Dear Sir:

I am writing to you as I am greatly concerned about this past Saturday evening's occurrence at Stayner when travelling from Lindsay to Meaford at about 8:30 P.M. Your are probably aware that I have already reported this whole matter to the O.P.P. at Owen Sound and also to the Lindsay O.P.P. as I felt people in authority should know what we encountered that night. Although we are still upset and frightened, I shall relate to you what happened.

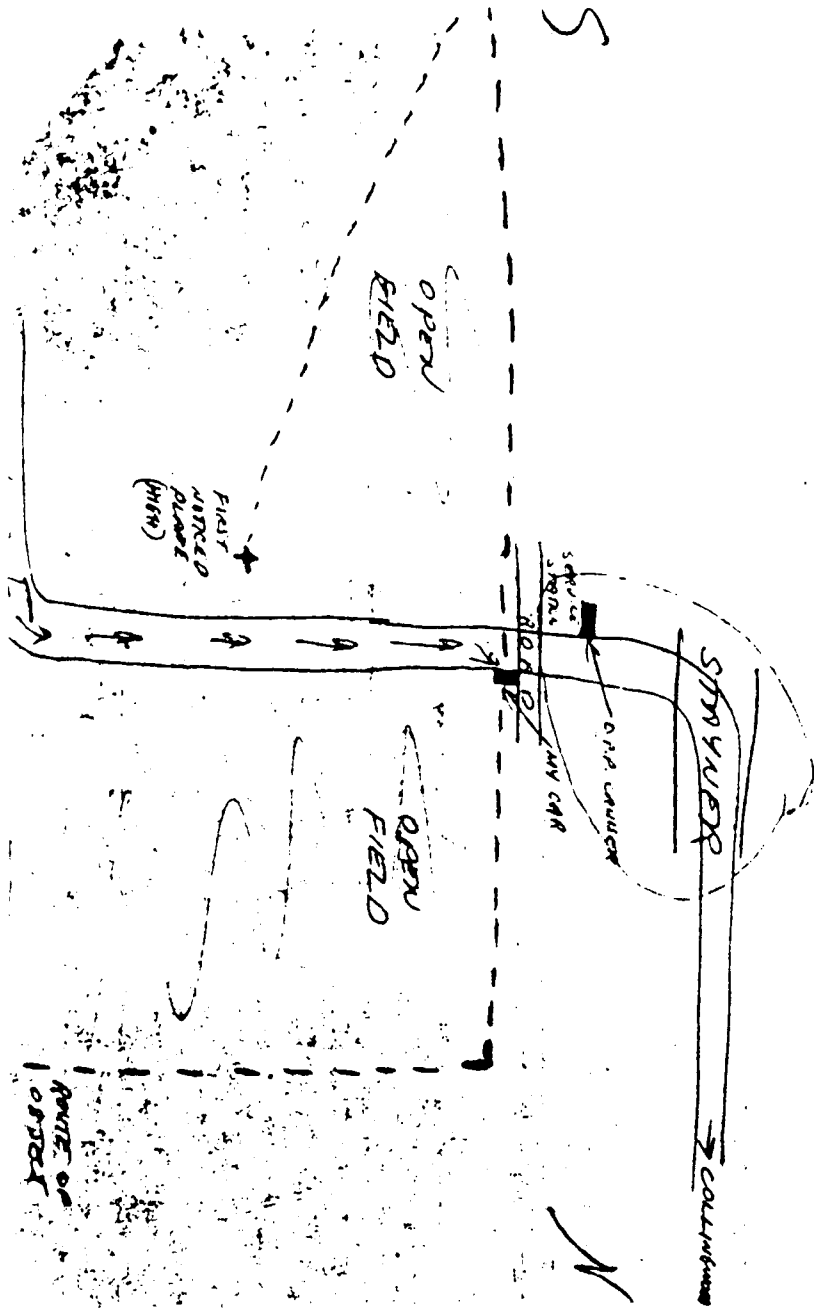
Driving from the east on Hwy.26 after proceeding around a curve approaching Stayner accompanied by my 18 year old daughter, 2 and 10 year old, 2 they observed flashing lights to the north of us on the far side of the open field and moving in the same direction we were. There were no other cars on the road at the time. The girls commented that it didn't look like any plane or helicopter but were wondering what it was. It was moving at about our speed and then it suddenly turned south on a 90° coming our way. When 2 yelled out that "it was coming towards us", I immediately pulled over to the shoulder of the road, stopped the car and opened the car door. And just as I stood up, I saw a huge circular object about 100 to 200 feet more or less just passing above us, cruising silently, slowly and there were five red glowing lights spaced evenly around the inside of the circle close to the outside edge and there were brilliant white-bluish lights flashing around the rim or edge of it. The bottom of it, I noticed, as it passed over us, was flat and the colour of steel. As it moved still in the southerly direction, there was no sound whatsoever from it or anything else at that time until our poedle began barking and growling. Although the bottom was flat, the rest of it was similiar to the shape of a large water tower. And this thing had followed us and passed over us!!!!!!!

As it moved away from us still at the same slow speed and very low, we saw a small plane flying at full speed towards it only the plane was considerably higher than that of the object. Ahead of us, we noticed that an O.P.P. cruiser was parked at a service station entrance on the other side of the highway with the front of the car parked facing the road. I understand that a 2 was on duty that night and I know that he couldn't have possibly missed seeing the same thing we did. I would sincerely like to know who the pilot of the plane was that followed the object as he would certainly confirm what we saw and I would appreciate knowing if the pilot caught up with it and where.

Something should be done about this and a full investigation made. I am writing to the Trenton Air Force base about this whole matter, and shall carry it much further to find out what it was.

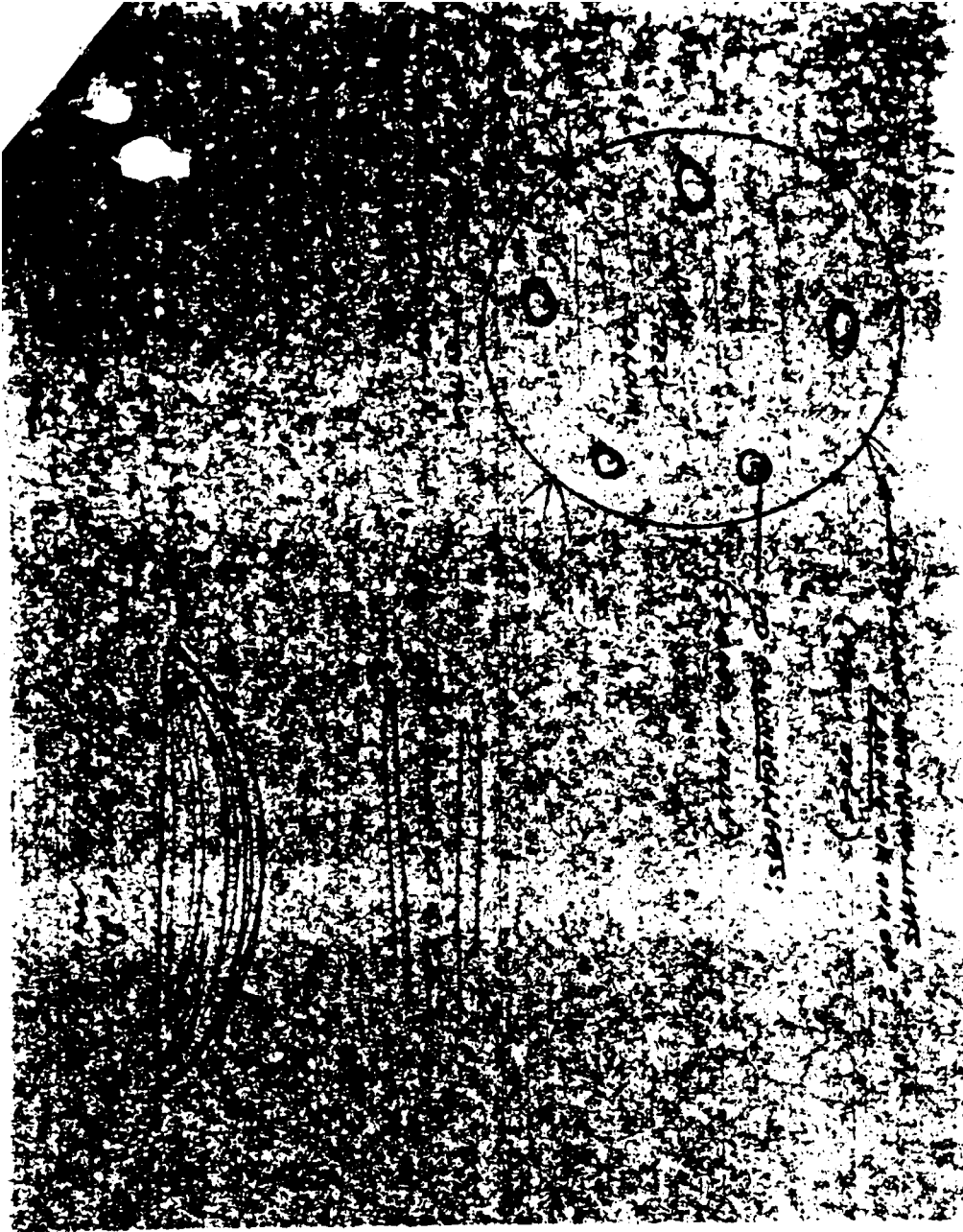

UFOs 'over Pickering'

Air traffic controllers say "no way" but there are three ambulance drivers, one policeman, and one deejay who are "damn sure" a dozen UFOs scanned Pickering's nuclear power station last night.

"For eight hours they were up there, floating around, zipping this way and that," said Andy Parks, music director of 14 CHOO radio in Ajax. "Red, green, orange, yellow, hot pink.

"Maybe a mile high. I've seen reports on the news wire for the last six years about UFOs. Never believed them. But seeing is believing."

Parks, following reports of UFO sightings last night, went with a news crew down

to Pickering power station where the objects seemed to be centring.

With him were a number of spectators including Ajax-Pickering ambulance drivers Ed Thornton, Murray Martin, and Russ Abram. Durham Regional Police Constable Bob Usher saw the commotion, drove down, and saw the "unidentified flying objects."

Abram said his 12-year-old daughter Karen phoned from home saying that she saw "something strange over the lake" from their ninth-floor apartment . . . and Dad confirmed it was "strange indeed."

But air controllers in Toronto and Oshawa said last night they had heard word of sightings but

"picked up nothing on radar."

"You never do on reports such as this," said Toronto International supervisor Don Finlay. "If you do, then that's news."

But Parks "swears" that last night Oshawa flight control tower confirmed the objects as "unidentified."

Last night, however, officials there said they "did not see any UFOs."

Parks, who has a private pilot's licence, said "no planes move like that, no planes pulsate like that.

"Pickering's power station is one of the most powerful in the world. Right?"

"Well, someone from another world is on to it now. Believe me!"

INVESTIGATION OF UFO REPORT
CFB GAGETOWN AREA 23 SEP 72

Reference: A. Letter - (2) 6 Oct 72 (copy attached).

1. The attached letter regarding investigation of a UFO report is self-explanatory and is being referred to you for action as it falls within your region.
2. (2) The notations on the UFO report itself would indicate that attempted to correlate the sighting through CFB Greenwood and also through your Command Operations. He was apparently advised, however, to contact this headquarters. From the information available there appears to be no reason why the report should not have been checked through CFB Gagetown and (2) advised of the result. You should take this action now, therefore, unless there are security or other reasons which would make such a course of action inadvisable.
3. The Canadian Forces no longer conduct field investigations into reported UFO's as this responsibility has been transferred to the National Research Council. We should, however, co-operate to the extent of establishing whether reported sightings are in fact one of our aircraft or are the result of some other military activity. A formal arrangement is not considered necessary for this purpose. If it were, it would be established on a national basis and only through a request from NRC headquarters. (2) will be advised to this effect and also advised to expect to hear from your staff regarding the particular sighting on the 23 Sep 72.

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
I am in receipt of your letter of the 6th of October and wish to advise you that I have asked the ~~Commander~~, Maritime Command to assist you in your investigation of the UFO report of the 23rd September. You may expect to hear from a member of his staff very shortly.

With regard to an arrangement to check out reports with our operations, I don't think a formal procedure should be necessary. If such were the case, it would be necessary to establish such a procedure on a national basis through NRC Headquarters. Maritime Command staff should be able to assist you on an informal basis, however, in checking out reports, such as the one of the 23rd September, where there is a possibility the sighting relates to a military activity.

Command. Perhaps you could advise if this is so, and whether these
constables did, in fact, see one of the Canadian Armed Forces'
helicopters.

I wonder if it would be possible to set up an
arrangement with your operations to check out some of these reports
that do come in from time to time. I am quite sure that many of
them need not be checked out formally through any of the armed forces
or the Department of Transport, but there are times when it is wise
to investigate and to allay suspicions, fears and to satisfy the
curiosity of the public when they inquire. I feel that if we do not
do this, it will soon be that we will get no reports of any Meteorites
themselves being seen, and this is rather important to the Committee
since we must rely on casual observers to report occurrences of
Meteorites.

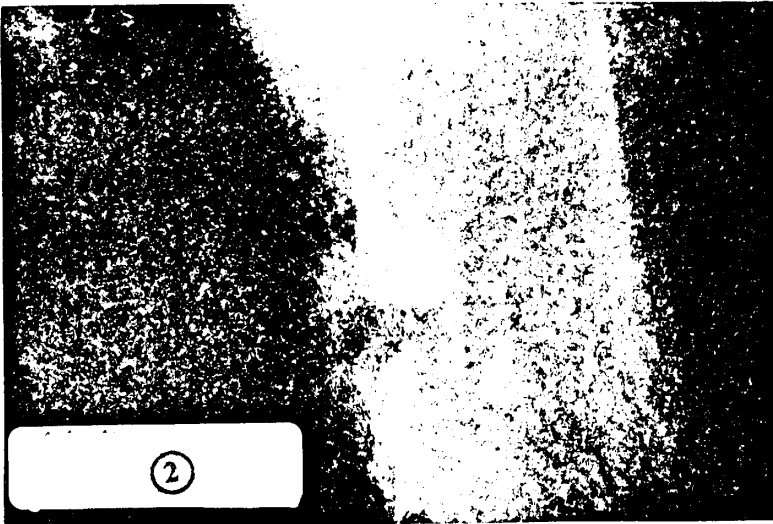

SUBJECT: Cape Breton Photographs: Summary and Opinion

1. There is very sound evidence that there has been considerable UFO activity in this area over a period of several months. As one air force general once said: "Credible people are seeing incredible things."

2. However, the value of this story, if it is to move rational investigation of the UFO subject further depends on establishing of the pictures taken at Ingenish so that there is no other possible conclusion to draw from them except that they are a UFO.

3. Opinions gathered from (2)

indicate that even if the UFO reports themselves are valid, before, during, and after the pictures were taken, there is the possibility that the pictures could have resulted from an accidental jamming of the shutter of the camera, unknown to the operator, which could have distorted a picture of the moon.

4. While this is not necessarily the case, it is a possibility that can't be ignored, and which weakens the potential of the story to the point where it would not advance the already-documented verbal material on the UFO phenomenon.

5. All the experts agree that there has been no intentional doctering of the original.

6. Reasons why the object in the picture could be a distorted picture of the moon, due to a temporary camera defect are: (a) a slight change in temperature can sometimes make a shutter jam, causing an unsought time exposure, (b) the moon rose that night at 15° south of east, close to the picture area, (c) on a 50 mm lens, the image of a full moon would be 1/50th of an inch, very close to the image on the slides, (d) test pictures I made of the moon did not produce the same effect at 1/225 or 1/60 sec. exposure, but did so when I put the shutter on bulb exposure. (Samples attached)

7. While none of this rules out the UFO sightings in the area, it does add up to enough doubt about the pictures to eliminate using them as a basis for the story.



Dear Colonel:

A line to thank you for your hospitality and your interest in this strange phenomenon that is certainly one of the most baffling stories I've run into.

Had a meeting with the Reader's Digest editors yesterday, and they definitely plan to go ahead with the story, after further expert examination of the original slides. Preliminary examination has already shown that camera defects, film anomalies, and trick photography seem highly improbable. Further, the substantiating testimony of the student, ② is so close to the pictures, ② without his being aware of what they looked like, that the evidence points to the reality of the object -- whatever the hell it is.

The original slides are being kept in a safe down here, but I want to send you duplicate slides as soon as they are returned from ②

I will then forward these to you, along with my full research report to the Reader's Digest. I would be most grateful for whatever information your own inquiry might turn up.

I did one story on UFOs for ② and vowed I'd never do another one. But these pictures are so intriguing that they drive me up the wall, and I find myself doing one more.

I shall be back in touch with you, and send the material and duplicate slides along to you as soon as possible. It would be preferable to send the originals, but the Reader's Digest doesn't want to risk mailing them. The one thing I can certify is that the duplicates will be identical to the originals.

Probably will be coming up again to Sydney after the pictures have been checked out. Will look forward to seeing you again.

In response to your letter of 2 January, 1970 a thorough review of our files revealed that this Headquarters did not receive (2) original drawing but rather a photograph produced by the photographic Section of Training Command Headquarters in Winnipeg, Manitoba. Therefore, contact was made with Squadron Leader (retired) Paul Bissky who was the Training Command Staff Officer Operations at Winnipeg when (2) originally reported his UFO. Squadron Leader Bissky stated that he personally returned the original drawing from which the photograph was produced to (2) He also said that the original was on white paper and that he returned a burnt shirt, hat, gloves and radio active soil samples at the same time. It is Squadron Leader Bissky's guess that these items were then given to the Canadian Aerial Phenomena Research Organization because someone from this organization was constantly interviewing (2) during this period.

2. It is regretted that this is all the information that this office can find but it is hoped that it will be of some assistance to (2) in his search for his drawing.
