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
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In a period of thirty years, the United States fought in two world wars. During both wars enemy agents were located in this country and could have caused tremendous sabotage, had it not been for the work of certain government and police officials. Chief of Police Frank W. Joret of Edgewater, New Jersey, is one of the responsible police officials who has contributed greatly to the defense of the United States.

Edgewater, New Jersey, is situated on the Hudson River, and in addition to housing important factories, has many docks. This waterfront region became of particular importance during the first World War. It was then that Frank Joret, not yet Chief of Police, was assigned to cover this district.

"For many weeks," Chief Joret relates, "there had been a great deal of hi-jacking of vital materials from transport vessels. Much of the stealing was of a minor nature, but the total was devastating. Frankly, we had tried every possible method of tracking down the criminals responsible for this, but to no avail. No one had ever seen them or found any reasonable clues that would lead to their arrest."

One evening Chief Joret was walking through the waterfront area when he noticed two men strolling down another street. "I became extremely suspicious," he recalls. "This was not an area where one was apt to take an evening walk, and these men were walking so aimlessly that I sensed something might be wrong. Actually, if they had looked as if they were going somewhere, I probably wouldn't have been so suspicious.

"I approached them to ask where they were going, and immediately they started to run. I

gave chase for two blocks, and then they split up and ran down opposite streets. Within another hundred yards, I caught one of them with a flying tackle." As soon as the culprit was brought to the ground, Chief Joret engaged in a terrific struggle with him. The streets were deserted and the two men fought for twenty minutes before the policeman managed to subdue his opponent.

"I noticed that one of the men had dropped a package while running," continued the Chief, "and I dragged the suspect I had caught back to that spot and picked up the package. Later, when I took him to headquarters to be booked, I opened the package and found that it contained valuable machinery parts. This was our first break in the waterfront hi-jackings."

Unfortunately, however, the break didn't materialize. The man who was caught wouldn't talk, and loret wasn't able to get an accurate description of the other offender. "For a few days," he went on, "no further progress was made until I was awakened early one morning by a phone call. I looked at the clock and noticed that it was almost three o'clock. The voice on the phone was muffled and he warned me to give up my investigations of waterfront crimes, or I would be killed. As soon as he hung up I had the call traced, and phoned the New York police. I drove to the given address with the New York police, only to find that our man had left. However, for the first time we were able to secure some descriptions of the man we were after."

For the next three weeks, Chief Joret, working closely with the New York police, tracked down his man through New York City. Finally, early one evening they caught up with him as he was entering a moving picture theatre. "Capturing this man," Chief Joret continues, "was only the start of our work. He was merely a link in the chain, and it took many months before the whole gang was rounded up and arrested." Finally, after a year of diligent work, Chief Joret succeeded in completely stopping the waterfront robberies. This was an achievement that contributed greatly to the nation's efficiency during the first World War.

Chief of Police Frank Joret has spent forty-one years in the police department. In 1908 he was appointed a special officer and in 1911 he was made a permanent member of the force. "The force, at the time," Chief Joret declares, "was composed of exactly six men." Police work was on a completely different level than it is today. Policemen weren't trained at all. They learned their 'trade' by actual experience and, in doing so, often made many mistakes. Fortunately, the criminals at the time were not as clever as they are today, so actually law enforcement was on a fairly high level.

"Today, of course, a law enforcement officer is fully trained before he is put on the job. Not

only must he have knowledge of police and legal procedure, but he must also be something of a psychologist. Edgewater has a permanent population of about 4,000, but there are over 40,000 workers in the factories and docks in the area. This means that our force, although small, has many of the problems that face the police department of a community of 50,000 people." To meet this problem Chief Joret has organized a top-flight 25-man force composed of highly-trained, diligent and hard-working law enforcement officers.

One of the most difficult problems that faces Chief Joret is the tremendous amount of petty thievery that goes on at both factories and docks. "I must always have my men on the alert and I can not tolerate even the smallest theft. It is vital that any thievery be tracked down and the criminal arrested. Often, of course, the thefts are not committed by chronic thieves, but still you must impress upon the ordinary citizen that any thievery will be punished."

Although much of Chief Jorer's time is spent taking care of the waterfront area, he is also extremely interested in the youth of Edgewater. "Whenever I look at a youngster," he declares, "I can't help but think that he might well be Chief of Police in later years. I believe that every youth should feel a responsibility to the community, for this will enable him to grow up into a fine citizen."

Chief Joret's smiling, friendly face is familiar to every youngster in town. They know him not only as a law enforcement officer, but also as a friend. They know that although firm and intolerant of second offenders, he will always give them fair play and go along with them to help them out of any difficulties which they may face. Chief Joret has set up a juvenile bureau which handles all juvenile cases and works with parents, schools, and religious leaders in the handling of juvenile 'problems. The results of this bureau have been excellent, and today there are virtually no juvenile cases of any consequence in Edgewater.

Chief Joret feels that each day law enforcement becomes more efficient. "Every day we learn something new which will help us in both crime prevention and detection. A police officer should never forget that although he spends a great deal of time in criminal detection, the prevention of crime is equally important. Our society should be constantly improving, and one way of helping it do so is to effectively prevent crime."

Frank Joret is a man who backs up his words with actions, as his many years of serving the people of Edgewater have proven. Throughout his years of work, he has constantly maintained a high level of police work and achieved constructive results that should be held up as models for American youngsters everywhere.

The Condor

NE of the largest existing NE of the largest birds of flight, is the condor. Its average length is four feet from its beak to the end of its tail, while its wings have a spread of approximately nine feet from tip to tip. It is a member of the vulture family and enjoys carrion (decaying flesh of dead animals). One condor of average size has been observed to devour a calf, a sheep, and a dog during a single week. When in search of food they are known to attack sheep, goats, and deer. Shepherds hunt them down when they observed in their vicinity in order to protect their flock. The condor is easily caught for it is a stupid bird being more intent on a feast than on its own safety. Because of this fact, a barricade is made of sticks and stones and a dead animal is placed within it. When the condor sees the carcass it swoops down for a feast, Having devoured the animal and often to excess, the extra weight requires him to make an added run to get off the ground. His flight is thus similar to that of an airplane in which a dash down a runway must be made before it can take to the air. Being blocked by the barricade, the bird can-not easily fly and is captured or killed. As the condor is a heavy sleeper and sleeps most of the day, many are caught by climbing up a tree and noosing them before they awaken.

The condors are found in South America along the Andes Mountains from the equator to the Straits of Magellan. The favorite roosts are at heights of 10,000 to 16,000 feet and at levels where there is perpetual snow. They are powerful and graceful flyers for they sail in the air without flapping their wings.

Air mail stamps of nearly all the South American countries bordering on the Andes have shown pictures of the condor on their designs. Among these countries are Argentina, Bolivia, Chile, Ecuador, and Peru. A number of regular postage stamps of Bolivia have depicted the condor on its designs.























