Recently, in 1938, the Koala Bear was picked to be put on the design of the 4d stamps of Australia.

















Richard N. Tucker's return to Islip from three years in Naval Intelligence, the first of a series of fires that caused thousands of dollars damage occurred. Islip has a population of 60,000 and covers over 25 square miles. Within a period of three weeks seven serious fires were started in commercial buildings, and in each case there was ample evidence of arson, but no clue to the criminals.

"Frankly," Chief Tucker related, "I didn't know what to do. I had all my men doing double duty, and alerted all the townspeople, but the fires continued. Fortunately, they were all set when the buildings were empty, so there was no loss of life. Arsonists are a special brand of criminals. They are mentally ill, and very dangerous. Their crimes are carefully planned. How did we know that the next fire would not be in an apartment house?" Chief Tucker went through the general routine of police work, checking the strangers in town, and hunting for witnesses, but all to no avail.

One evening, while puzzling over his problem, the chief got an idea. "It is generally true that arsonists set fires because they love to watch flames. It gives them a thrill. Yet, all of the fires had been in lonely parts of town, and when the police and fire departments arrived, there was no one around. Was it possible then, that the criminal was a member of the fire department? This thought kept running through my mind, and it seemed logical. In order to get full satisfaction out of setting a fire, the arsonist must watch it; the safest way to do so would be as a member of the fire department.

"Our fire department is composed of professional firemen and a larger group of volunteers. I immediately, tactfully investigated our professional firemen, most of whom I have known for many years. Much to my relief, I found them all above reproach and certainly not arsonists. Then I checked on the volunteers. This wasn't too easy, as a different group generally turned out for each fire.

"My first move was to get a list of all volunteers who had helped fight the latest series of fires. I found that only five men had attended all the fires, and that three of these men had joined the volunteers only a few weeks before the first fire was set. This looked like a lead, but I had to find some way to trap them. I spent . some time discussing the fires with the volunteers, and especially with these five men. I soon eliminated two men, who were old-time volunteers, lived within two blocks of the firehouse and generally were on hand to help out. The other three men however, lived quite a distance from the firehouse, and it seemed strange that they were all 'just strolling' in the vicinity of the firehouse when the alarm was rung. I began spending most of my time in the fire station, because I was sure the criminals would repeat their crime. Sure enough, one evening at about twelve o'clock, a call came in from a home on the outskirts of town. Immediately the town alarm was sounded and at precisely this moment the three men under suspicion wandered in, ready for action. This could not be coincidence. I went out with the firemen and found the home in flames. It took three hours to get the fire under control."

Chief Tucker's next move was to sound two false alarms, confiding his plan only to the head of the fire department. On neither occasion were any of the three men around to help fight the fire. He knew then that these were the men he was after. The conviction of an arsonist is generally extremely difficult, however, as they are rarely caught in the act. "It was impossible for me, or any of my men, to trail them, as they knew us on sight, so I called a police friend of mine from a neighboring town and asked him

to follow one of the men. He and his two assistants were prepared to stick with the man day and night. I served as one of the night reliefs, since it would be difficult for the arsonist to recognize me after dark. I had a special muffer built for the car so that we could use it without being heard.

"We followed the man for six days and nights before our break came. Early one morning, when everyone was asleep, I heard footsteps approaching the man's home. From my position, half a block away, I could not recognize the faces of the people coming to his house but I knew that both were men. After about twenty minutes the three of them came out and got into a car. I quietly started my motor and followed at a safe distance, without lights. They drove for about ten miles and stopped. I left my car and moved closer. Fortunately, they were too busy to hear me, and I was soon within twenty feet of them, stationed behind a tree. Working quickly, they took out a five-gallon oil can and some gasoline-soaked rags. As they were about to light a match, I moved in and made the arrest. There was no struggle, and I took them back to town and booked them for arson."

It is this intelligent kind of work that makes Chief Tucker one of the most capable and admired police chiefs in America. He entered police work at 21, and slowly worked his way up to his present position. Chief Tucker feels that democracy is all important in police work. "It is ability alone that counts," he says. "Any man who is capable can work his way up to become a leader of policemen."

Police work is more than a job for Chief Tucker. It is a way of life. Proof of this is the fact that some years ago, Chief Tucker arrested one of his closest friends on a charge of misappropriation of funds. "I did it as tactfully as possible, but I had to do my duty."

The chief feels that the youth of this country are being brought up with so many advantages that there is little tendency for them to become criminals. "Better education makes better citizens, and most young people today are fairly well educated. The average youngster gets plenty of freedom, exercise and normal social life, and hence will probably turn out to be a normal adult, devoid of criminal tendencies."

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




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
