

SYNOPSIS:

Each month we follow the field closely on the status, of security work by analyzing the backlog of pending cases and delinquency in espionage, internal security, security matter and foreign intelligence cases in classifications 65, 100 and 105. Status of these cases as of February 28, 1963, is set forth below.

In February, there was an increase in pending active matters in the entire field in the security classifications from 18,157 to 18,548. Delinquent matters decreased from 1,395 to 1,286. The percentage of delinquent matters decreased from 7.6% to 6.9%.

RECOMMENDATION:

The field will continue to be followed closely regarding security delinquency and you will be advised of the results of the review of the March, 1963, administrative reports.

DETAILS:

The February, 1963, administrative reports from all offices indicate that the total pending active matters in classifications 65, 100 and 105 increased from 18,157 to 18,548. Delinquent items decreased from 1,395 to 1,286. The percentage of delinquent items decreased from 7.6% to 6.9%.



TAMPA OFFICE

SUGGESTION: That security index cards, including the 5- by 8-inch cards maintained in resident agencies on those subjects residing within the resident agency territory, contain a notation of the appropriate subsection of the Attorney General's regulations which constitute the grounds for apprehension. For security, this notation could be abbreviated as "AGR ld," "AGR le," etc.

CURRENT PRACTICE: This information is not included on these security index cards; however, the Emergency Detention Program Manual states in executing the Apprehension Notice and Register the paragraph, "Grounds for Apprehension must be completed by setting forth reference to specific subsections of the Attorney General's regulations the reasons for believing the public safety required the arrest, search or seizure.

OBSERVATIONS: SAC Santoiana, Tampa Office, felt suggestion would be of practical assistance and a time saver in an emergency.

This division advised, by way of background information pertaining to this suggestion, the Attorney General's regulations which would be issued at the time the Emergency Detention Program is invoked list. six broad categories regarding "grounds for apprehension" and calls for the inclusion on the form, "Apprehension Notice and Register," which will be executed by Agents, a specific ground for apprehension by reference to one or more of the six broad categories set forth in the regulations. Copies of the "Apprehension Notice and Register" must be furnished the U. S. Although most of our security index subjects will fall within one of the six categories; namely, "affiliation or collaboration with any organization or movement that has sought or seeks to alter the form of Government of the United States by force or violence or by

other unconstitutional means," it does not appear feasible to adopt this suggestion because of the numerous changes continually occurring in the security index and the administrative effort needed to keep the records accurate. It would appear that in the vast majority of cases, the Apprehension Notice and Register executed by resident agencies will be forwarded to headquarters city for subsequent referral to U.S. Attorneys. The addition of specific grounds for apprehension could be completed at headquarters city.

The Training Division agrees with the views as expressed by the Domestic Intelligence Division and feels the additional administrative effort would not be warranted.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the suggestion not be adopted. On approval, no further action is necessary with regard to the suggester as he was thanked by prior letter.

For the above reasons, the Domestic Intelligence Division recommends against adoption of this suggestion.

(SEMIANNUAL REVIEW AND ANALYSIS)

Origin: This program instituted November, 1960. Purpose: Program established to keep track of dangerous individuals of pro-Castro affiliations, activities or sympathies and to insure they are neutralized in event of hostilities involving Cuba. Scope: Program applies to two categories of pro-Castro Security Index subjects concerning whom we would take appropriate action in case of Cuban emergency. (A) Individuals placed on Security , Index solely on basis of their pro-Castro activities, connections or sympathies. (B) Individuals placed on Security Index for other reasons (such as members of Communist Party) who, by reason of pro-Castro activities, are considered dangerous in event of hostilities with Cuba and who are tabbed "Pro-Cuban." Tie-In With Other Programs: This program is coordinated with over-all Security, Index program. Case Load: As of April 8, 1963, 231 individuals are tabbed "Pro-Cuban"; 147 Cubans are listed in the Special Section "Cuban." or which 73 are Cuban aliens. Magnitude: In the event of hostilities with Cuba, the Government could immediately proceed to pick up those individuals listed on the Security Index who are Cuban aliens. We keep the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) informed concerning these aliens, and the Attorney General is having deportation warrants against them prepared for service by INS should the eventuality arise.

Past or Present Weaknesses: No present weaknesses in this program. Program instituted November, 1960, in view of possibility of a break in relations between the U.S. and Cuba or a limited emergency growing out of Cuban situation. Administrative Control: One Supervisor has the direct responsibility for following captioned matter and assuring that the field vigorously presses all aspects of this program. Accordingly, it receives a continuing review. Adequacy and Currentness of Instructions: SAC Letters 60-54 and 62-55 dated November 22, 1960, and October 5, 1962, respectively, furnished the field over-all instructions concerning this program. These instructions are still current and complete.

Over-All Value: This program serves to more completely discharge our responsibilities in the security field as they relate to the Cuban situation. Contemplated Action: Program should be continued as now constituted. It will be closely watched to assure that any needed changes are effected.

SYNOPSTS:

Each month we follow the field closely on the status of security work by analyzing the backlog of pending cases and delinquency in espionage, internal security, security matter and foreign intelligence cases in classifications 65, 100 and 105. Status of these cases as of March 31, 1963, is set forth below.

In March, there was a decrease in pending active matters in the entire field in the security classifications from 18,548 to 18,517. Delinquent matters increased from 1,286 to 1,581. The percentage of delinquent matters increased from 6.9% to 8.5%.

Letters are being sent to the offices indicated by asterisks on page four herein, commenting on their delinquency and pointing out the necessity of bringing their security cases to a current status.





Security Index (SI) maintained in a current status. The names of 10,000 individuals contained in the SI as of May 15, 1963. During the 25-week period November 17, 1962, to May 10, 1963, the names of 340 individuals were added to the Security Index with 606 cancellations. Other changes on existing SI cards totaled 4,142.

CUBAN ELERGENCY PLANS INTERNAL SECURITY - CUBA

By memorandum 5-24-63 you were advised that as of that date there were 74 Cuban aliens on the Security Index (SI). Since that date two Cuban aliens have been added to the SI and two Cuban aliens were deleted. One Cuban alien departed the United States aliens were deleted. One Cuban alien departed the United States and returned to Cuba while another has been developed to full and returned to Cuba while another has been developed to full informant status and is actively cooperating with the Bureau as informatical double agent in its continuing investigation of Cuban a potential double agent in its continuing investigation of Cuban intelligence matters. He, therefore, no longer meets the SI criteria. The present total of Cuban aliens on SI remains at 74.

During this same period, the total number of individuals included in the "Cuban" Special Section of the SI which section includes both aliens and United States citizens increased from 151 to 154. Further, the present total of individuals on the SI tabbed C for "pro-Cuban" increased from 236 to 239.

Our investigations of Cuban aliens are continuing and the field is being closely followed to insure that the Bureau's obligations are met. You will be kept advised of progress in this regard.



SUBJECT: DELINQUENCY IN SECURITY INVESTIGATIONS

SYNOPSIS:

Each month we follow the field closely on the status of security work by analyzing the backlog of pending cases and delinquency in espionage, internal security, security matter and foreign intelligence cases in classifications 65, 100 and 105. Status of these cases as of June 30, 1963, is set forth below.

In June, there was a decrease in pending active matters in the entire field in the security classifications from 17,777 to 17,603. Delinquent matters increased from 1,606 to 1,872. The percentage of delinquent matters increased from 9% to 10.6%.

Letters are being sent to the offices indicated by asterisks on page four herein, commenting on their delinquency and pointing out the necessity for bringing their security cases to a current status.

RECOMMENDATION:

The field will continue to be followed closely regarding security delinquency and you will be advised of the results of the review of the July, 1963, administrative reports.

The keeping of paper work connected with security-and intelligence-type investigations at a minimum has been the subject of study over a period of years and numerous streamlining procedures have been adopted in efforts to keep it at the lowest possible level without impairing our operations in this field and to release Agent personnel for active outside investigations.

Recognizing that the Bureau is presently faced with very heavy investigative responsibilities both in the security and criminal fields, this section has been reviewing our requirements in this field to see what steps we could take at this time to further streamline our operations. This study has been limited to security investigations of individuals. The following observations are made.

ELIMINATION OF NEGATIVE REPORTS IN SECURITY INDEX CASES

Periodic reports are received in all Security Index (SI) cases (10,796 SI subjects as of June 13, 1963). It is the observation of this section that in a certain percentage of cases these reports will contain only verification of residence and employment and a statement to the effect that certain confidential informants and sources were contacted and were unable to furnish any information regarding the subject's participation in subversive activities. This report, generally of two pages, is accompanied by a cover letter setting forth the identities of informants and sources contacted and a Form FD-305 containing certain administrative details, such as the availability of a photograph, whether the SI card in the case is up to date, basis for continued retention in the SI, et cetera.

RE: SECURITY INVESTIGATIONS - PAPER WORK MANAGEMENT

While these reports do serve a useful purpose as they are disseminated to the Department and to many other agencies of the executive branch having an interest in the subject's activities or lack thereof, it is believed that failure to receive them will not materially affect our operations.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the field no longer be required to submit negative-type reports in SI cases and that submission of information in this type case be limited to a letter setting forth identities of sources and informants contacted in connection with the investigation, accompanied by the Form FD-305 referred to previously herein. This will encompass sufficient information for adequate supervision of the case at the Seat of Government. If you agree, there is attached a proposed SAC Letter. Appropriate manual changes being prepared.



CUBAN EMERGENCY PLAN INTERNAL SECURITY - CUBA

By memorandum 6/24/63 you were advised that as of that date there were 74 Cuban aliens on the Security Index (SI). Since that date, two Cuban aliens have been added to the SI and two Cuban aliens were deleted. One Cuban alien departed the United States and returned to Cuban while another was removed from the SI by the Department as he no longer met the criteria. The present total of Cuban aliens on SI remains at 74,

During this same period, the total number of individuals included in the "Cuban" Special Section of the SI, which section includes both aliens and United States citizens, increased from 154 to 155. Further, the present total of individuals on the SI tabbed C for "pro-Cuban" increased from 239 to 242.

Our investigations of Cuban aliens are continuing and the field is being closely followed to insure that the Eureau's objectives are met. You will be kept advised of progress in this regard.

Each month we follow the field closely on the status of security work by analyzing the backlog of pending cases and delinquency in espionage, internal security, security matter and foreign intelligence cases in classifications 65, 100 and 105. Status of these cases as of July 31, 1963, is set forth below.

In July, there was a decrease in pending active matters in the entire field in the security classifications from 17,603 to 16,573. Delinquent matters decreased from 1,872 to 1,367. The percentage of delinquent matters decreased from 10.6% to 8.2%.

Letters are being sent to the offices indicated by asterisks on page four herein, commenting on their delinquency and pointing out the necessity for bringing their security cases to a current status.

RECOMMENDATION:

The field will continue to be followed closely regarding security delinquency and you will be advised of the results of the review of the August, 1963, administrative reports.

DETAILS:





DELINQUENCY IN SECURITY INVESTIGATIONS

SYNOPSIS:

Each month we follow the field closely on the status of security work by analyzing the backlog of pending cases and delinquency in espionage, internal security, security matter and foreign intelligence cases in classifications 65, 100 and 105. Status of these cases as of August 31, 1963, is set fortbelow.

In August, there was an increase in pending active matters in the entire field in the security classifications from 16,573 to 17,099. Delinquent matters increased from 1,367 to 1,678. The percentage of delinquent matters increased from 8.2% to 9.8%.

Letters are being sent to the offices indicated by asterisks on page four herein, commenting on their delinquency and pointing out the necessity for bringing their security cases to a current status.

RECOMMENDATION:

The field will continue to be followed closely regarding security delinquency and you will be advised of the results of the review of the September, 1963, administrative reports.

DETAILS:

The August, 1963, administrative reports from all offices indicate that the total pending active matters in classifications 65, 100 and 105 increased from 16,573 to 17,099. Delinquent items increased from 1,367 to 1,678. The percentage of delinquent items increased from 8.2% to 9.8%.

The following statistics show the status of pending work, including both pending active and pending inactive matters, and delinquency for all field divisions for the last four months.

As noted in my memorandum of September 5, 1963, captioned "Domestic Intelligence Division, Suggested Organizational Changes," developments in the espionage field require a heavier concentration of manpower on these cases, particularly in the New York area (New York and Newark Offices).

I have caused a review to be made of our over-all operations in the security field to see if there are areas in which we can take steps to conserve manpower through curtailment of paper work and direct the activities of the manpower so conserved to investigations in the above field until such time as the situation is alleviated. The following recommendation is offered:

ANNUAL REPORTS IN SECURITY INDEX CASES

We presently fequire the submission of annual reports in Security Index cases and while I consider the submission of such necessary and fully justified because of 1) the necessity for thorough and complete analysis of a subject's Security Index status at least on an annual basis, 2) the necessity for keeping the Department advised of the results of our investigations for its concurrence and approval of those persons listed for arrest in the event of an emergency, 3) to insure proper discharge of our responsibilities with respect to the dissemination of information to other Government agencies having an interest therein, and 4) the necessity for having these cases in as current a status as practicable should an emergency occur necessitating their apprehension and detention as owe will not have time to prepare lengthy reports following implementation of the Emergency Detention Program, I do feel that because of the pressing need for manpower in the espionage field in the New York area, a one-year moratorium should be placed upon the submission of annual reports in Security Index cases in these two offices. Approximately 3,325 subjects would be involved, thus resulting in the elimination of this number of reports over the one-year period.

I do not propose that we limit our investigative activity in this field of operation; however, the elimination of the above reporting will result in a greater concentration of investigative

activity in the internal security field as well as in the field of espionage. I do not feel that this moratorium should be extended beyond the two offices mentioned above inasmuch as the need for such has not been demonstrated in other field divisions.

RECOMMENDATION:

If you agree with the above, appropriate instructions will be issued the New York and Newark Offices.
