of Justice. I regret that I cannot help you and hope you will not infer either that we do or do not have data in our files relating to the subjects you mentioned.

In response to your request, enclosed is a copy of the list of organizations which have been cited by the Department of Justice as coming within the scope of Executive Order 10450, together with some material I hope will be of aid to you. In addition, the "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," prepared by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, can be obtained from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington 25, D. C., at a cost of seventy cents a copy. For your information, this Bureau does not maintain a mailing list for the distribution of publications such as that in which you are interested.

We are confused! We have read your book, MASTERS OF DECEIT, W. Cleon Skousen's THE NAKED COMMUNIST, Cardinal Cushing's booklet "Questions and Answers on Communism," many other books, numerous government publications based on testimony before investigating committees, and attended numerous lectures, all on the subject of Communism. Now comes along a booklet entitled "Communism: to Freedom" by Fr. John F. Cronin, S.S. of the National Catholic Welfare Conference. The main objective of the booklet, according to a newspaper article, is to assure Catholics that the Communist threat is "almost exclusively external" and that "those who concentrate on the menace of internal subversion are fighting the wrong war at the wrong time." He suggested that ample credit be likewise given to Mr. Hoover. Reynolds felt quite elated at this turn of event and said he and the newspaper officials would like to start publication sometime next week of either selected excerpts or "Masters of Deceit" in its entirety. He visualized a series of some 12 to 18-articles on a daily basis. He said he will carry this on the front page. He said he would like to have a statement from Mr. Hoover, if the latter agrees, setting forth why the book was written, what it states generally, what it is designed to accomplish in America and perhaps a commendation to the paper for printing it. He will place such a statement in a box on page 1 of the Evening Courier the day before publication starts next week. He said he hoped the publication would result in increased book sales and he said he knew the people of Arizona would herald this publication as a contribution to the fight against communism.

Mr. Reynolds has the greatest respect and admiration for the Director and during his conversation with Wick stated Mr. Hoover was, in his view, the greatest man in America. Mr. Reynolds' name has been added to the Special Correspondents' List.

The Congressman and I had discussion in general about a number of other matters and he asked that I drop by his office in the near future. We have had cordial relations with Congressman Sheppard. He supported the FBI Retirement Bill. In June, 1949, the Director lunched with him in the Attorney General's office. He told the Director at that time of the desirability of new members' of Congress taking the FBI tour with their families upon arriving in Washington. A former employee of the House Appropriations Committee in 1960 made allegations against Congressman Sheppard stating he was an alcoholic and had illicit affairs with many women. The source further stated that Congressman Sheppard had obtained large sums of money from wealthy persons in California for campaign expenses at times when no campaign was being conducted. The Department indicated no action was to be taken in so far as investigation of these charges was concerned. There was no verification of the charges. 





The Reformers of four centuries ago walked a path worthy of our walk. We can walk with them in honor.


We will then walk within the Scriptures. Neither the traditions nor wisdom of men will be our guide. We will look to the Holy writers for God's Word to us and to the world.

Dear Sir,

In my opinion, there is no one more able or better positioned than yourself to really do this country a service. Your book Masters of Deceit" was one such venture, but only a small percentage of our population read books. What you say through the press carries infinately more weight. Your integrity and moral courage are unquestioned. Therefore, when you do voice an opinion it is a powerful weapon, both for and against:

Lets review a statement you recently made concerning anti-communists. This statement, has caused more consternation and in my opinion, actual harm, than I can tell you. Please read the enclosed clippings. The communists want us to stay in a state of neutrality. They don't want us defensive, rather, they want a "neutral" opponent. Look at the list of literature enclosed. These are the books and references that many study groups in our area are using. When one completes this study, he probably knows more about the communist mind and ambition than any other random group of 1000 people. He is actually an expert, in a sense.

I was a training officer in the army, prior to the Korean conflict, teaching classes on Communism and its evil. I've studied the subject extensively over the last 10 years; and, though I am not associated with any one group, I have worked at random trying to educate my community on the dangers of internal communism. Think what your statement does to my stature when reviewed by a "neutral" neighbor. I immediately become a radical, an extremist. I deny this emphatically. I deplore the actions of the vocal few, just as you. Whether you meant them to be or not, your words are being used by Anti-Anti-Communists to great advantage. General statements are just what the communists are looking for. They can be twisted. You must be specific and exclude the

hard working, quite, dedicated American from being included, by association, with a few radicals. I understood your statement, but look what the groups that want it misunderstood have done with it:


The Editor of our local paper was called on this editorial, and he says it came off the wire service from Washington, D.C. I have also talked with him personally concerning these editorials and I suggested he follow them up with a constructive editorial on what people can do to become better informed. To date he has not done this. He has also admitted he has not read "Masters of Deceit" nor any Government publications on Communism. He appears to be indifferent on the subject. This is certainly doing an injustice to many people in our community.

Articles like Father Cronin's are again confusing the American people. You write a book concerning the Communist party in this country and its aims. Father Cronin says the Red threat is external not internal. Are we to believe your book is fictional? I think any intelligent person can see that the Red threat is external and internal.

I hope that you will be able to find an answer to this kind of editorial and that you will speak out on behalf of the many citizens who are trying to become better informed.

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No Amateur's Game

From two totally different quarters, men who make a specialty of studying communism are beginning to suggest that we have too many self-styled "experts" on the subject.

One is FBI Director J. Edgar

One is FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover, whose credentials in this field hardly need emphasis.

The other is Father John F. Cronin, assistant director of the National Catholic Welfare Conference's Department of Social Action. "Communism: Threat to Freedom," his second book in the field, is drawing deserved attention.

In the American Bar Assn.

Journal, Hoover says:

"Today far too many selfstyled experts on communism are plying the highways of America, giving erroneous and distorted information.

"This causes hysteria, false alarms and misplaced apprehenzion by many of our citizens.

"We need enlightenment about communism, but this information must be factual, accurate and not tailored to echo personal idiosyncracies."

Father Cronin, in his new book, likewise cautions Americans to be wary of the self-appointed specialists, including some whose credentials look pretty satisfactory at a hasty glance.

In this category he would place some former agents of the FBI itself, some former FBI informants, and certain persons

who have had first-hand contact with Communists as either party members or victims.

Cronin argues that unless a former FBI man specialized in subversion, his agency experience does not qualify him as an expert. The value of one-time informants would be considerable, he suggests, only where they were placed close to top Red sources in years more recent than 1955. Things change fast.

As for defectors or victims, the measuring rod is much the same. The big questions are how upto-date and accurate their information is. Like Hoover, Cronin thinks much of it old and mis-

leading.

This is not the first time the FBI chief has spoken out on this matter. A year ago, in a message to law enforcement officers in the United States, he said Americans need to understand communism, but added:

"This cannot be achieved by daydling at the spring of knowledge. It can only be accomplished by dipping deeply into thoughtful, reliable and authoritative source of information."

Next time you see somebody get up and offer himself as an expert on communism, find out just how solid his background is, and how current his information.

And remember that you have some quite unassailable specialists standing, in effect, at your shoulder and advising such caution.
