

Domestic Intelligence Division advised it felt the work involved in keeping this data up to date at all times was not warranted since these priorities change so frequently due to changes in positions on part of subjects or lack of substantial activity by subjects. If change should inadvertently not be made and reliance were placed on stamped notation, there is much more chance of error. Reliance on notation rather than a file review would not be a good practice. The card index maintained on these subjects uses different colors for different priorities on these subjects uses different colors for different priorities as an aid to persons working with these cases. PURPOSE

To obtain approval of the attached SAC Letter instructing the field to identify members of the Young Workers Liberation League (YWLL) and to institute security investigations of YWLL officers and leading activists.

BACKGROUND

The YWLL was formed as a successor organization to the W.E.B. DuBois Clubs of America in Chicago, Illinois, on 2/7-9/70. Headquartered at 29 West 15th Street, New York City, and with chapters being organized throughout the country, the YMLL's aims and purposes are to educate youth in the revolutionary ideology of Marx and Lenin and recruit the more promising disciples into the Communist Party (CP). The major task of this developing organization will be to fight the draft, end militarization on campus and instruct all young people who oppose the war, including GIs, on the socialist alternatives. The expressed views of this new CP youth organization will, therefore, be to foment dissent among youth to oppose military service which is the country's foremost weapon in its defense. SAC Letter 70-21 dated 4/21/70 instructed the field initiate an investigation of captioned organization and to report formation of YWLL chapters.

OBSERVATIONS

In view of the YWLL's expressed aims and purposes and the close connection of its members with militant New Left activities, efforts should be made to identify all members of the YWLL and investigations should be instituted on all of its officers and leading activists. Those individuals falling within the necessary criteria will be included on the Security Index. The YWLL is the newly formed youth group of the CP, USA. However, since these will be investigations of youthful revolutionaries, closely following

COOPERATION WITH PASSPORT OFFICE DEPARTMENT OF STATE

Current MOI chapter on security investigations is extremely lengthy (110 pages) and cumbersome. This section, which governs a substantial part of our security work, including investigations of Markist-Leminist organizations and front groups, New Left organizations, and Security Index subjects, has not been overhauled for more than 15 years, and it is seriously in need of streamlining, updating, and reorganizing.

For the past several months, as time has permitted, this entire section has been reviewed, streamlined, and reorganized by Supervisor John R. Keating of the Research Section who has werked closely with knowledgeable supervisors throughout the Division in connection with this project. This project has now been completed and there is attached a revised Section 27 which it is believed is far better organized and will prove more useful and more readable both to Agents in the field and to our supervisory staff. Not only is the revised section much shorter than the current version (less than half in length), but it has also been organized with a (view to providing maximum convenience in locating subject matter and in combining related topics which are not scattered throughout this section.

The following specific changes have been made in //connection with this project:

1. All of the pertinent material relating to applicable statutes has been combined in the initial section of the Compter. Heretofore, pertinent statutes had been scattered throughout the section. At the same time, we have considerably streamlined the statutory information especially to eliminate portions of the Smith Act of 1940 and the Internal Security Act of 1950 which have recently been declared unconstitutional. Eased on recent court decisions diclaring these statutes invalid, we have also ideleted references to the National Defense Education Act of 1958, the National Science Foundation Act of 1950, and the statute Roy RECORDED (concerning the right to strike against the Government,

- 2. We have substantially streamlined the current provisions (870) relating to investigations and reports on the Communist Party, USA, and other Marxist-Leninist groups to eliminate redundancies of verbige and repetition.
- 3. We have broken down current Section S7D (relating to security investigations of individuals) into a number of more meaningful and clearly defined subsections. Currently, S7D runs to some 80 pages and is most unwieldy and complicated. In our rewritten chapter we have broken this lengthy section down into such categories as policies and objectives, procedures, techniques, administrative procedures, and dissemination.
- 4. Throughout the entire chapter we have used streamlined wording, eliminated repetition and verlinge, and sought to organize the material under well-defined and meaningful subheadings.
- 5. A table of contents has been prepared for the entire chapter. Currently the chapter contains only a table of contents with regard to 87D.

This rewritten version of Section 87 has been reviewed and approved by the Internal Security Section which handles the bulk of investigations involved. Pertinent portions have also been reviewed and cleared by the Nationalities Intelligence Section (Cuban matters) and the Racial Intelligence Section (communist infiltration of racial matters and black nationalist investigations). No policy changes have been made in revised version with exception of those enumerated above.

ACTION:

That attached rewritten version of Section S7 be approved. Arrangements will be made so that when this Manual change is issued, an SAC Letter will be prepared advising the field of the major changes. At the same time, necessary changes in the FEI Mandbook will be separately submitted.

To obtain approval of the attached SAC Letter reminding the field of the need to obtain photographs of subjects in security investigations.

BACKGROUND

Section 87D, Manual of Instructions, requires that reasonable efforts be made during a security investigation to obtain a photograph of the subject. With increasing frequency, the field is closing cases without giving sufficient attention to the need for photograph.

dus

OBSERVATIONS

A photograph of a security subject is an integral part of each investigation and should be obtained except in those rare instances where usual sources are exhausted and further efforts would not be feasible. Instances where photographs have prevented would not be feasible. It is rarely safe to assume that an "mis-idents" are numerous. It is rarely safe to assume that an informant has identified information furnished by him with the informant has identified information furnished by him with the subject of the investigation unless all identifying data, including a photograph, has been considered. Additionally, photographs a photograph, has been considered. Additionally, photographs (which are required of Security Index subjects) should be available (which are required of Security Index subjects) should be available at the time subjects are recommended for the Security Index, thus obviating the need to retain cases in pending status for further investigation. No manual changes will be necessary.

(C) SECURITY INVESTIGATIONS OF INDIVIDUALS - PHOTOGRAPHS OF SECURITY SUBJECTS -- The Manual of Instructions, Section 87D, page 28, specifies that reasonable efforts should be made to obtain a photograph of the subject during the course of a security investigation. Some offices are not fully complying with this requirement. Reiterate this rule to appropriate Agent and Supervisory personnel and insure strict adherence to it in the future.

To obtain approval of attached airtel to all offices, advising moratorium on certain aspects of security investigations is rescinded.

BACKGROUND:

In 2/69, as a matter of temporary expediency, the Executives Conference approved a moratorium on certain Security Matter - Communist investigations and periodic report writing in Priority II and Priority III Security Index cases. This moratorium was later extended to 1/1/71.

Memorandum 10/29/70 from the Executives Conference to Mr. Tolson recommended that the moratorium on report writing and investigations in Priority II and Priority III Security Index cases be lifted. The recommendation was approved by the Director.

There are approximately 10,690 individuals currently included in Pririty II and Priority III of the Security Index. Virtually no investigation has been conducted regarding approximately 6,924 of these individuals since the imposition of the moratorium in February, 1969. Many of these individuals have changed residence and/or employment and their whereabouts are unknown. To fulfill our current responsibilities, we should know where they are.

If the moratorium is rescinded, the field will be required to reopen approximately 2215 Priority II cases for reports and approximately 4709 Priority III cases to verify residence and employment and submission of letterhead memoranda where information in field office files warrants

PROPOSED INTENSIFICATION OF CERTAIN INVESTIGATIONS IN THE SECURITY FIELD

The Conference examined the question of whether the current situation demands intensification of certain security-type investigations. In particular, reference was made to (1) lifting of the existing moratorium on report writing and investigation in Priority II and Priority III. Security Index cases, (2) the intensification and expansion of investigations of black, white and ethnic group extremists and (3) development of selected contacts of individuals who could be targeted against Soviet intelligence personnel (DESECO Program). These items are being individually considered below.

Lifting of existing moratorium on report writing and investigation in Priority II and Priority III, Security Index cases.

There are approximately 10,690 individuals currently included in Priority II and Priority III of the Security Index. Virtually no investigation has been conducted regarding approximately 6,924 of these individuals since the imposition of the moratorium in February, 1969. Many of these individuals have changed residence and/or employment and their whereabouts are unknown. To fulfill our current responsibilities, we should know where they are.

Black Student Unions and similar groups on college campuses.

In 1967, black students began forming their own groups to project their demands, many of which indicate a commitment to black nationalism. These groups are autonomous and have a strong sense of common purpose. The Black Panther Party has made open efforts to organize the Black Student Unions nationally and other black extremist groups have used these organizations to project their extremism and separatism.

Campus disorders involving black students increased 23 per cent in the 1969-70 school year over the previous year indicating that these groups represent a real potential for violence and disruption. In the past, we have opened cases on these organizations following evidence of black extremist activities; however, in view of the vast increase in violence on college campuses, it is felt that every Black Student Union and similar group, regardless of their past or present involvement in disorders, should be the subject of a discreet preliminary inquiry through established sources and informants to determine background, aims and purposes, leaders and key activists. It is estimated that this would cause the field to open approximately 4,000 cases involving organizations and the key activists and leaders connected therewith.

Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) and militant New Left campus organizations.

At the end of the 1969-70 academic year, the various factions of the SDS, excluding the Weatherman faction, which has become an organization in its own right, consisted of a membership of approximately 2,500 individuals. In addition to the SDS groups, there are about 252 totally independent groups on college campuses which are pro-communist New Lefttype and are followers of the SDS ideology. It is estimated

that the membership of these organizations consists of about 4,000 members. At the present time, we are conducting investigations of all of these organizations but have not, in the past, initiated investigations of the individual members of such organizations, with the exception of the key activists and individuals who are known to be violence prone.

Major campuses across the nation have been completely disrupted by violent demonstrations, bombings, arsons and other terroristic acts perpetrated by these organizations. It is, therefore, proposed that cases be opened on all individuals belonging to such organizations to determine whether they have a propensity for violence. If this proposal were implemented, it is estimated that the field would be required to open approximately 6,500 new cases.

Puerto Rican Students Union and the En La Brecha (in the breach)

The Puerto Rican Students Union is based in New York and is active on campuses in New York City and near by New Jersey. It embraces the extremist ideology of the New Left and calls for the independence of Puerto Rico.

Fn La Brecha is a Cleveland-based Puerto Rican youth organization with weapons in its headquarters and members have been associated with New Left individuals. In view of the extremist nature of these two organizations, all members should be identified and investigated. This would result in the opening of approximately 200 cases.

Jewish Defense League (JDL)

The JDL is an anti-New Left and black nationalism organization, the violent nature of which has been illustrated by its direction of attacks against diplomatic establishments in the New York area and alleged implication in bombings of offices of foreign countries. Members have participated in an

attempted highjacking of an international flight. This militant group of Jewish youth claims a national membership of 8,000 with chapters in approximately 20 of the major metropolitan areas of the country. We presently have under investigation those JDL members identified as being in leadership positions, participants in acts of violence or active in organizational affairs. In view of the violence-prone nature of the organization, it is felt that investigations of individuals should also include the lower level membership exclusive of those who appear as members only because of financial assistance they afford. This would result in the opening of approximately 800 additional cases.

Development of selected contacts of individuals who could be targeted against Soviet intelligence personnel (DESECO Program).

As of 10/1/70, there were 795 Soviet officials and employees assigned to Soviet establishments in the United States. Of this number, 307 are known or suspected Soviet intelligence personnel based on investigative coverage and other sources. Basic to our coverage of these individuals is the development of as many sources and informants as possible from among those persons in regular contact with the Soviets. Of these sources and informants the most important are those who are developed into Double Agents. These are individuals who receive specific intelligence assignments from the Soviets. We are currently operating 71 active Double Agents against the above Soviets. One of the most productive programs for the development of Double Agents is the DESECO Program. Since its inception, this Program has provided continuous flow of sources, informants and Double Agents. We have interviewed 1,120 individuals of which 379 have been placed in contact with Soviets resulting in the development of 84 valuable informants and Double Agents. This points out the fact that this Program is productive. Therefore, in view of these positive results and our need to increase informant coverage of Soviet activities, it is believed necessary to intensify this Program. We intend to do this by

requiring every Special Agent in the Washington Field Office and New York Office handling investigations of Soviet personnel to immediately open and develop two completely new DESECO subjects. This will amount to a total of 526 new cases under this valuable Program

With respect to implementation of these programs,
Assistant Director stressed that there absolutely
would be no lessening of existing controls in regard to the
investigations of these matters.

Members of the Committee recognize that implementation of these investigations would certainly impose a burden on existing manpower but after carefully analyzing the seriousness of the current situation, it was the considered opinion of all present that we should take necessary steps to institute the above programs at this time.

RECOMMENDATION:

If the Director approves, appropriate instructions will be issued to the field to implement the above programs designed to expand our security investigative coverage of extremist elements.

This memorandum suggests that the current procedure for Xcharacterizations of organizations in letterhead memoranda and reports in all security classifications, except security of Government employees and applicant investigations, be amended.

Current Procedure

Current procedures for characterization in security-type investigations call for the affixing of appendix pages to letter-head memoranda and reports for each organization mentioned in the communication. In each instance, this increases the size of the document by adding at least one page to each one that mentions an organization. In some instances, as many as five or six appendix pages must be added to a one-page document (an example attached). It can readily be seen that this increases the size of the document but adds little information to the subject of the communication.

Recommended Procedure.

In order to save space, effect a monetary saving and add to the readability of these Bureau documents, the following method of characterizing organizations is suggested: (1) that characterizations in applicant and security of Government employee (SGE) investigations be continued as presently required with appendix pages being added to the end of the communication; (2) that letterhead memoranda and reports in all other security classifications contain a short succinct characterization in the classifications contain a short succinct characterization in the details immediately following the first mention of an organization and the appending of a characterization at the end be eliminated; and the appending of a characterization at the end be eliminated; (3) that on an annual basis field offices furnish current characterizations of organizations of which they are office of origin. (This, in effect, is the long form developmental history of the organization which is currently submitted by the field as a

characterization and will continue to be used in applicant and SGE cases.) In addition, it is recommended these annual submissions contain a short succinct statement which can be used in other security classifications as noted above. This would be a statement giving the character of the organization only. As is currently required, both the long and succinct summaries would be first required, both the long and succinct summaries would be first approved at the Bureau and, thereafter, used throughout the field.

Advantages

One advantage of this procedure is that the space used for storage at the Bureau and other agencies would be considerably reduced due to the fact that long characterizations would be eliminated in security classifications.

The needs of other Government agencies for detailed information relating to the various subversive organizations required under the provisions of Executive Order 10450 would be met.

Reports in other types of security investigations would be more readable in that it would not be necessary to refer to the end of a communication for the description of an organization nor would it be necessary to read a long developmental history of it in order to get an idea of the nature of an organization.

Should an agency need additional characterization beyond the succinct form furnished in the communication, the agency could receive this information upon request by being furnished a copy of the long form, approved on an annual basis and in the possession of the Eureau.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. That this suggestion be referred to the Training Division, Attention: Suggestion Desk, for appropriate action.

2. That the comments and recommendations of the Inspection Division, General Investigative and Special Investigative Divisions be obtained.

KEY BLACK EXTREMIST PROGRAM RACIAL MATTERS

During your investigations of black extremist organizations and individuals, you have furnished information indicating that certain individuals are extremely active and most vocal in their anti-Government statements and their calls for terrorism and violence. Although the violence potential in all black extremists necessitates continued priority attention by all offices, there are certain individual leaders and activists who can be considered as Key Black Extremists (KBE).

At this time, the Bureau is designating those on the attached list as KBEs. The term KBE does not require that an individual actually hold an official position in an organization but is to include others of equal importance because of their Sinfluence as black extremists.

An intensified investigation of each person on the attached list must be immediately instituted with the objective of developing complete and detailed information on their day-to-day activities and future plans. Each office must continually remain alert for additions to the KBE list. Submit all recommendations to make specific subjects KBEs to the Bureau for approval. These cases must be given intensive investigative attention and close supervision by all offices. Maintain a high level of

informant coverage on the subjects. All avenues of investigative attention must be explored and necessary recommendations to the Bureau must be made promptly.

The desirable coverage must include, but not be limited to, the following investigation. These investigations must be conducted with initiative and imagination in order that the desired results are achieved. Each of these cases will receive close scrutiny at the Bureau.

- (1) All KBEs must be included in Priority I of the Security Index. If not already so included, promptly submit FD-122.
- (2) All KBEs must be included in the Black Nationalist Photograph Album (BNPA). Promptly submit photograph and required background on each KBE not presently in the BNPA and when a subject is designated a KBE.
- (3) All aspects of the finances of a KBE must be determined. Bank accounts must be monitored. Safe deposit boxes, investments, and hidden assets must be located and available information regarding them must be reported.
- (4) Continued consideration must be given by each office to develop means to neutralize the effectiveness of each KBE. Any counterintelligence proposal must be approved by the Bureau prior to implementation.
- KBE to be placed in the National Security File in the Laboratory. When possible, obtain specimens from public records, law enforcement agencies, and similar sources. Send specimens to the Bureau under separate cover letter by registered mail for the attention of the FBI Laboratory. When they are of value as evidence, so state in the transmittal when they are of value as evidence, so state in the transmittal letter and request their return after copies have been made. letter and reduces their return after tuture comparisons by Specimens should be sufficient to permit future comparisons by the Laboratory.

- (9) The Federal income tax returns of all KBEs must be checked annually in accordance with existing instructions.

If no investigative summary report has been submitted in each case, such a report must be submitted to the Bureau by '2/15/71. Thereafter, an investigative report should be submitted at least every 90 days. Furthermore, appropriate communications suitable for dissemination should be promptly communications suitable for dissemination should be promptly submitted in the interim to keep the Bureau fully advised of the activities of each KBE. 

SYNOPSIS

Suggests Form FD-122 which is used to recommend an individual for inclusion on the Security Index and to change personal data of a Security Index subject be amended to include recommending removal of a subject from the index. At present, this is done by writing a letter to the Bureau. A succinct summary could be added to the form or attached to the form thus obviating the need for a separate letter with the time and work involved in its preparation.

Voucher-Statistical Section, Administrative Division, advised that from an operational standpoint, it had no objection to the proposed action. Domestic Intelligence Division agreed with the idea and stated this would provide uniformity in that the same form would be used for all changes involved. Training Division has amended the wording to remove excess verbiage. (Samples are attached with the amended revised FD-122 for approval.)

RECOMMENDATIONS: (1) That the suggestion be adopted and the attached letter be forwarded to the suggester advising him of this fact. His idea has been acknowledged by prior letter.

(2) On approval, this memorandum will serve as the authority for the Domestic Intelligence Division to take appropriate action to place the procedure into effect.

DETAILS

Suggests this form be amended to include the possibility of recommending removal of anSI subject. This could be done through the addition of one extra ballot box, whereby the form could be utilized to recommend removal of the subject from the SI. A succinct summary could be added to the form thus obviating the need for a separate letter to be written.

ADVANTAGES: The suggester feels this would be of great assistance in standardizing recommendations for the SI. He notes that Form FD-397, Recommendation for Addition to, Change in, or Deletion From Agitator Index, included a block relating to the deletion of Agitator Index subjects (it should be noted this form has now been deleted since this index has been abolished). This was a time-saving device in this regard and the suggester feels a similar block on Form FD-122 would be useful (sample of proposed form attached).

OBSERVATIONS: Voucher-Statistical Section, Administrative Division, advised that from an operational standpoint, it had no objection to the proposed amendment to the FD-122.

pointed out that at present individuals are recommended for removal from the SI by a letter from the field to the Bureau. Under the proposed procedure, Form FD-12 could be used for deletion with the reasons for such deletion included in a succinct summary attached to the FD-122. Even though the idea may not save a great deal of time on an overall basis, it will add uniformity in that the same form would be used for recommending an individual for the SI, submitting changes in his status, and recommending his deletion from the SI. The use of the form additionally will immediately alert the reader to the recommended action whereas the recommendation may be buried in a letter and not easily discernible.

Since both of the interested divisions recommend approval, Training Division has no objection to this action. After consulting with the Domestic Intelligence Division, it has been decided the format should be revised on the line where this information will be listed to eliminate unnecessary verbiage. An amended format of the FD-122 is attached for approval.

William Greider concerning the Security Index (SI) Program. It is fairly accurate and a complete disclosure of the Program. Greider requested information about the SI from Mr. _ on 6/10/71 and was given a "no comment' reply. He indicated he had some information about the SI at that time.

As you know, the SI consists of subjects who are considered for apprehension if the Emergency Detention Program (EDP) is invoked. Our responsibilities in the Program originated with Presidential Directive dating back to 1939. Security investigations of individuals are related to the EDP, which is based on Title II of the Internal Security Act of 1950 (ISA-1950). The EDP involves plans for apprehension and detention of individuals potentially dangerous to the internal security in event of national emergency. Recommendations that individuals be included in the SI are approved by the Special Agents in Charge in each field division and approved by the Bureau. -Activities of individuals added to the SI are thoroughly reviewed by the .. Department which makes the final decision as to whether the individual should be retained on the SI. This article was no doubt triggered by mention of the SI in the Medburg case. Greider quotes unnamed ex-FBI Agents and ex-Departmental attorneys. There is no doubt that many of these are sufficiently knowledgeable to talk about the SI. Annually the Director informs the House Appropriations Committee/of the number of people we have in the SI and the number of those tabbed for priority apprehension. Previously the news media has referred to a detention program in connection with legislative attempts to repeal the ISA-1950. However, there has never been such a detailed public disclosure of the SI as a whole.

This article does contain several inaccuracies: JUN 22 1971

1. According to the article, denied knowing about the SI. This can't be true; by letter, 4/5/67, he gave the Director permission

to put the EDP into effect if the President, he, or certain Departmental attorneys were not available to put it into effect.

- 2. The article relates that the Program is unknown to Congress. The Director informs the House Appropriations Committee relative to it annually, in "off the record" testimony.
- 3. The article states that the Bureau maintains an Agitator Index. The Agitator Index was established 8/67 to include those who had demonstrated a propensity for fomenting disorder of a racial and/or security nature. After it served our purpose we abolished it in 4/71.
- 4. The article implies that the SI is never purged. Actually, it is under constant review by the Bureau as well as the Department to eliminate those who do not warrant retention.
- While we do have 12, 604 on the SI, no more than 1,300 are considered for priority detention.

The article mentions a Bureau "memorandum," 2/26/71, concerning our investigation of a college student, "Mary Jane L." (last name not spelled out). This memorandum, according to the article, was one of the items stolen from our former Resident Agency in Media, Pennsylvania, and made specific reference to the SI. The article quoted part of the memorandum referring to the SI. The memorandum in question is a letter from the San Francisco Office to the Bureau, 2/26/71, entitled "Changed: SM-ANA." The quote in the article is accurate and taken from page 2 of the San Francisco letter.

In attachment to a letter to the Attorney General, 3/25/71, captioned "Burglary of the FBI Resident Agency, Media, Pennsylvania March 8, 1971," we referred to the theft of the letter and specific reference therein to the SI. 

Actually Greider's article is not the first time the letter and its reference to the SI has been publicized. For example, the 3/25/71 edition of "The New York Times," dealing with the theft of FBI documents from Media, refers to the letter and stated "The girl (the subject) was not placed on the 'Security Index." Similar references to the same letter appeared in the 3/30/71 edition of "The Harvard Crimson," a weekly newspaper of Harvard University, and the 4/10/71 edition of "The New Republic" magazine.
