

CATEGORIES FOR CRAFTS CONTEST

1. Nature Craft: dried flowers, pine cones, painting on rocks, cornhusks, driftwood, shells, etc.
2. Sequin and Bead Craft: flowers, jewel pictures, Indian beading, ornaments, etc.
3. Paper Craft: papier-mache, paper sculpture, quilling, 3-D situations, "quick" decoupage, decoupage, etc.
4. Dough Craft: bread dough flowers, baked dough sculpture, baskets, etc.
5. Sugar Craft: mold, sculpture, cake decorating, royal icing, pulled sugar, etc.
6. Metal Craft: tin can craft, copper enameling, wire sculpture, etc.
7. Leather Craft: purses, belts, billfolds, etc.
8. Wood Craft: carving, wood burning, doll furniture, etc.
9. Glass Craft: stained glass, painting on glass, marble craft, etc.
10. Plaster Craft: hydrocal, casting, sculpture, etc.
11. Plastic Craft: resin casting, antiqued flowers or fruit, etc.
12. Dye Craft: batik, hand or block print, stencil and tie dye, etc.
13. Canning: made from mold.
14. Pottery: hand molded pieces, wheel thrown, hand built pottery, etc.
15. China Painting
16. Decorative Painting on Wood: rosemaling, peasant rub out, etc. (masonry or fiber board may be used).
17. Decorative Painting on Metal: Tole, Pennsylvania Dutch, etc.
18. Decorative Painting on Fabric: liquid embroidery, canvas, velvet, etc.
19. Jewelry: Any single medium or combination of media.
20. Macrame and Knitting
21. Fabric Craft: applique, felt or burlap work, wall hangings, Swedish weaving, huck weaving, etc.
22. Stuffed Toys: dolls and animals, etc.
23. Clay Flavors: salt, burlap, cotton, etc.
24. Combination Craft: a combination of two or more crafts such as dip 'n' drag, string pictures, etc.
25. Basic Embroidery: stamped canvas cross stitch, such as sampler.

27. Weaving: loom or hand weaving (not crocheting or weaving).
28. Edgings: lace, tatting, crocheted lace, fringe (not hairpin lace).
29. Cut or Drawn Work and Hemstitching
30. Hooked Work: rugs, wall hangings, etc.
31. Quilting: large pieces - bedspreads, throw baby quilts, etc.
32. Quilting: small pieces - pillows, purses, clothing, etc.
33. Crochet (pattern): hairpin lace, afghans, pillows, shawls, bedspreads, tablecloths, etc.
34. Knitting (pattern): afghans, pillows, shawls, bedspreads, etc.
35. Crewel (pattern)
36. Needlepoint (background): background completion only
37. Needlepoint (stamped or pattern): stamped canvas or count from a pattern.
38. Needlepoint (creative stitches): bargello, samplers, Aran designs, etc.
39. Garment (knitted or crocheted): suits, jackets, gloves, sweaters, dresses, etc.
40. Stitchery: use of any thread or yarn in unusual stitches.
41. Combination Needlework: this category is designed for pieces that are more than one basic craft—such as a knitted afghan with a crocheted combination of these crafts to form one piece.
42. Original design: conceived and executed entirely by the entrant with no commercial or outside assistance. This entry may be in Basic Embroidery, Crewel, Counted Cross Stitch, Crochet, Knitting, Needlepoint or any combination of these crafts. The entrant's worksheet must accompany the piece with a short description of the execution of design. Photographs may be used to aid the explanation.

EXAMPLE FOR PLACEMENT OF ENTRIES: If a finished piece is basically one craft, such as a knitted afghan with a crocheted edge, the best placement of the entry would be in knitting. If it is a knitted afghan with a cross stitch design and a crocheted edge, the best placement would be in Combination Needlework.
