## The Shooting in Pocahontas.

Last week we announced the killing of Geo. E. Mory by Mrs. Mary Young at Durbin, Pocahontas county, but could give no particulars. We con dense from the Times the following in regard to the tragedy :

Mory, who was somewhat under the influence of liquor, went to Mrs. Young's hotel for dinner. There were at the hotel some other men who were quarreling in the dining room and Mory indulged in some loud talk, whereupon Mrs. Young appeared and presented a revolver to the head of Mory and told him to "quit chewing." Mory quieted down and began eating his dinner. After a short interval, Mory, whose mind seemed to be dwelling on the pistol incident, said: "Lady, you held a pistol at myhead, something that has never been done before and something I don't want you to do again." At the renewal of hostilities in this manner both rose from the table and John Taylor, the negro waiter, rushed in and seized the man and thrust him into the corner of the room. While they were struggling together Mrs. Young shot and killed Mory, the ball passing entirely through his body, entering just below the fifth rib.

An inquest was held over the dead bedy and Mrs. Young and Taylor were committed to jail. Mrs. Young 18 about 23 years old. She was accompanied by her husband, who is a cripple from rheumatism, and by her baby, a pretty child about two years old. She is a yery small woman, probably not weighing 100 pounds.
