On November 13, 1964, a general membership meeting of the Chicago NALC Chapter was held at the Packinghouse Workers Center, 4859 South Wabash Avenue, Chicago, Illinois.

Approximately 55 to 60 people were estimated to be in attendance.

A. PHILIP RANDOLPH

A. PHILIP RANDOLPH, National Chairman of the NALC, with headquarters in New York City, served as the main speaker.

In his speech, RANDOLPH stated that in connection with the past national elections, the trade unions made a big contribution to the recent election victory. He said that the

AFL - CIO is continuing this drive throughout the nation; that modern technological problems have affected the Negro job struggle.

RANDOLPH further stated that the Negro people should continue in the registration drive because political power is still something that the American working man needs.

RANDOLPH spoke on the postponement of the Conference in Washington, D. C., stating that it has been postponed to some time possibly early in 1965. He said that this Conference will not be a big conference but that most of the civil rights organizations will participate. RANDOLPH further stated that in addition to the conference described above there will be another conference with civil rights organizations participating prior to the national NALC Conference to be held in May, 1965.

RANDOLPH then discussed the Mississippi situation stating that he himself had been in Mississippi and observed activities there. He said that the conditions in Mississippi are horrible -- there are police cars all around -- Negro people are afraid because of terror that has been perpetrated against them -- that Negro meetings are watched by the Police, Sheriffs and the KKK. RANDOLPH stated that in regard to these conditions he intends to tell President JOHNSON just what is going on in Mississippi.

Concerning the NALC, RANDOLPH stated that the organization is in a unique position since it is the only civil rights organization working with the labor movement. He further stated that we must work close with the central bodies of the AFL-CIO. Concerning the AFL-CIO RANDOLPH stated that it is participating in the national drive for early retirements.

A review of the file on HARRY HERZHAFT WACHTEL revealed that according to records of the Veterans Administration, he was inducted into the United States Army on 10/13/42, and served on active duty from 7/27/43 to 11/9/45. He was honorably discharged at Fort Dix, New Jersey, as a Master Sergeant. WACHTEL served in the Army Signal Corps and reportedly had Army Serial Number 12152796.

WACHTEL was born on 3/26/17, in Brooklyn, New York, to MIRIAM and SAM WACHTEL. He was married to [redacted] on 7/30/52, in Brooklyn, New York.

It is to be noted that on 3/5/44, [redacted] furnished information which revealed that the name HARRY WACHTEL was on a list of names, significance unknown, which was maintained at the Headquarters of the Kings County CP at 25 Court Street, Brooklyn, New York. The same source furnished information on 3/5/64, which revealed that the name and address of [redacted] (HARRY WACHTEL) is [redacted] were on a list of names of newly elected officers of the Bath Beach Club of the Kings County CP.

It is also to be noted that when HARRY WACHTEL's name was found at the Kings County CP Headquarters, he was reportedly on active duty with the United States Army. The possibility exists that WACHTEL was a member of the CP prior to his entry into the United States Army or that his name was merely on a mailing list of persons to whom CP propaganda could be mailed since [redacted] was a CP member at that time.

Frequent correspondence from receiving offices in matters pertaining to CIRM, Martin Luther King, Jr., and similar related matters contain references to the relationship between King and Harry Wachtel of New York City. The characterization of Wachtel, as originated by the New York Office, usually opens with a statement to the effect that he is the Executive Vice President for the Gandhi Society for Human Rights. It is believed that in order to show a firmer association between Wachtel and King, it would be well to also include in the opening portion of the characterization on Wachtel that the Gandhi Society for Human Rights is a fund-raising adjunct of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference which Conference is headed by King.

Receiving offices should include the suggested revision in characterizations of Wachtel in the future.

The first day's session on December 12, 1964, was held in the Hotel Woodstock, 127 West 43rd Street, New York, New York, and was attended by approximately 100 youth. The session was convened shortly after 11:00 a.m., by [redacted] who gave the welcoming speech. This was followed by [redacted] who read the report on the State-Wide Conference. After some discussion of this report, the conference broke for lunch at 1:45 p.m. Several leaders of

W.E.B. DU BOIS CLUBS OF AMERICA

A source has advised that on October 26-27, 1963, a conference of members of the Communist Party (CP), including national functionaries, met in Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of setting in motion forces for the establishment of a new national Marxist-oriented youth organization which would hunt for the most peaceful transition to socialism. The delegates to this meeting were cautioned against the germ of anti-Soviet and anti-CP ideologies. These delegates were also told that it would be reasonable to assume that the young socialists attracted into this new organization would eventually pass into the CP itself.

A second conference of over 20 persons met in Chicago on December 28-29, 1963, for the purpose of initiating a "call" to the new youth organization and planning for a founding convention to be held in June, 1964.

A second source has advised that the founding convention for the new youth organization was held from June 19-21, 1964, at 150 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, California, at which time the name W.E.B. DuBois Clubs of America was adopted. Approximately 500 delegates from throughout the United States attended this convention. The aims of this organization, as set forth in the preamble to the constitution, are: "It is our belief that this nation can best solve its problems in an atmosphere of peaceful coexistence, complete disarmament and true freedom for all peoples of the world, and that these solutions will be reached mainly through the united efforts of all democratic elements in our country, composed essentially of the working people allied in the unity of Negroes and other minorities with whites. We further fully recognize that the greatest threat to American democracy comes from the racist and right wing forces in coalition with the most reactionary sections of the economic power structure, using the tool of anti-communism to divide and destroy the unified struggle of the working people. As young people in the forces struggling for democracy, we shall actively strive to defeat these reactionary and neo-fascist elements and to achieve complete freedom and democracy for all Americans, thus enabling each individual to freely choose and build the society he would wish to live in. Through these struggles we feel the American people will realize the viability of the socialist alternatives."

YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE

The May, 1960, issue of the "Young Socialist" (YS), page 1, column 3, disclosed that during April 15-17, 1960, a national organization entitled "The Young Socialist Alliance" (YSA) was established at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This issue stated that this organization was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication YS.

The above issue, page 6, set forth the Founding Declaration of YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognizes the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles, and that the supporters of the YS have come into basic political solidarity with the SWP on the principles of revolutionary socialism.

A source advised on May 6, 1964, that the original YSA was an organization formed during October, 1957, in New York City by youth of various left socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the SWP. The leaders of this group were the guiding forces in the establishment of the national organization.

The source further advised on May 6, 1964, that the YSA is dominated and controlled on a national basis by the SWP through having SWP members comprise exclusively the National Executive Committee (NEC) and through an official SWP representative at all YSA NEC meetings. The YSA, in reality, is the youth and training section of the SWP and the main source of new SWP members.

The headquarters of the YSA are located in Room 631, 41 Union Square West, New York City.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

Recipient offices were instructed to be extremely alert to all available information concerning any such meeting so that, if held, the desired intelligence deriving therefrom might be obtained.

With the return of King to the U. S., which will probably take place today or tomorrow, efforts may be reinstated between principals which will result in a personal meeting. This is to further alert recipient offices to the possibility and to emphasize the extreme desirability for any possible personal meeting between King and Levison to be covered through available sources. New York is specifically instructed to institute appropriate physical surveillances of Levison during such time that King is in the New York City area. Consider also possible coverage of [redacted]. Memorandum

From: National Negro Commission and Org. Dept.

To: All Districts and comrades responsible for Negro work.

Re: Negro History Week Activity for February, 1965.

The recent meeting of the National Negro Commission held in New York City had a three-point agenda:

1. An analysis of the elections in the Negro community.
2. We took note of the preparations for a summit meeting called by the Negro American Labor Council some time in January in Washington, D.C.
3. Negro History Week Activity.

In this memo, we shall forego a discussion on the first two points. We believe that the election results are now common knowledge and when the reports as well as the Draft Resolution on the election results is available, this will more than suffice to show the role of the Negro vote and the problems thereof.

In regard to the second point, this matter has been discussed with all districts.

We shall therefore discuss Negro History Week 1965.

Our approach to organizing activity around this issue must be of a twofold character. On the one hand, we must assist all broad forces interested in Negro History Week activity to make 1965 a turning point in the character of the observation of Negro History Week. Heretofore, the observation has taken the form mainly of highlighting Negro achievements in various fields of endeavor. Naturally, individual Negro achievements, past and present, are important. But we are of the opinion that the struggle must now be mounted on a higher level. In line with the new developments within the country in which all segments of the American people have come closer to a realization of the importance of the Negro question, it is now possible to broaden the scope of Negro History Week, making it a focal point for the struggle to include the true role of the Negro people and the Negro question, past and present, in the curricula of all schools throughout the nation. This involves pressure on school boards and other governmental levels. Appropriate speakers in schools during and after this period is also a valuable form. We should also assist other forces to prevent Negro History Week from being only an observance of brotherhood. We should encourage trade unions to undertake appropriate programs.

The other aspect of this year's observance must take the form of highlighting the contributions of the American Communist Party to the struggles of the Negro people, past and present. There is a great urgency for us to raise our Party's participation in this regard to a higher level than ever before in our history. The chief endeavor of the bourgeoisie in these cold war years in the Negro field has been to bury the contributions the CP has made. Tons of literature have been poured out in which either the role of the Party was deleted or grossly distorted. A whole new generation of freedom fighters has risen up without any knowledge of our contribution. Many of these young fighters are searching for answers that the present leadership of the Negro liberation movement does not fully provide. It is therefore imperative that our contributions reach these youth.

Hence, in the framework of modesty, we must prepare meetings and materials which will serve this purpose. We propose that the central figure highlighting the contributions of American Communists should be around the person of Comrade Ben Davis.

We, therefore, propose that Memorial meetings commemorating his memory and highlighting Communist contributions be organized.

In New York the plan is to organize in Harlem one of the largest rallies in the last ten years and preparations are under way to achieve this objective. In all the Districts on the Eastern seaboard, such as Connecticut, New Jersey, Philadelphia, Massachusetts-where Ben went to school-, Maryland-where he first worked, etc., we urge full participation in supporting the meeting being organized in Harlem. It is likewise proposed that all other Districts organize Ben Davis Memorials, no matter how small or large, although the emphasis must be to give such meetings attention such as we have not done in recent years. The National Office will make speakers available. Comrades Winston, Jackson, Patterson, Lightfoot, Hall and others will be available for such gatherings.

All such memorials should be of a united front character, as broad as possible given the local situation. But in all instances the breadth of such gatherings must not negate the ability to bring forward in the clearest manner the role of Ben Davis, the Communist.

A pamphlet highlighting the life's work of Ben Davis is in preparation. We urge the widest distribution of this pamphlet and especially must we guarantee that the young cadre within the various civil rights organizations get a copy of this pamphlet.

In addition to this, we are proposing that a special supplement be prepared for The Worker which will highlight all the various achievements of the CP throughout the years. We urge preparations for maximum circulation.

Thirdly, it would be very good if progressive book stores were encouraged to make available package sales of various literature that Communists and other progressives have written on the Negro question.

Lastly, the Org-Ed Commission is working on an outline for theoretical discussion on the Negro question in all levels of Party organization, to be ready for Negro History Week.

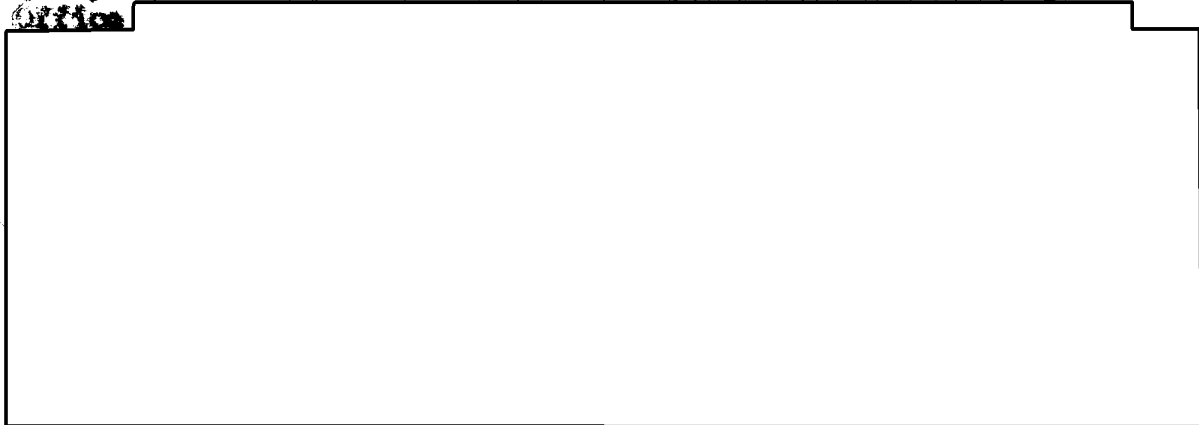

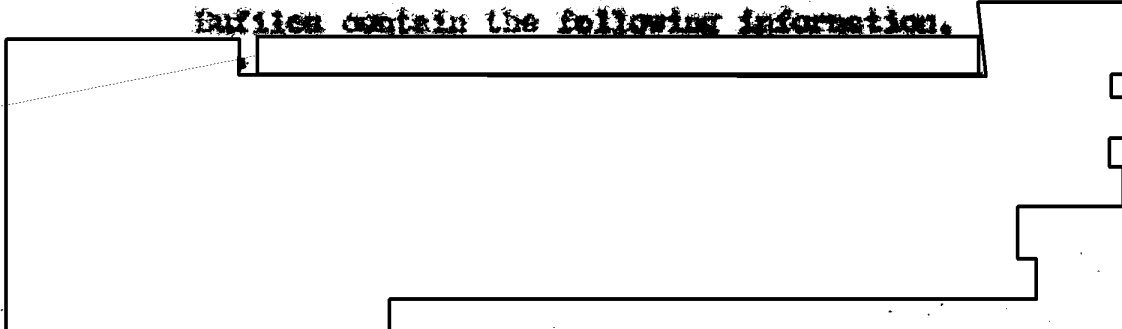

His differences with the CP, however, are merely tactical and he continues his ideological adherence to Communism.

BLACKWELL said that a letter had been received from someone in Philadelphia (possibly Mississippi) which stated that the boycott will be supported and they want action.

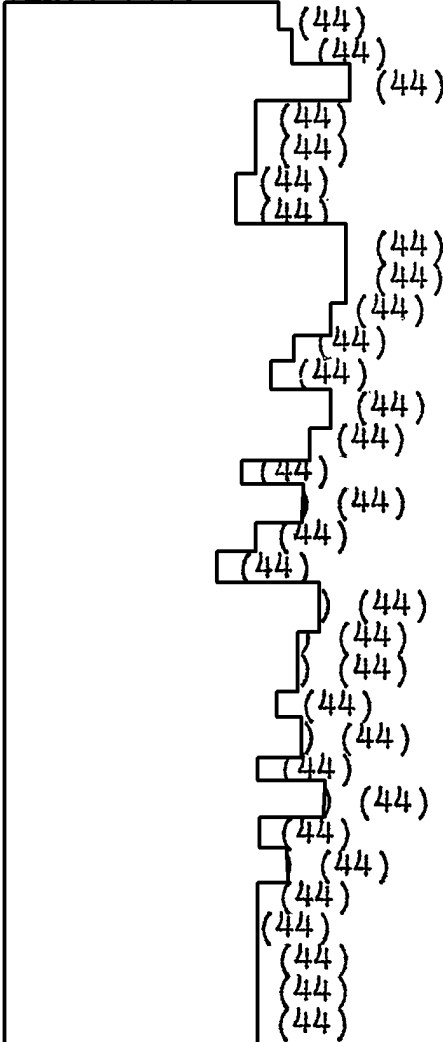

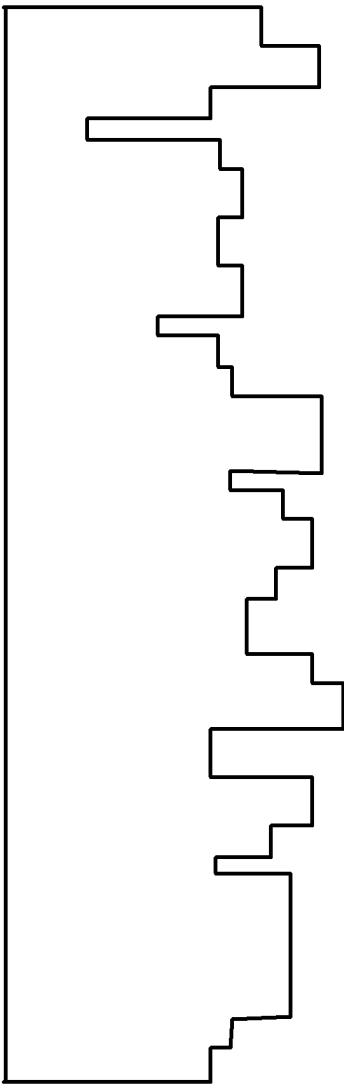

The Bureau is now in receipt of your letter 12/3/64 captioned, [redacted], SM-C," which, for the most part, reviewed the results of prior investigation as well as a review of your file 43-2112 concerning [redacted]. A lead was set out for the Boston Office to contact the relatives of the subject of your file 43-2112 in an attempt to determine that subject's present residence and employment. A lead was also set out for your office to forward Boston photographs taken 9/3/64 at Washington, D.C., which photographs were apparently forwarded your office by WFOairtel 9/18/64.

The Bureau has closely reviewed the correspondence relating to the matter of [redacted] alleged involvement and it appears that this matter is not being given the prompt and penetrative investigative attention it merits and as directed in the original instructions from the Bureau in its airtel of 9/11/64. For example, it appears that the photographs which your office is to send to Boston for exhibition to a named source should have previously been submitted. Also, it appears that the investigation to date by your office has not been of sufficient intensity as evident by the fact that your office was aware in early September of the possibility of the subject of your file 43-2112 being the individual in question, and to date, there is no indication to the Bureau that such a logical source as a military record has been checked concerning that individual although there is an indication that he probably served in the Navy.

The foregoing is being brought to your attention in order to further emphasize the Bureau's desire to have resolved the alleged involvement of [redacted] in the New York City riots. This matter must be given prompt attention.

It appears that from the information originally obtained, as reported in referenced letterhead memorandum, and the known information about [redacted] that he is the individual who was to be involved in the arrangements for a welcoming of King. The fact that an individual with such a subversive background as [redacted] may now be doing a service on behalf of King is most significant. You are, therefore, instructed to conduct a searching, but discreet, investigation which will definitely establish [redacted] services on behalf of King, if he does actually perform such services. Note particularly that there is a strong likelihood that [redacted] will not be in direct contact with King and is most likely to deal through King's advisors such as Wachtel, Rustin, [redacted] and others.

"In this memo, we shall forego a discussion on the first two points. We believe that the election results are now common knowledge and when the reports as well as the Draft Resolution on the election results is available, this will more than suffice to show the role of the Negro vote and the problems thereof.

"In regard to the second point, this matter has been discussed with all districts.

"We shall therefore discuss Negro History Week 1965.

"Our approach to organizing activity around this issue must be of a twofold character. On the one hand, we must assist all broad forces interested in Negro History Week activity to make 1965 a turning point in the character of the observation of Negro History Week. Heretofore, the observation has taken the form mainly of highlighting Negro achievements in various fields of endeavor. Naturally, individual Negro achievements, past and present, are important. But we are of the opinion that the struggle must now be mounted on a higher level. In line with the new developments within the country in which all segments of the American people have come closer to a realization of the importance of the Negro question, it is now possible to broaden the scope of Negro History Week, making it a focal point for the struggle to include the true role of the Negro people and the Negro question, past and present, in the curricula of all schools throughout the nation. This involves pressure on school boards and other governmental levels. Appropriate speakers in schools during and after this period is also a valuable form. We should also assist other forces to prevent Negro History Week from being only an observance of brotherhood. We should encourage trade unions to undertake appropriate programs.

"The other aspect of this year's observance must take the form of highlighting the contributions of the American Communist Party to the

struggles of the Negro people, past and present. There is a great urgency for us to raise our Party's participation in this regard to a higher level than ever before in our history. The chief endeavor of the bourgeoisie in these cold war years in the Negro field has been to bury the contributions the CP has made. Tons of literature have been poured out in which either the role of the Party was deleted or grossly distorted. A whole new generation of freedom fighters has risen up without any knowledge of our contribution. Many of these young fighters are searching for answers that the present leadership of the Negro liberation movement does not fully provide. It is therefore imperative that our contributions reach these youth.

"Hence, in the framework of modesty, we must prepare meetings and materials which will serve this purpose. We propose that the central figure highlighting the contributions of American Communists should be around the person of Comrade Ben Davis.

"We, therefore, propose the Memorial meetings commemorating his memory and highlighting Communist contributions be organized.

"In New York the plan is to organize in Harlem one of the largest rallies in the last ten years and preparations are under way to achieve this objective. In all the Districts on the Eastern seaboard, such as Connecticut, New Jersey, Philadelphia, Massachusetts - where Ben went to school -, Maryland - where he first worked, etc., we urge full participation in supporting the meeting being organized in Harlem. It is likewise proposed that all other Districts organize Ben Davis Memorials, no matter how small or large, although the emphasis must be to give such meetings attention such as we have not done in recent years. The National Office will make speakers available. Comrades Winston, Jackson, Patterson, Lightfoot, Hall and others will be available for such gatherings.

"All such memorials should be of a united front character, as broad as possible given the local situation. But in all instances the breadth of such gatherings must not negate the ability to bring forward in the clearest manner the role of Ben Davis, the Communist.

"A pamphlet highlighting the life's work of Ben Davis is in preparation. We urge the widest distribution of this pamphlet and especially must we guarantee that the young cadre within the various civil rights organizations get a copy of this pamphlet.

"In addition to this, we are proposing that a special supplement be prepared for The Worker which will highlight all the various achievements of the CP throughout the years. We urge preparations for maximum circulation.

"Thirdly, it would be very good if progressive book stores were encouraged to make available package sales of various literature that Communists and other progressives have written on the Negro question.

"Lastly, the Org-Ed Commission is working on an outline for theoretical discussion on the Negro question in all levels of Party organization, to be ready for Negro History Week."

[redacted] rose to say it was not his understanding the children were to be given shelter in churches or freedom schools set up during the shutdown and that plans were going forward to send some of them into various department stores and GALAMISON interrupted him to say he would speak of this later and "there were department stores in Brooklyn, too" but that the overflow of children not going into the stores, or to the UN, or the museums or on other planned missions must have a place to go to. [redacted] offered to chair the Transportation project, to see that cars and drivers were provided at each school. An unknown school teacher of CARIS in Brownsville who had been contacted by [redacted] was nominated for the Food project.

GALAMISON stated that more people must be reached and he was ready to go into any home where four to six people were gathered who might be sympathetic and talk to them enlisting their aid. Alternatively, Bklyn Core would send a speaker. He said funds were needed and two secretaries were hired who were willing to work throughout the project for \$50. a week, names not given. [redacted] was asked to speak by GALAMISON and he rose to state that things were status quo for a year now regarding those arrested in the past year and whom he was representing and it looked like things would remain this way since PAT's representatives also arrested, had gone scot-free. GALAMISON remarked [redacted] worked for free and much money was owed to him.

[redacted] spoke of a project scheduled for Tuesday, December 15th where Brooklyn Core would carry two huge wooden crosses from headquarters to City Hall where a rally would be in progress at 1 PM protesting allocation of funds for building of segregated

schools and all present might participate; leaflets were distributed. [redacted] gave out flyers describing a drive to obtain more transfers on busses in Bedford-Stuyvesant.

GALAMISON mentioned INTERVENTION DAY sponsored by EQUAL, slated for January 15th, 1965 wherein 50 prominent people including perhaps ROY WILKINS would stand at a given site in Harlem near 125th St. and request Mayor WAGNER to address them there and try to find a solution for heading off the shutdown of the schools. If no solution was found, the shutdown would proceed and GALAMISON said that immediately and gradually schools would be shut down at planned sites in the City until by February 3rd all the schools now segregated or known as a 600 school would be closed and not opened until specific demands for a timetable and other specifications were met. He stressed it would not be a boycott but a COMPLETE SHUTDOWN and at this moment all were in readiness according to reports in his hands from the contact people. [redacted] rose and spoke of a Rally at Williams Central Congregational Church in Harlem on December 20th at which MALCOLM X and ADAM CLAYTON POWELL would be present. GALAMISON mentioned the DuBois Clubs were giving an affair shortly to raise funds for Operation Shutdown as well. [redacted] was said to be

[redacted], chaired by MILTON GALAMISON, with about 50 people attending. Among those present were: [redacted]

[redacted] other representatives of Brooklyn Core, names unknown, a male Negro representing [redacted] of a Brooklyn 600 school, a Chinese man from New York Core whose name may have been [redacted], a young Negro woman about 30 years slight build, wearing glasses, who represented the New York Council at 122nd St. near E. River Drive in Manhattan and who said she would shortly pledge her group numbering 2000 persons to the boycott and claimed to have sent 2000 telegrams to President JOHNSON demanding the resignation of J. EDGAR HOOVER. Also a dark Negro male, age about 25 representing FOCUS, [redacted] of EQUAL and the PARENTS WORKSHOP, and one [redacted] last name unknown, a Negro male about 25 with medium brown complexion, 6 ft. tall, weighing about 170 lbs., green eyes and close cropped hair. [redacted] read the Minutes of previous meeting and asked [redacted] to come in some day the following week to type up the minutes of the 4 meetings previously held. Dr. GALAMISON asked what the different groups had been doing and a white representative of BILYN CORE's Executive Council said a meeting had been held and \$100. pledged to Operation Shutdown with the suggestion all other groups follow this example. The Core representative further stated that the Committee had come up with the following plans of procedure:

1. Intensive fund raising drive.
2. Distribution of already printed flyers to educate parents, teachers and children of Operation Shutdown and soliciting their participation.
3. Follow up of such distribution by door to door bell-ringing to organize parents and students for participation and support and to explain necessity for the shutdown.

4. Plans for picketing sites of projects where "segregated" schools were to be built and blocking them with "bodies".

The Negro representative of [redacted] brought his message that he had a direct line to all 600 schools, had investigated, and found them all to be ready and eager to participation in Operation Shutdown on short notice. Rev. GALAMISON lauded this and added that he personally knew of eight 600 schools who would go out en masse by the following Monday, if requested.

GALAMISON spoke of the desperate need for dedicated help of all kinds for funds. He said several fund raising ideas were to be put into practice shortly. He asked every organization and group to pledge at least \$100. as did Brooklyn Core. GALAMISON said the whole project could not proceed without secretarial services and the occasional help of [redacted] and [redacted] was not enough; that a full-time paid secretary would be needed throughout the operation. Volunteers were asked to see him after the meeting. GALAMISON then showed to the assembly a large cardboard placard on white was an umbrella design, black on one side, white on the other and the letters I and S meaning Integrated Schools imprinted thereon; he said buttons would be made up and sold using this emblem. GALAMISON then showed to the group a large black placard lettered in yellow and under the heading OPERATION SHUTDOWN, each segregated school and address was listed. By Borough. GALAMISON went down the line and asked for and received volunteers to work on the shutdown of each school. [redacted]

[redacted] in Brooklyn explaining that she knew the principal, and he would cooperate. [redacted] took four specific Brooklyn schools and stated work had already begun and they were practically sewn up for support. When the Manhattan placard was put on display, GALAMISON asked [redacted] to speak of what Harlem was doing and [redacted] took the floor. He [redacted] said all of Harlem was behind the project and any organization that would support it would be acceptable including THE BLACK MUSLIMS. He said there was only one school on the list which may have been P.S. 139, of which he was in doubt. This was

because the powers-that-be planned to shut it down on the pretext that it was needed for other purposes but actually because it was a school dedicated to the struggle for Civil Rights and always had been active participants in every boycott. [redacted] further stated that plans were afoot as to the activities of the children who would remain away from school and one such plan was to send them into prominent department stores which would be an effective action since all Negroes were regarded as thieves and kleptomaniacs. The inference was that the fear of looting etc. might hasten support for Operation Shutdown. [redacted] said that the previous summer's rioting had focused attention on the desperation of the Negro people and this same desperation was present now in most of Harlem's population. [redacted] said that every Junior High Segregated school listed on GALAMISON's placard would obtain full support and cooperation from the Harlem people and the students therein. They were, in his words, "all swen up".

[redacted] spoke of a plan sponsored by EQUAL (now supporting Operation Shutdown) known as "Intervention"; this entailed contacting 50 prominent people, advising them of the dangers of the coming shutdown of 600 schools and asking for a Committee to be formed to head it off, and for concrete suggestions of an alternative. The idea was that the press would have to play this up and when no suggestion was forthcoming, Operation Shutdown would be accepted as the only possible solution. [redacted] said a new organization should be added to GALAMISON's supporting list, called FIGHT, located in her home area. GALAMISON added [redacted] should be reactivated and he would be willing at any time to go to any designated place to speak where support might possibly be forthcoming. The Negro girl representing Frederick Douglas chapter of NAACP announced she was in full support of Operation Shutdown but her leaders had ordered her to withdraw their name as NAACP would not support the operation. [redacted] was introduced and stated that he was working on the release of people arrested on December 16th for disorderly conduct and other charges since PAT had had 65 demonstrators arrested that very day and all were discharged - he would use this as the basis for a plea that the same treatment be accorded the December 16 participants. GALAMISON spoke at length again on the need for funds and present outstanding debts. Papers with tear sheets would be sent out when secretarial help became available soliciting funds from organizations and individuals known to be sympathetic. GALAMISON asked if the people present would want one more meeting (the following Thursday) before the holidays set in and the reply was unanimous in the affirmative so a meeting was scheduled for a week from December 3rd. Meeting adjourned at about 10:40 P.M.

AMERICAN INSTITUTE FOR MARXIST STUDIES

A source advised on April 9, 1963, that on April 7, 1963, at a meeting of the District Committee of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA) of New England, held in Boston, Massachusetts, HERBERT APTHEKER stated he was developing an organization called American Institute For Marxist Studies (AIMS), which would eventually legalize the CP. He stated AIMS would publish literature on History, Science, Physics, Archeology and other subjects which would be put out quarterly with various supplements.

A second source advised in December, 1959, that HERBERT APTHEKER was elected to the National Committee, CP, USA, at the 17th National Convention of the CP, USA, held in December, 1959.

A third source advised on June 7, 1963, that on June 3, 1963, HERBERT APTHEKER spoke at the CP, USA, New York District Board meeting concerning AIMS. APTHEKER stated that AIMS would unite and strengthen the CP although the CP would not be connected with it. He stated AIMS was being formed to operate within the scope of the MC CARRAN and SMITH Acts and would legally bring Marxist material and opinions to the attention of American scholars and the general public.

A fourth source advised on May 15, 1964, that, as of that date, AIMS was located on the fifth floor west at 20 East 30th Street, New York City, New York.

FREEDOMWAYS ASSOCIATES, INCORPORATED

The records of the New York Secretary of State, Albany, New York, show that the certificate of incorporation of Freedomways Associates, Incorporated, was filed on March 2, 1961.

The Spring, 1964, issue of "Freedomways" is self-described as "A Quarterly Review of the Negro Freedom Movement" published by Freedomways Associates, Incorporated, 799 Broadway, New York City.

On May 24, 1961, a source advised that a report was given on "Freedomways" at a meeting of the National Board, Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), held on May 24, 1961. It was stated that the original plan called for the publication to be openly Marxist, but that it was later decided it would not be avowedly a Marxist publication. Editorials are in the hands of a mixed group of Marxists and non-Marxists. It was stated that the central purpose of "Freedomways" is to develop a theory and positive criticism of currents in the Negro movement, as well as to raise the level of understanding and discussion taking place in Negro life today and to project a socialist and pro-Soviet orientation.

On May 25, 1961, another source advised that "Freedomways" was set up for the CPUSA by JAMES JACKSON, a member of the National Committee of the CPUSA.

The first speaker at the rally was [redacted] stated that the "Challenge" would begin on January 4, 1965 at Washington, D.C., with some sort of demonstration, possibly a march. The "Challenge" will continue until July 4, 1965.

The next speaker, Malcolm X, spoke on the Congo and the Kenya rebellion in Africa and pointed out that the African Freedom fighters, better known as the Mau Mau, were needed to straighten things out in Mississippi and Harlem. Malcolm X acknowledged that freedom is won by ballots and votes, but stated that freedom fighters were needed where justice did not prevail.

The next speaker, Jesse Gray, Harlem Rent-Strike Organizer, said that the MFDP needs an appeal to the masses; more black people should join in MFDP.

Malcolm X spoke for about 15 minutes and stated that freedom for the Negro people cannot be won through policy of non-violence; that there are only two ways to win freedom for the Negro; namely, by ballots or by bullets. He stated that the language understood in Mississippi is the language of violence.

The "New York Times", December 21, 1964, page 18, in an article entitled "Malcolm Favors a Mau Mau in U.S.", narrated that Malcolm X, "the black nationalist leader", declared at a rally on December 20, 1964, that "we need a Mau Mau" to win freedom and equality for the Negroes in the United States.

A mimeographed hand-out circulated at Brooklyn College, Brooklyn, New York on December 21, 1964, announced that a "rally for justice in Mississippi", would be held on Dec. 21, 1964, at noon at Brooklyn College, Brooklyn, New York. The circular stated that speakers from Student Non-Violent Co-ordinating Committee (SNCC) would speak at the rally. The rally was sponsored by the Brooklyn College Chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP).

Confidential Source Number 4, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on November 20, 1958, that Jesse Gray had been the organizer for the Harlem Region of the Communist Party (CP), but this position terminated during November, 1958.

Confidential Source Number 5, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on January 24, 1964, that according to William Patterson, Chairman of the New York District CP, Jesse Gray is no longer a CP member, but is friendly to the CP.

MUSLIM MOSQUE, INCORPORATED (MMI)

The March 13, 1964, edition of "The New York Times," a daily newspaper published in New York, New York, contained an article on page 20 which indicated that MALCOLM X (LITTLE), former national official of the Nation of Islam (NOI) who broke with the NOI on March 8, 1964, publicly announced in New York City on March 12, 1964, that he had formed the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI). The MMI, according to the article would be a broadly based politically oriented black nationalist movement for Negroes only, financed by voluntary contributions. In this public statement MALCOLM X urged Negroes to abandon the doctrine of non-violence when it is necessary to defend themselves in the civil rights struggle, and he also suggested that Negroes form rifle clubs to protect their lives and property in time of emergencies in areas where the government is unable or unwilling to protect them.

Incorporation papers of the MMI filed on March 16, 1964, with the Business Section, Clerk of Courts, New York County, New York, New York, reflect that the MMI was incorporated under the Religious Corporation Law of the State of New York to work for the imparting of the Islamic Faith and Islamic Religion in accordance with "accepted Islamic principals." The principal place of worship to be located in the Borough of Manhattan, New York, New York.

The May 23, 1964, edition of the "New York Amsterdam News," a weekly Negro newspaper published in New York City, contained an article by columnist JAMES BOOKER in which he indicated that he had heard that the visit by MALCOLM X with Muslim leaders during his African tour has changed him to become soft in his anti-white feelings and to become more religious.

On October 6, 1964, a confidential source advised that the MMI is apparently affiliated with the true orthodox Islamic Religion through its affiliation with the Islamic Foundation (of New York), 1 Riverside Drive, New York City. The only teachings of the MMI are on the Islamic Religion.

A second confidential source advised on October 20, 1964, that the headquarters of the MMI are located in Suite 128, Hotel Theresa, 2090 Seventh Avenue, New York, New York, where they were established on March 16, 1964. These headquarters are shared with the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU) which is also headed by MALCOLM X.

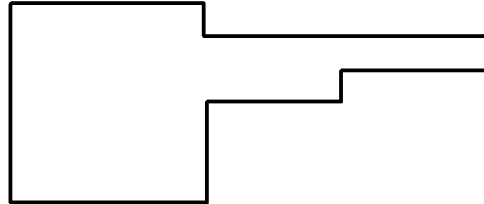

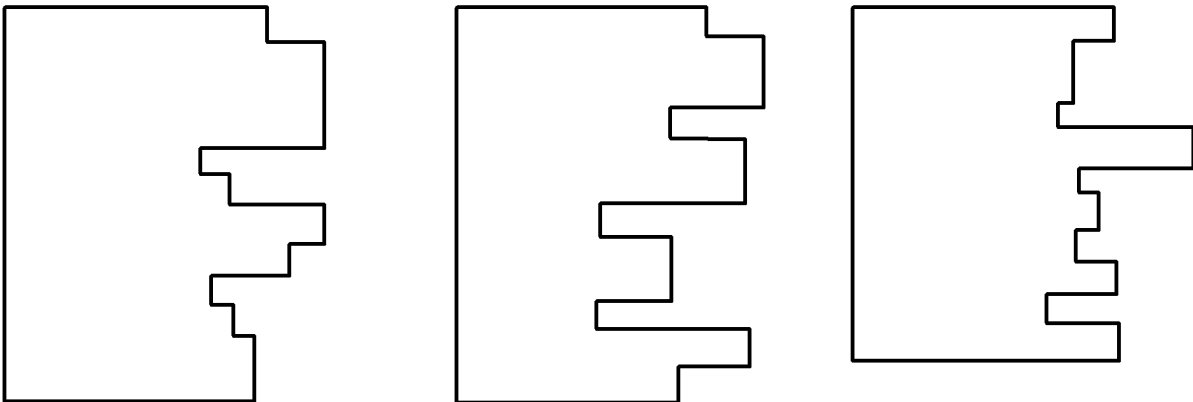

Members of the Brooklyn and New York Chapters of The Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) were present as well as various members of the DuBois Clubs.

Brooklyn CORE stated that they had five schools which they were ready to shut-down at a moment's notice. It was also stated that all of the special "600" schools (described as schools for disturbed youngsters) were ready to shut-down on short notice. A representative of Brooklyn CORE presented Reverend Galamison a check for \$100.00 from Brooklyn CORE. Galamison stated that each organization committed to this project was expected to contribute a like amount and another \$100.00 in January, 1965.

Milton Galamison mentioned "Intervention Day" sponsored by EQUAL, (a civil rights organization), slated for January 15, 1965, wherein 50 prominent people including perhaps Roy Wilkins would stand at a given site in Harlem near 125th Street and request Mayor Wagner to address them there and try to find a solution for heading off the shut-down of the schools. If no solution was found, the shut-down would proceed and Galamison said that immediately and gradually schools would be shut-down at planned sites in the City until by February 3rd all the schools now segregated or known as "600" schools would be closed and not opened until specific demands for an integration timetable and other specifications were met.

W.E.B. DU BOIS CLUBS OF AMERICA

A source has advised that on October 26-27, 1963, a conference of members of the Communist Party (CP), including national functionaries, met in Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of setting in motion forces for the establishment of a new national Marxist-oriented youth organization which would hunt for the most peaceful transition to socialism. The delegates to this meeting were cautioned against the germ of anti-Soviet and anti-CP ideologies. These delegates were also told that it would be reasonable to assume that the young socialists attracted into this new organization would eventually pass into the CP itself.

A second conference of over 20 persons met in Chicago on December 28-29, 1963, for the purpose of initiating a "call" to the new youth organization and planning for a founding convention to be held in June, 1964.

A second source has advised that the founding convention for the new youth organization was held from June 19-21, 1964, at 150 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, California, at which time the name W.E.B. DuBois Clubs of America was adopted. Approximately 500 delegates from throughout the United States attended this convention. The aims of this organization, as set forth in the preamble to the constitution, are: "It is our belief that this nation can best solve its problems in an atmosphere of peaceful coexistence, complete disarmament and true freedom for all peoples of the world, and that these solutions will be reached mainly through the united efforts of all democratic elements in our country, composed essentially of the working people allied in the unity of Negroes and other minorities with whites. We further fully recognize that the greatest threat to American democracy comes from the racist and right wing forces in coalition with the most reactionary sections of the economic power structure, using the tool of anti-communism to divide and destroy the unified struggle of the working people. As young people in the forces struggling for democracy, we shall actively strive to defeat these reactionary and neo-fascist elements and to achieve complete freedom and democracy for all Americans, thus enabling each individual to freely choose and build the society he would wish to live in. Through these struggles we feel the American people will realize the viability of the socialist alternatives."

The source further advised [redacted] hundreds of meetings of the CP, at which Saul Mills was present, as well as hundreds of Trade Union meetings run by the CP. In respect to Saul Mills' knowledge of the CP nature of these meetings, the source stated that there is no question but that Mills was cognizant at the time they were official meetings of the CP. The source [redacted] Saul Mills in 1944, at a meeting called by the National Committee of the CP, and observed him at a meeting of top functionaries of the CP, held following the 1944 convention, at which time Mills delivered a speech.

In "The Saturday Evening Post", issue of July 11-18, 1964, page 76, Bayard Rustin is the subject of a feature article captioned: "The Lone Wolf of Civil Rights". In it, Rustin is said to have come to New York in 1938, as an organizer for the Young Communist League (YCL), and as such, he had the job of recruiting students for the "Party". Furthermore, the article reports that during his first years in New York, Rustin gave most of his earnings to the "Party". He reportedly left the "Party" in 1941, the article states.

The YCL has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The "Daily Worker", February 11, 1957, page 1 column 2, reported that Bayard Rustin, Executive Secretary, War Resisters League, was an observer at the 16th National Convention of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA), held in New York City, on February 9-12, 1957.

The "Daily Worker" was an East Coast Communist publication until it ceased publication on January 13, 1958.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on September 25, 1963, that during a meeting of the National Board, CP, USA, on that date, Benjamin J. Davis remarked that, "Rustin calls me constantly--openly."

Another confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on February 19, 20, 1964, that Bayard Rustin contacted Benjamin J. Davis on those dates

The "National Guardian", a weekly publication, New York City, dated December 26, 1964, page four, in an article, entitled, "Political Action Federation Outlines Steps At Conference", announced that preliminary steps were taken December 19 to establish a Negro power bloc in New York at the Federation for Independent Political Action's first conference on "The Black Revolution - A Struggle for Political Power."

The following is quoted from the "National Guardian" article:

"In a day-long discussion, leaders of New York's community-based Negro organizations approved a series of immediate moves to alleviate conditions in the ghettos and named an interim committee to formulate long-range goals and plans. The call to the conference stated its aim thus:

" 'Black independent political action means active organized involvement of the man-in-the-street, the victims of ruthless slumlords, the unemployed and youth to change rotten conditions in the ghetto. Through struggle, political power can be built by the people for liberation from white-dominated political control and economic exploitation. With independent political power, the black revolution can boldly move forward in advancing the interests of the masses.' "

The conference was described as "all-black" even the press was asked to send Negro reporters and television crews, but none came, according to the article.

The article related that interim committee members named were: Isaiah Robinson, chairman of the Harlem Parents Committee and vice chairman of the Ad Hoc Committee to Support the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party Challenge; Jesse Gray; Reverend Milton Galamison, school boycott leader and chairman of the Brooklyn Parents Workshop for Equality; Jim Haughton, director of the Harlem Unemployment Center; William Strickland, Northern Student Movement; Clarence Jones, attorney; John Henrik Clarke, an editor of "Freedomways, and Malcom X.

Among specific actions supported is the scheduled February 3 shut-down of 31 junior high schools and 15 of the so-called "600" schools (for difficult pupils). The aims of the shut-down are (1) upgrading of 200 Negro and Puerto Rican teachers to supervisory and administrative positions; (2) establishment of a curriculum and screening of evaluation process for "600" schools; (3) the hiring of Negro custodians; (4) halting of school construction on present sites.

The federation also decided to support the drive for passage by the State Legislature of the "emergency repair bill" empowering the city to collect rents and make building repairs five days after a complaint is filed. A delegation to Albany at the opening of the Legislature January 4 will demand passage of the bill.

Two themes were stressed by the speakers (1) Unity among all grassroots groups to form a political action movement; (2) house-by-house organization to fight for the needs and desires of the people.

In his keynote address, Jesse Gray stated that "a revolutionary movement is in the making." He said: "The lack of unified, organized black political power is one reason we are not yet a revolutionary movement. Another is that we require revolutionaries. Real revolutionaries are out in the streets organizing people around their day-to-day problems."

The article further related that Victoria Gray, one of the three Freedom Democratic Party congresswomen from Mississippi, related the history of the attempt by the Mississippi Negroes to gain a voice in politics first through the regular Democratic Party - which almost totally bars Negro participation - and then through the formation of the FDP. Mrs. Gray asked conference delegates to support the party's challenge to the seating of the five "regular" Mississippi representatives in Congress next session.

The article noted that identification with Modern Africa and the American Negro's Cultural Heritage in Africa was apparent in the emblem of the Federation for Political Action (FIPA) - a stylized African lion.

The "National Guardian" is characterized in the Appendix.

A confidential source advised on November 20, 1958, that Jesse Gray had been organizer for the Harlem Region of the Communist Party (CP) but that position was terminated during November, 1958.

The second source advised on January 24, 1964, that according to William Patterson, Chairman of the New York District Communist Party (CP), Jesse Gray is no longer a CP member but is friendly to the CP.

The third confidential source, who was in a position to furnish reliable information, on February 26, 1957, identified the photograph of [redacted] as the person [redacted] to be a member and in a [redacted] in the Labor Youth League, (LYL).

AMERICAN INSTITUTE FOR MARXIST STUDIES

A source advised on April 9, 1963, that on April 7, 1963, at a meeting of the District Committee of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA) of New England, held in Boston, Massachusetts, HERBERT APTHEKER stated he was developing an organization called American Institute For Marxist Studies (AIMS), which would eventually legalize the CP. He stated AIMS would publish literature on History, Science, Physics, Archeology, and other subjects which would be put out quarterly with various supplements.

A second source advised in December, 1959, that HERBERT APTHEKER was elected to the National Committee, CP, USA, at the 17th National Convention of the CP, USA, held in December, 1959.

A third source advised on June 7, 1963, that on June 3, 1963, HERBERT APTHEKER spoke at the CP, USA, New York District Board meeting concerning AIMS. APTHEKER stated that AIMS would unite and strengthen the CP although the CP would not be connected with it. He stated AIMS was being formed to operate within the scope of the MC CARRAN and SMITH Acts and would legally bring Marxist material and opinions to the attention of American scholars and the general public.

A fourth source advised on May 15, 1964, that, as of that date, AIMS was located on the fifth floor west at 20 East 30th Street, New York City, New York.

APPENDIX

FREEDOMWAYS ASSOCIATES, INCORPORATED

The records of the New York Secretary of State, Albany, New York, show that the certificate of incorporation of Freedomways Associates, Incorporated, was filed on March 2, 1961.

The Spring, 1964, issue of "Freedomways" is self-described as "A Quarterly Review of the Negro Freedom Movement" published by Freedomways Associates, Incorporated, 799 Broadway, New York City.

On May 24, 1961, a source advised that a report was given on "Freedomways" at a meeting of the National Board, Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), held on May 24, 1961. It was stated that the original plan called for the publication to be openly Marxist, but that it was later decided it would not be avowedly a Marxist publication. Editorials are in the hands of a mixed group of Marxists and non-Marxists. It was stated that the central purpose of "Freedomways" is to develop a theory and positive criticism of currents in the Negro movement, as well as to raise the level of understanding and discussion taking place in Negro life today and to project a socialist and pro-Soviet orientation.

On May 25, 1961, another source advised that "Freedomways" was set up for the CPUSA by JAMES JACKSON, a member of the National Committee of the CPUSA.

APPENDIX

MUSLIM MOSQUE, INCORPORATED (MMI)

The March 13, 1964, edition of "The New York Times," a daily newspaper published in New York, New York, contained an article on page 20 which indicated that MALCOLM X (LITTLE), former national official of the Nation of Islam (NOI) who broke with the NOI on March 8, 1964, publicly announced in New York City on March 12, 1964, that he had formed the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI). The MMI, according to the article would be a broadly based politically oriented black nationalist movement for Negroes only, financed by voluntary contributions. In this public statement MALCOLM X urged Negroes to abandon the doctrine of non-violence when it is necessary to defend themselves in the civil rights struggle, and he also suggested that Negroes form rifle clubs to protect their lives and property in time of emergencies in areas where the government is unable or unwilling to protect them.

Incorporation papers of the MMI filed on March 16, 1964, with the Business Section, Clerk of Courts, New York County, New York, New York, reflect that the MMI was incorporated under the Religious Corporation Law of the State of New York to work for the imparting of the Islamic Faith and Islamic Religion in accordance with "accepted Islamic principals." The principal place of worship to be located in the Borough of Manhattan, New York, New York.

The May 23, 1964, edition of the "New York Amsterdam News," a weekly Negro newspaper published in New York City, contained an article by columnist JAMES BOOKER in which he indicated that he had heard that the visit by MALCOLM X with Muslim leaders during his African tour has changed him to become soft in his anti-white feelings and to become more religious.

On October 6, 1964, a confidential source advised that the MMI is apparently affiliated with the true orthodox Islamic Religion through its affiliation with the Islamic Foundation (of New York), 1 Riverside Drive, New York City. The only teachings of the MMI are on the Islamic Religion.

A second confidential source advised on October 20, 1964, that the headquarters of the MMI are located in Suite 128, Hotel Theresa, 2090 Seventh Avenue, New York, New York, where they were established on March 16, 1964. These headquarters are shared with the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU) which is also headed by MALCOLM X.

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of December 1, 1961, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the "National Guardian":

- "1. 'established by the American Labor Party in 1947 as a "progressive" weekly \* \* \*. Although it denies having any affiliation with the Communist Party, it has manifested itself from the beginning as a virtual official propaganda arm of Soviet Russia.' [redacted], a student at Columbia University and a member of the Young Socialist Alliance reported in [redacted]

[redacted] about the meeting of May 2nd Committee which was described by him as a front for the Progressive Labor party which had been inactive for some time. The meeting was held at the Manhattan Center with about 500 persons in attendance. Over one hundred were Negroes including many African students. MALCOLM X was in the audience. Among the speakers were [redacted] Red leader. The meeting launched on the campus thru the device of getting hundreds of thousands of students to sign a pledge of refusing to fight in the imperialist war of Viet Nam and of recruiting from the campus much of the student peace-minded. A collection was taken. US-Belgian Congo actions were attacked and the war in Viet Nam as well as the integration struggle betrayals.

In the discussion in [redacted] it was the estimation of [redacted] that this latest PL attempt to form a front group on campus to replace the Student Committee for Travel to Cuba would be just a flash in the pan which would dissolve. In the discussion [redacted] pointed out that there was going to be a meeting held in Harlem this Saturday in which were invited leaders of the black movement in the US; such persons were included as MALCOLM X, [redacted] and Rev. GALIMISON. The conference is being called to form political units to struggle against the Democratic and Republican politicians and to form alliances politically to advance the Negro struggle. [redacted] said in the course of the discussion that the SWP was responsible for this radical departure from traditional Negro thinking. He said that the SWP campaign in Harlem and during the election campaign was saying exactly what this call for the leaders of the Negro community said. He

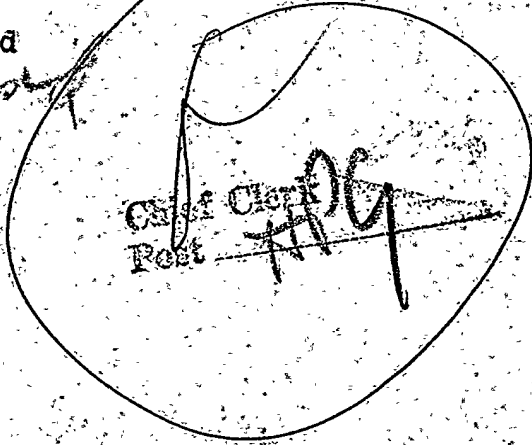

The 12/9/64 edition of the "Yale Daily News" on page 4 contains an article entitled "Lowenstein Urges Democratic Merger". This article revealed that at a kaffee klatsch held by the Yale Young Democrats at the Yale Law School, New Haven, on 12/8/64, ALLARD K. LOWENSTEIN argued for a coalition of the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party (FDP) with the State Loyalist Democratic Party. This article revealed that LOWENSTEIN was a writer "in residence at Ezra Stiles" (College, Yale University, New Haven, Conn.), and that during his speech he pointed out that the moment for breaking down the white party structure is soon. In his address, LOWENSTEIN said that at Atlantic City (Democratic National Convention) many members of the party felt that they had been used as pawns but the skepticism of many members of the FDP goes further. These individuals, according to LOWENSTEIN, are dissatisfied with the American political system and distrustful of the values of middle-class America. He said that "these" are the radical members of the party and support comes from other radical groups like the "National Guardian" and the Lawyers Guild. LOWENSTEIN was quoted as having stated that on the other hand there are those in the (Democratic) Party who believe that by coalition, effective pressure can be brought to bear on the racists in the State Party to effect social changes. LOWENSTEIN said it is difficult to say just who is in control of the FDP at present and he doubted that Mississippi Negroes and poor white farmers could ever ally in an agrarian party "not with the problems of race."

A review of New Haven Office indices reveals that ALLARD KENNETH LOWENSTEIN has been the subject of investigation by the New York Office, such case captioned "ALLARD KENNETH LOWENSTEIN, IS-SPAIN, REGISTRATION ACT," Bufile 105-103168, New York file 105-51644. Information set forth in the report of SA [redacted] dated 1/25/62 at New York, New York, in the latter-mentioned investigation, reveals that as of 1962 LOWENSTEIN was employed by Stanford University, Palo Alto, Calif.; that he was awarded an LL.B. Degree by Yale University, New Haven, Conn., during 1954, and that during 1958 he was employed as Foreign Policy Assistant to then U. S. Senator HUBERT H. HUMPHREY. Instant report revealed that LOWENSTEIN resided at 25 West 81st Street, New York, New York; that he had been employed by the American Association for the United Nations, and that at one time he indicated he was going to write a book, subject matter not known. It also pointed out that LOWENSTEIN travels frequently and often makes political speeches during his travels.

Since New York was origin in the latter-mentioned case, New Haven is not aware of the extent of investigation conducted therein nor the ultimate disposition of such case.

The 5/12/54 edition of the "Yale Daily News" on page 1 contained an article captioned "Communist Threat Debate by McWhorter, Lowenstein." This article revealed that on 5/11/54 a debate was held at Yale University between [redacted] New York attorney, and ALLARD K. LOWENSTEIN, Yale Law School, Class of 1954, before a meeting of the Young Democratic Club. In the reported debate, LOWENSTEIN opposed "red hunting committees" on the grounds that they create a reign of terror where the liberal fears to express views since he would be branded a communist. LOWENSTEIN said that only one-tenth of one per cent of the American teachers were "reds" and to prosecute all teachers for this minority was not worth the cost to our "American heritage". He reportedly affirmed the necessity of ridding American schools of "red-minded" teachers but stated that this should be done locally on substantial evidence.

On January 6, 1965, a source advised that the Negro American Labor Council (NALC) State of the Race Conference is now scheduled to be held in Washington, D.C., on January 10, 1965. Source advised that notice of this date was received by way of a NALC National Office letter which was mailed to the office of the Chicago Chapter, NALC, Chicago, Illinois, and was received by that office on or about Saturday, January 2, 1965.

Source further advised that as of January 6, 1965, no Communist Party (CP) of Illinois members who are also members of the Chicago Chapter NALC are scheduled to attend this conference.

Source further advised that at a CP of Illinois State Board meeting held in Chicago on January 5, 1965, the State of the Race Conference was not discussed; however, Jack Kling, CP of Illinois Board member who attended this meeting, did note in a conversation that the only person who the CP of Illinois knew would possibly attend the conference was [redacted]. According to the source, [redacted] is not a member of the CP of Illinois and is not subject to the influence of the CP of Illinois.

On January 5, 1965, another source advised that Claude Lightfoot, Chairman, CP of Illinois, originally designated Nate Sharpe, a CP of Illinois member and a member of the Chicago Chapter NALC, as the person to attend the State of the Race Conference in Washington, D.C. Source advised, however, that at the time Lightfoot appointed Sharpe, the question of the CP of Illinois' financing Sharpe's trip to the conference was raised, and at that time Lightfoot advised that the question of

financing Sharpe's trip would be taken under consideration by the CP and an answer would be forthcoming. Source advised that it was subsequently learned that Lightfoot had departed Chicago, Illinois, for a trip abroad without settling this question of finances, and Sharpe eventually advised the Chairman of the CP of Illinois Negro Commission that he would not go unless the CP paid for his expenses. It was learned that the Chairman of the CP of Illinois Negro Commission advised Sharpe that no monies were available for this purpose, and as a consequence Sharpe stated he would not attend the conference. ~~CONFIDENTIAL~~

(U) This source further advised that because of the poor financial condition of the Chicago Chapter NALC, it was very unlikely that the chapter would finance Sharpe's or any other Chicago NALC member's trip to this State of the Race Conference. Source advised that if any member of the Chicago Chapter NALC attended the conference, he would have to do so at his own personal expense. ~~CONFIDENTIAL~~

(U) The first source also advised on January 6, 1965, that an Executive Board meeting of the Chicago Chapter NALC is scheduled to be held the evening of January 6, 1964, where possibly a representative and/or representatives would be designated to attend the conference. ~~CONFIDENTIAL~~

Bureau 0-1 Form 12/30/64 requested advice as to status of investigation, making reference to reBulet 12/8/64. New York airtel 1/6/65, copies to Atlanta and New Haven, referenced New York airtel of 12/11/64 and the Bureau 0-1 Form and stated that New York has no additional pertinent information.

New York is now instructed to specifically advise of what efforts it has made, and the results thereof, in checking out the allegation that [ ] (LNU) had written an article for King which had received widespread circulation. New York should continue to pursue this matter through logical investigative channels.
